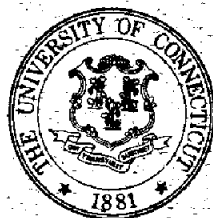

1986-87

Academic Structure: We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 50 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

Academic Fields: Undergraduates may major in 97 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 69 areas, and may choose from among 65 specialities for the Ph.D degree.

Alumni: As of October 31, 1986, there are 84,587 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut.

Admissions: As of October 1, 1986, 12,513 applications for freshman admission were received, 10,094 were admitted, and there were 3,704 paid deposits.

Residence Halls: We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residences which accommodate 9,158 undergraduate and 440 graduate students.

Employees: As of 11/86 we have 4,508 full-time employees: 2,045 women; 2,463 men; 1,210 faculty; 1,702 classified; 522 graduate assistants; and 1,074 other professionals.

Enrollment: For Fall, 1986 there are 13,195 undergraduate and graduate students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 2,638 who are non-residents.

As of 9/86 there were 9,691 students living on campus.

Extended and Continuing Education: During 1985-86, 17,735 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Non-credit programs enrolled 27,770 people in 574 programs, administered in 29 Connecticut communities.

Fees: In 1986-87, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$1,937 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$2,536 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

Financial Aid: In 1985-86, awards totaling \$32,892,456 were made through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$17,057,349 in educational loans, \$2,611,827 in various forms of student employment, and \$13,223,280 in grants and scholarships.

Library: As of 6/30/86, the University Library in Storrs has 1,581,600 volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2,142,350 volumes.

Facilities: As of Fall, 1986 we have 377 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,041,156 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve 10,600 registered cars.

