<b>Academic Structure</b>	We have 15 Schools and Colleges with 46 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.
<b>Academic Fields</b>	Undergraduates may major in 98 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's degrees in 70 areas, and choose from among 66 specialties for the Ph.D. degree.
<b>Alumni</b>	As of August 5, 1992, there are 95,021 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut.
<b>Admissions</b>	As of October 1993, 10,782 freshmen applications for admission were received, 8,778 were admitted, and 3,079 deposits paid.
<b>Residence Halls</b>	We have 88 undergraduate residence halls with a design capacity of 8,633, and 3 graduate residence halls which accommodate 442 students.
<b>Extended and Continuing Education</b>	During 1992-93, 60,629 people were served by Extended and Continuing Education: 21,145 enrolled in statewide credit courses, 30,626 in programs offered through the Centers and Institutes which make up the Office of Public Service and Applied Research, and 8,858 people were served by the Office of Meeting Planning Services. Programs were offered in more than 90 Connecticut communities.
<b>Fees</b>	In 1993-94 it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$4,290 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$4,878 for room and board to attend the University for one year.
<b>Financial Aid</b>	In 1992-93, awards totaling \$72,412,945 were made through various programs of financial assistance.
<b>Library</b>	As of 12/93, the University Library in Storrs has 1.89 million volumes, 2,729,821 microform units, and 8,902 current periodicals. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2.5 million volumes.
<b>Facilities</b>	<p>As of Fall, 1991 we have 383 usable structures on the Storrs Campus, with a total of 4,142,896 assignable square feet of floor space.</p> <p>The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 118 miles of sidewalk over 60 acres of parking lots to serve approximately 12,500 registered vehicles and an underground steam distribution system of 16.5 miles.</p>

