Academic Structure:	We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 59 Academic Departments, offering 16 different kinds of degrees.
Academic Fields:	Undergraduates may major in 98 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's degrees in 65 areas, and may choose from among 64 specialities for the Ph.D. degree.
Alumni:	As of November 1, 1981, there are 78,916 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut.
Admissions:	As of October 1, 1981, 12,613 undergraduate applications for admission were received, 7,961 persons were admitted, and there were 3,675 paid deposits.
Residence Halls:	We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residences designed to accommodate 9,006 students.
Employees:	As of 12/1/81, we have 4,477 full-time employees: 2,041 women; 2,436 men; 1,252 faculty; 1,725 classified; 427 graduate assistants; and 1,073 other professionals.
Enrollment:	<p>For Fall, 1981, there are 13,544 undergraduate and graduate students enrolled on the Storrs campus who are Connecticut residents, and 2,223 who are non-residents.</p> <p>There are 9,241 students living on campus, and 6,526 commuting.</p>
Extended and Continuing Education:	During 1980-81, 12,300 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Non-credit programs enrolled 5,515 in 286 course sections, administered in 23 Connecticut communities. 322 conferences and institutes were held, and attended by 24,979 persons.
Fees:	In 1981-82, it cost an average undergraduate student \$1,101 in tuition and fees, and \$2,245 for room and board to attend the University for one year.
Financial Aid:	<p>In 1980-81, approximately 14,500 students received approximately \$33,678,775 through various programs of financial assistance.