Academic Structure: We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 59 Academic Departments offering 16 different kinds of degrees.

Academic Fields: Undergraduates may major in 104 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 67 areas, and may choose from among 66 specialities for the Ph.D degree.

Alumni: As of June 30, 1984, there are 89,235 alumni, with 63% of them living in Connecticut

Admissions: As of October 1, 1984, 12,535 undergraduate applications for admission were received, 8,825 persons were admitted, and there were 3,306 paid deposits.

Residence Halls: We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residences which accommodate 9,168 undergraduate and 440 graduate students.

Employees: As of 11/84 we have 4,361 full-time employees: 1,975 women; 2,386 men; 1,205 faculty; 1,674 classified; 447 graduate assistants; and 1,035 other professionals.

Enrollment: For Fall, 1984 there are 12,944 undergraduate and graduate students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 2,346 who are non-residents.

As of 9/84 there were 9,643 students living on campus, and 5,647 commuting.

Extended and Continuing Education: During 1983-84, 15,084 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Non-credit programs enrolled 26,214 in 499 course sections, administered in 24 Connecticut communities.

Fees: In 1984-85, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$1,657 in tuition and fees, and \$2,362 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

Financial Aid: In 1983-84, approximately 11,000 students received \$29,822,024 through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$16,865,023 in educational loans, \$3,599,417 in various forms of student employment, and \$9,357,584 in grants and scholarships.

Library: As of 6/30/84, the University Library in Storrs has 1,489,127 volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2,018,180 volumes.

Facilities: As of Fall, 1984 we have 428 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,057,490 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve 10,567 registered cars.

