

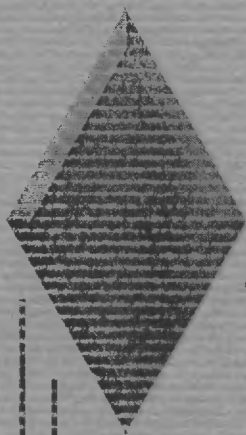

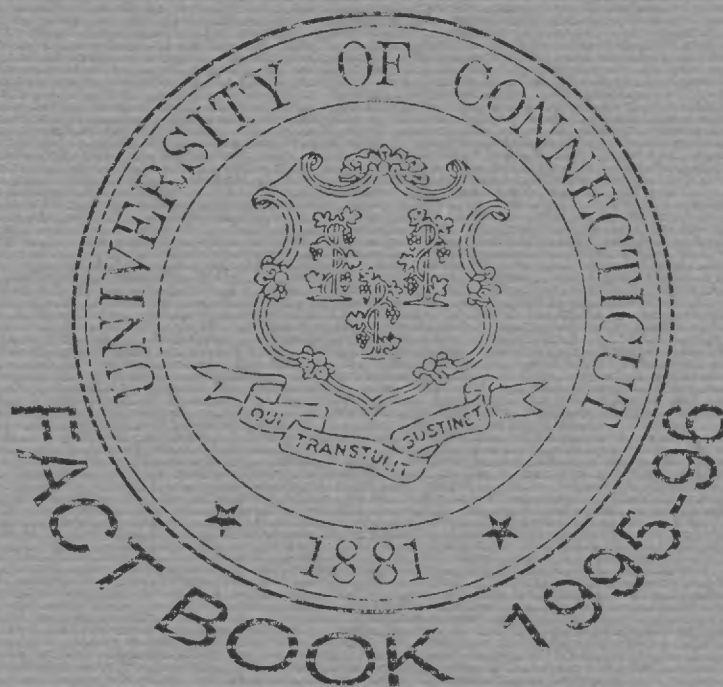

Academic Programs	The University offers a broad spectrum of liberal arts and sciences, professional and graduate education degree programs through its 17 colleges and schools, including the School of Dental Medicine, School of Medicine and School of Law. There are 8 kinds of undergraduate degrees in 102 majors. 11 graduate degrees in 78 fields of study and 3 graduate professional programs. The University also offers individualized majors and interdisciplinary fields of study.
Alumni	As of February 1, 1996, there are 136,935 alumni, with 62% of them living in Connecticut.
Admissions	In Fall, 1995, 10,809 freshmen applications for admission were received, 8,673 were accepted, and 2,956 enrolled.
Residence Halls	There are 69 residence halls served by 7 large dining halls and 21 small unit dining facilities on the Storrs campus designed to provide room and board for over 7,000 graduate and undergraduate students.
Extended and Continuing Education	During 1994-95, 60,455 people were served by Extended and Continuing Education: 18,753 enrolled in statewide credit courses, 33,340 in programs offered through the Centers and Institutes which make up the Office of Public Service and Applied Research, and 8,362 people were served by the Office of Meeting Planning Services. Programs were offered in more than 169 Connecticut communities.
Fees	In 1995-96 it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$4,810 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$5,124 for room and board to attend the University for one year.
Facilities	The University is comprised of the main campus at Storrs, 5 undergraduate regional campuses (one of which also houses the graduate School of Social Work), the Health Center and a School of Law. Storrs is the largest campus with 3,520 acres and 120 major buildings.