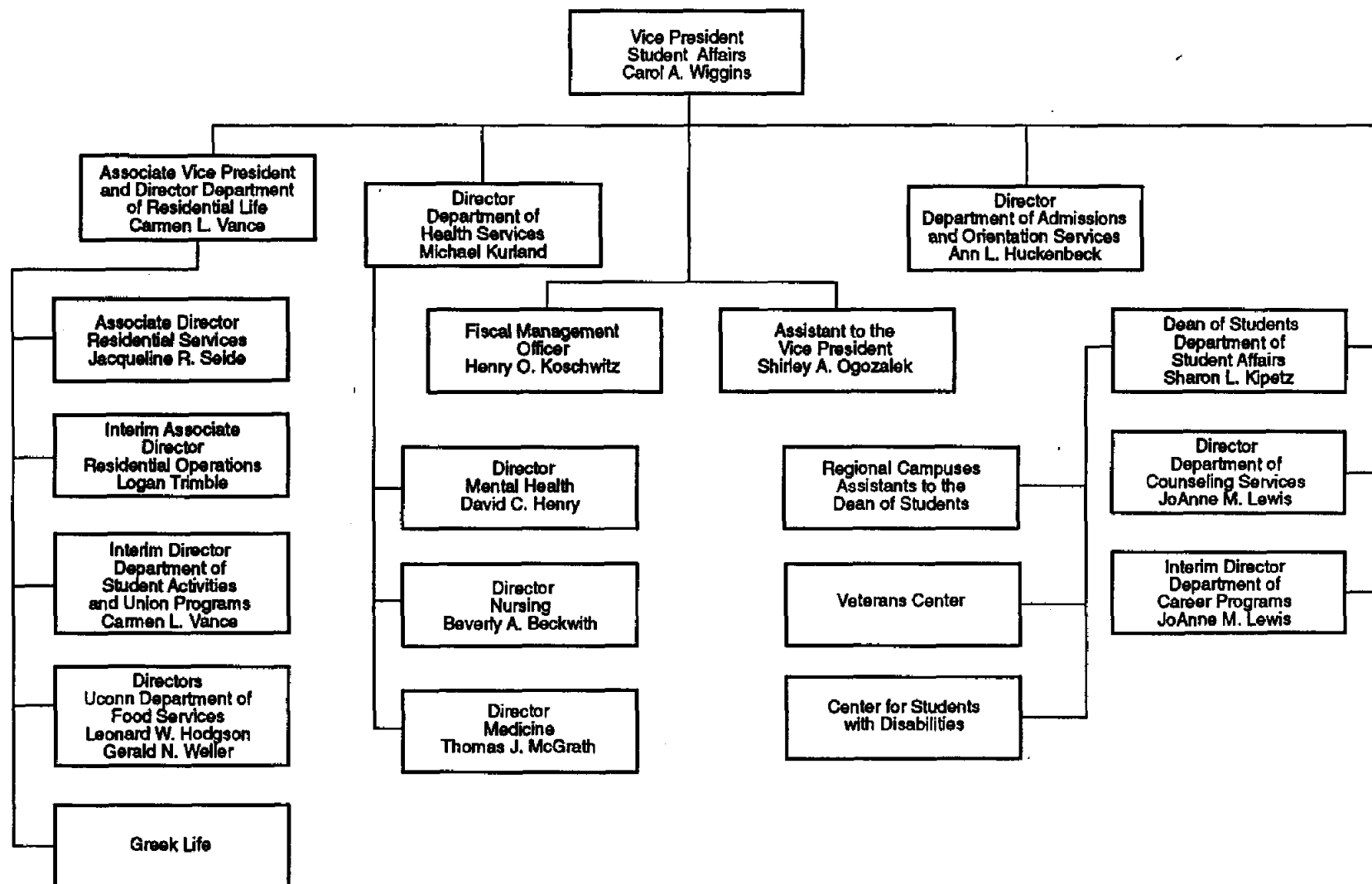


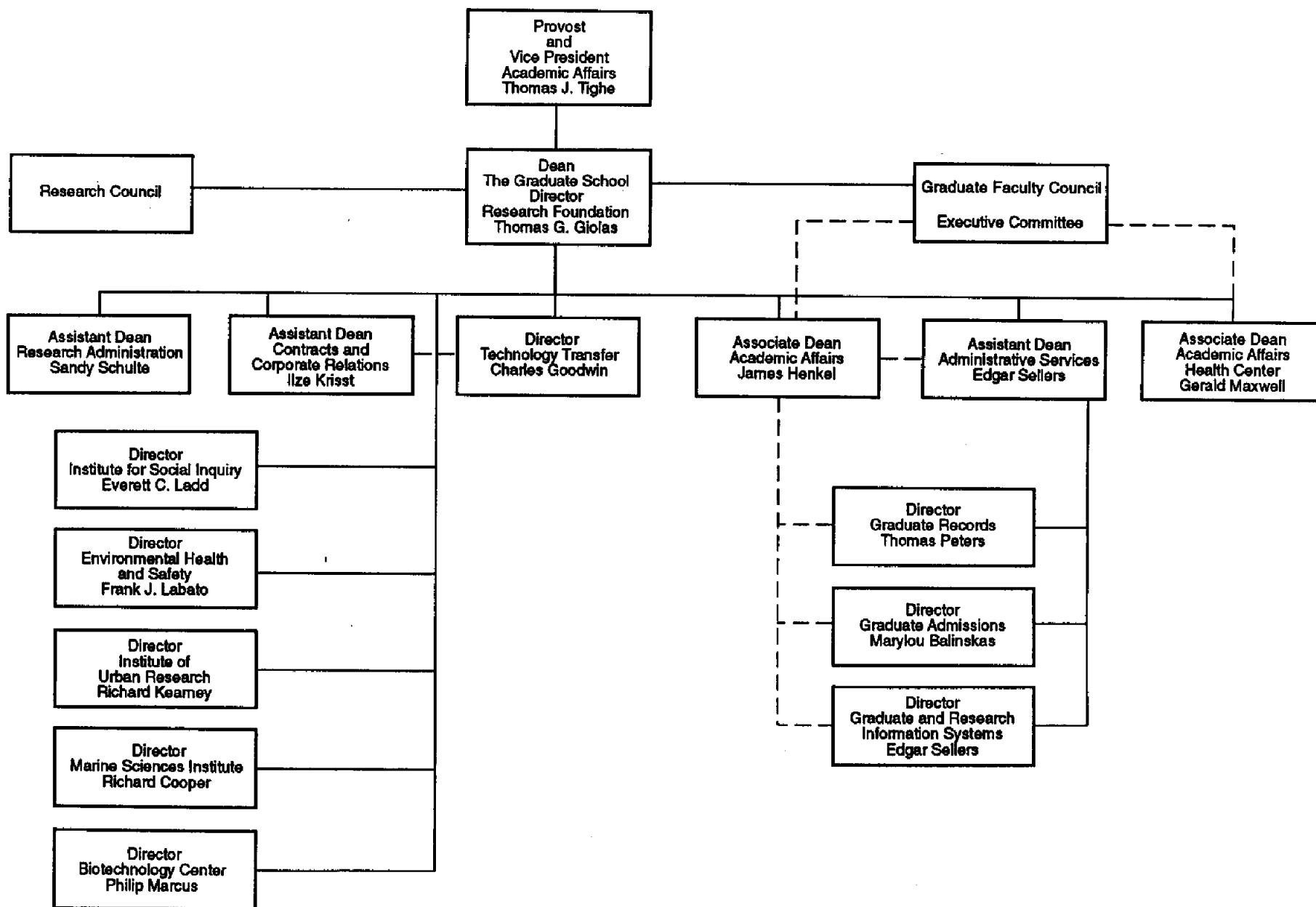
**University of Connecticut

as of January, 1994**

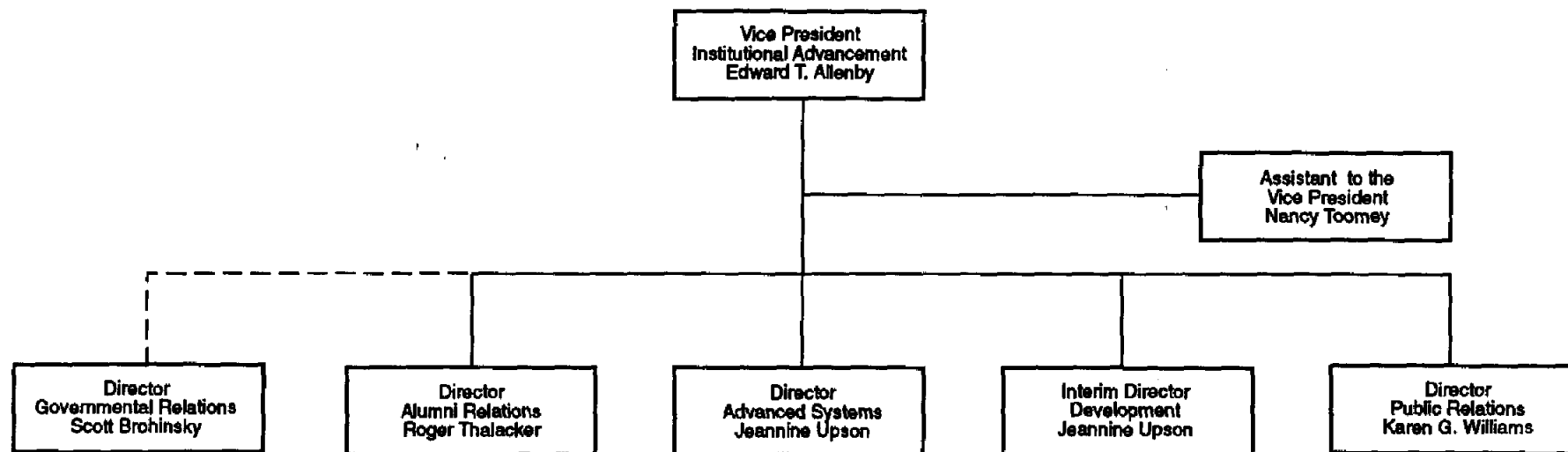