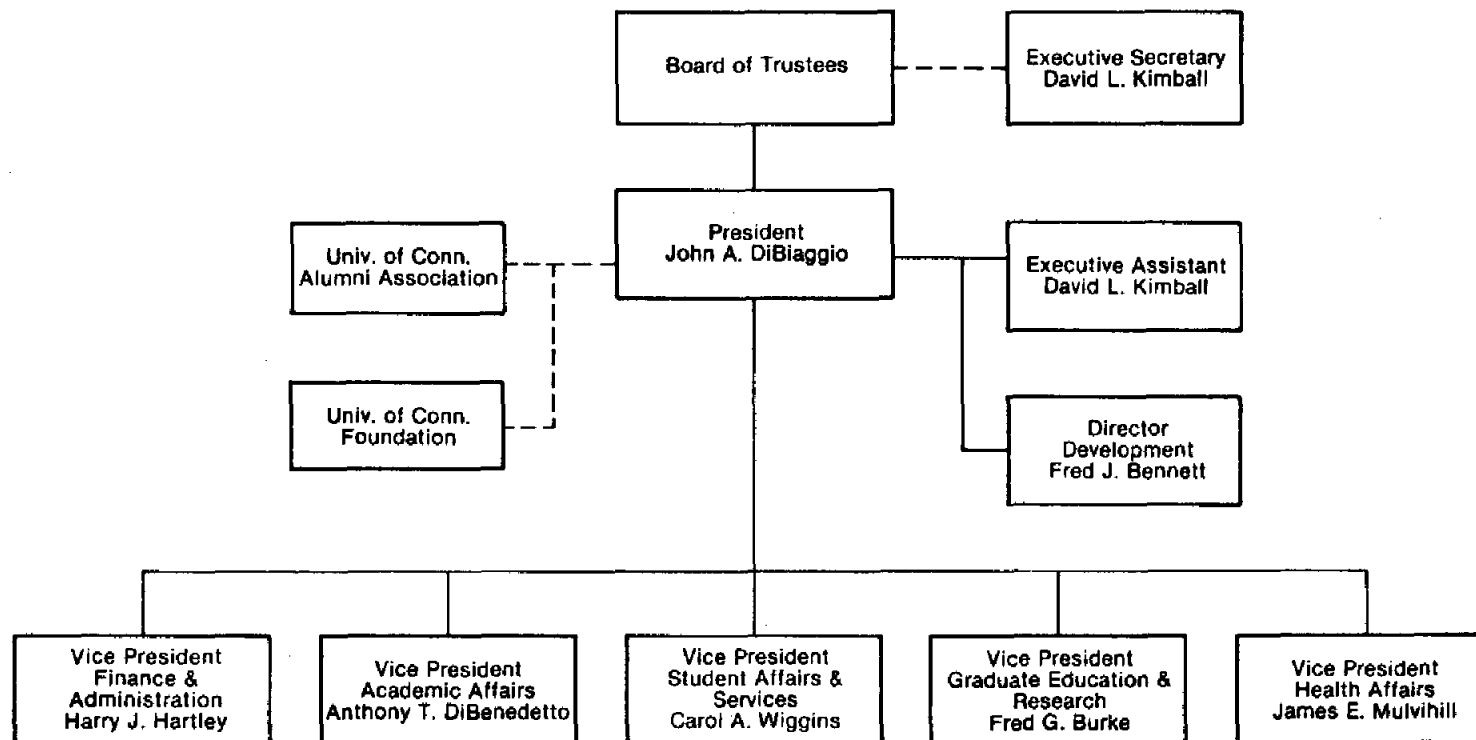

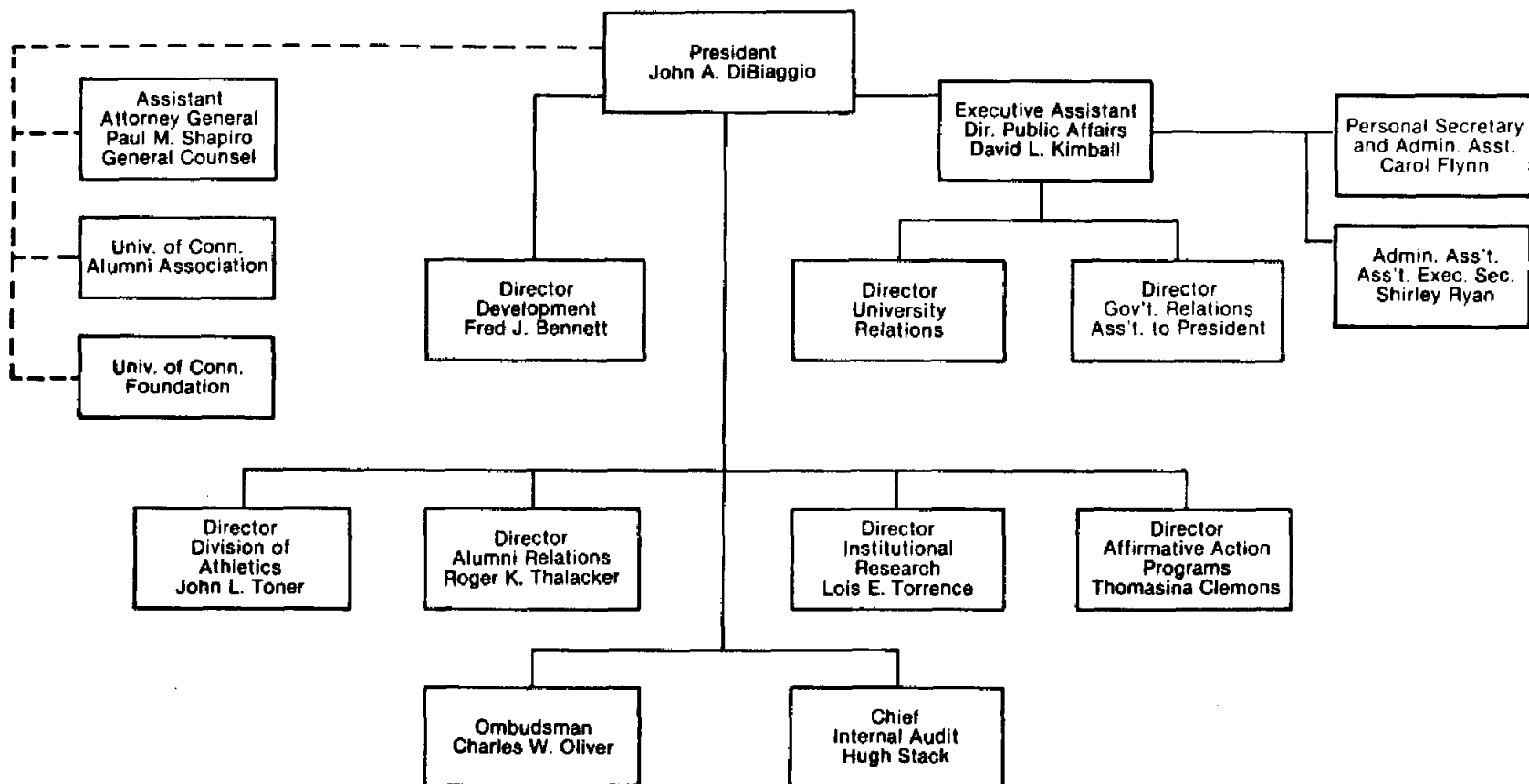