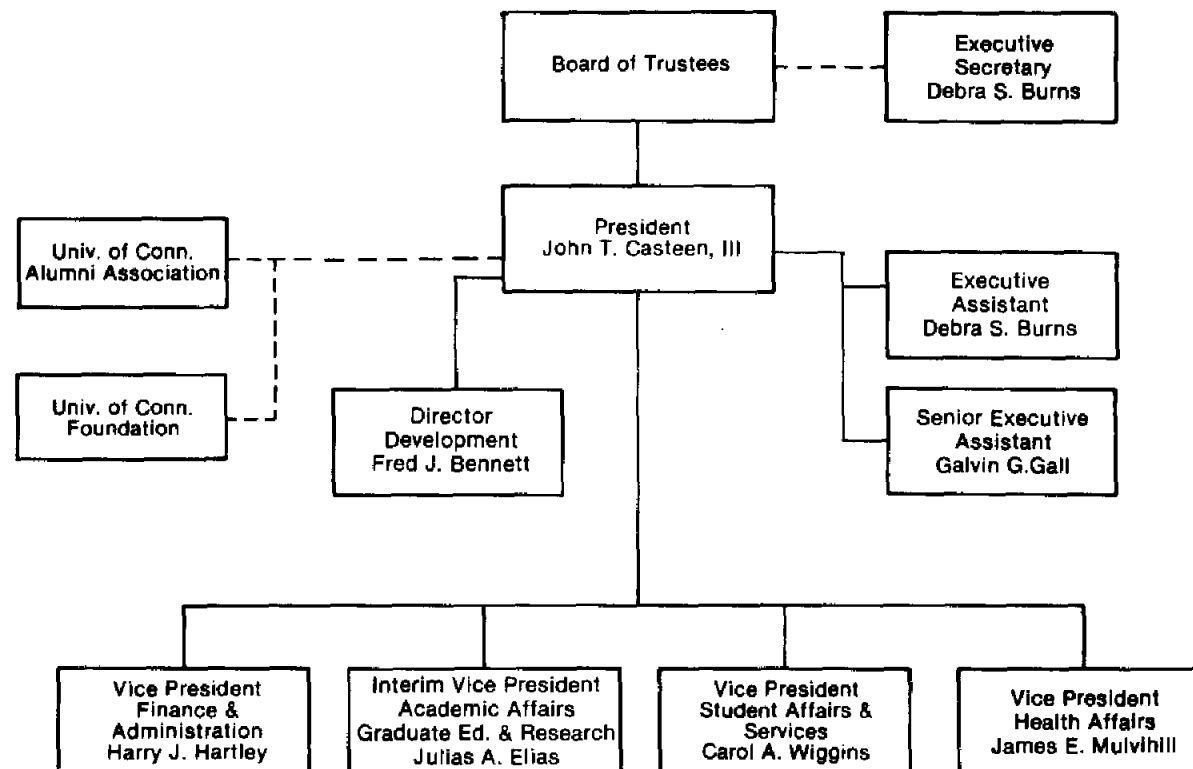

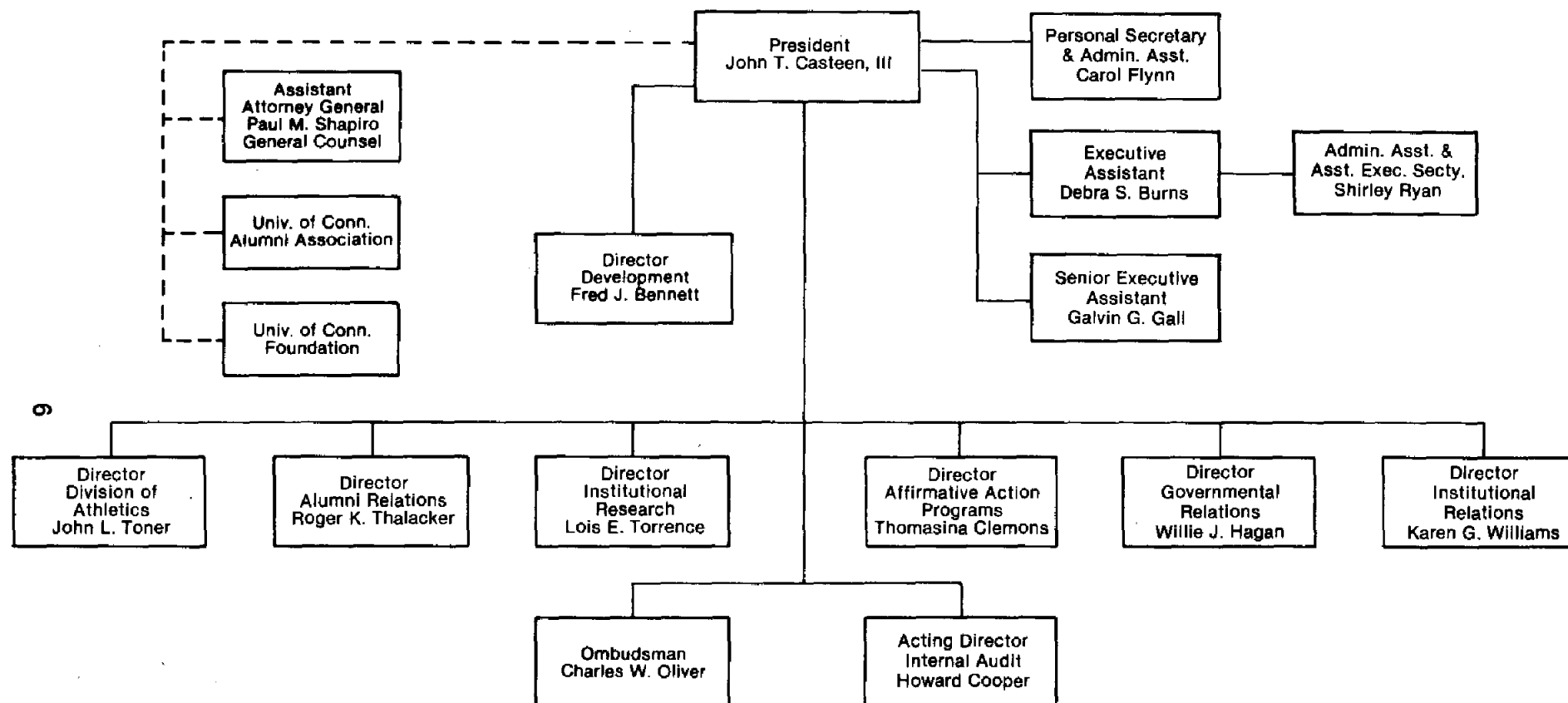