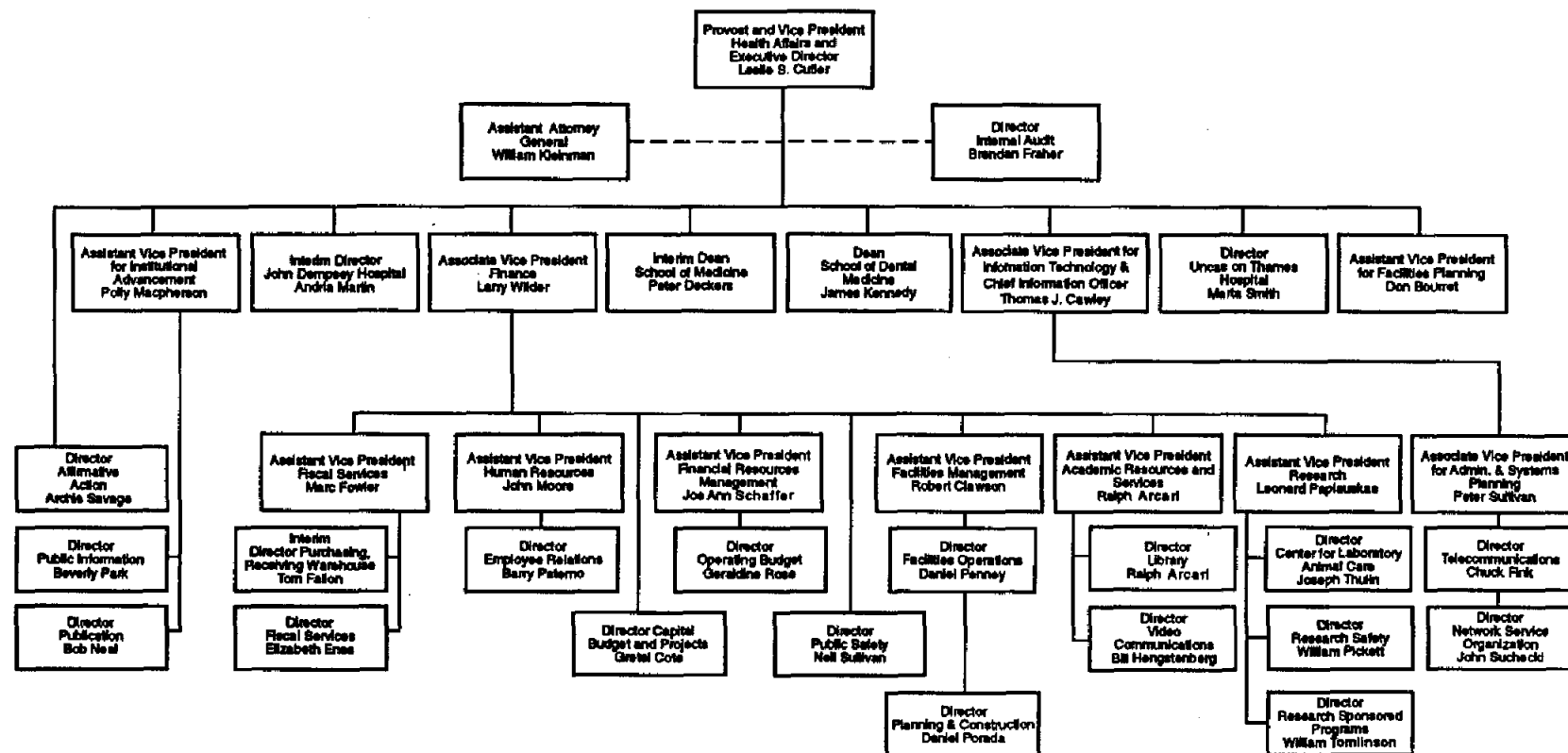

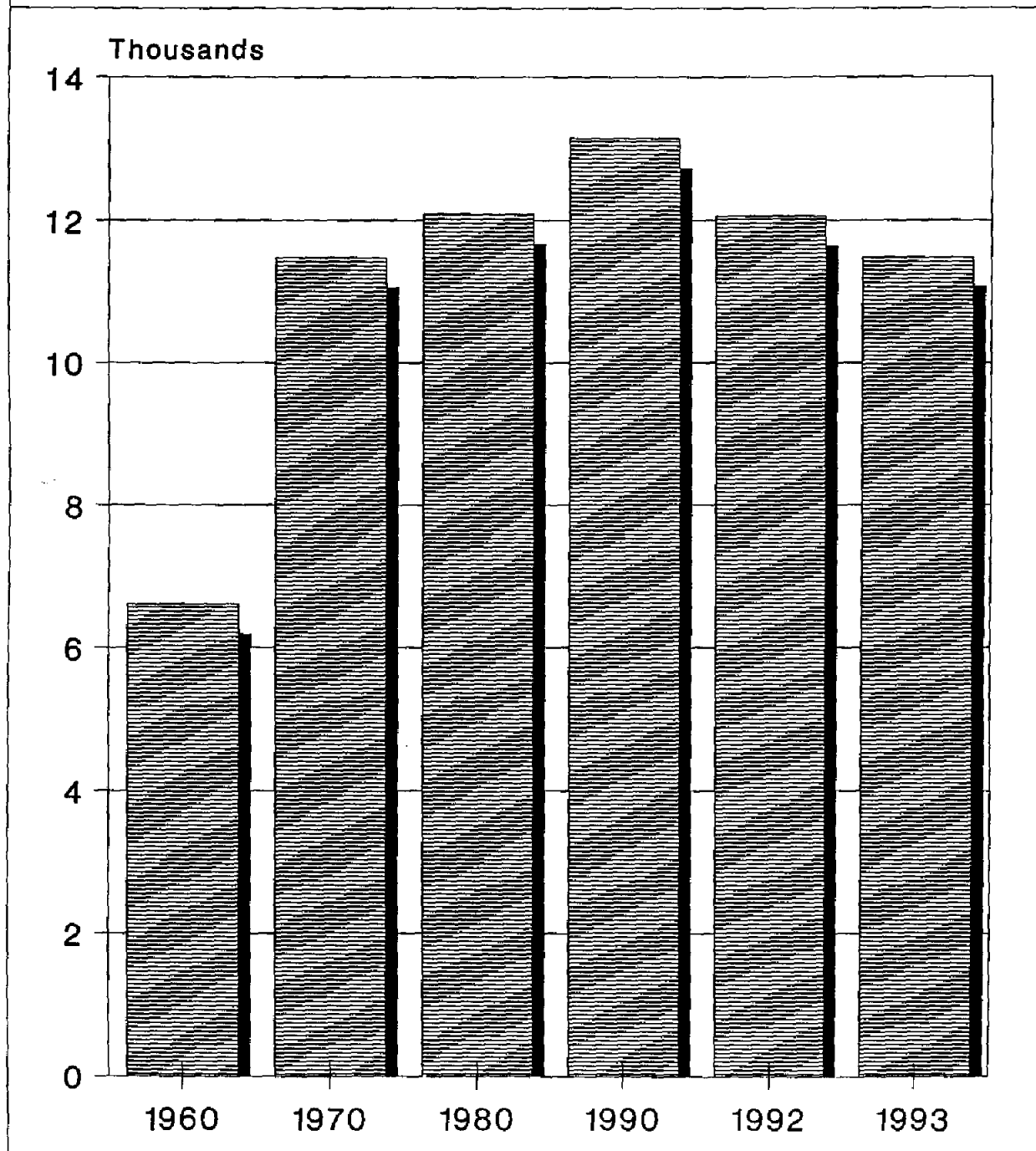

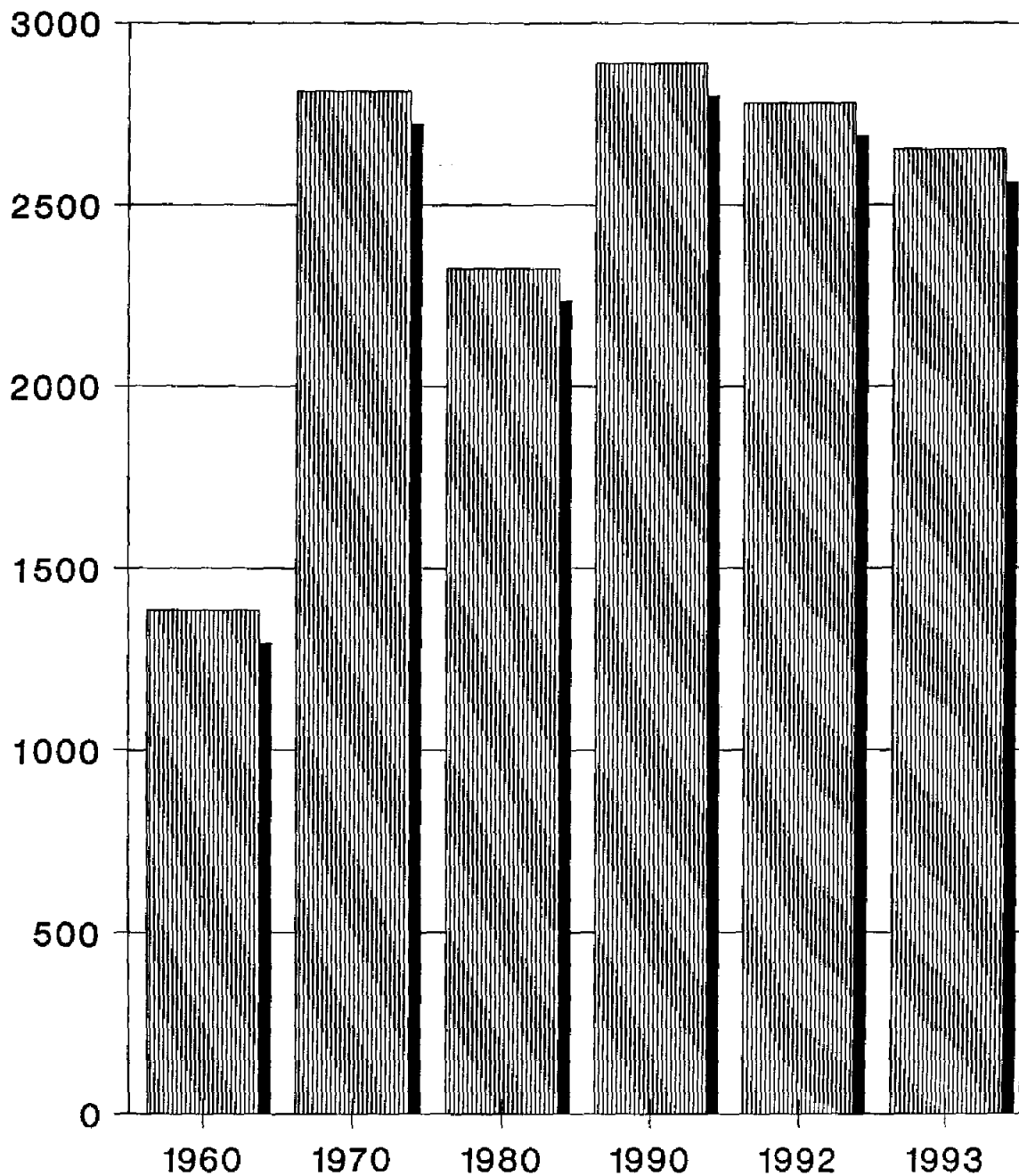

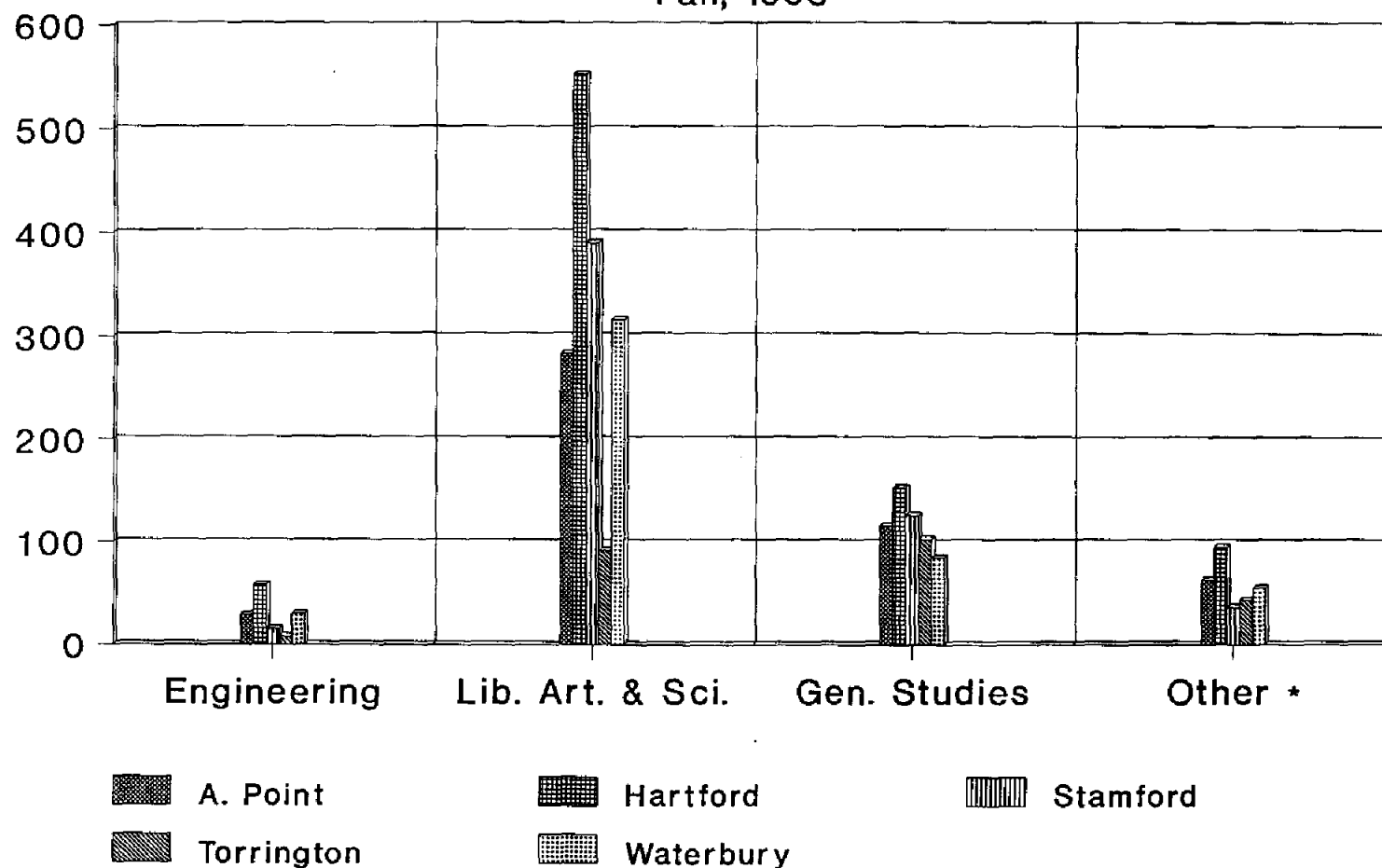