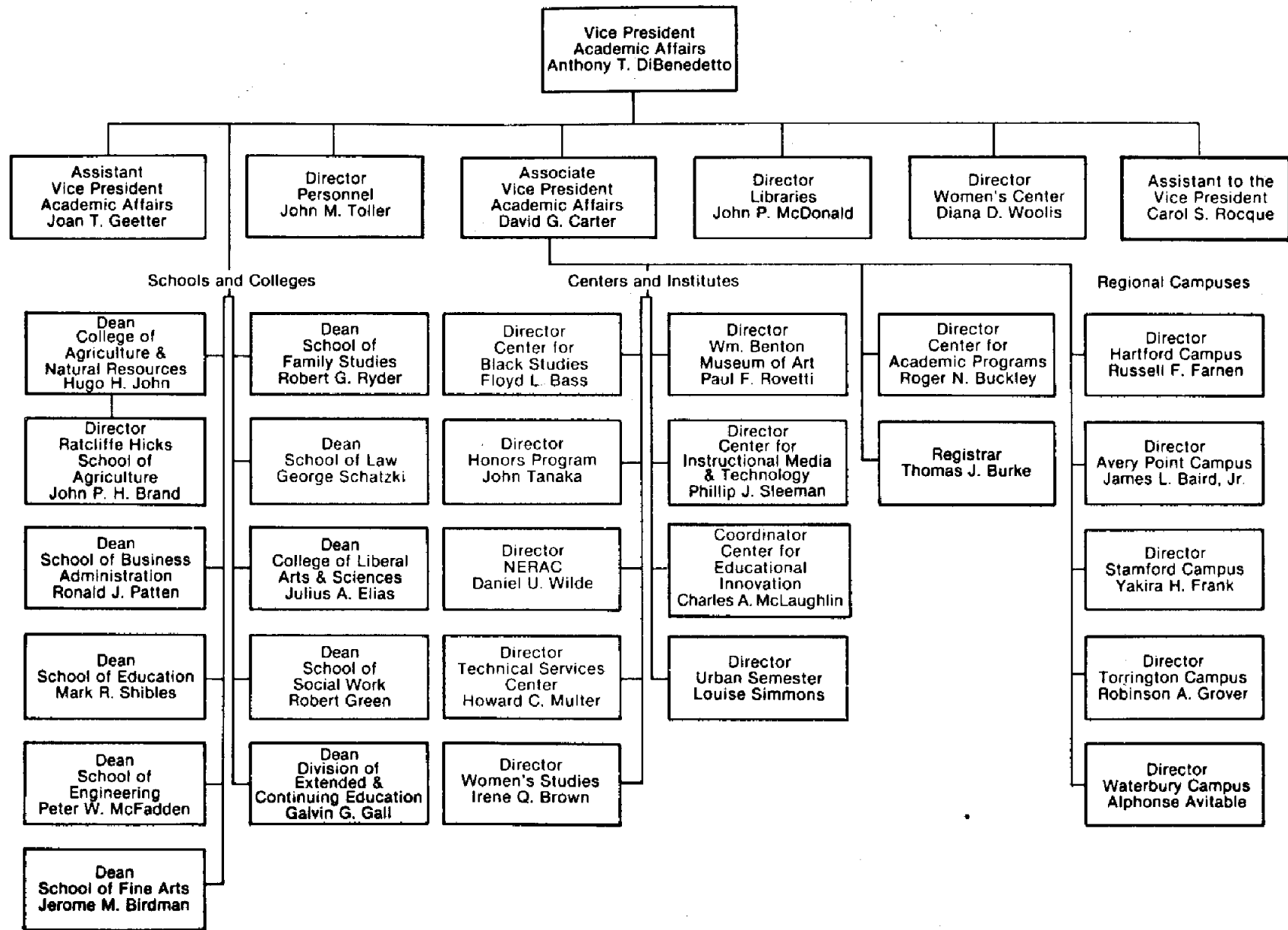


**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