**Academic Structure:** We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 49 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

**Academic Fields:** Undergraduates may major in 103 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 68 areas, and may choose from among 66 specialties for the Ph.D degree.

**Alumni:** As of June 30, 1985, there are 80,556 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut

**Admissions:** As of October 1, 1985, 12,281 undergraduate applications for admission were received, 9,343 persons were admitted, and there were 3,441 paid deposits.

**Residence Halls:** We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residences which accommodate 9,168 undergraduate and 440 graduate students.

**Employees:** As of 11/85 we have 4,403 full-time employees: 1,998 women; 2,405 men; 1,210 faculty; 1,674 classified; 499 graduate assistants; and 1,020 other professionals.

**Enrollment:** For Fall, 1985 there are 12,896 undergraduate and graduate students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 2,391 who are non-residents.

As of 9/85 there were 9,683 students living on campus, and 5,604 commuting.

**Extended and Continuing Education:** During 1984-85, 14,931 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Non-credit programs enrolled 28,154 in 529 course sections, administered in 26 Connecticut communities.

**Fees:** In 1985-86, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$1,801 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$1,306 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

**Financial Aid:** In 1984-85, approximately 11,000 students received \$32,185,704 through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$16,397,838 in educational loans, \$5,071,038 in various forms of student employment, and \$10,716,828 in grants and scholarships.

**Library:** As of 6/30/85, the University Library in Storrs has 1,502,404 volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 1,935,645 volumes.

**Facilities:** As of Fall, 1985 we have 380 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,050,233 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve 10,584 registered cars.