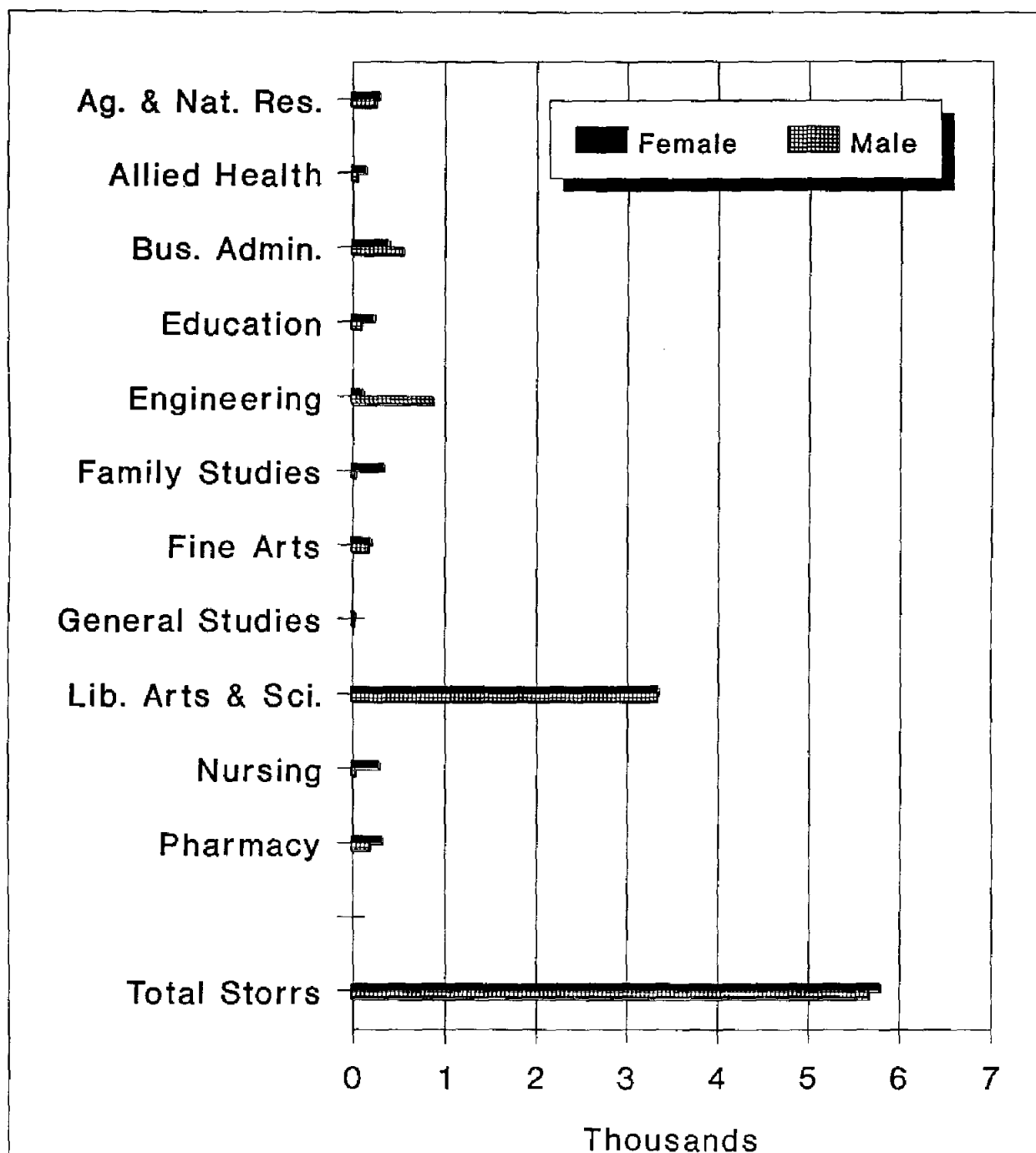

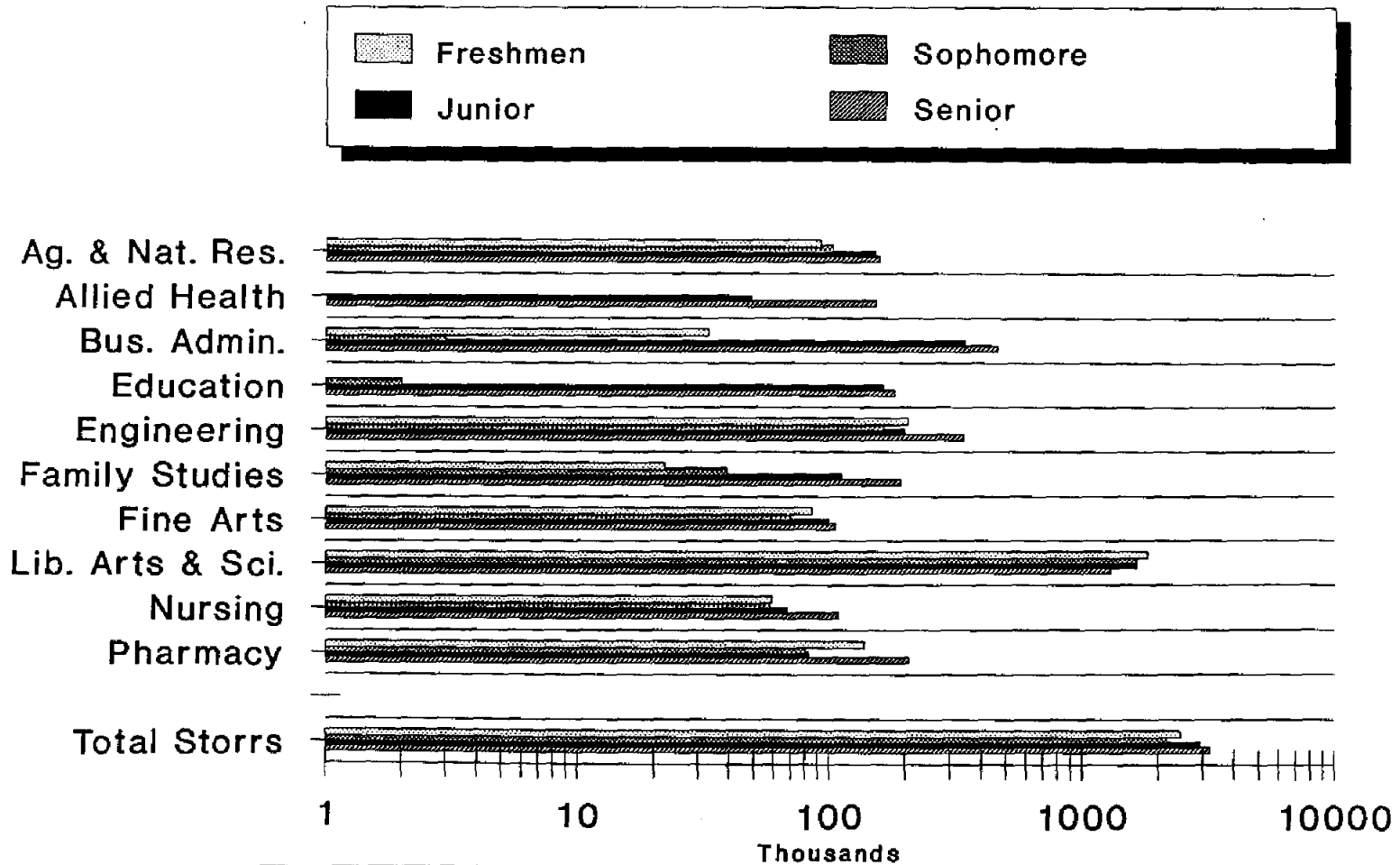

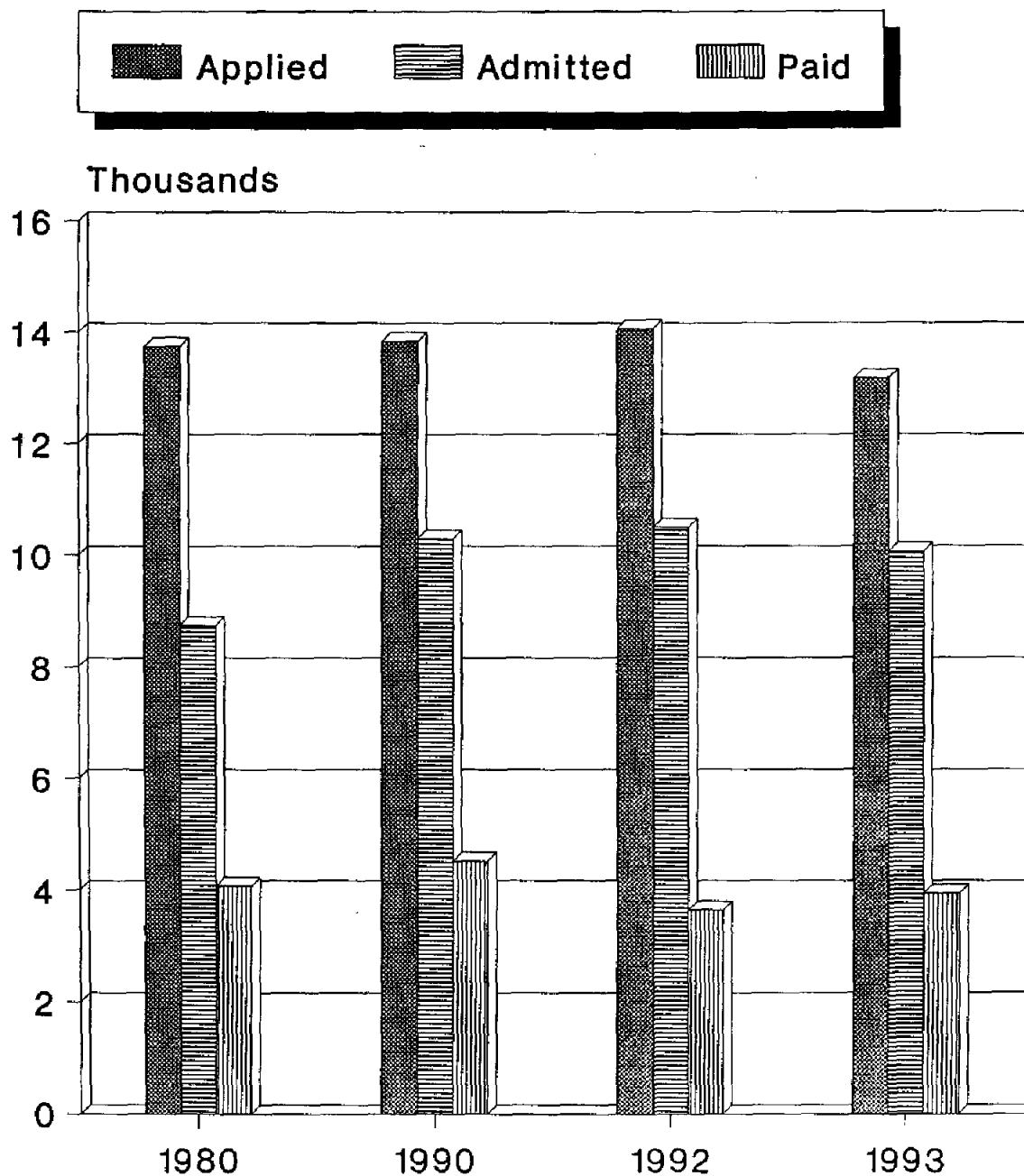

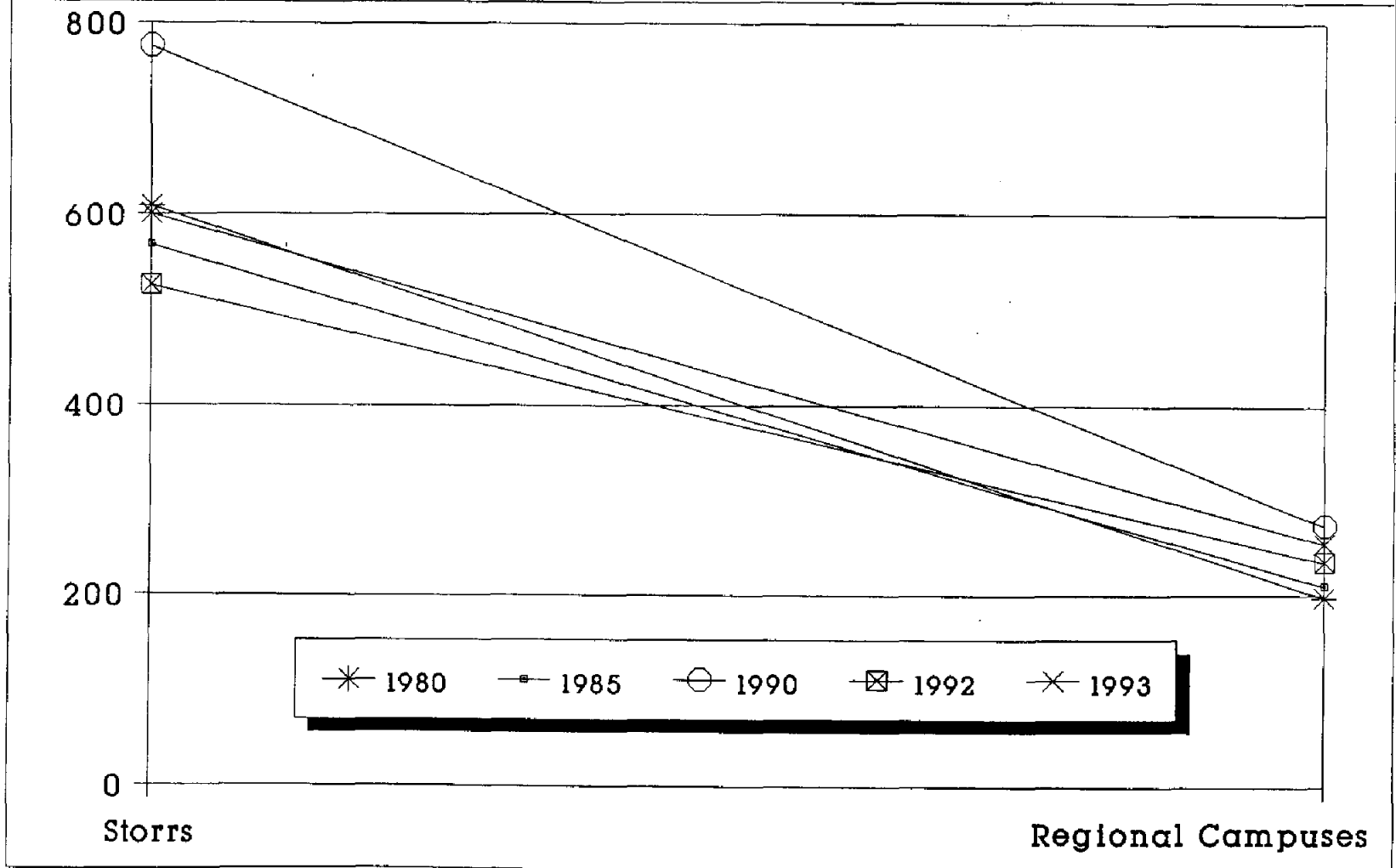