1984**

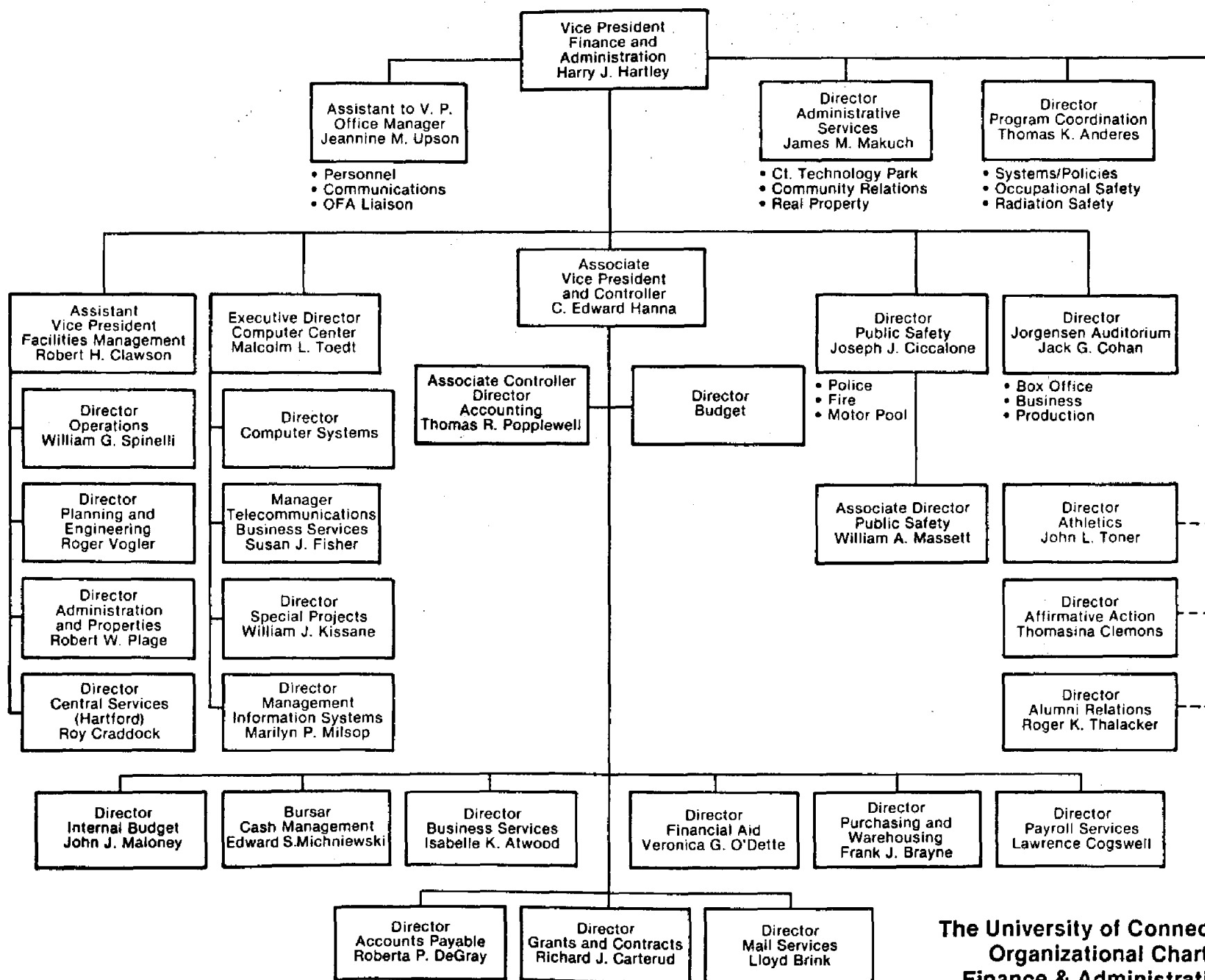




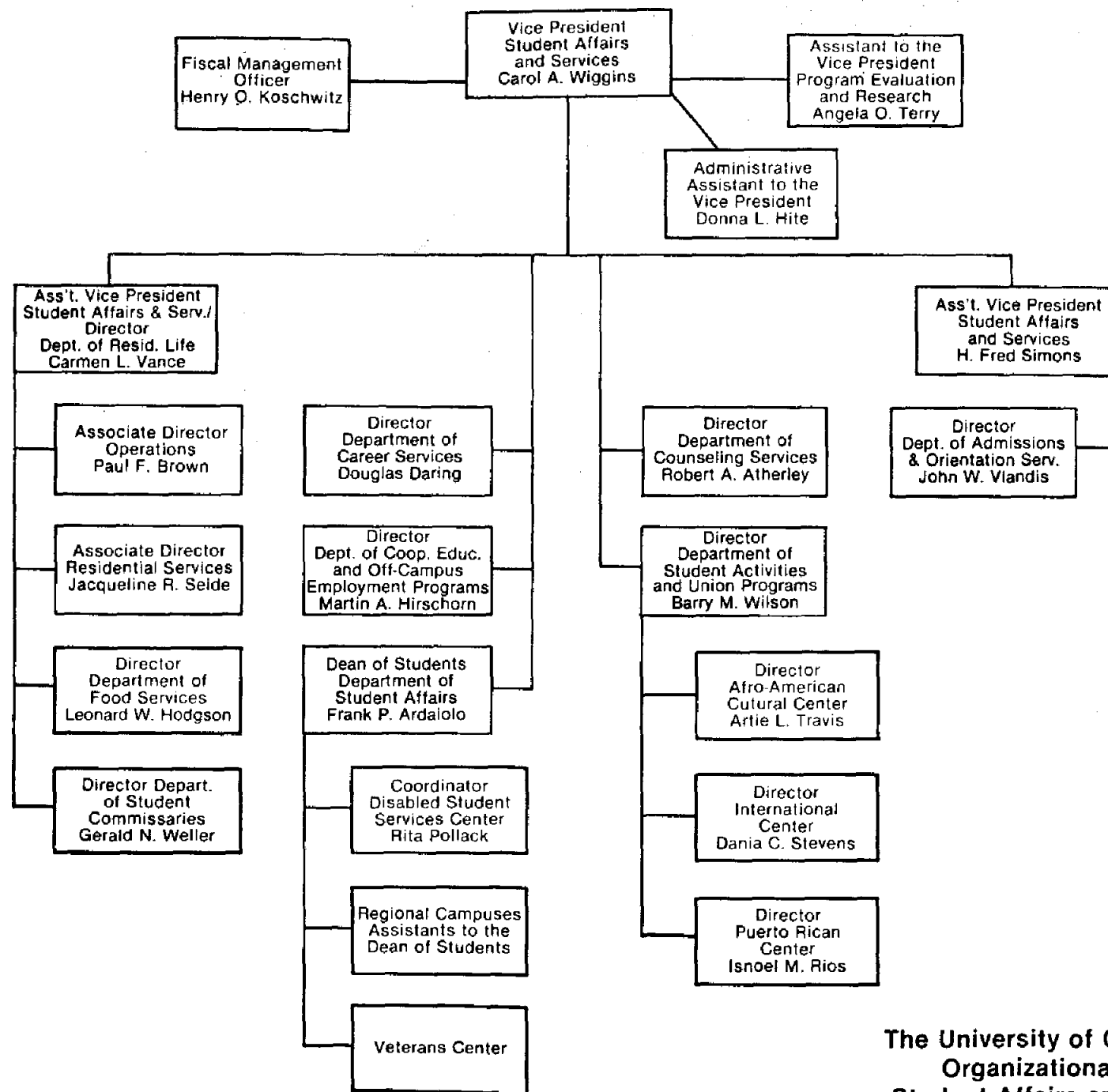