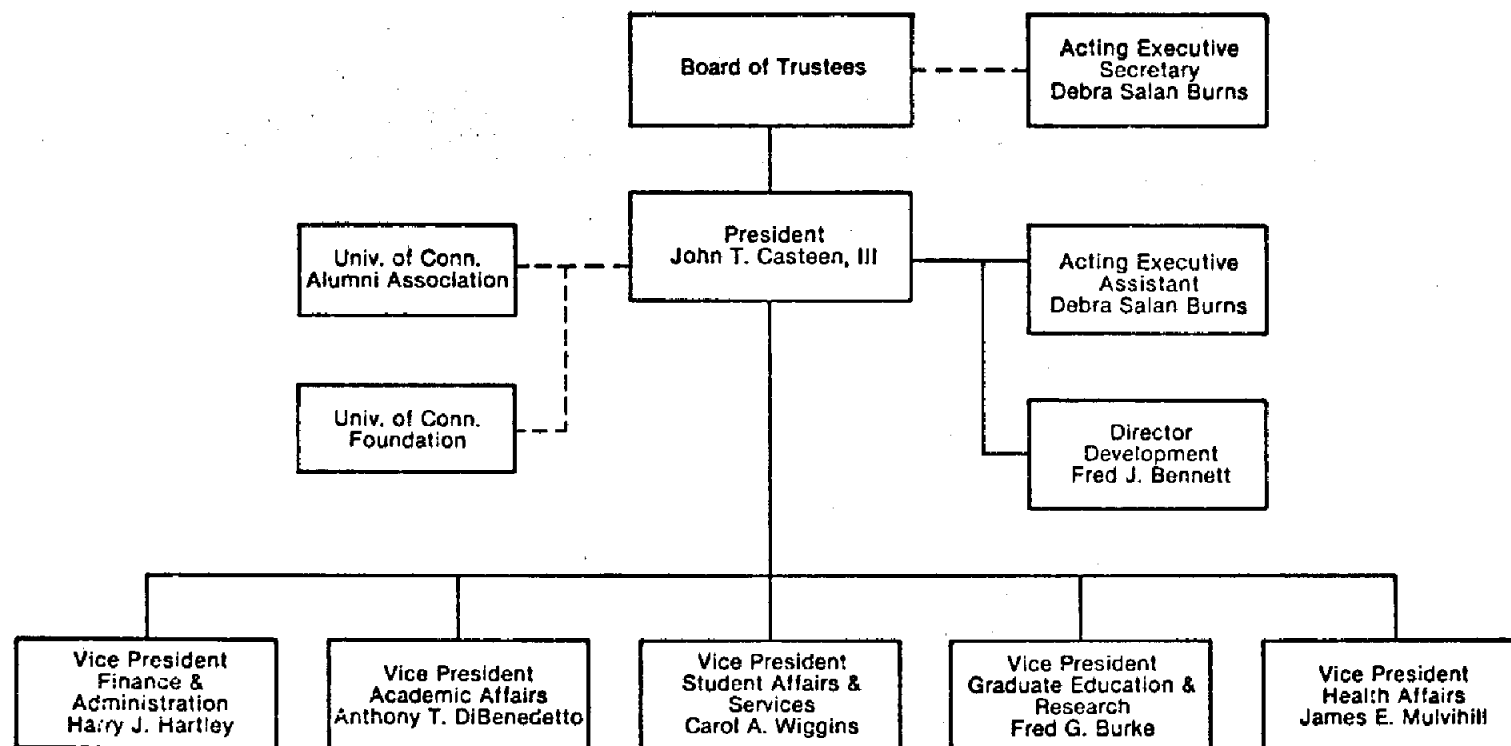

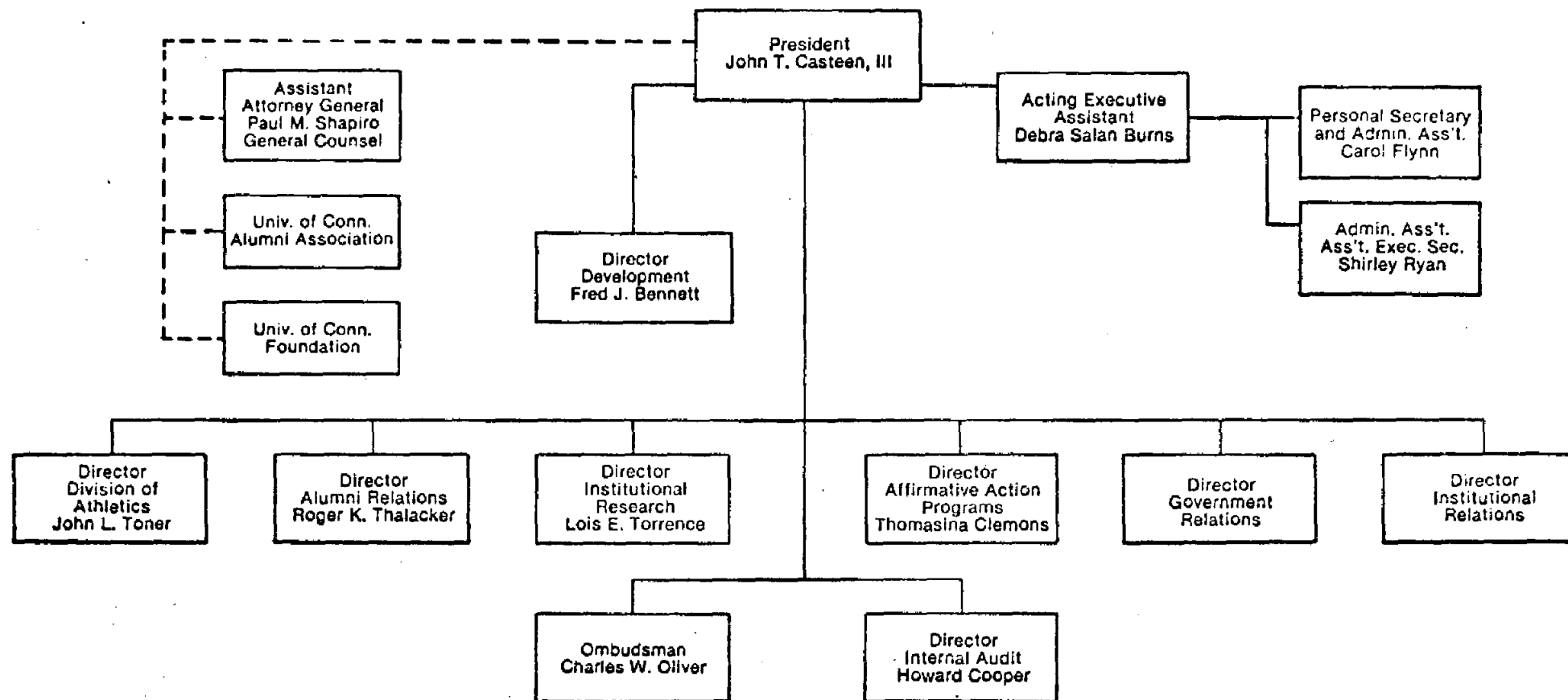

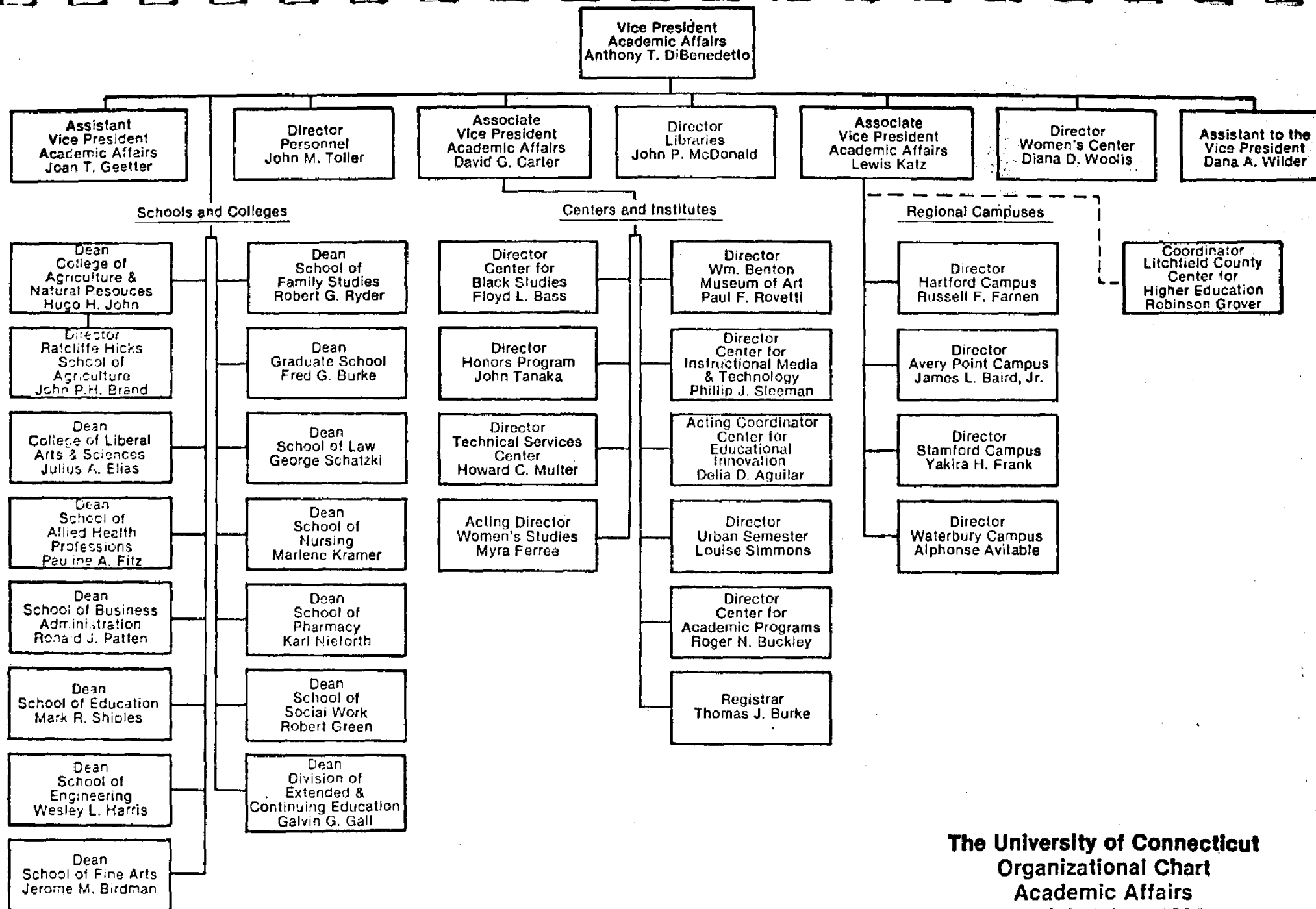