</p> <p>This total amount was composed of \$20,170,975 in educational loans, \$6,830,000 in various forms of student employment, and \$6,677,800 in grants and scholarships.</p>
Library:	As of 6/30/81, the University Library in Storrs has 1,370,537 volumes, 293,524 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 1,841,421 volumes.
Physical Plant:	<p>As of Fall, 1981, we have 447 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,050,340 assignable square feet of floor space.</p> <p>The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve 10,583 registered cars.</p>

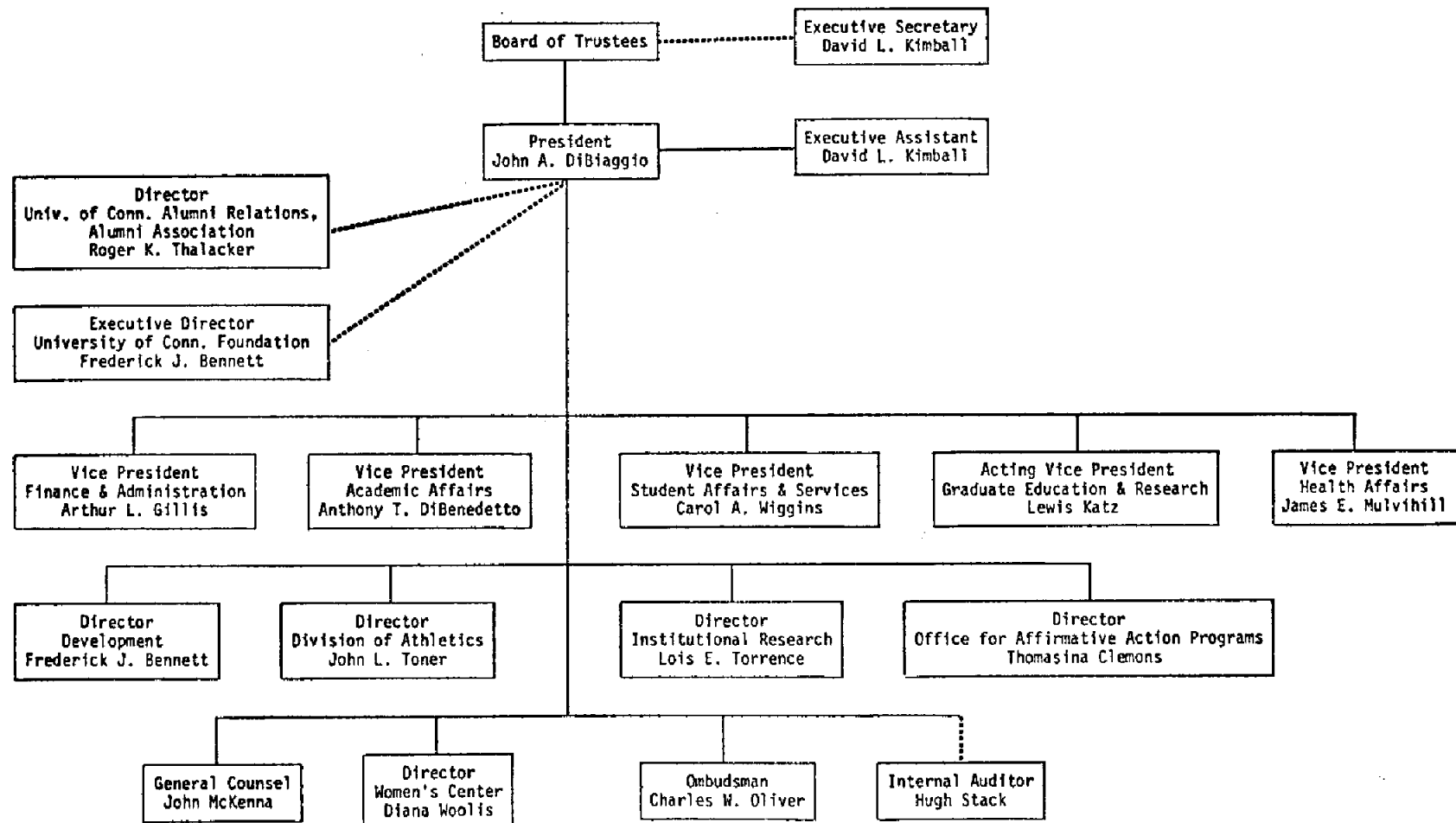

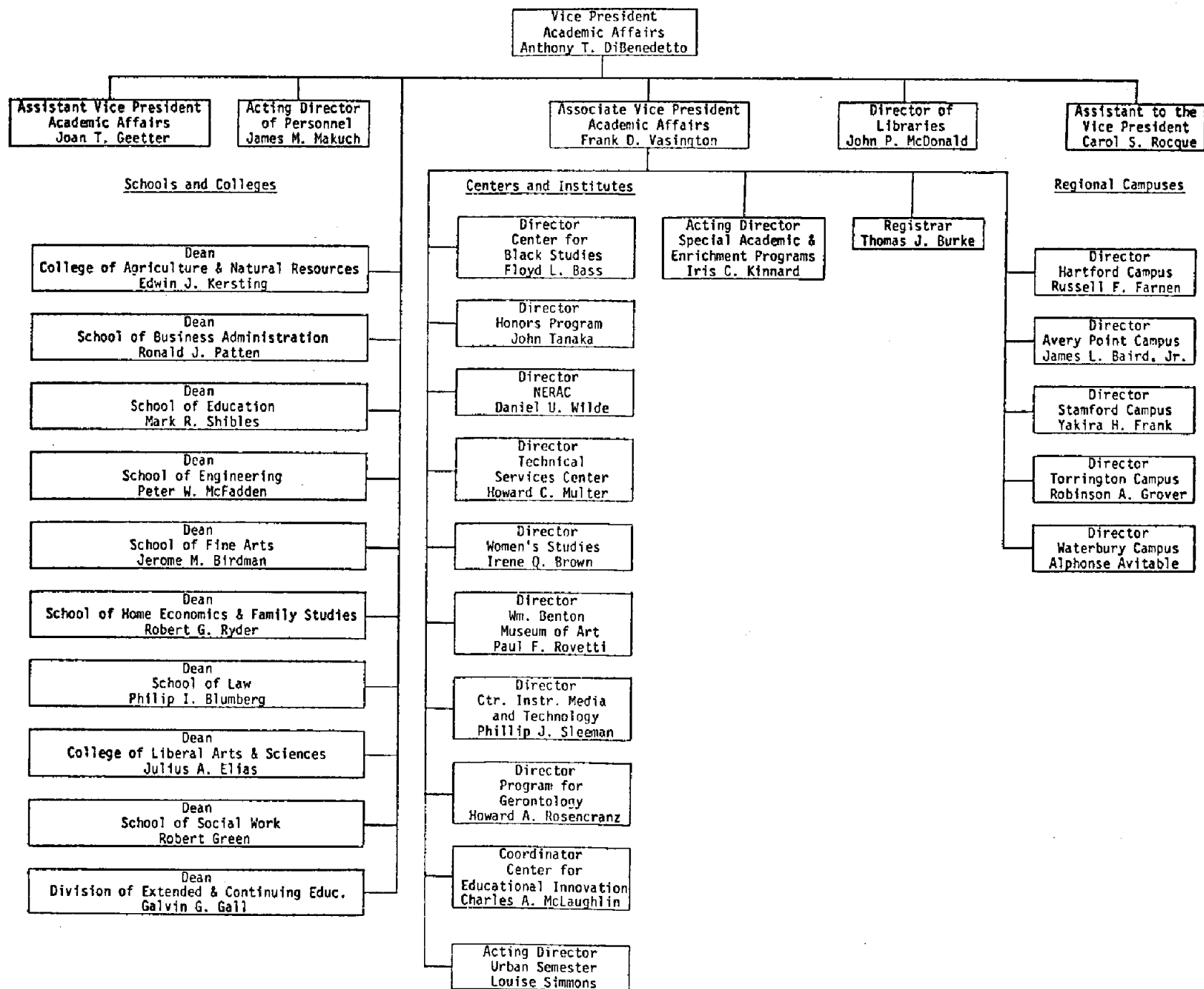