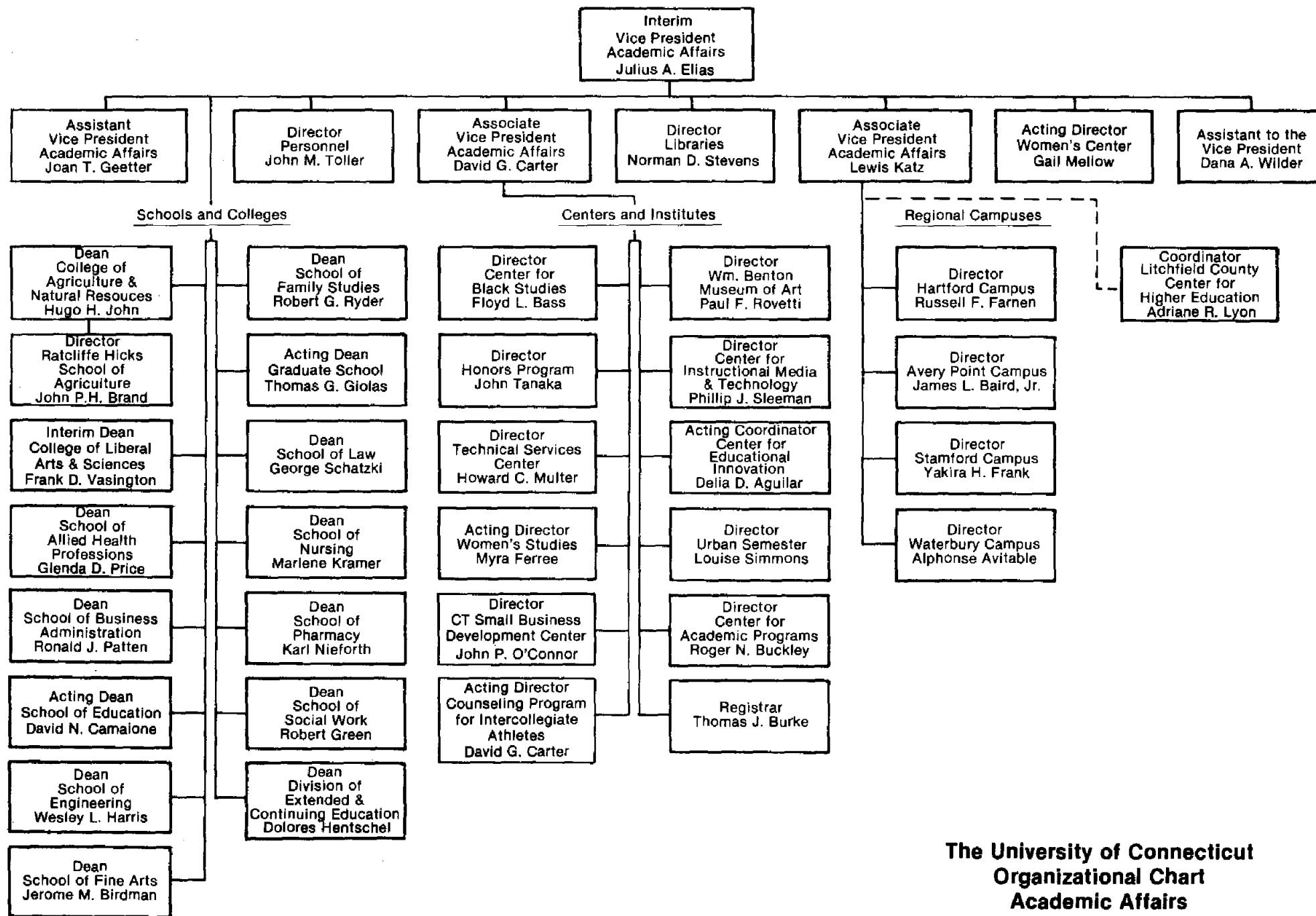


**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1986**