**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1985**

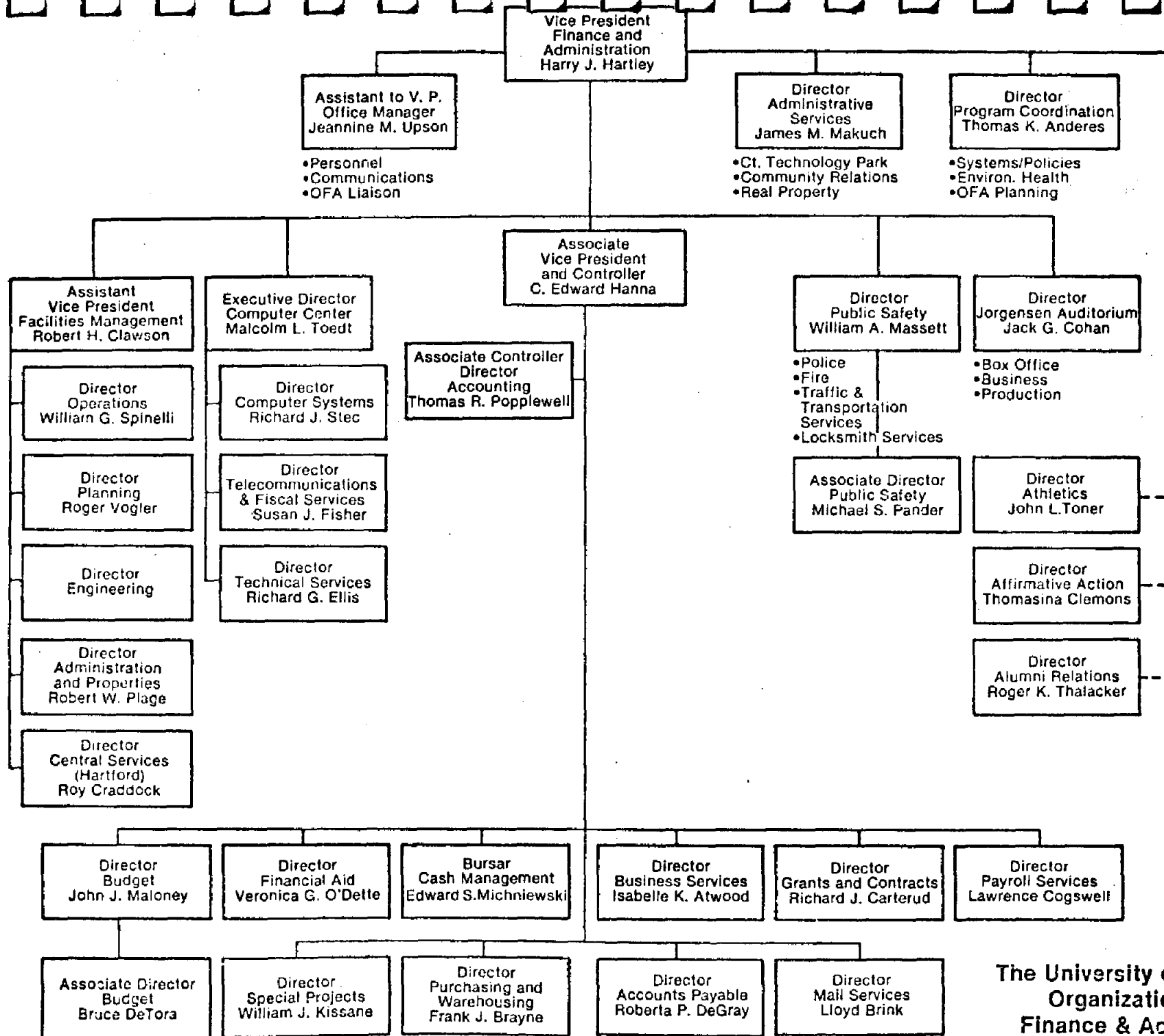