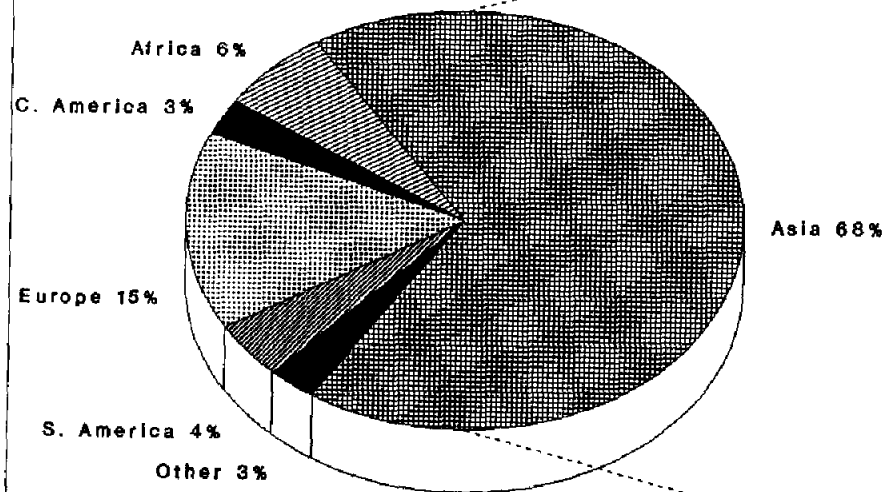

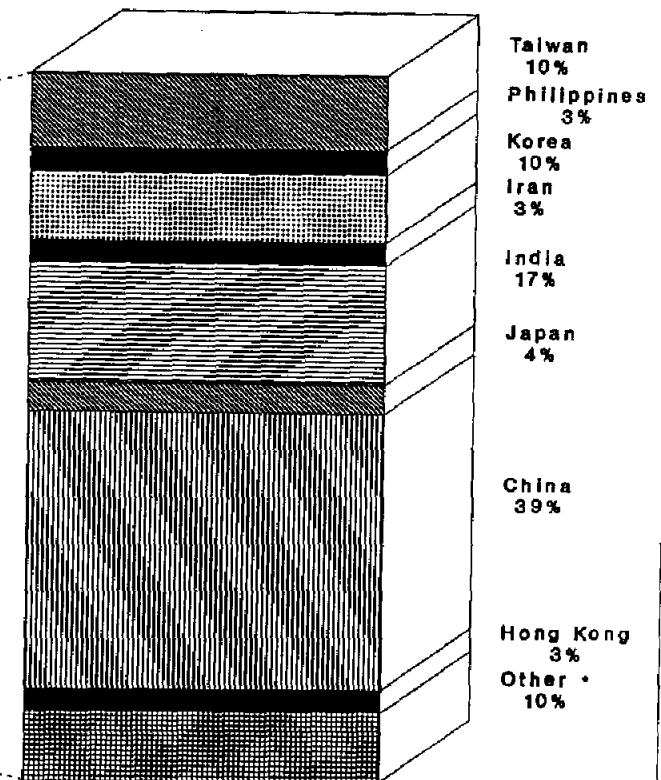

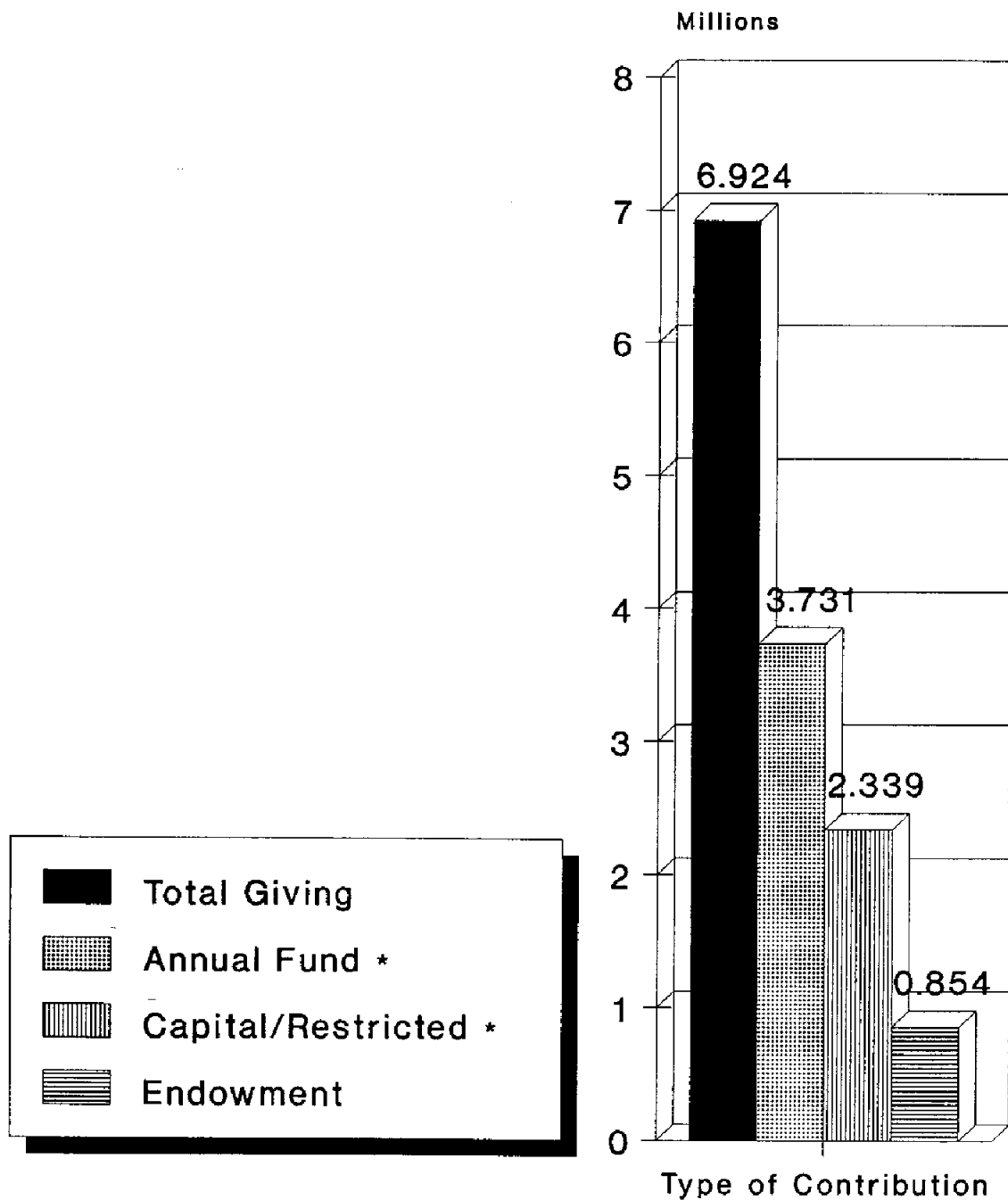

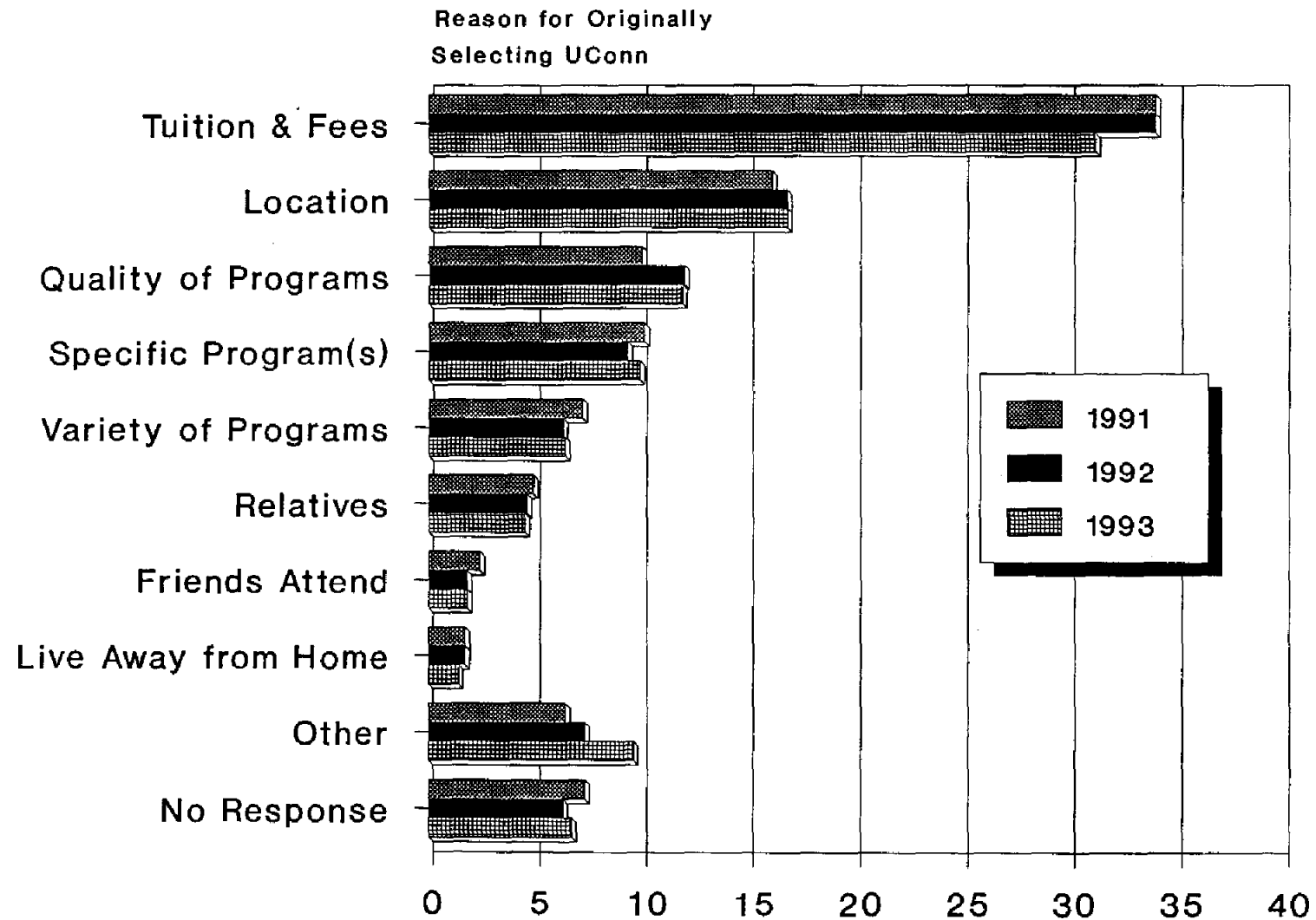