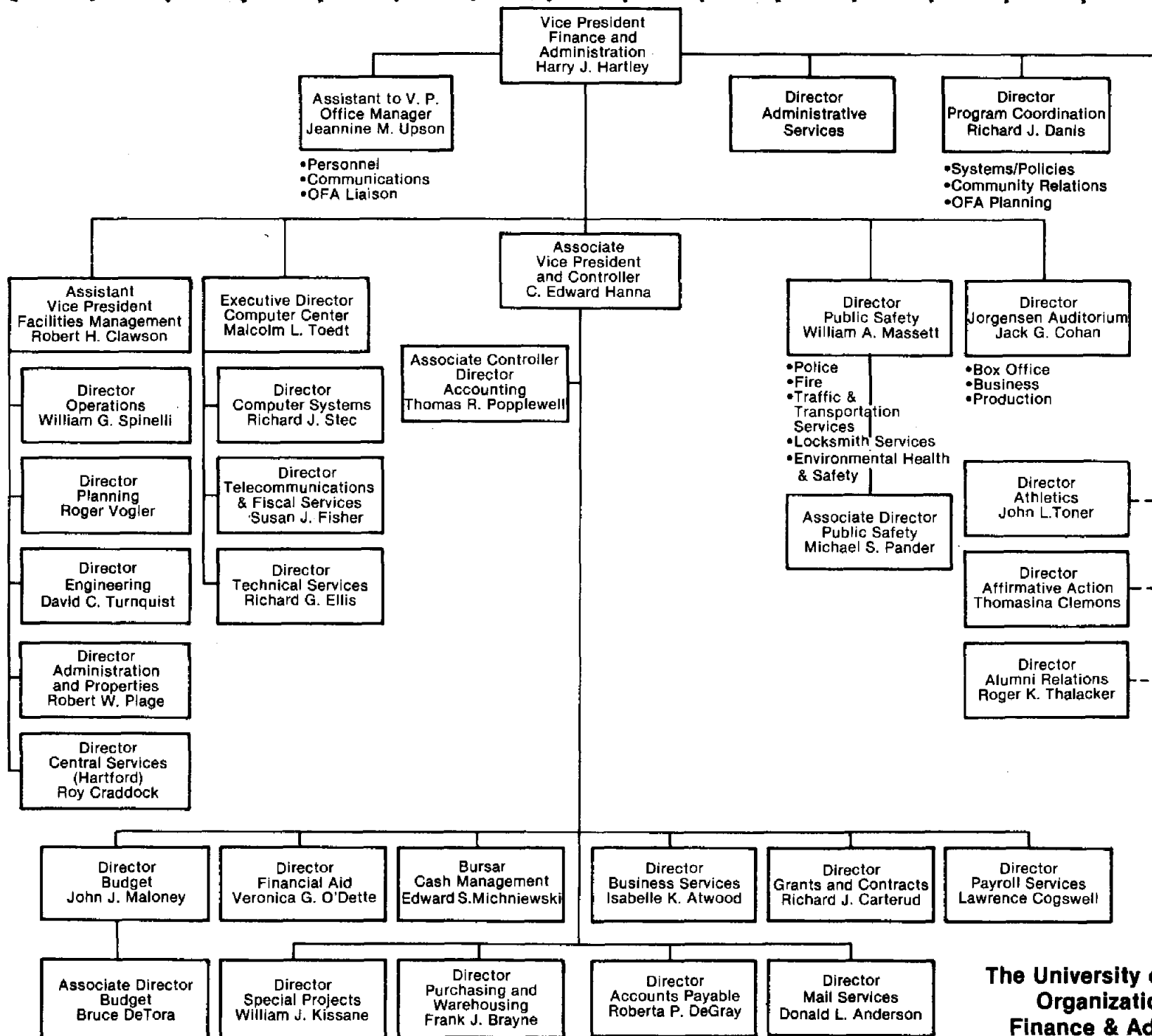




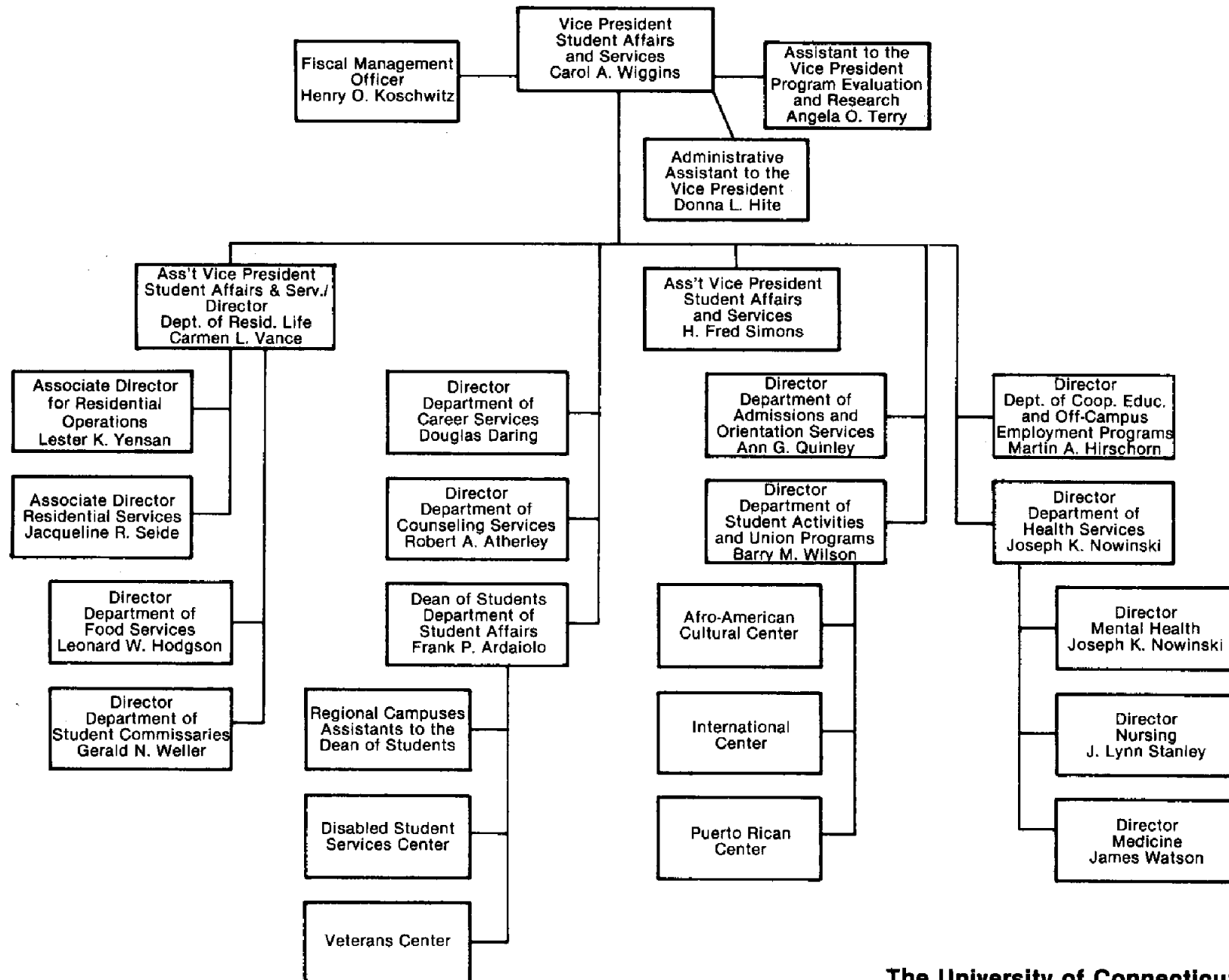