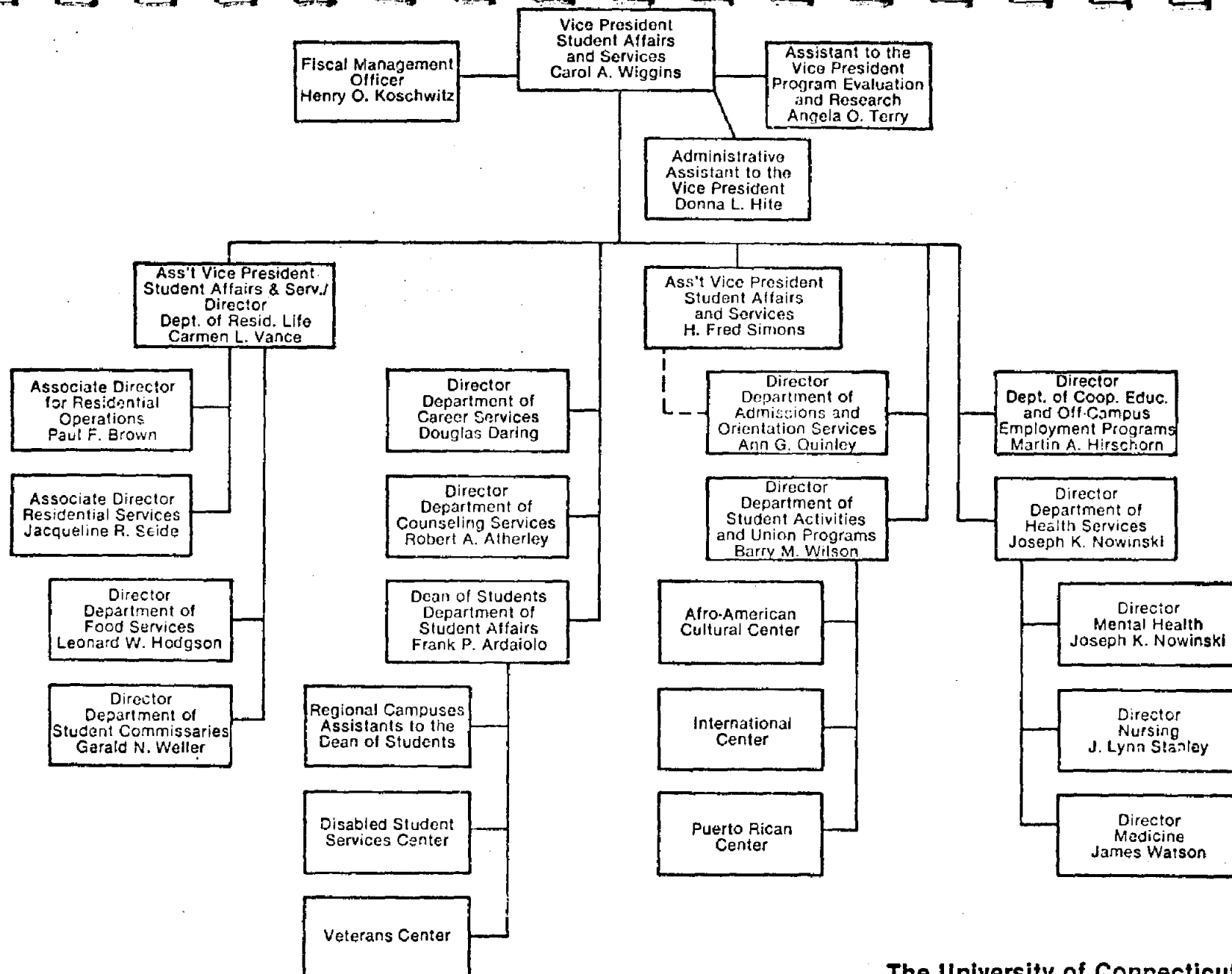
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1985**