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1984**



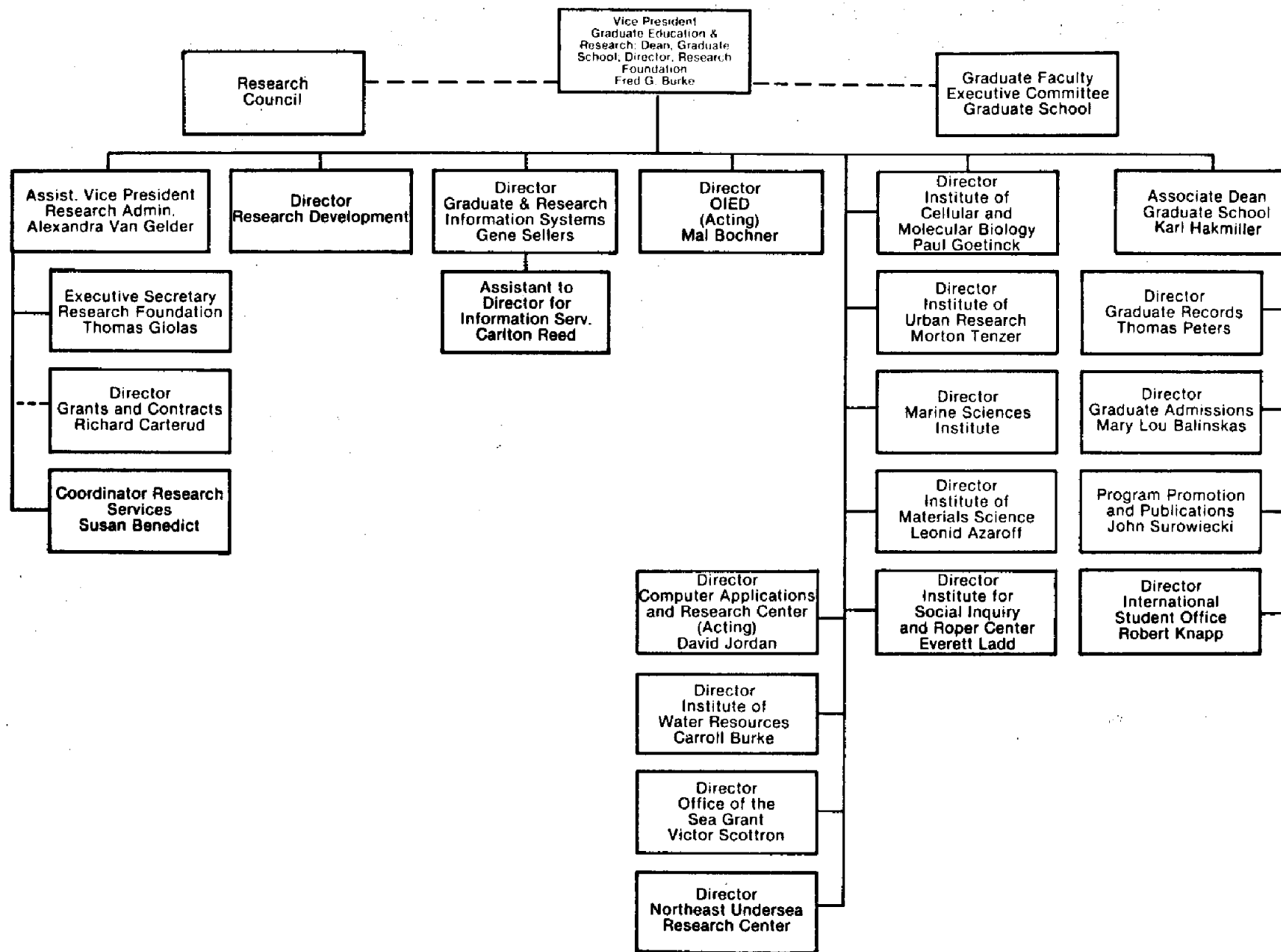
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1984**