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1986**



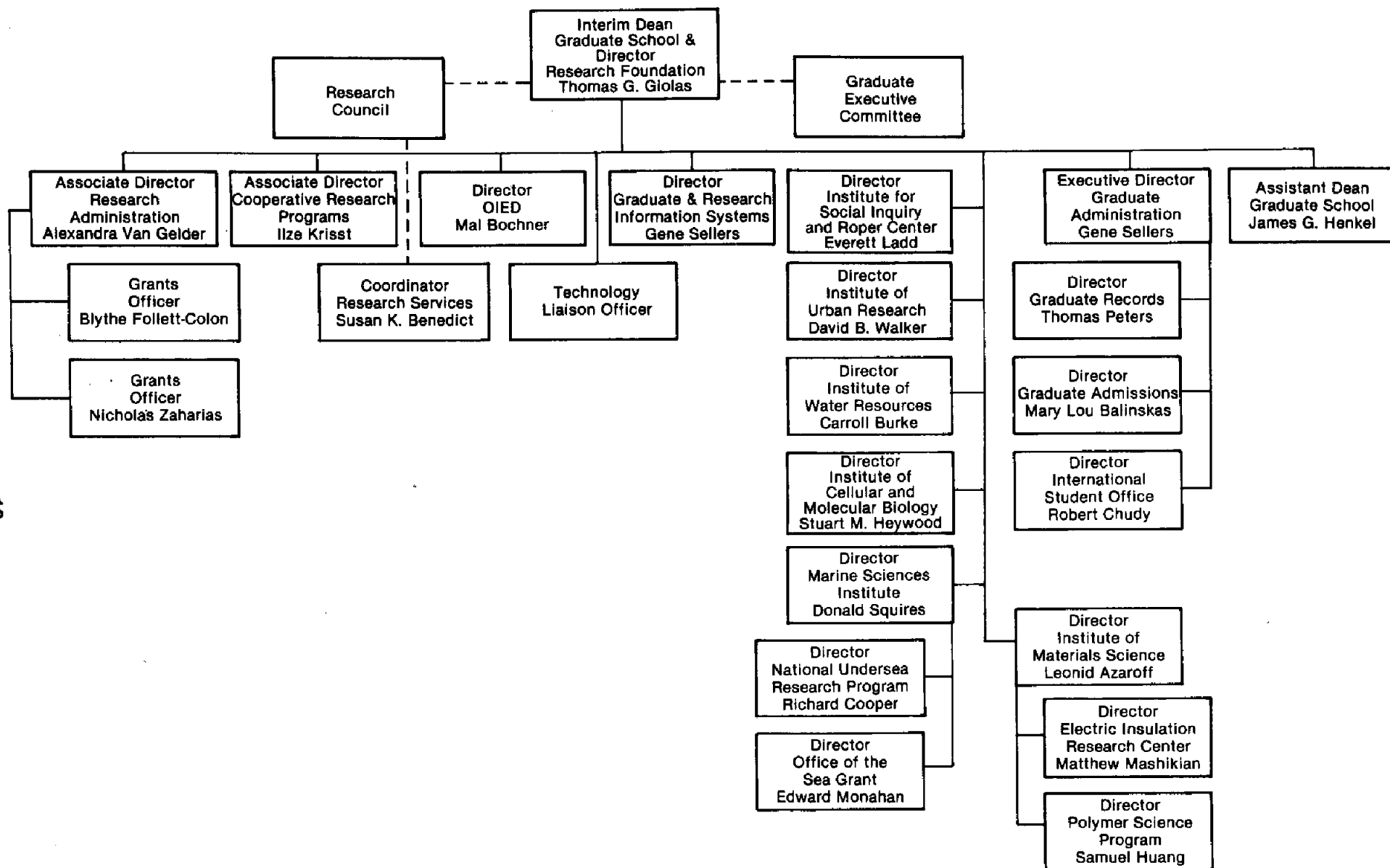
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1986**