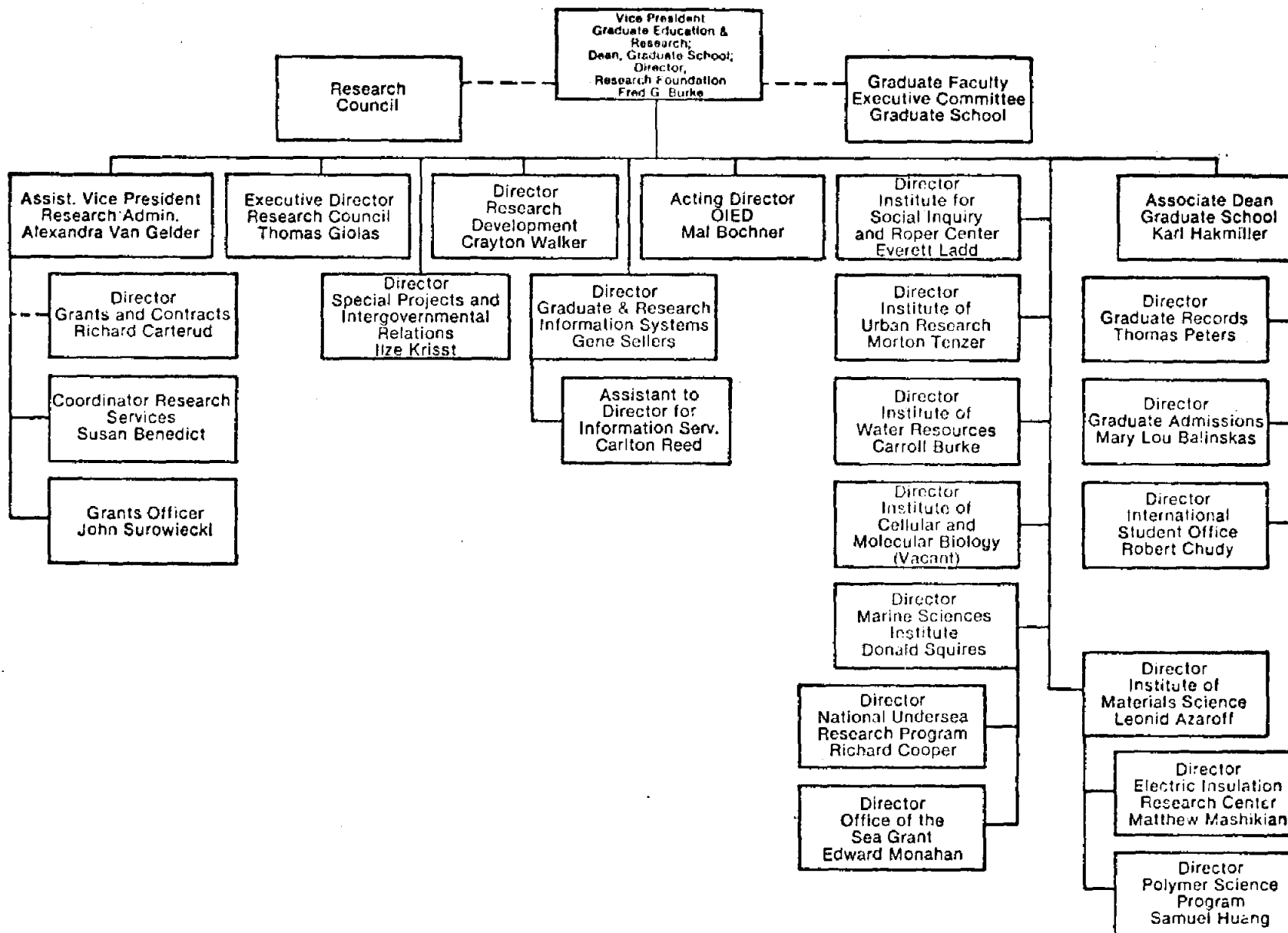
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1985**