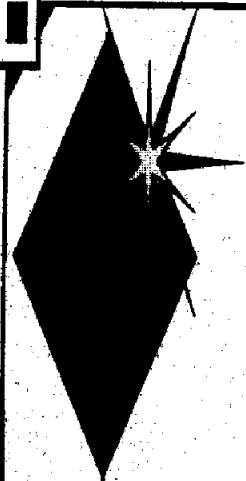

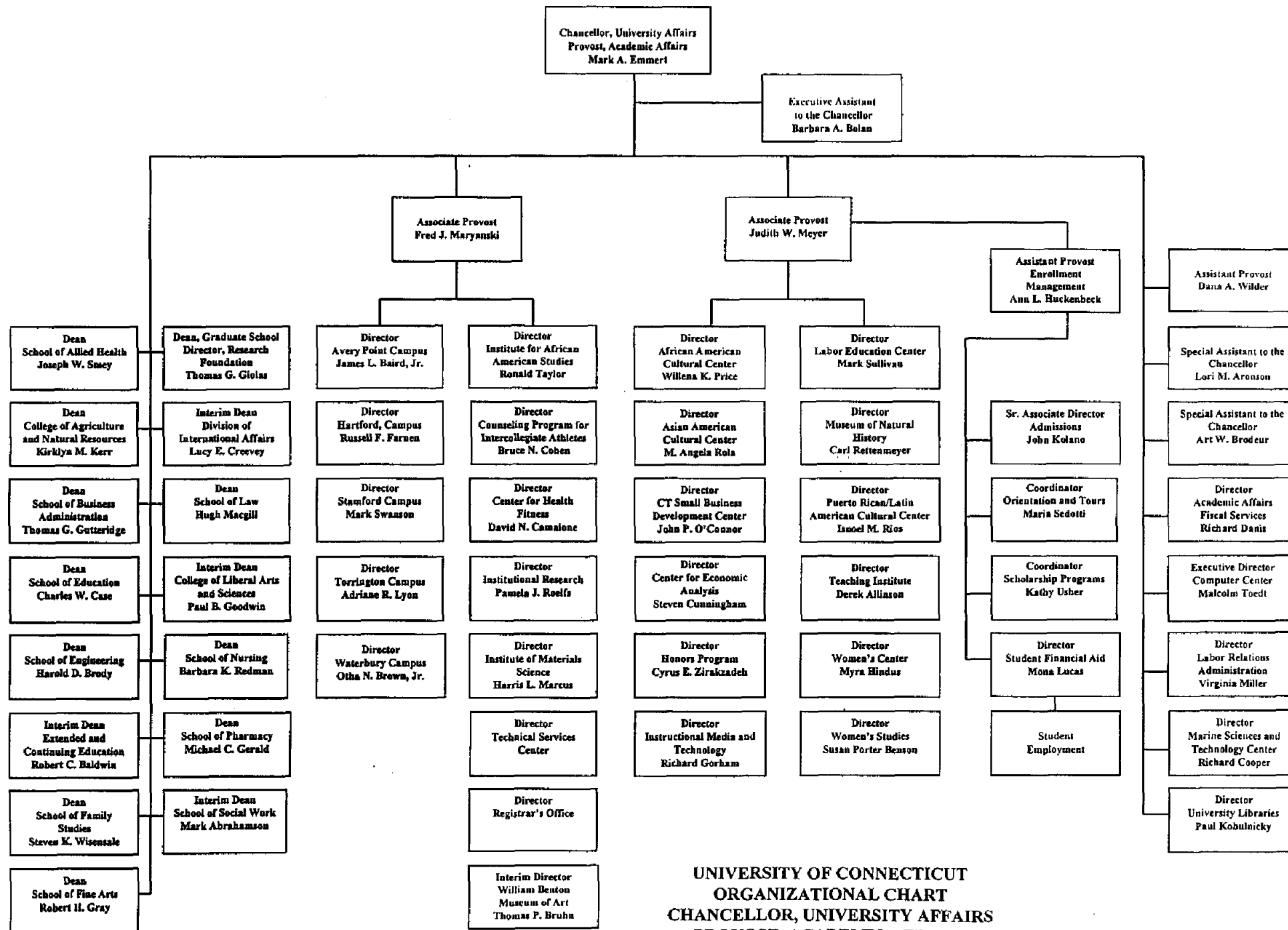