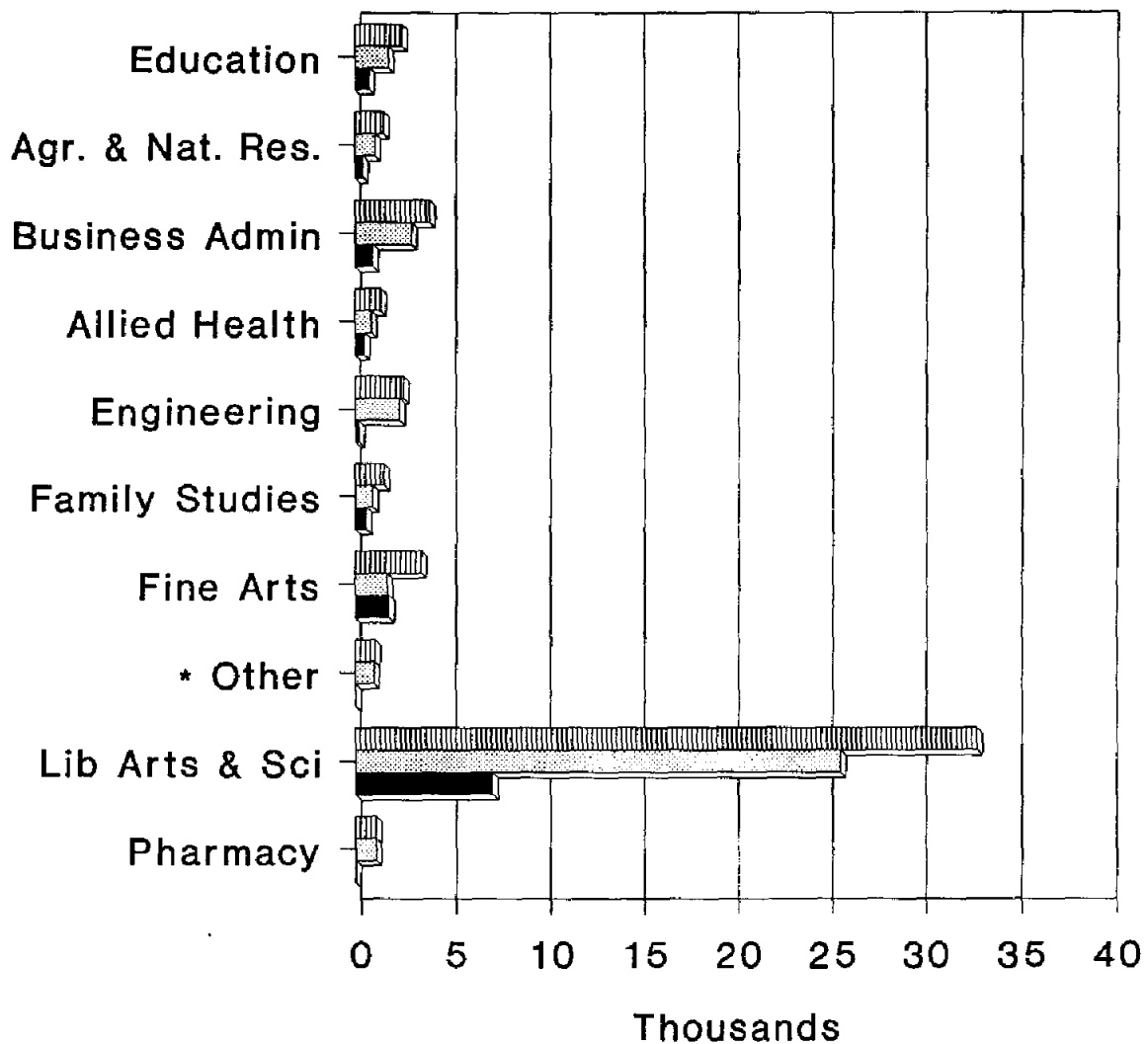

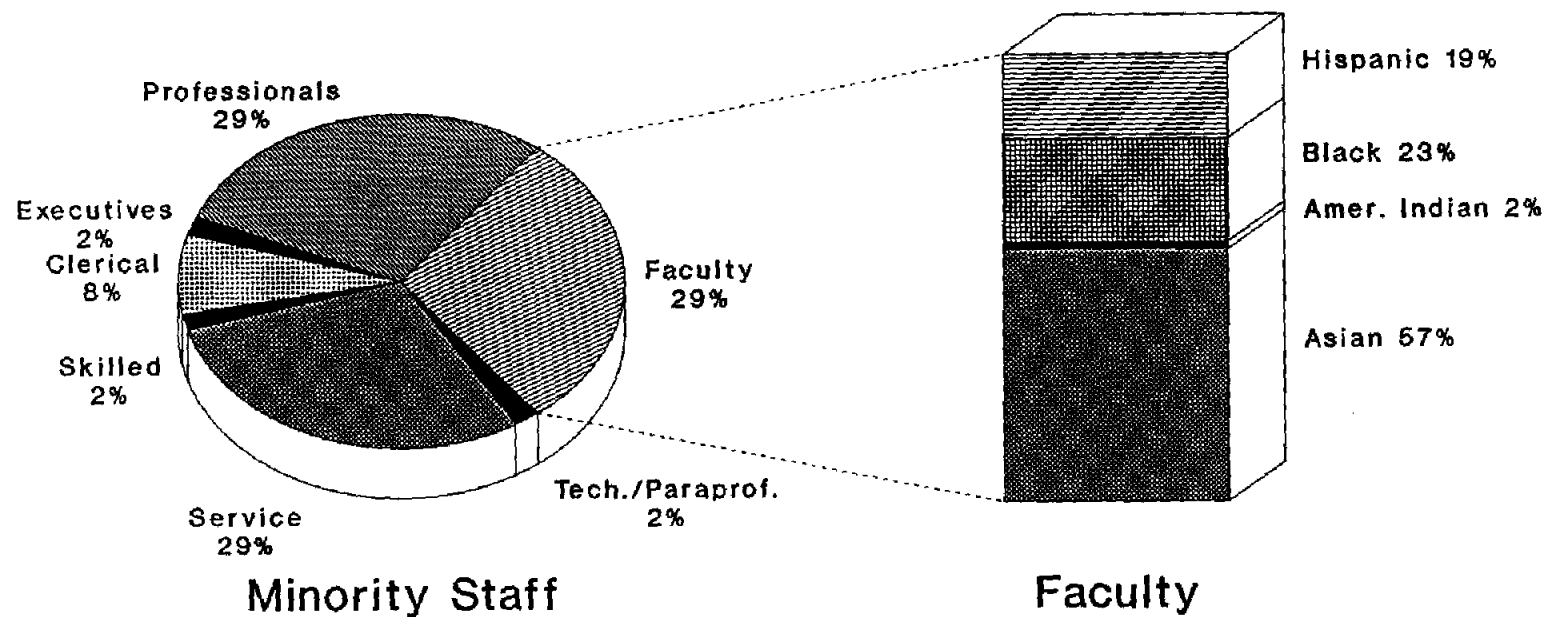

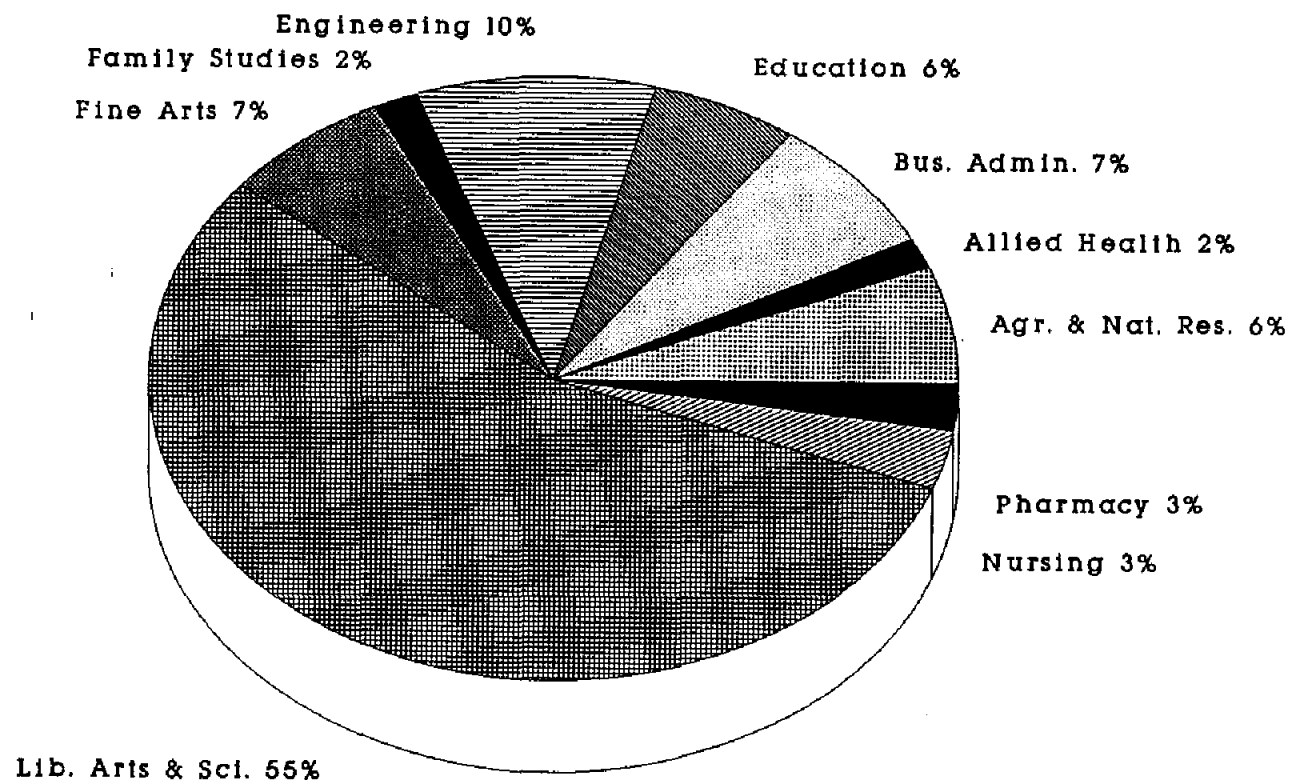

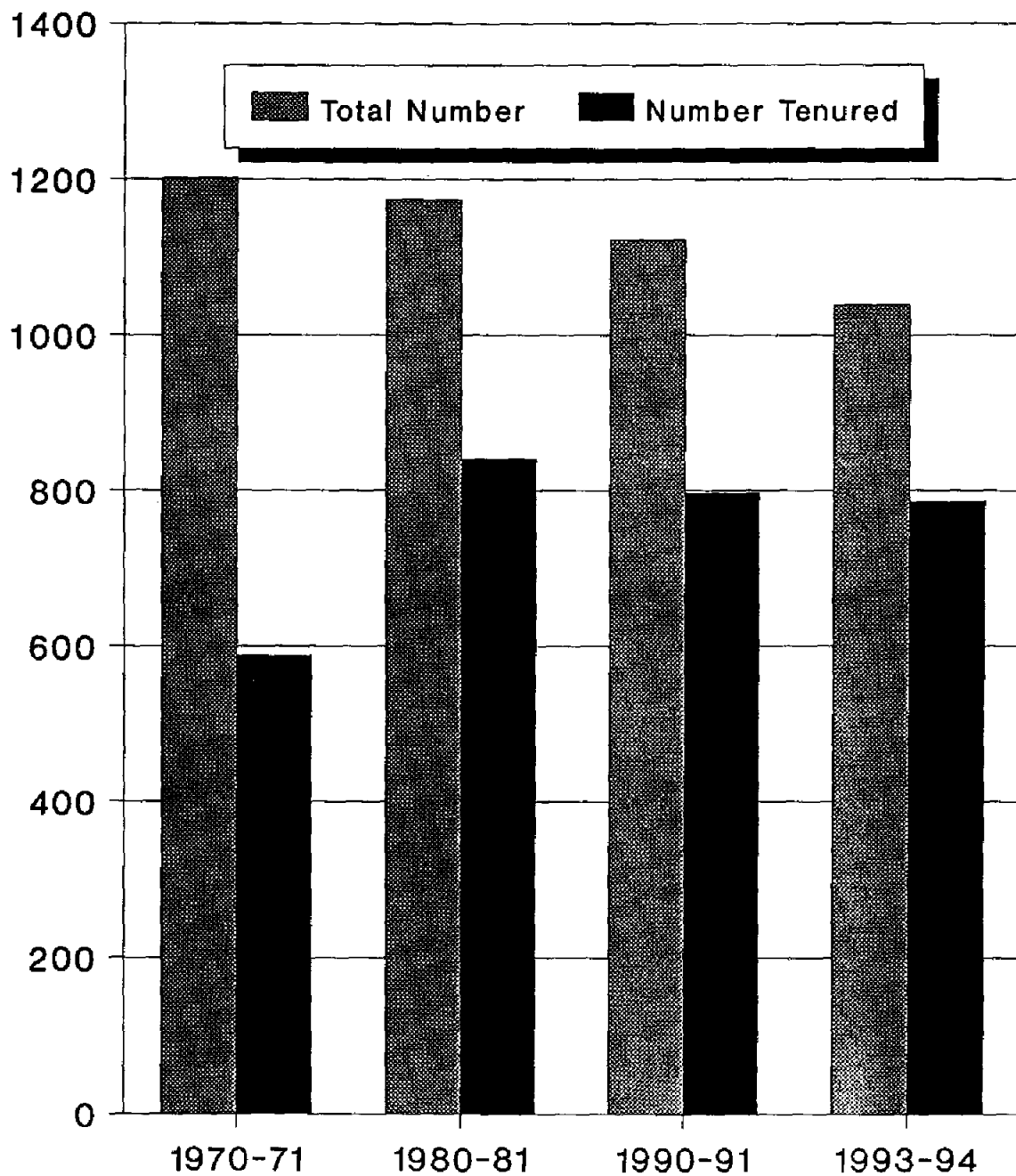