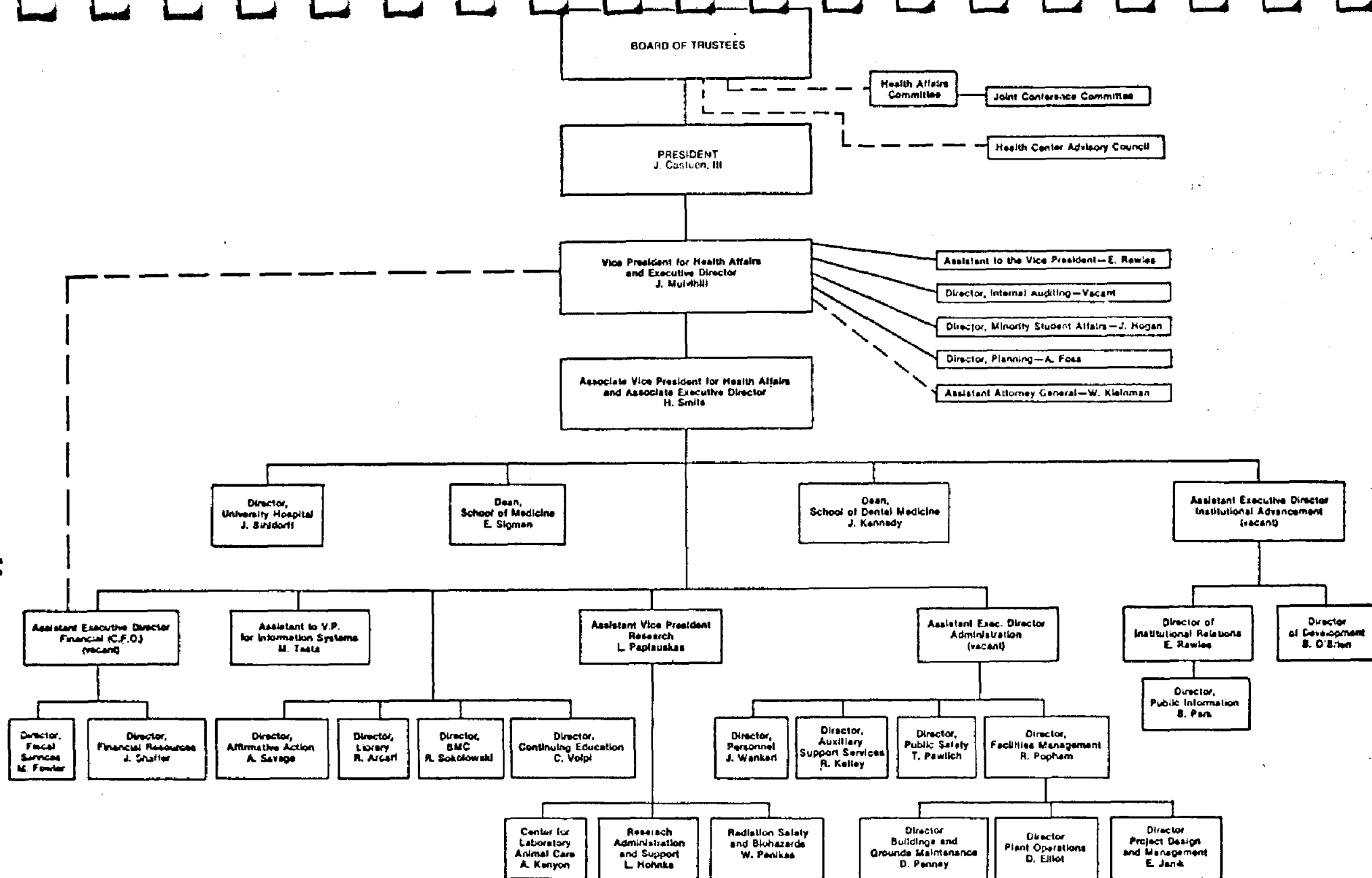
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1985**