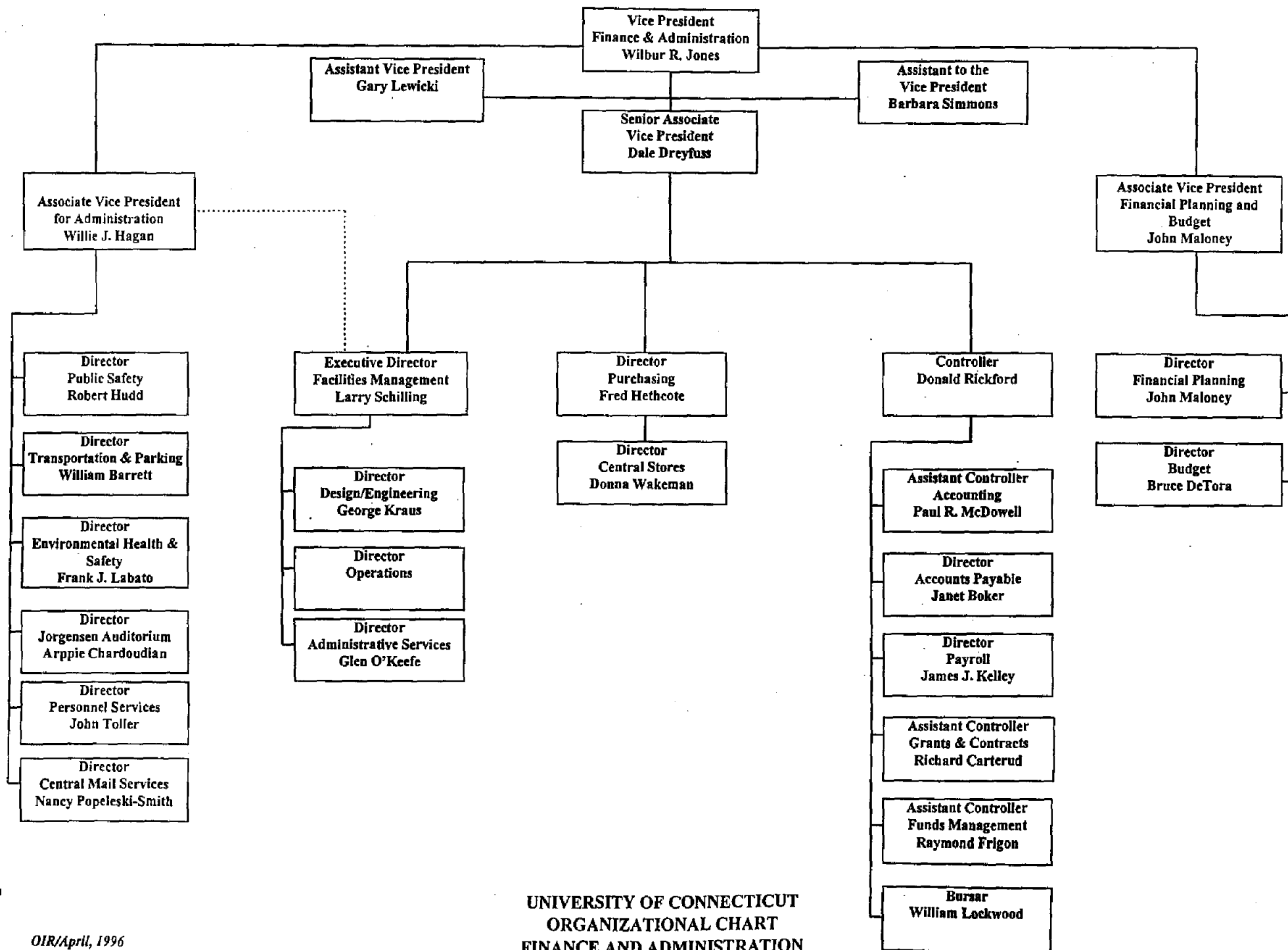
UNIVERSITY ORGANIZATION