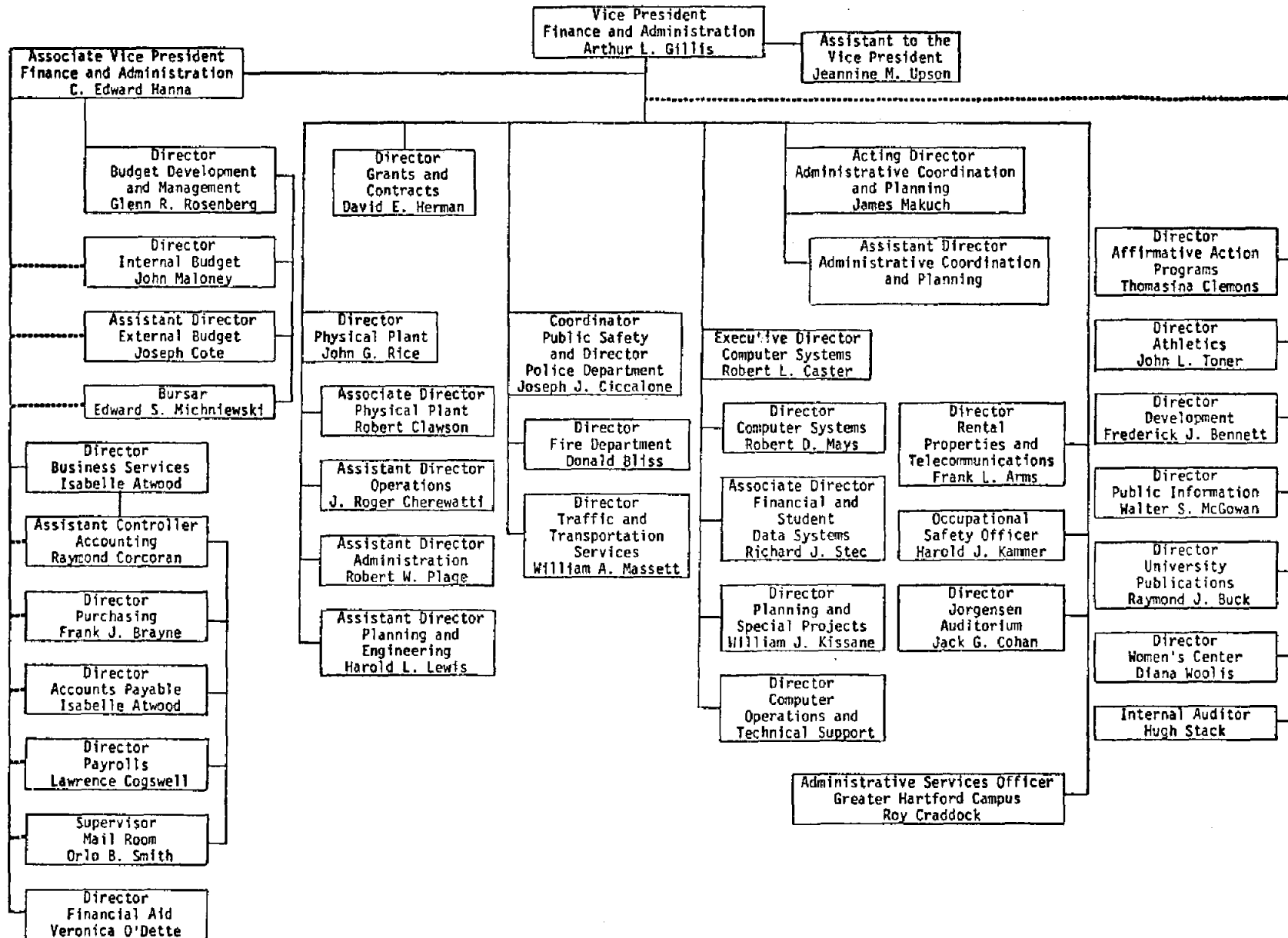

Organizational Chart



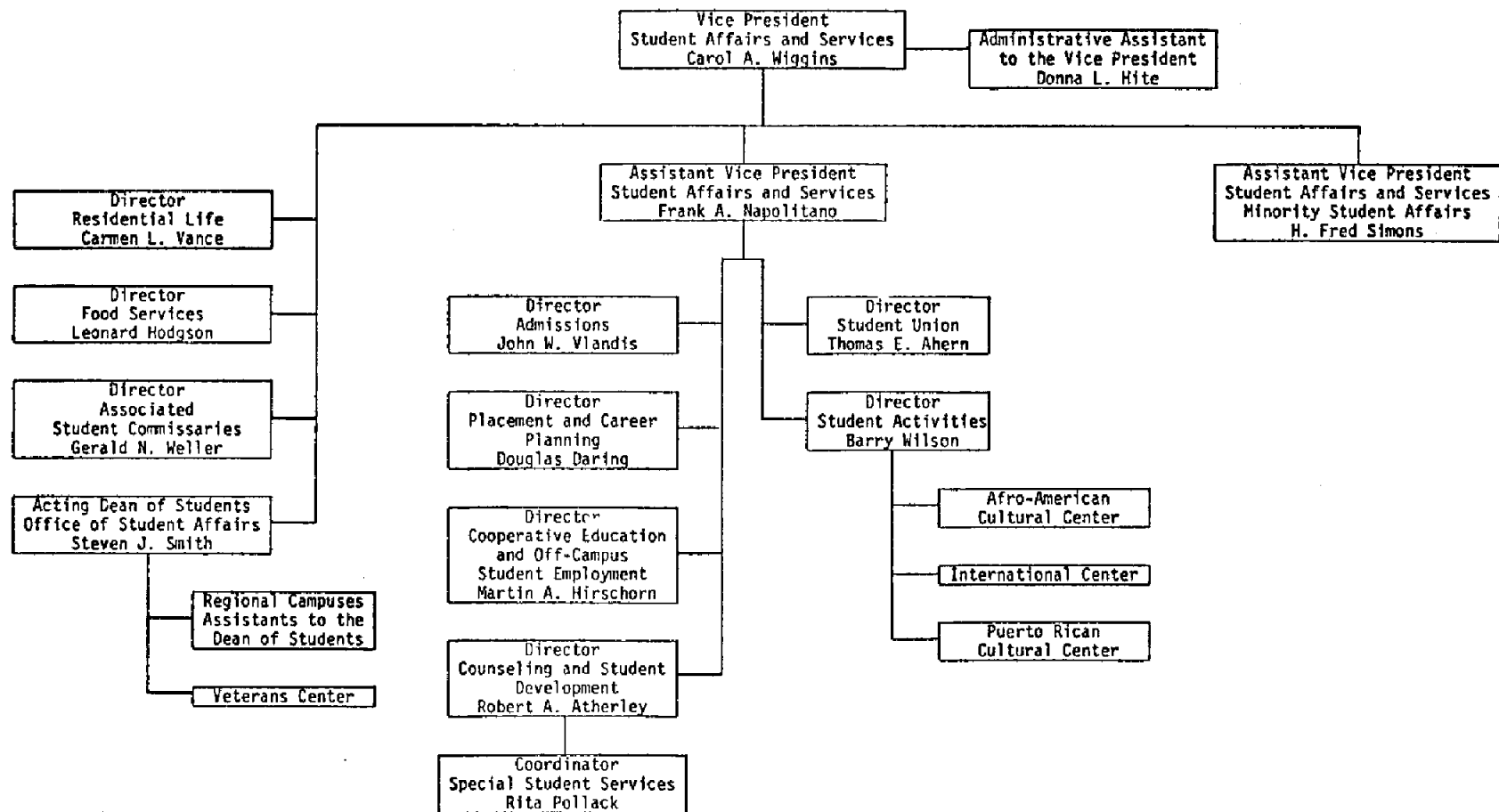

Organizational Chart



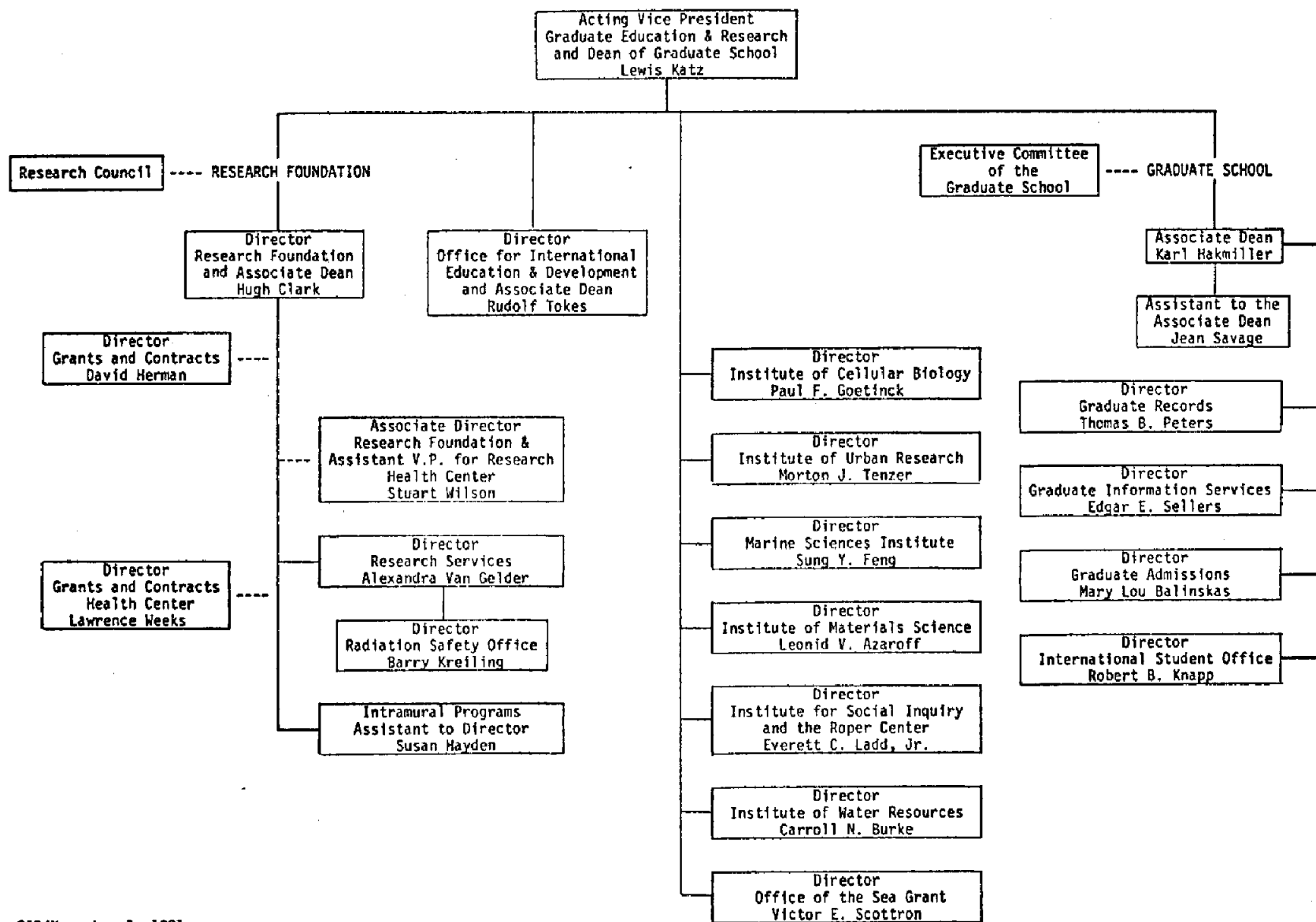
The University of Connecticut Organizational Chart

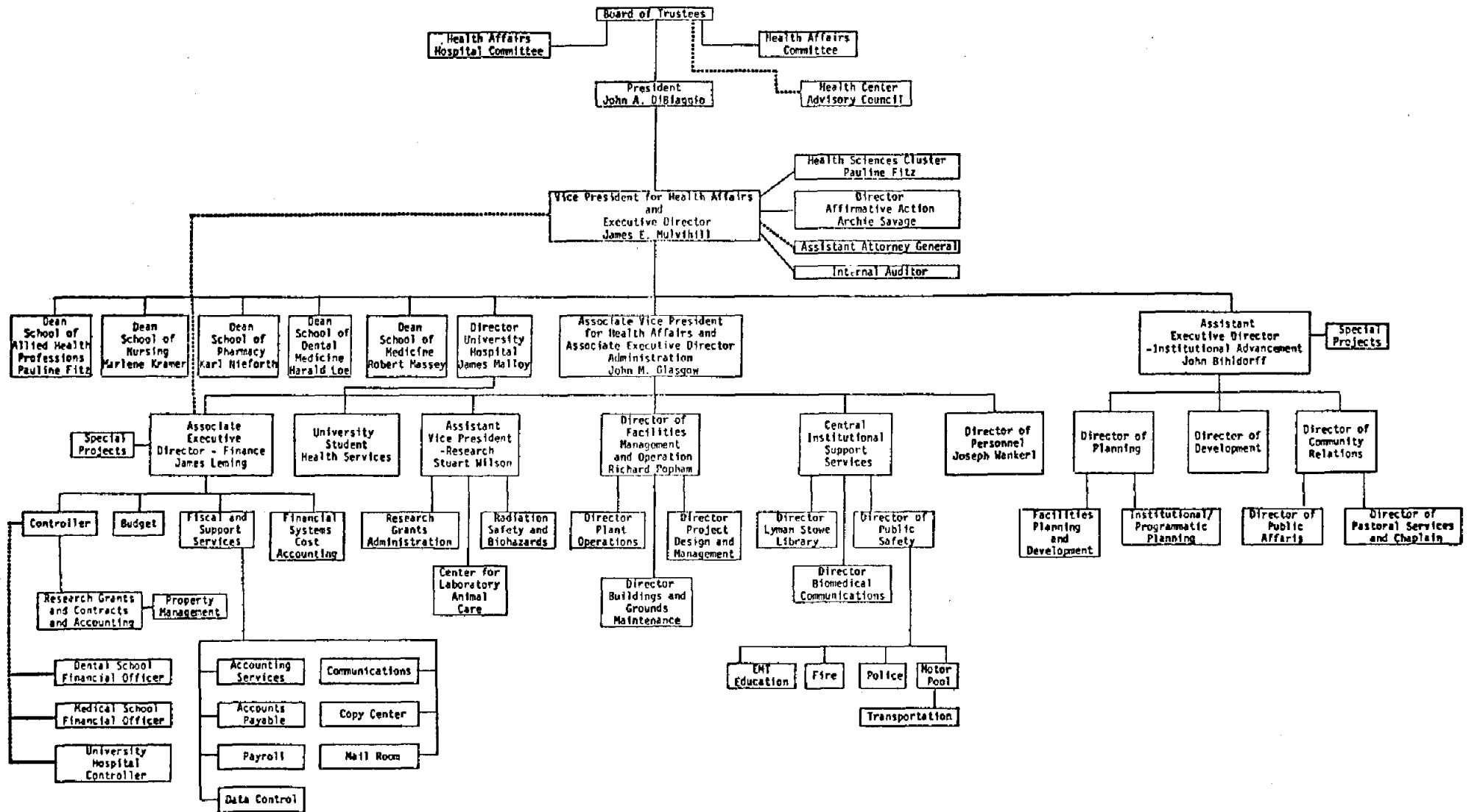

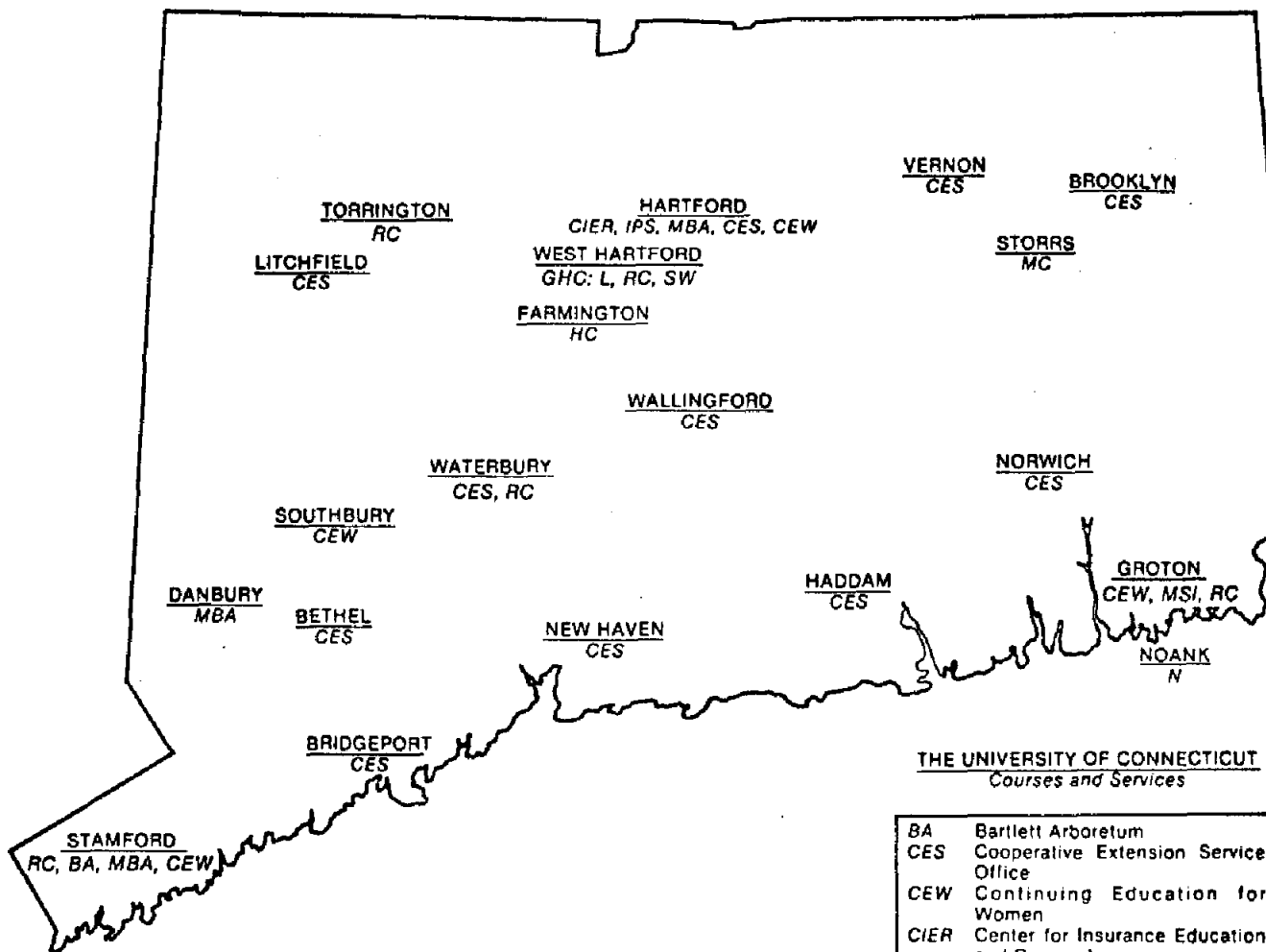

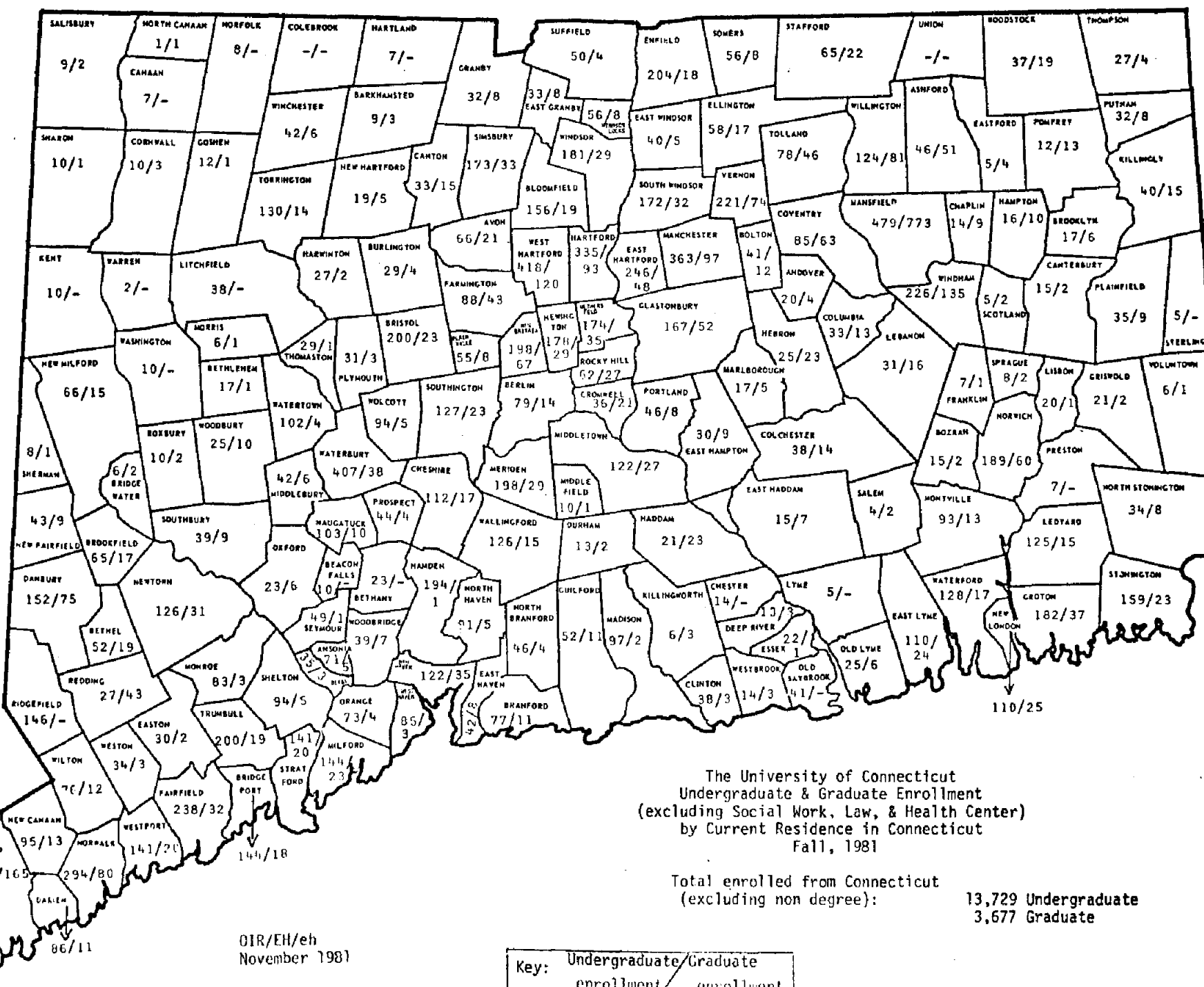