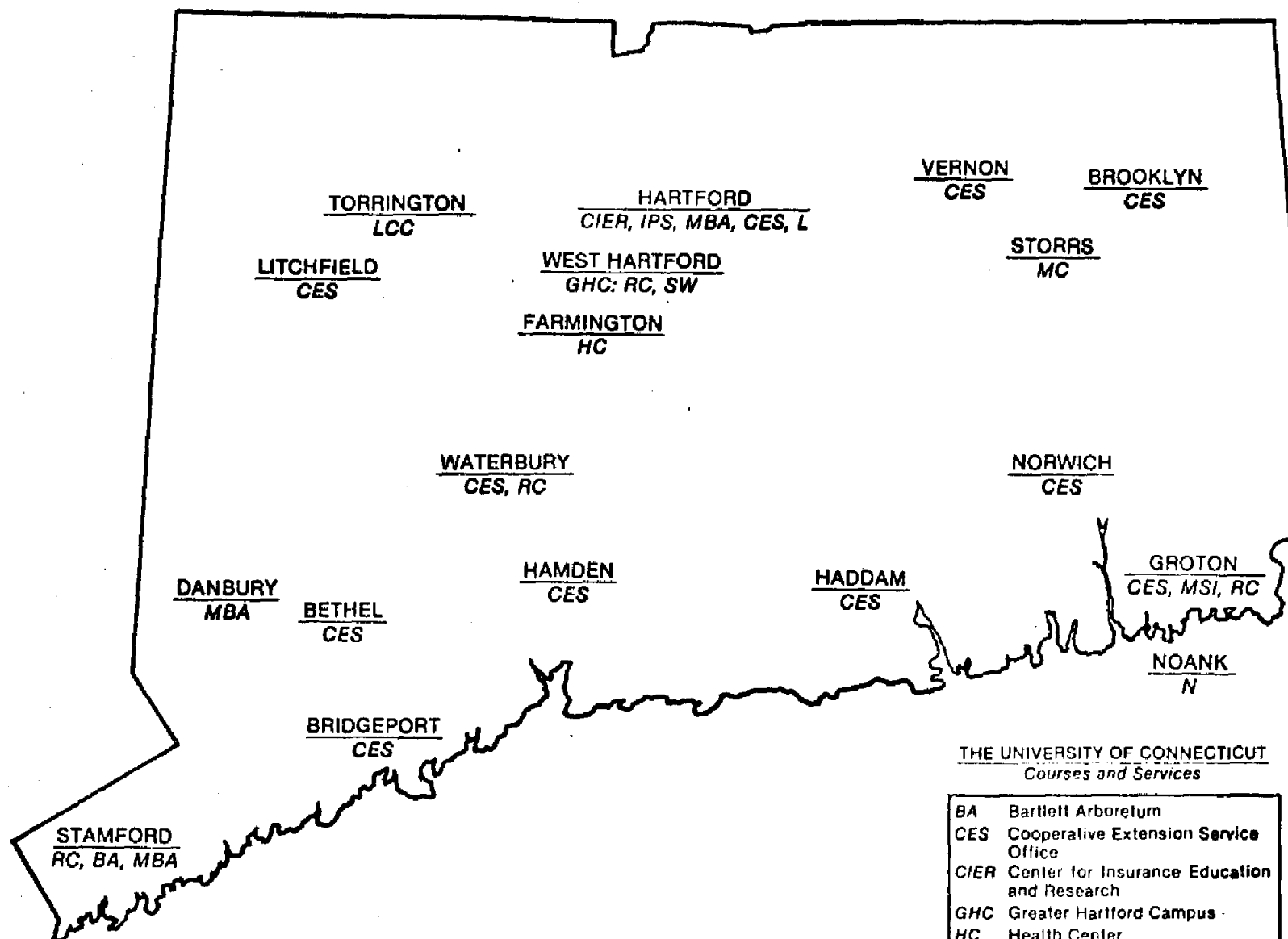


**The University of Connecticut