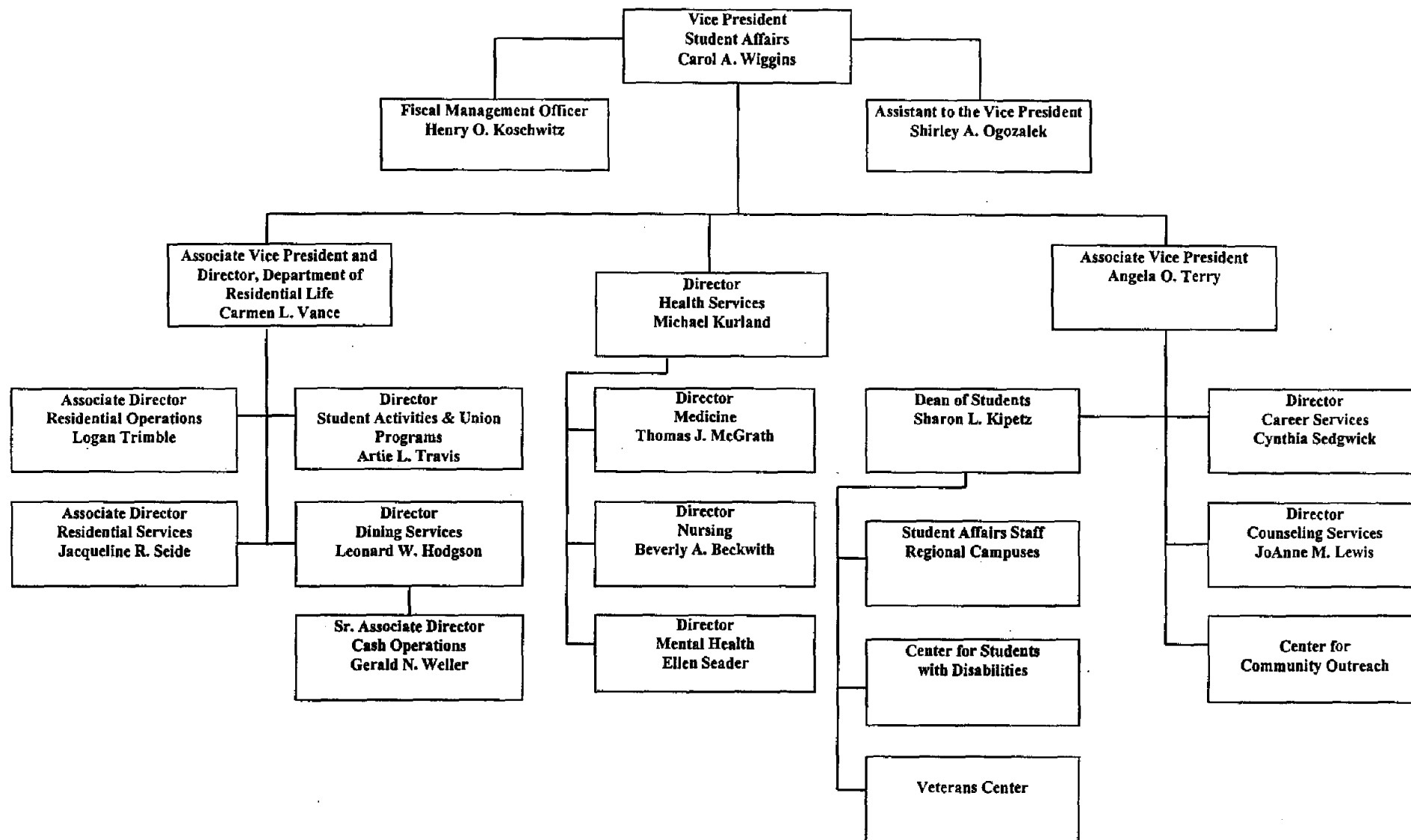
UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT

