Academic Structure:	We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 59 Academic Departments, offering 16 different kinds of degrees.
Academic Fields:	Undergraduates may major in 93 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's degrees in 69 areas, and may choose from among 67 specialities for the Ph.D. degree.
Alumni:	As of November 1, 1982 there are 80,651 alumni, with 64% of them living in Connecticut.
Admissions:	As of October 1, 1982, 13,614 undergraduate applications for admission were received, 8,257 persons were admitted, and there were 3,629 paid deposits.
Residence Halls:	We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residences designed to accommodate 9,006 students.
Employees:	As of 11/1/82 we have 4,339 full-time employees: 1,956 women; 2,383 men; 1,221 faculty; 1,672 classified; 395 graduate assistants; and 945 other professionals.
Enrollment:	<p>For Fall, 1982, there are 13,606 undergraduate and graduate students enrolled on the Storrs campus who are Connecticut residents, and 2,258 who are non-residents.</p> <p>There are 9,222 students living on campus, and 6,642 commuting.</p>
Extended and Continuing Education:	During 1981-82, 12,750 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Non-credit programs enrolled 4,692 in 342 course sections, administered in 19 Connecticut communities. 334 conferences and institutes were held and attended by 24,466 persons.
Fees:	In 1982-83, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$1,225 in tuition and fees, and \$2,250 for room and board to attend the University for one year.
Financial Aid:	<p>In 1981-82, approximately 16,000 students received \$35,284,589 through various programs of financial assistance.</p> <p>This total amount was composed of \$24,629,635 in educational loans, \$3,042,938 