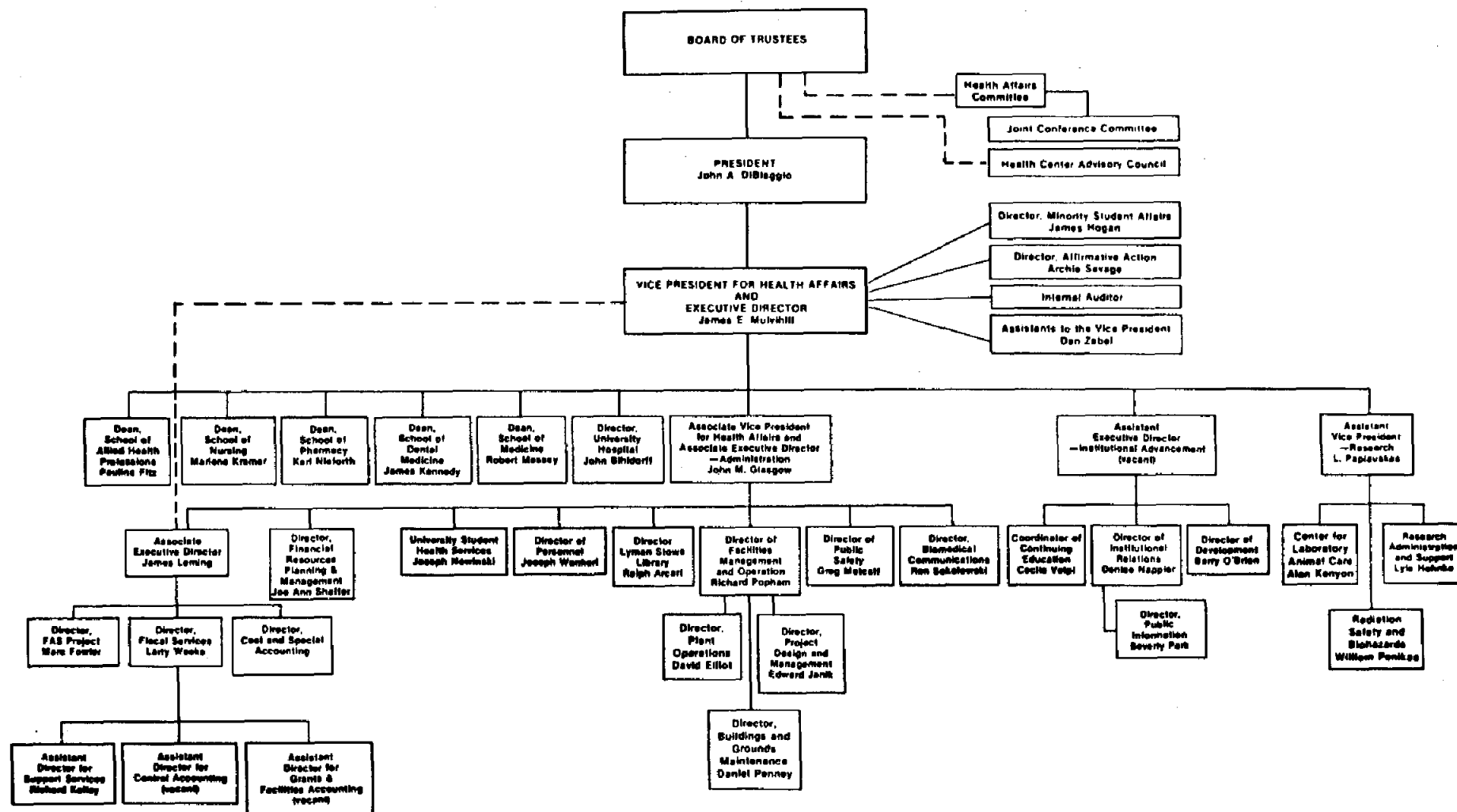


**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1984**