as of April, 1996



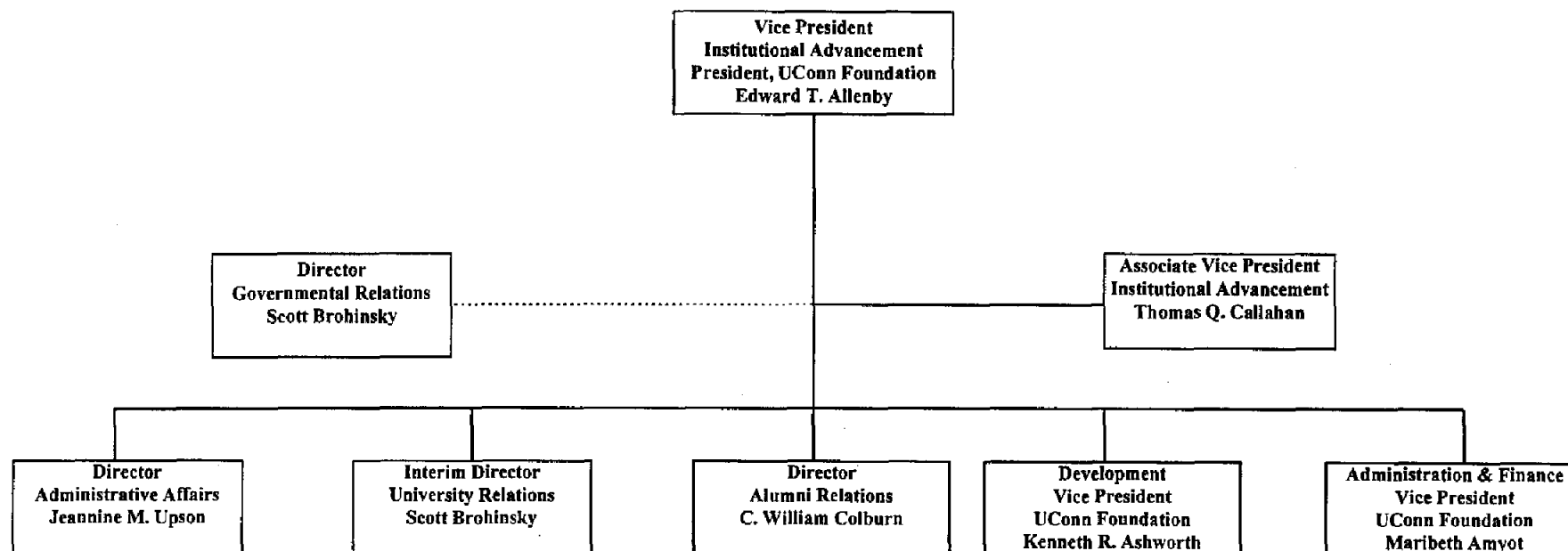

as of April, 1996

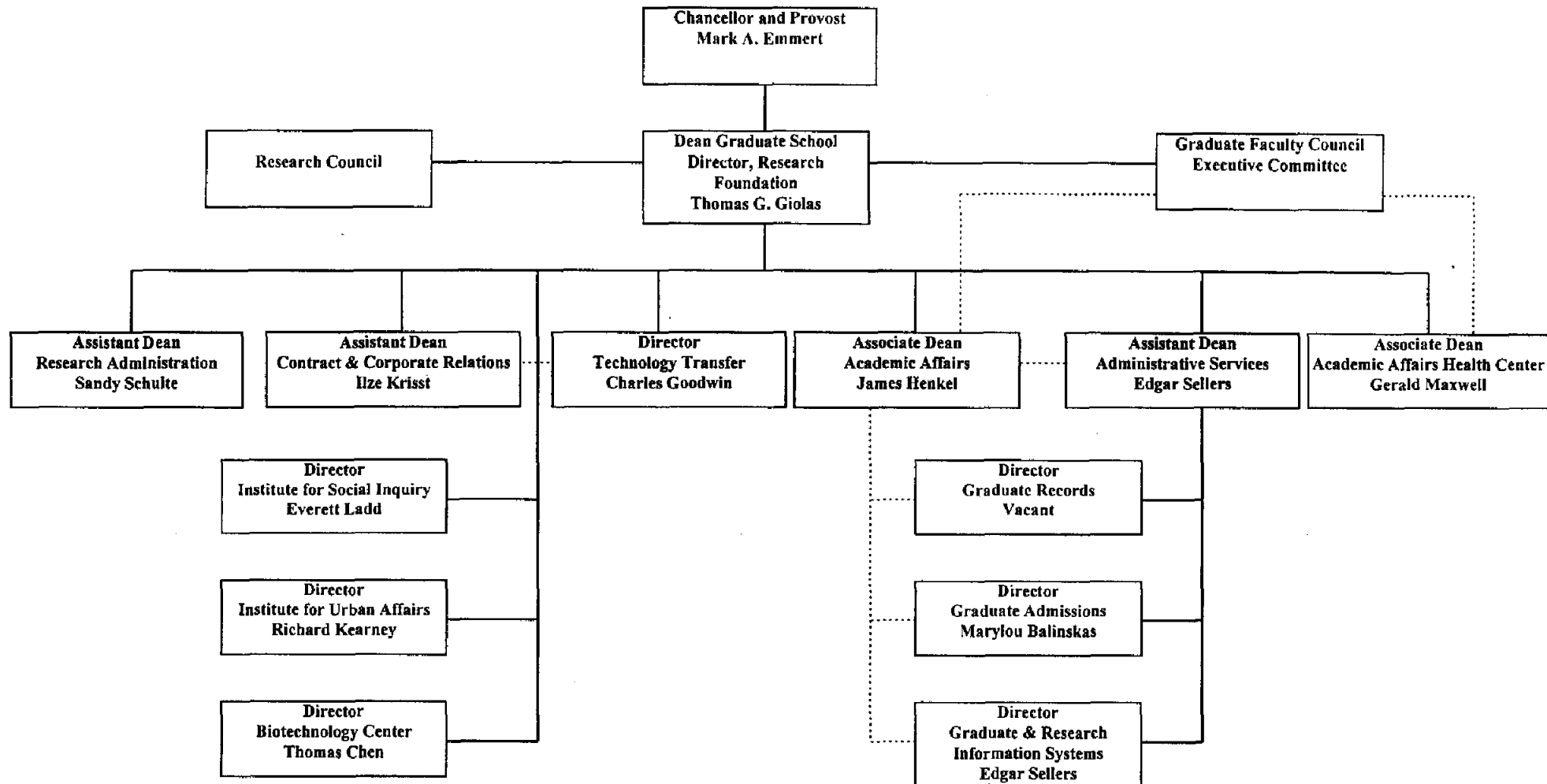