in various forms of student employment, and \$7,612,016 in grants and scholarships.</p>
Library:	As of 6/30/82, the University Library in Storrs has 1,411,017 volumes, 293,476 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 1,902,006 volumes.
Physical Plant:	<p>As of Fall, 1982, we have 433 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,051,296 assignable square feet of floor space.</p> <p>The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve 10,396 registered cars.</p>

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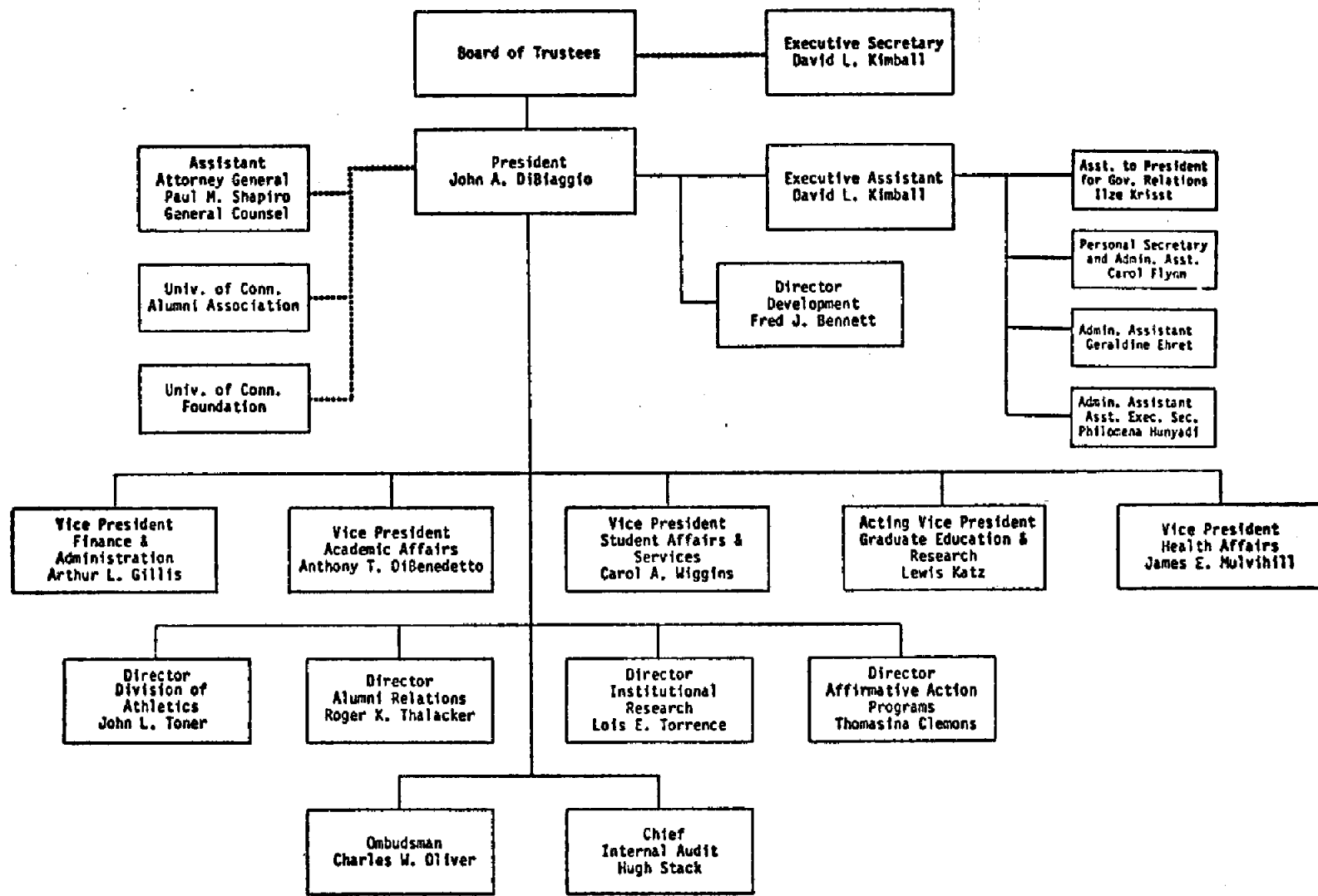

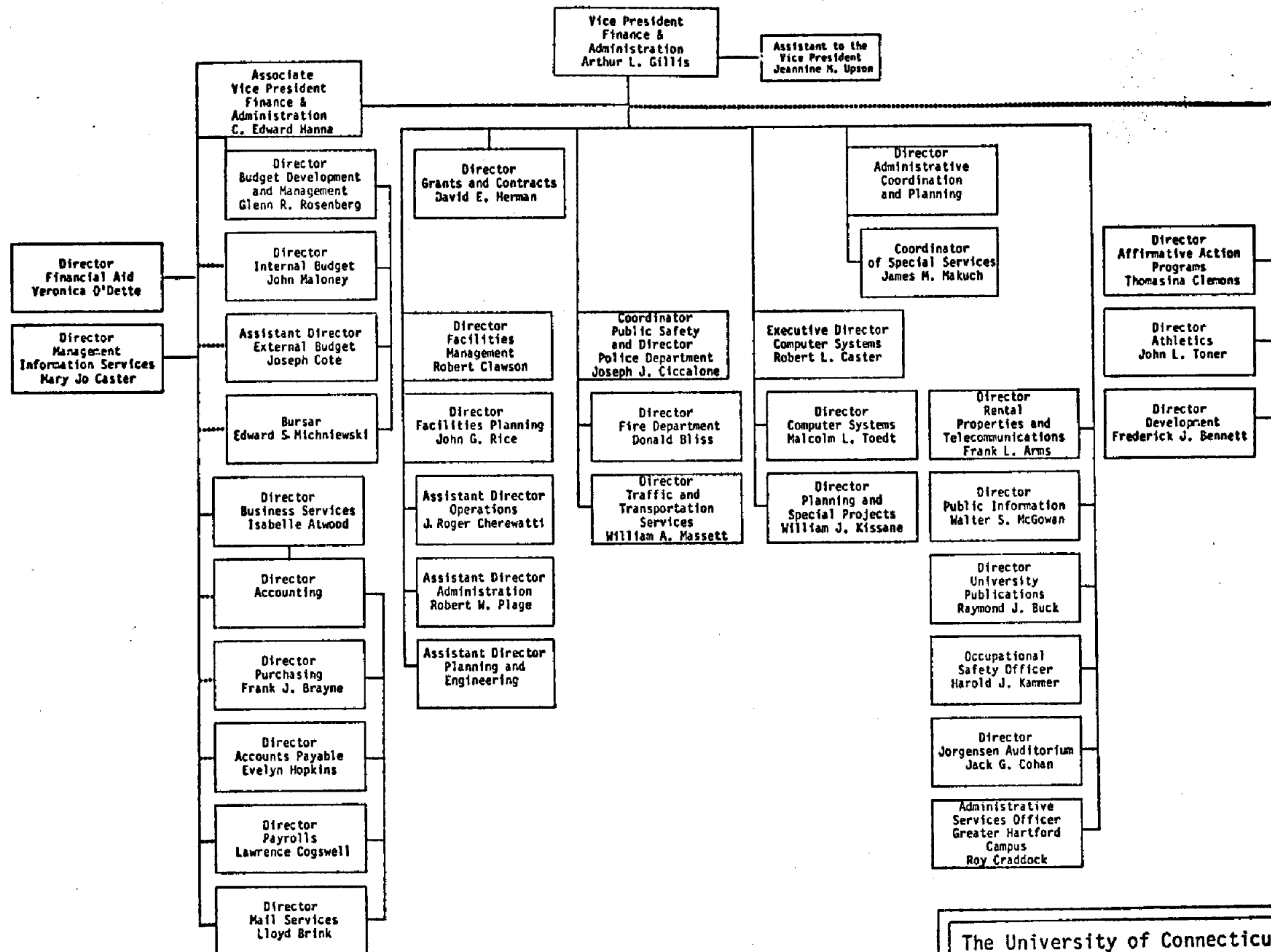

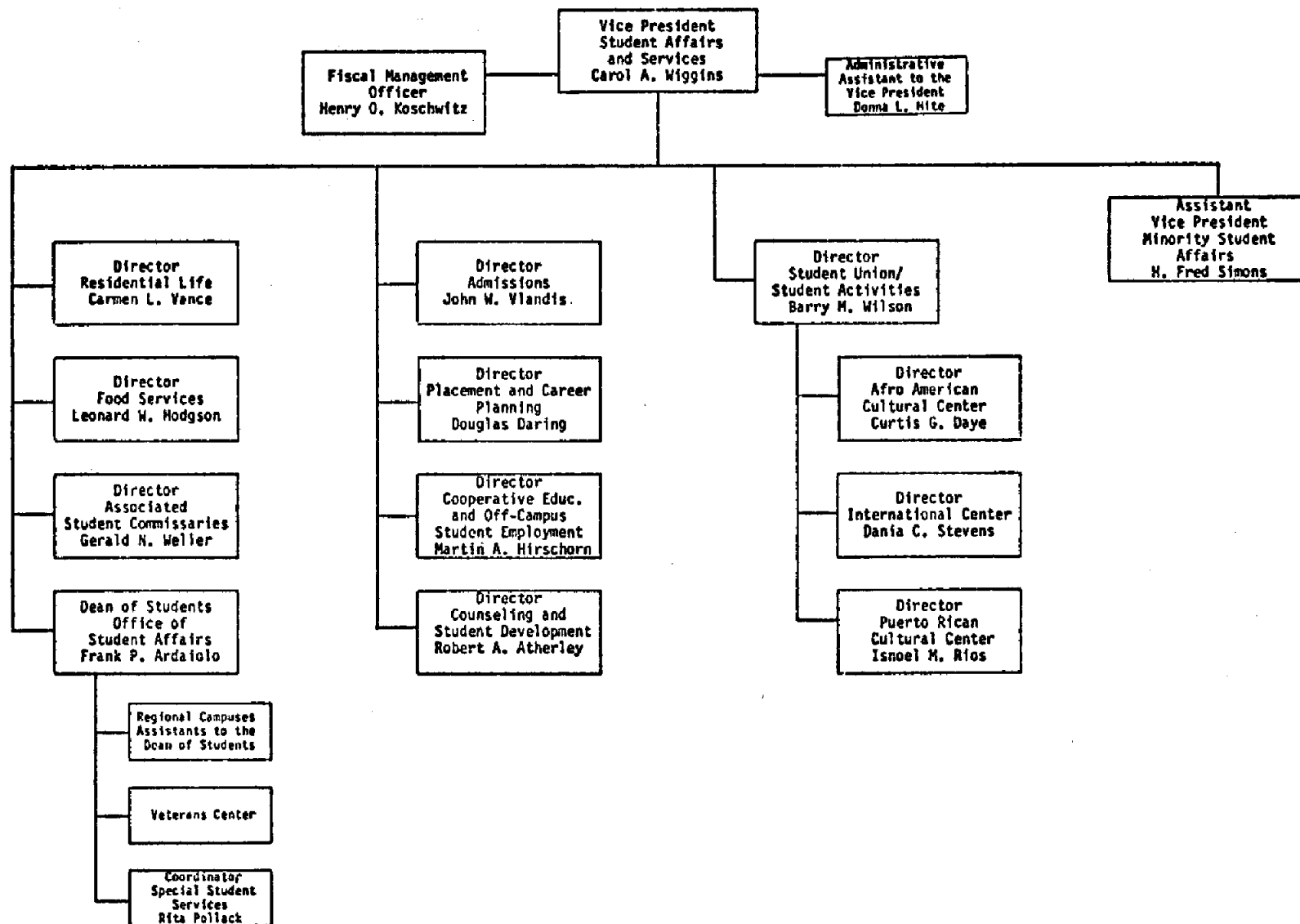
The University of Connecticut

as of November 1, 1982