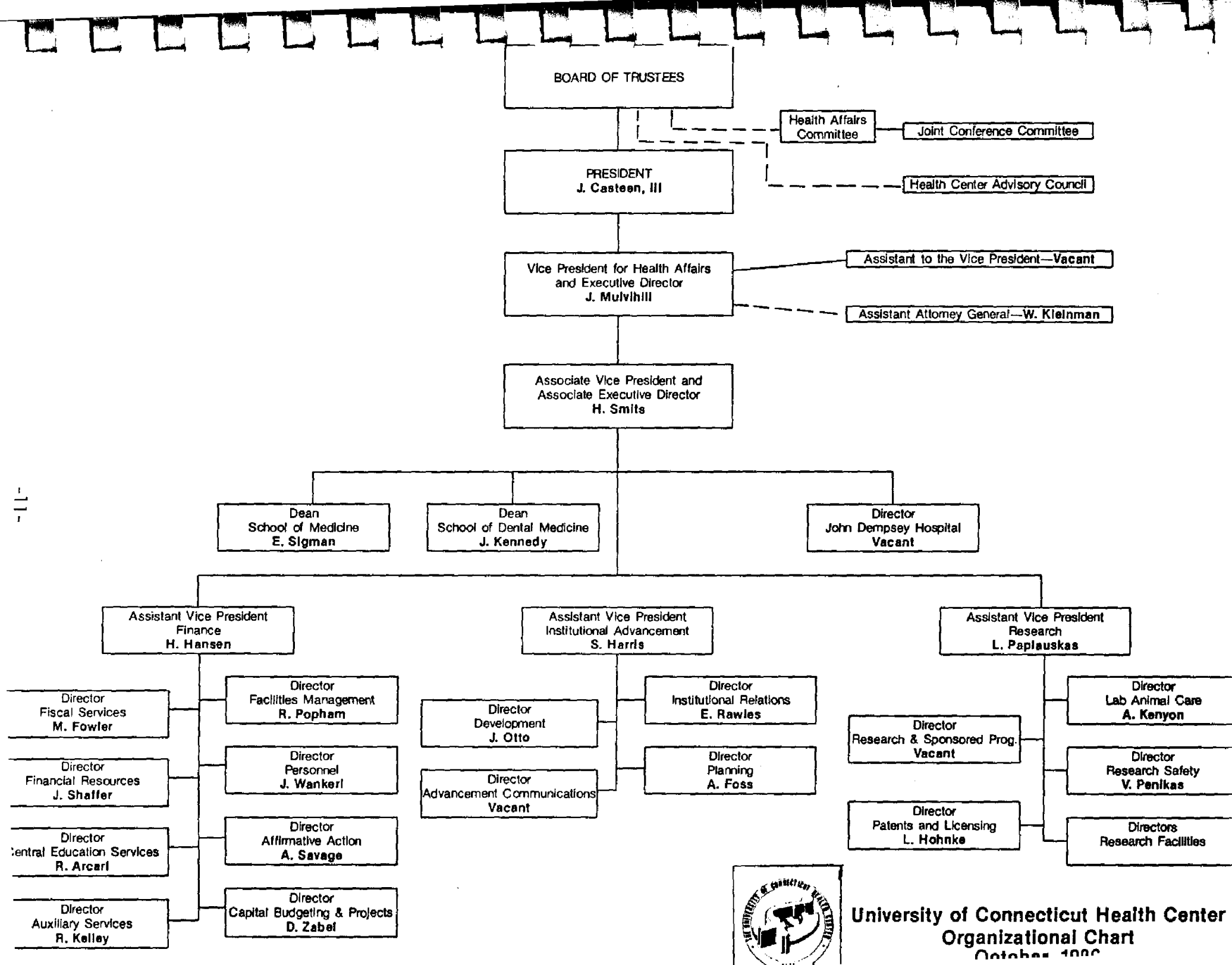
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1986**