as of April, 1996

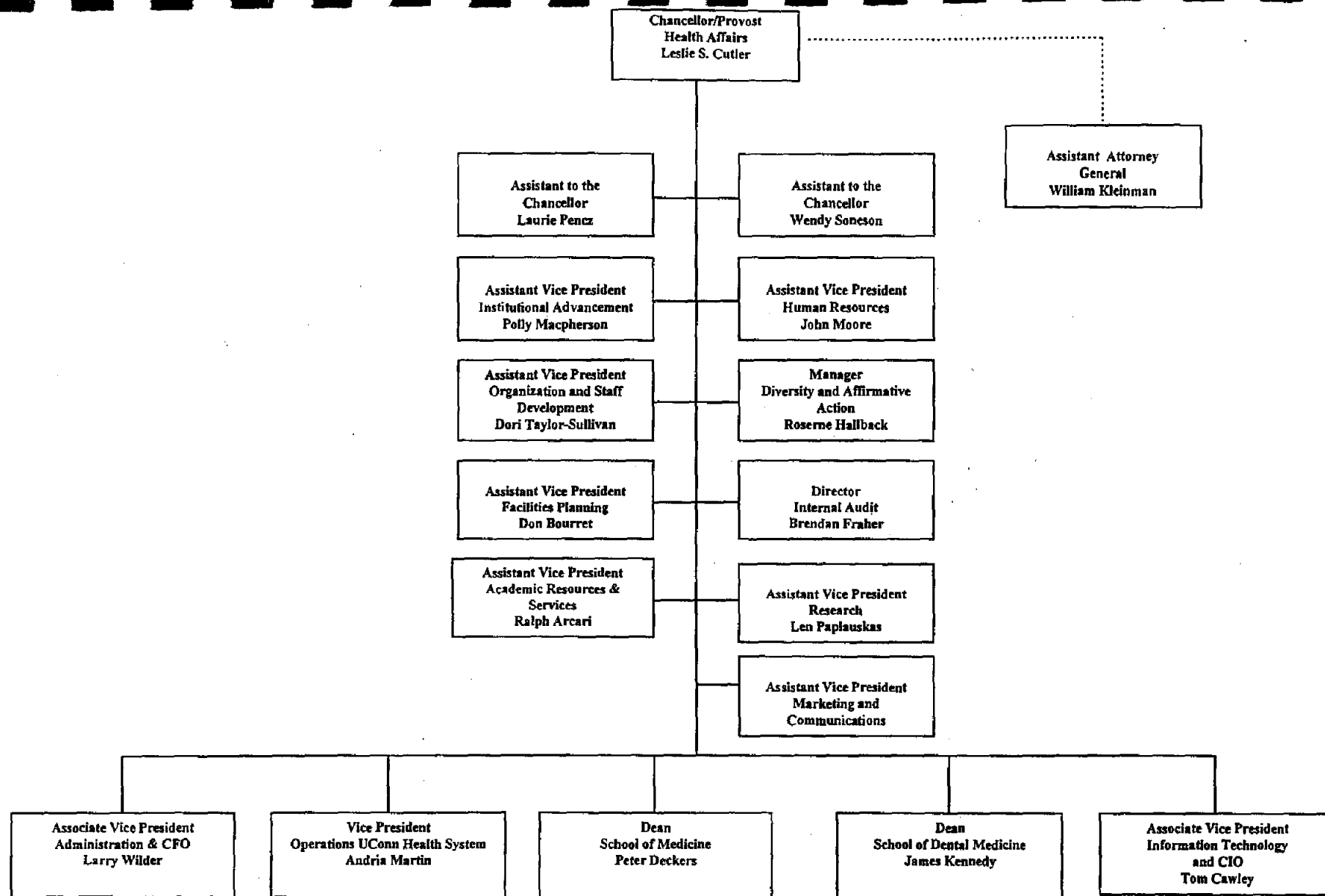


UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT



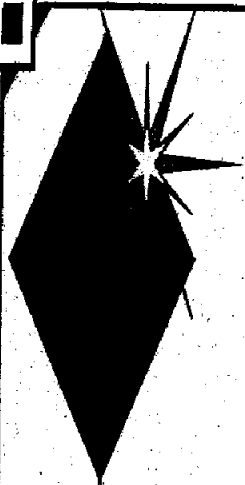

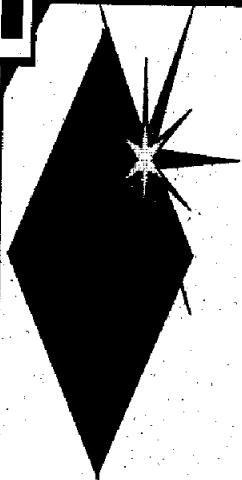