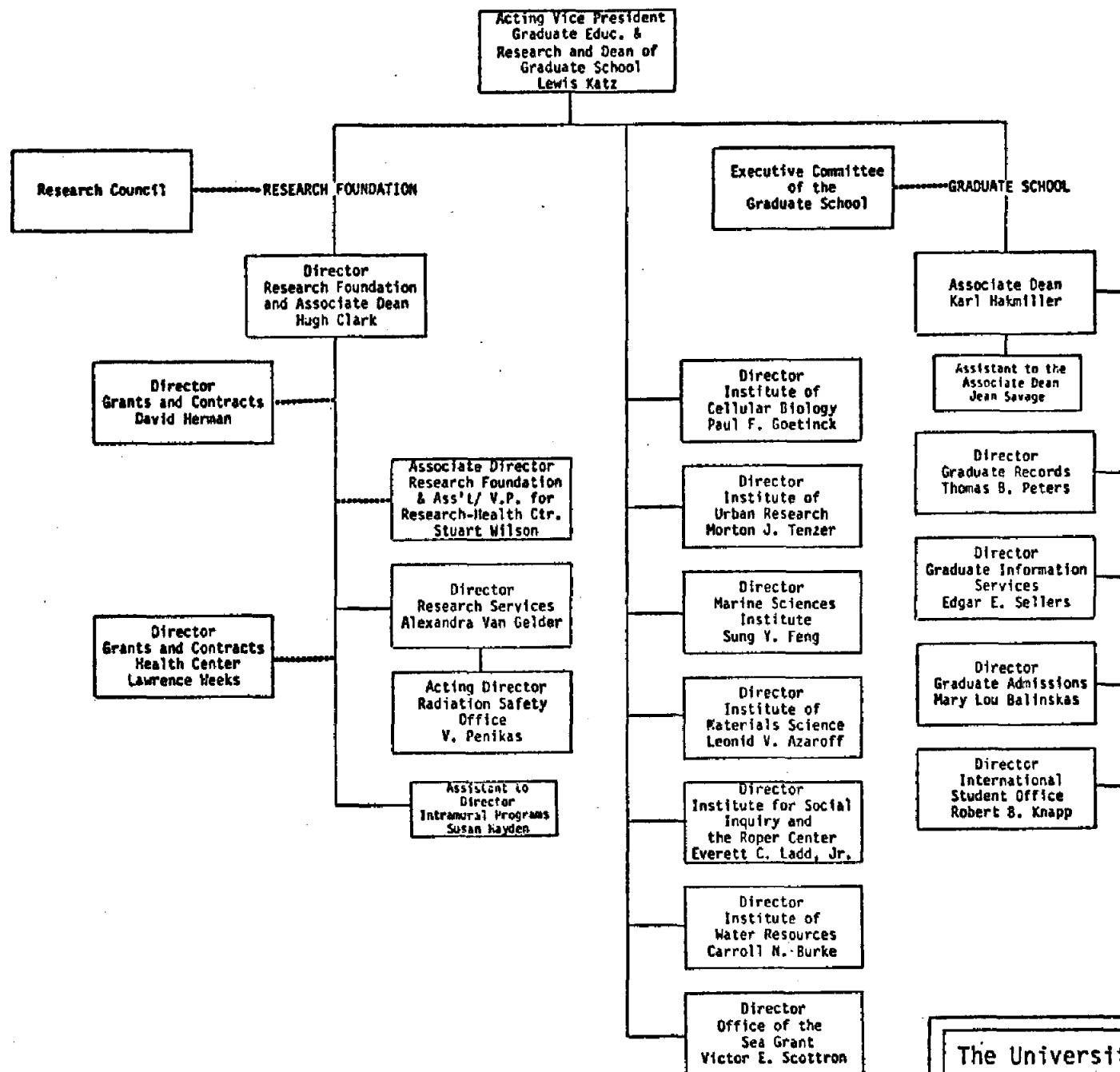
The University of Connecticut

as of November 1, 1982



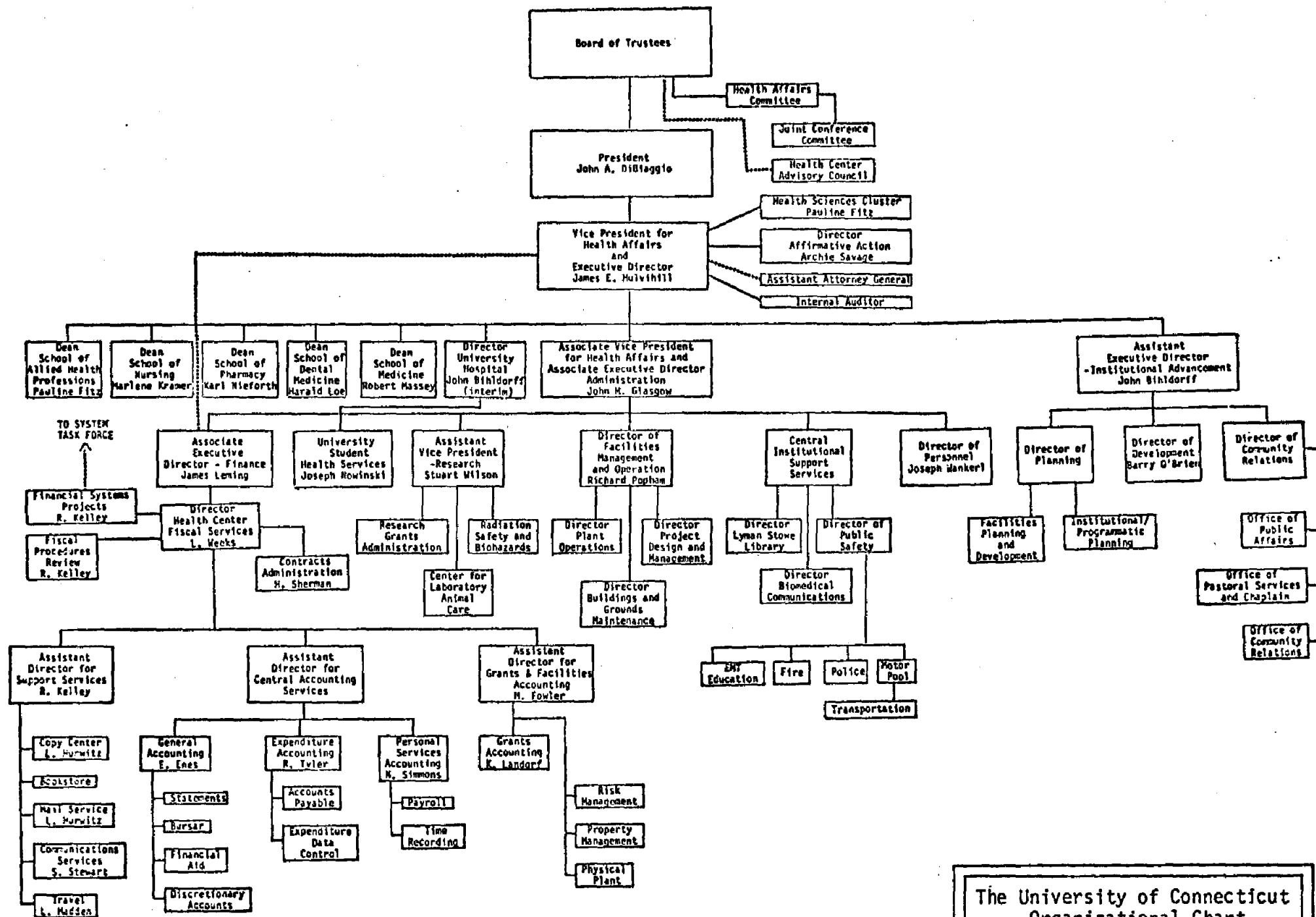
The University of Connecticut

as of November 1, 1982



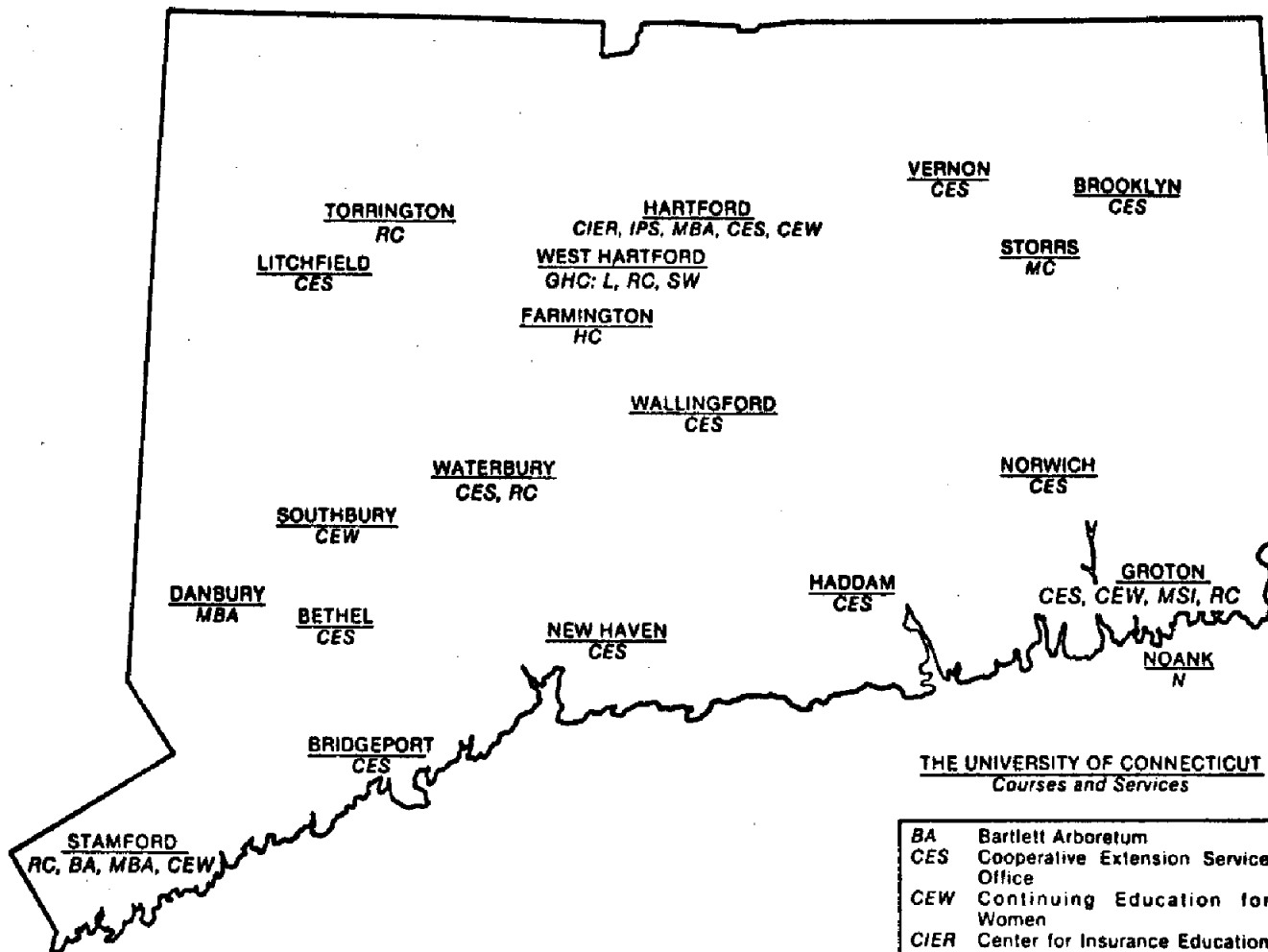
The University of Connecticut

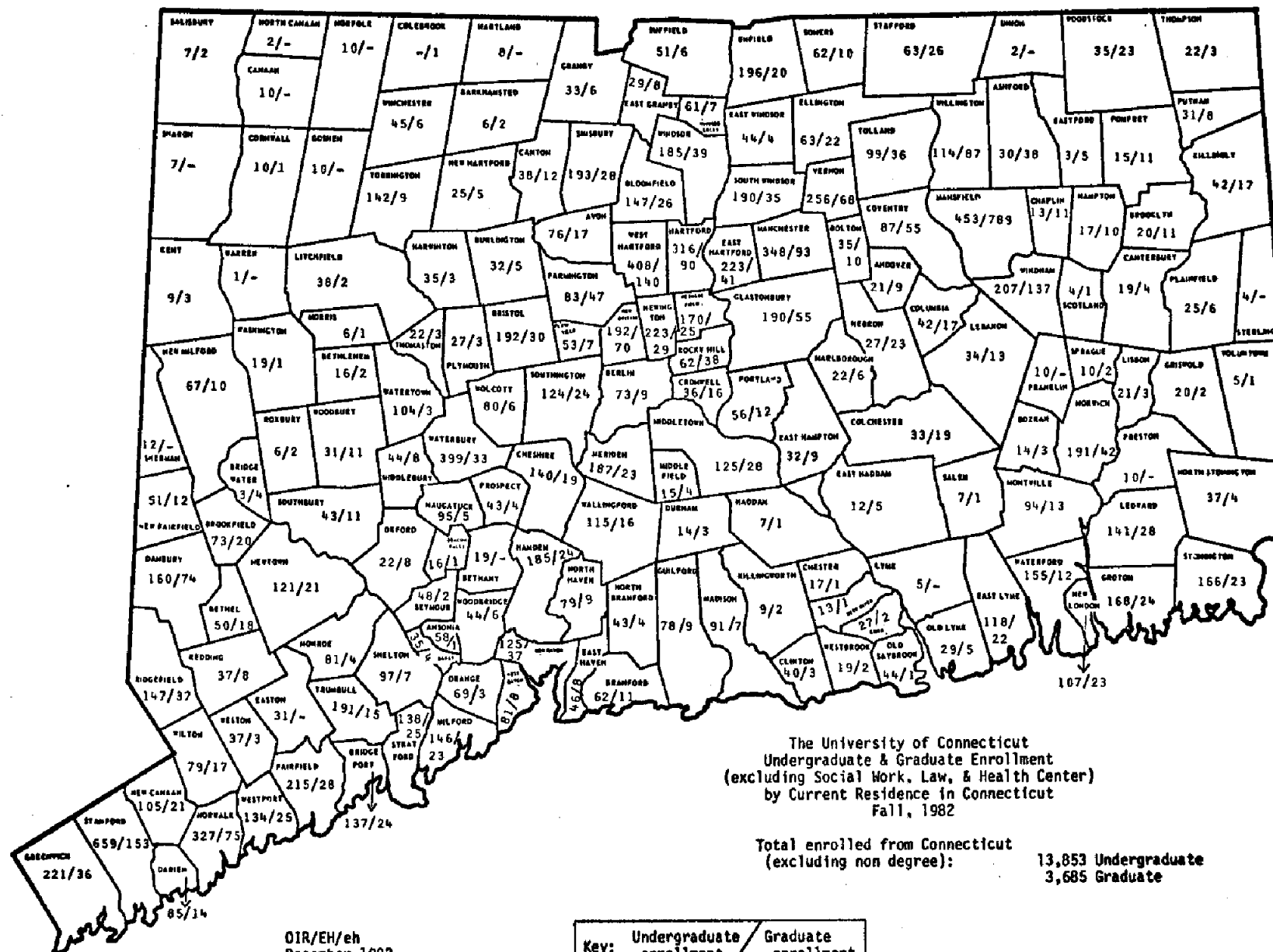

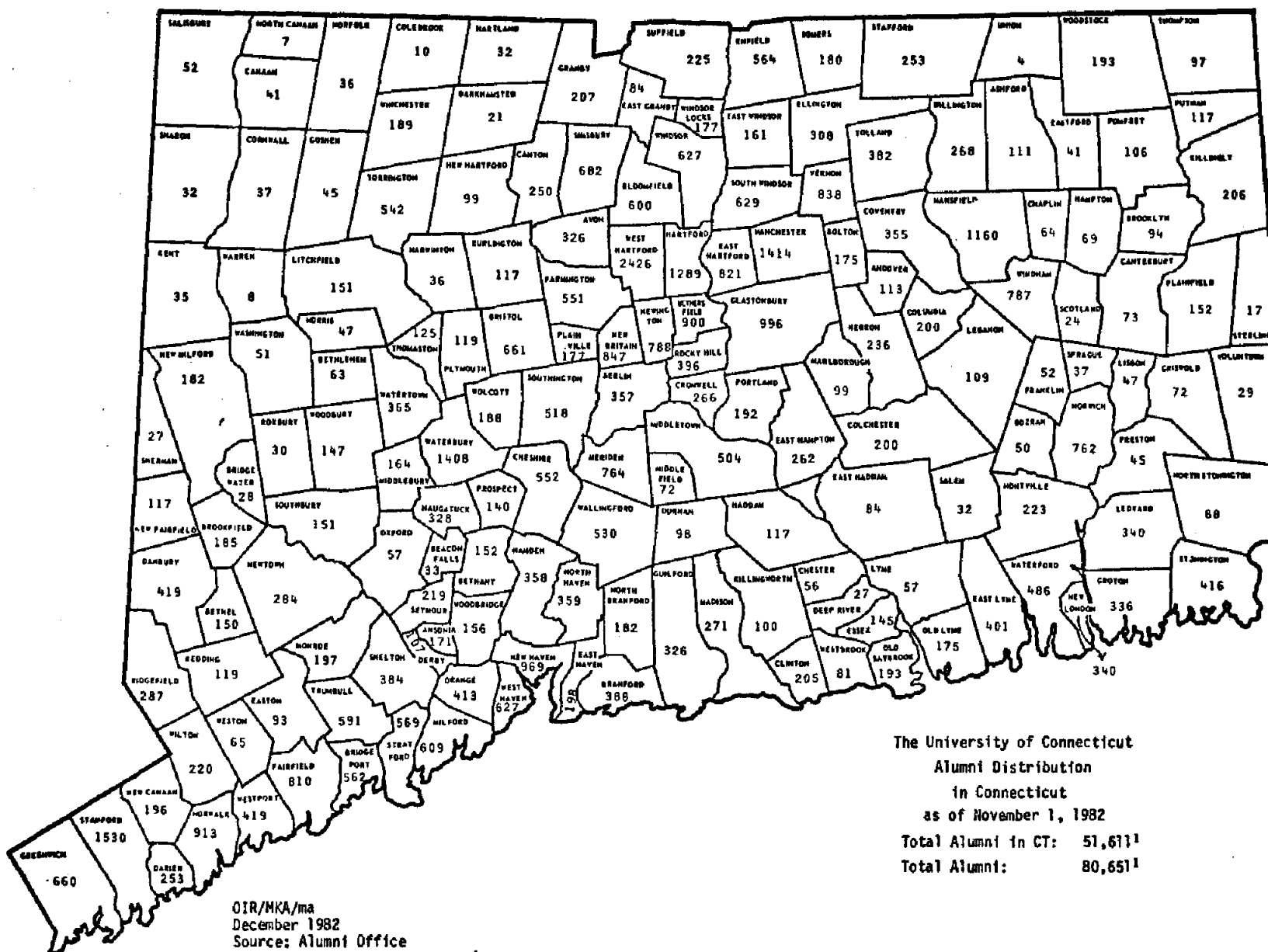