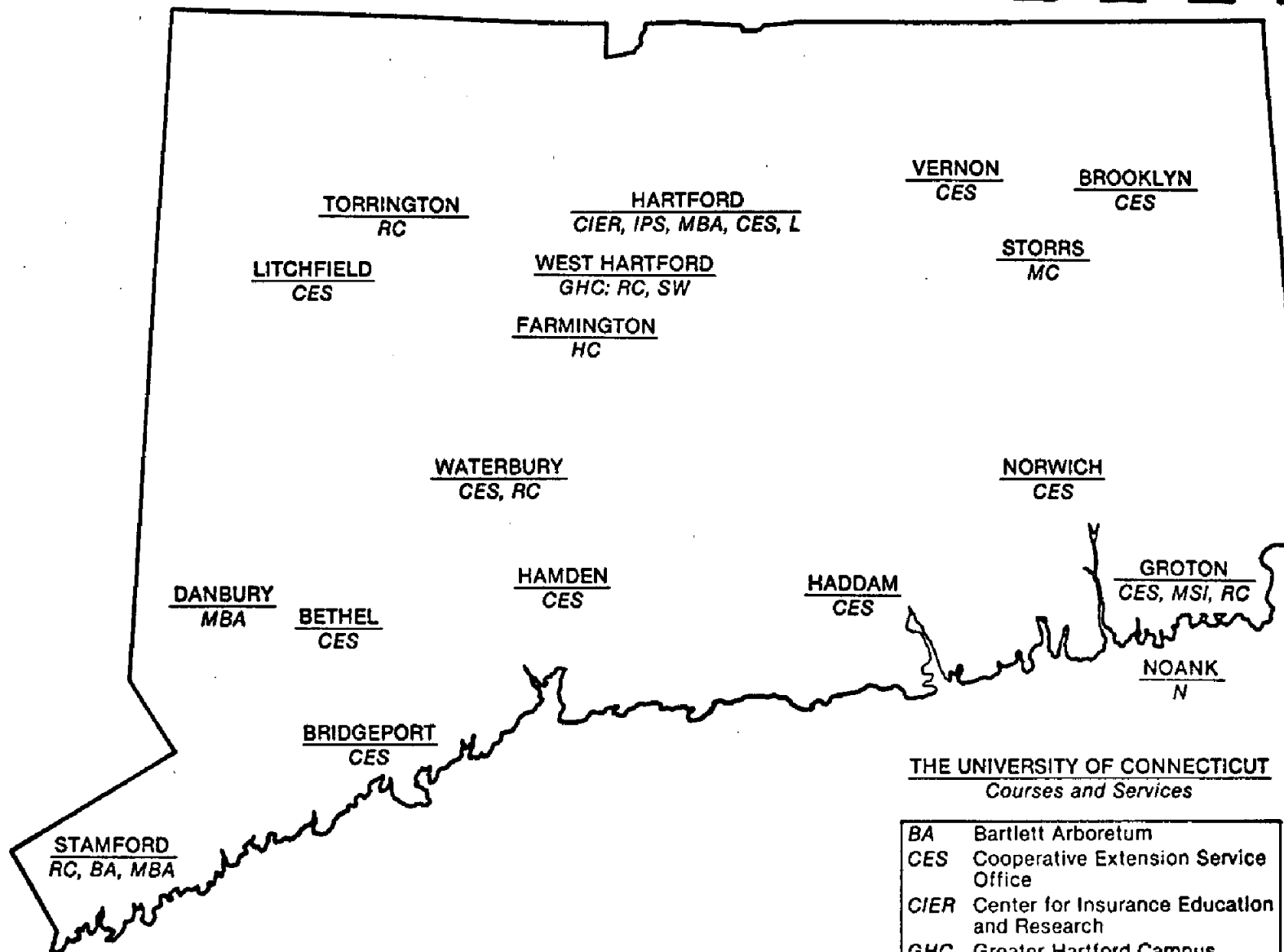
**The University of Connecticut

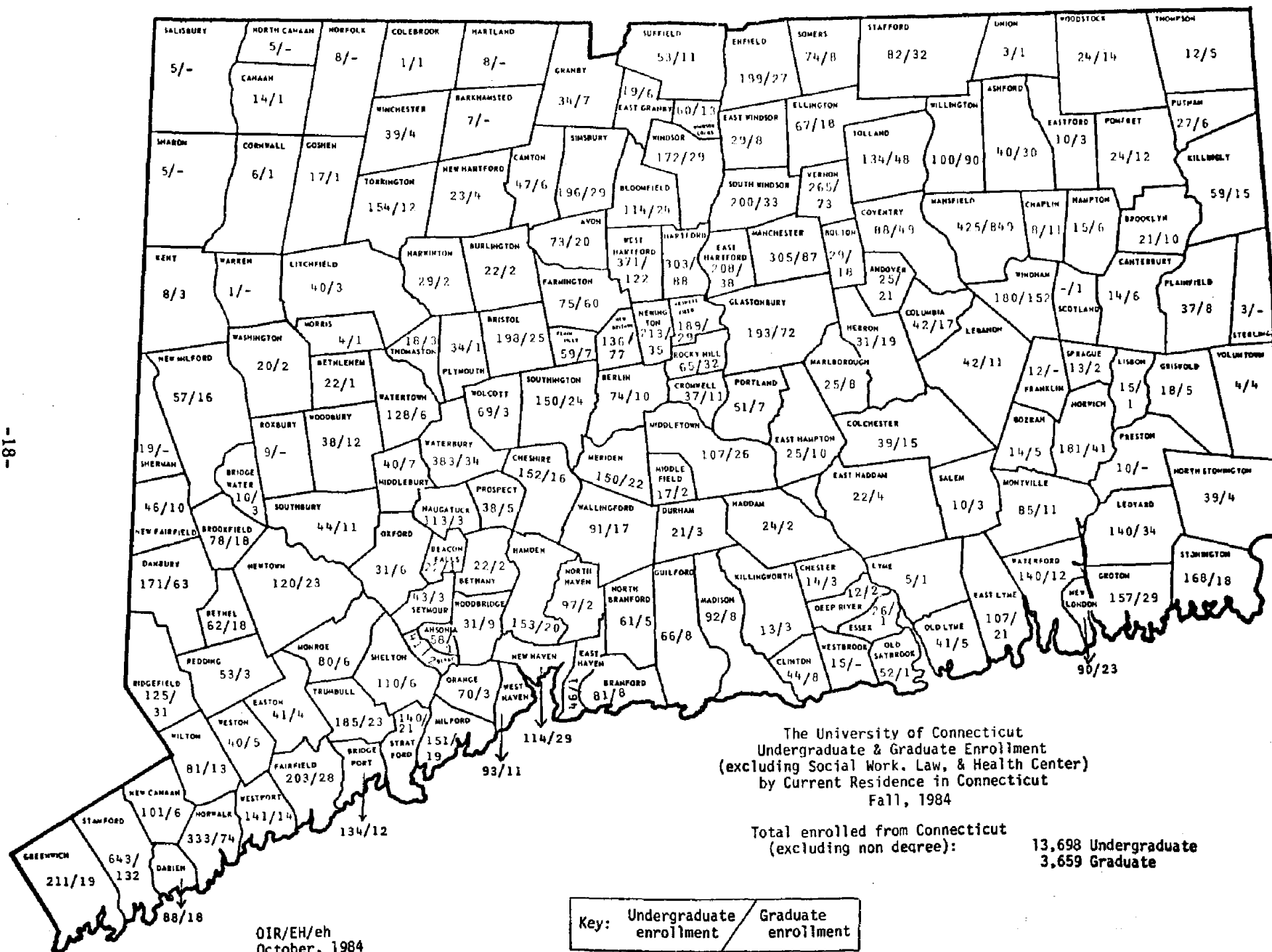