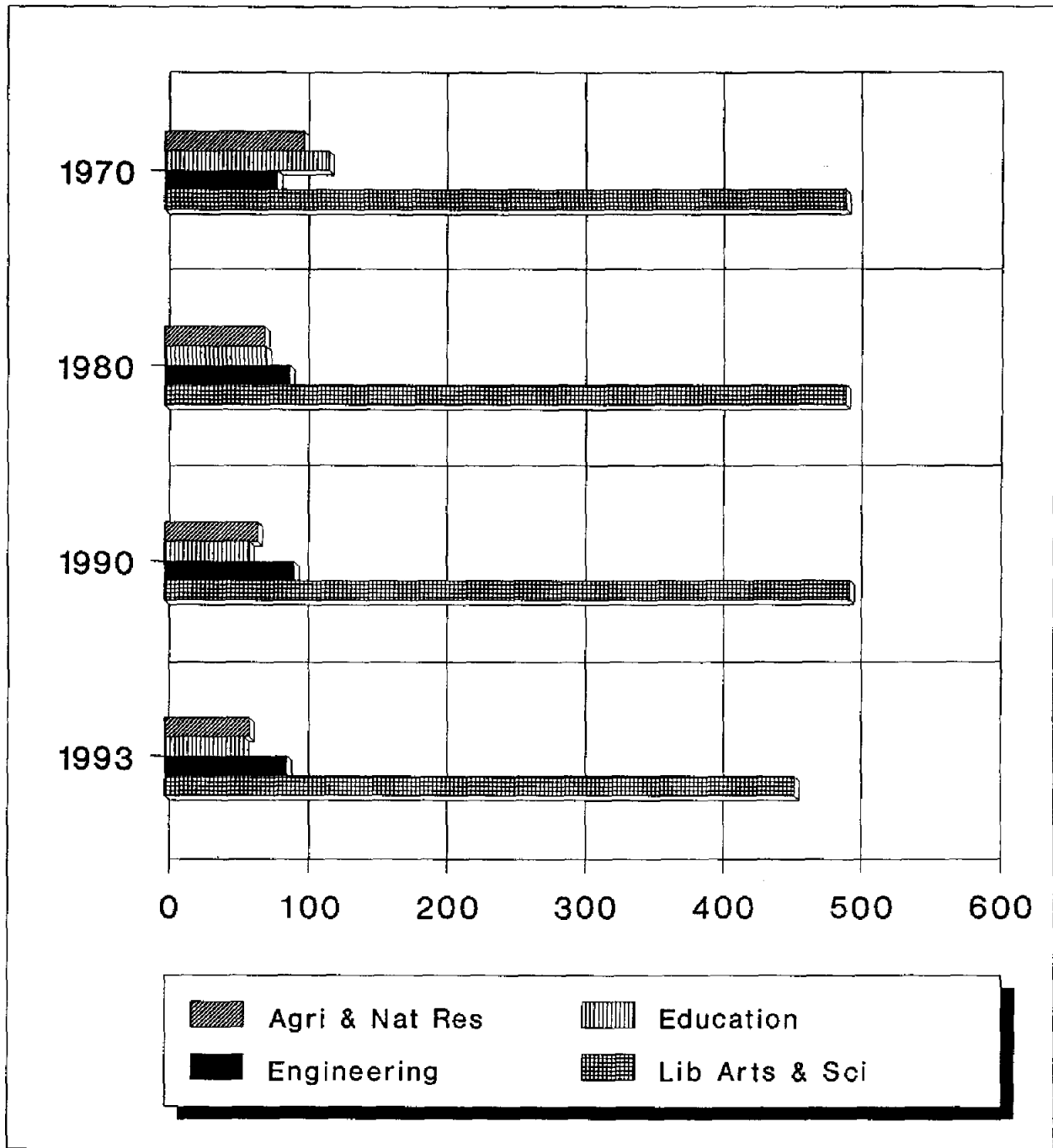

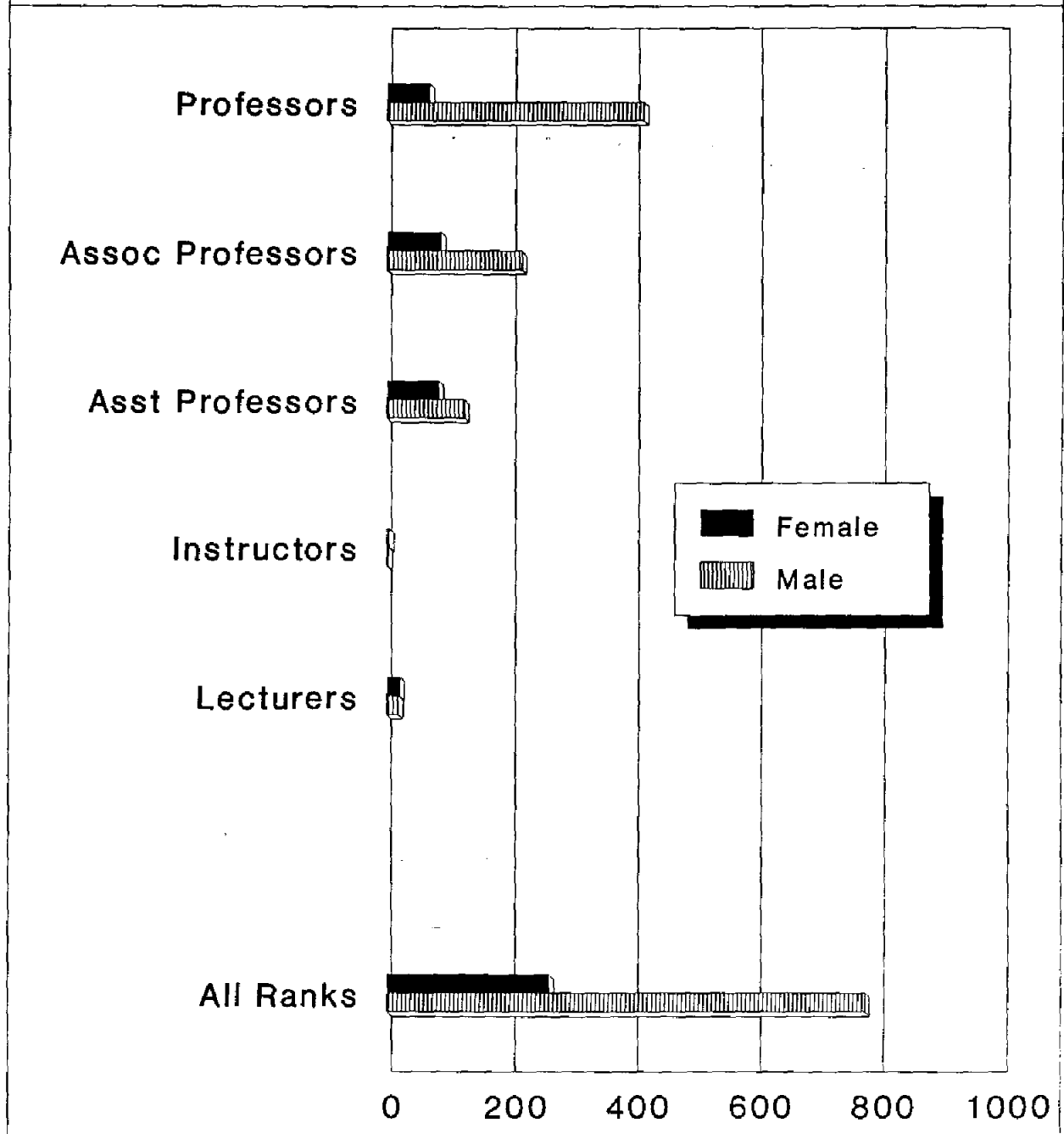

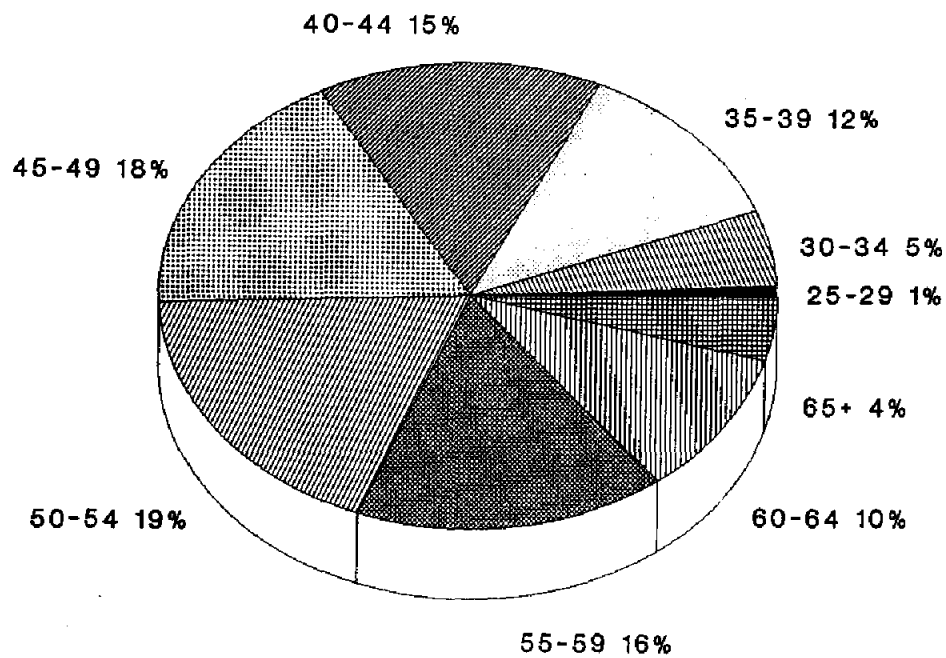

