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

**Academic Structure:** We have 15 Schools and Colleges with 46 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

**Academic Fields:** Undergraduates may major in 98 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 70 areas, and may choose from among 66 specialties for the Ph.D. degree.

**Alumni:** As of August 5, 1992, there are 95,021 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut.

**Admissions:** As of October 1992, 11,661 freshman applications for admission were received, 9,117 were admitted, and 2,873 deposits paid.

**Residence Halls:** We have 88 undergraduate residence halls with a design capacity of 8,633, and 3 graduate residence halls which accommodate 442 students.

**Enrollment:** For Fall, 1992 there are 13,501 undergraduate, graduate and non-degree students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 3,386 who are non-residents.

**Extended and Continuing Education:** During 1991-92, 70,609 people were served by Extended and Continuing Education: 22,280 enrolled in statewide credit courses, 14,009 in programs offered through Continuing Professional Education, and 18,969 in programs through the Centers and Institutes which make up the Office of Public Service and Applied Research. Programs were offered in more than 90 Connecticut communities.

**Fees:** In 1992-93, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$4,420 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$4,878 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

**Financial Aid:** In 1991-92, awards totaling \$62,438,953 were made through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$20,356,267 in educational loans, \$7,513,018 in various forms of student employment, and \$34,569,668 in grants and scholarships.

**Library:** As of 6/30/92, the University Library in Storrs has 1.85 million volumes, 312,665 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2.5 million volumes.

**Facilities:** As of Fall, 1991 we have 383 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,142,896 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 118 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 60 acres of parking lots to serve approximately 12,500 registered cars.





as of January, 1993**




University of Connecticut











1991-92 Fundraising Results
