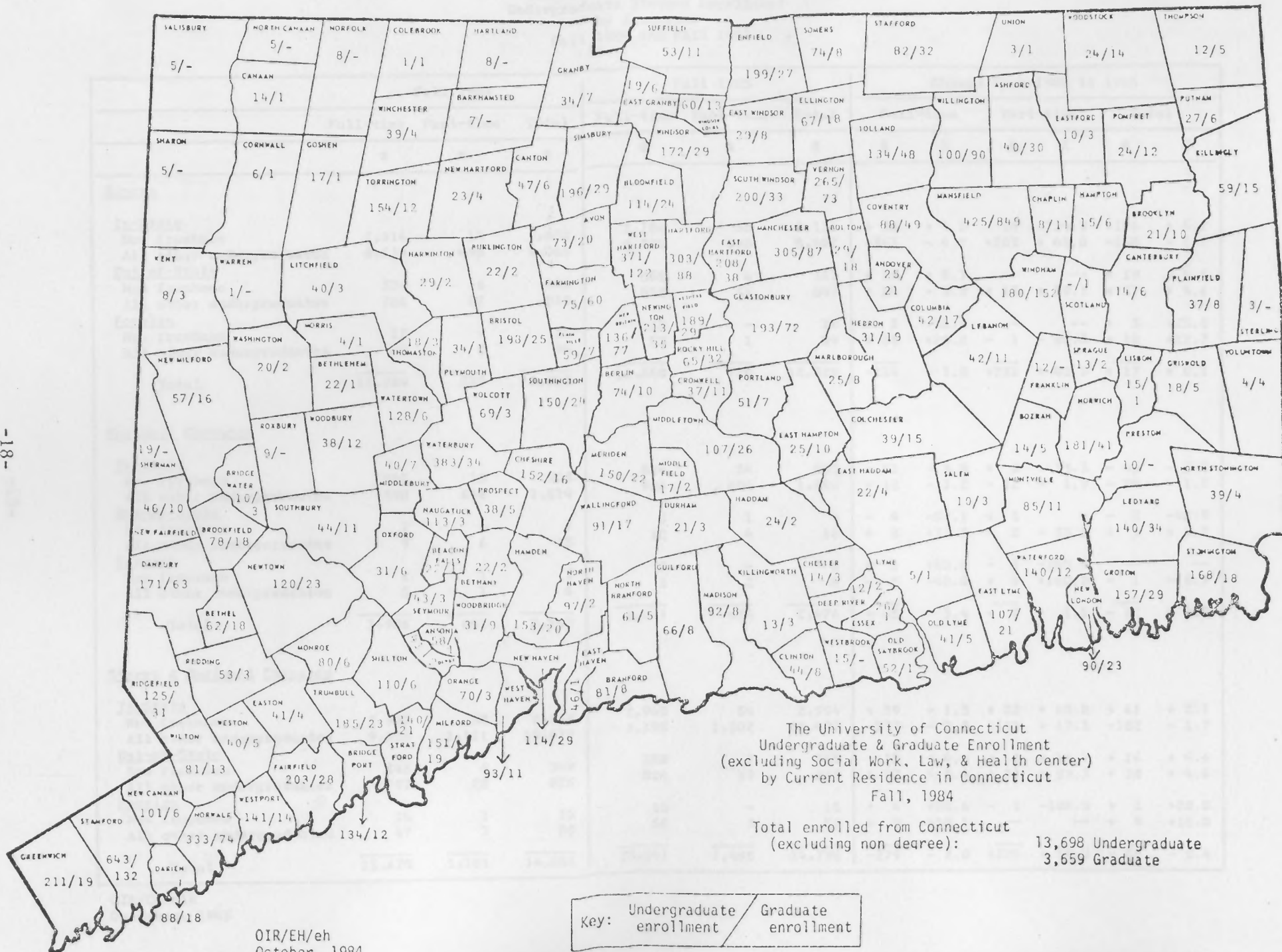

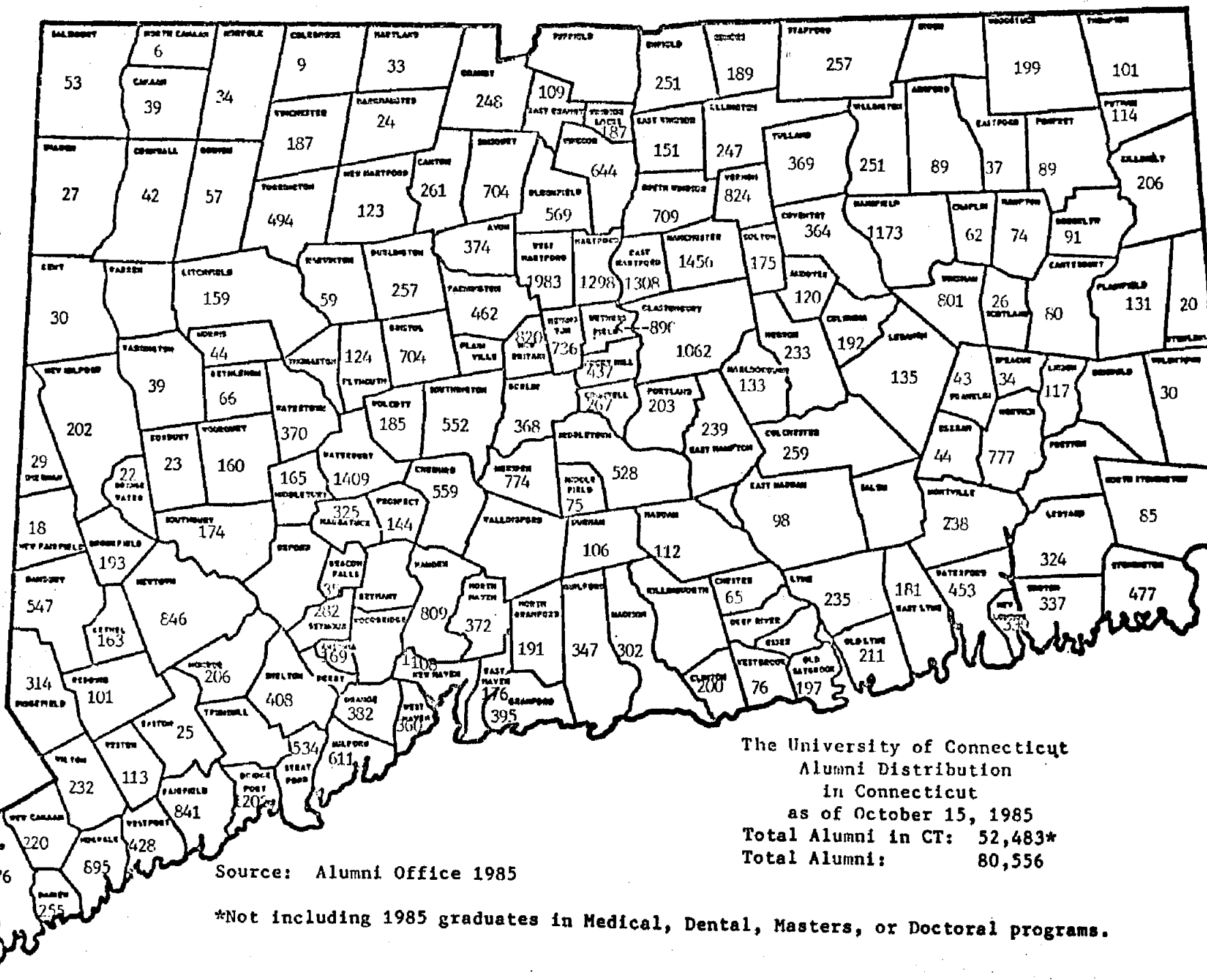