Distribution of 1,039 Members of the 1993-94 Full-time Teaching Faculty by Sex, Age, and Years of Service

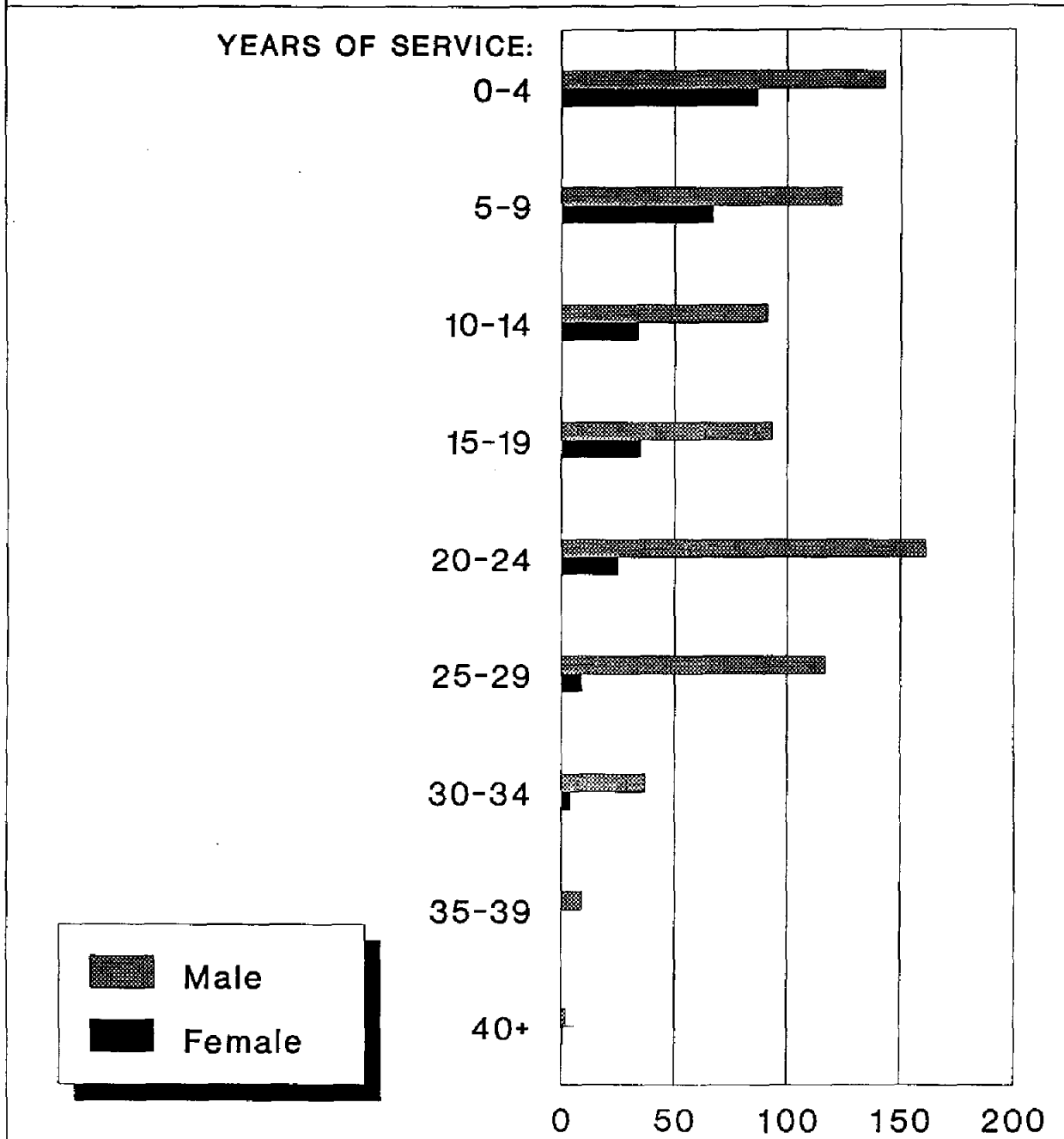

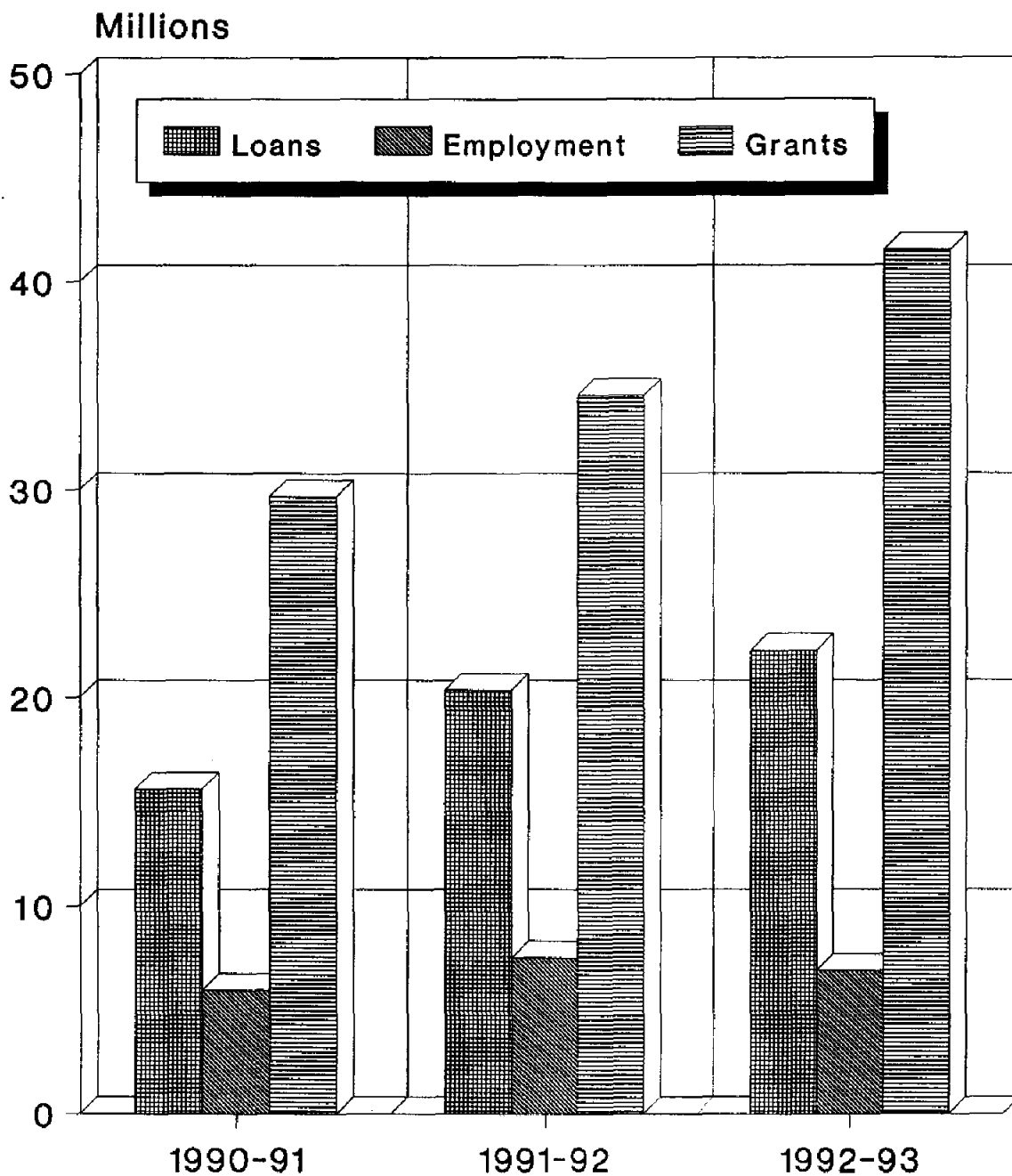