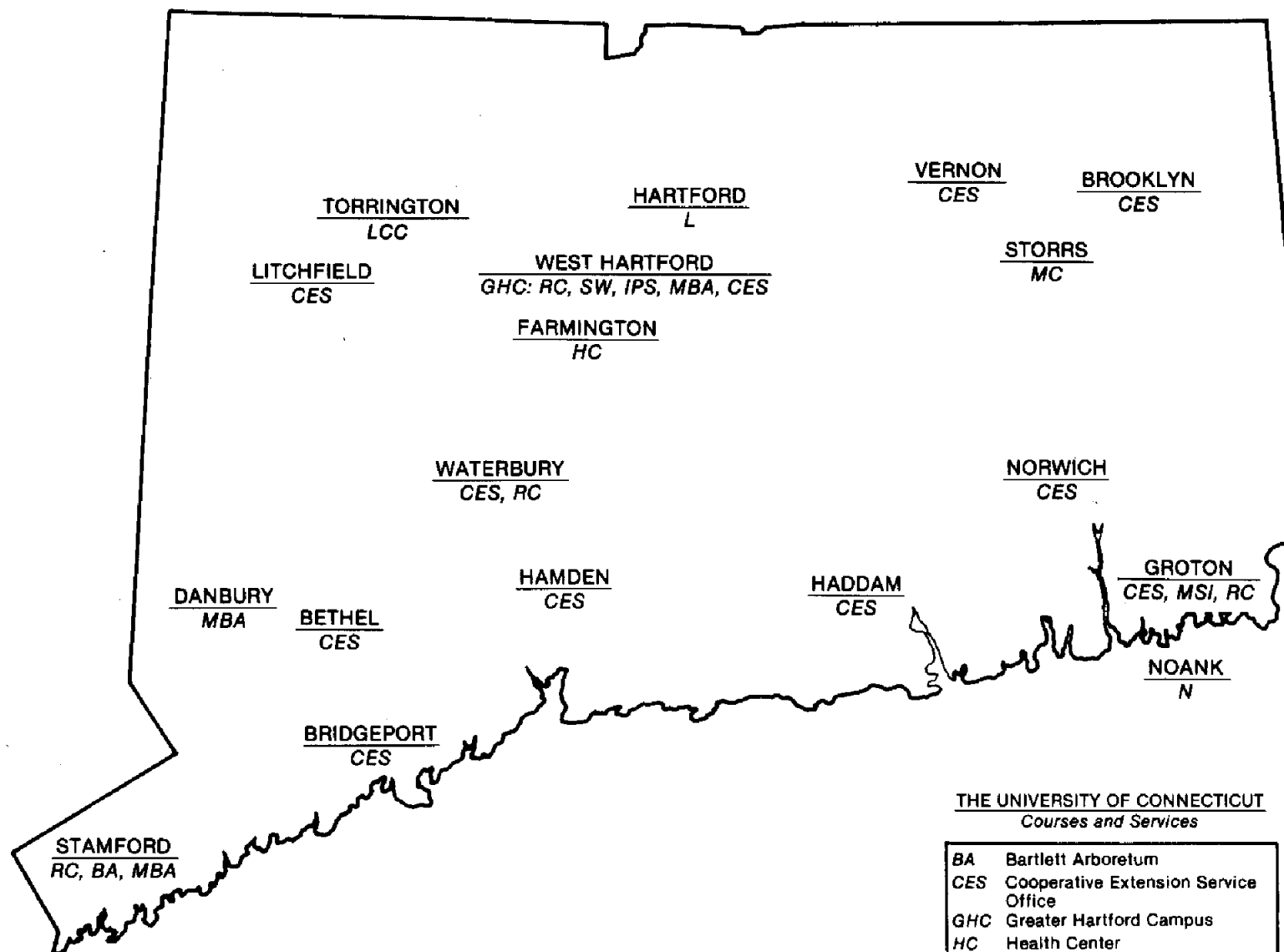


**The University of Connecticut

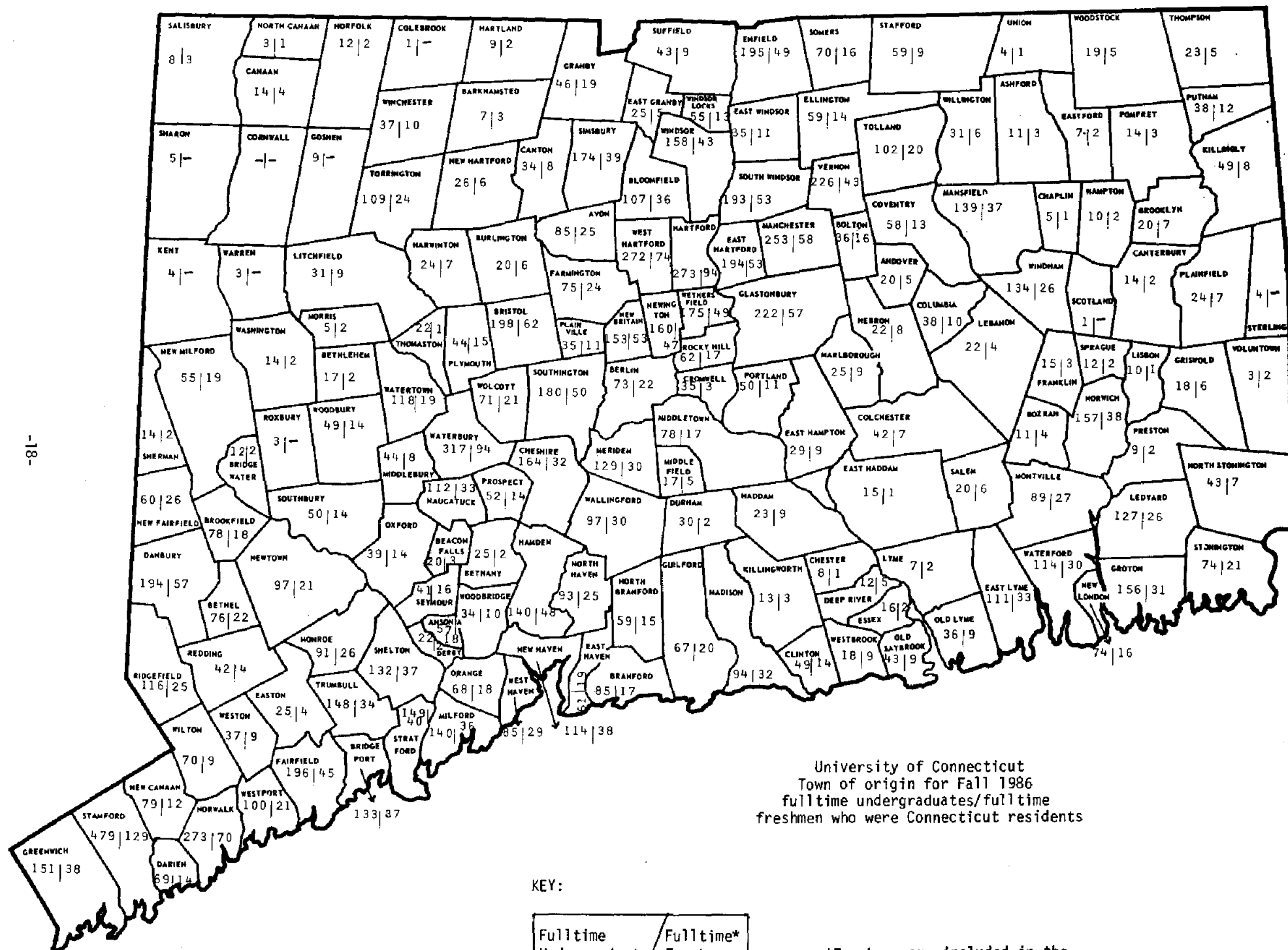

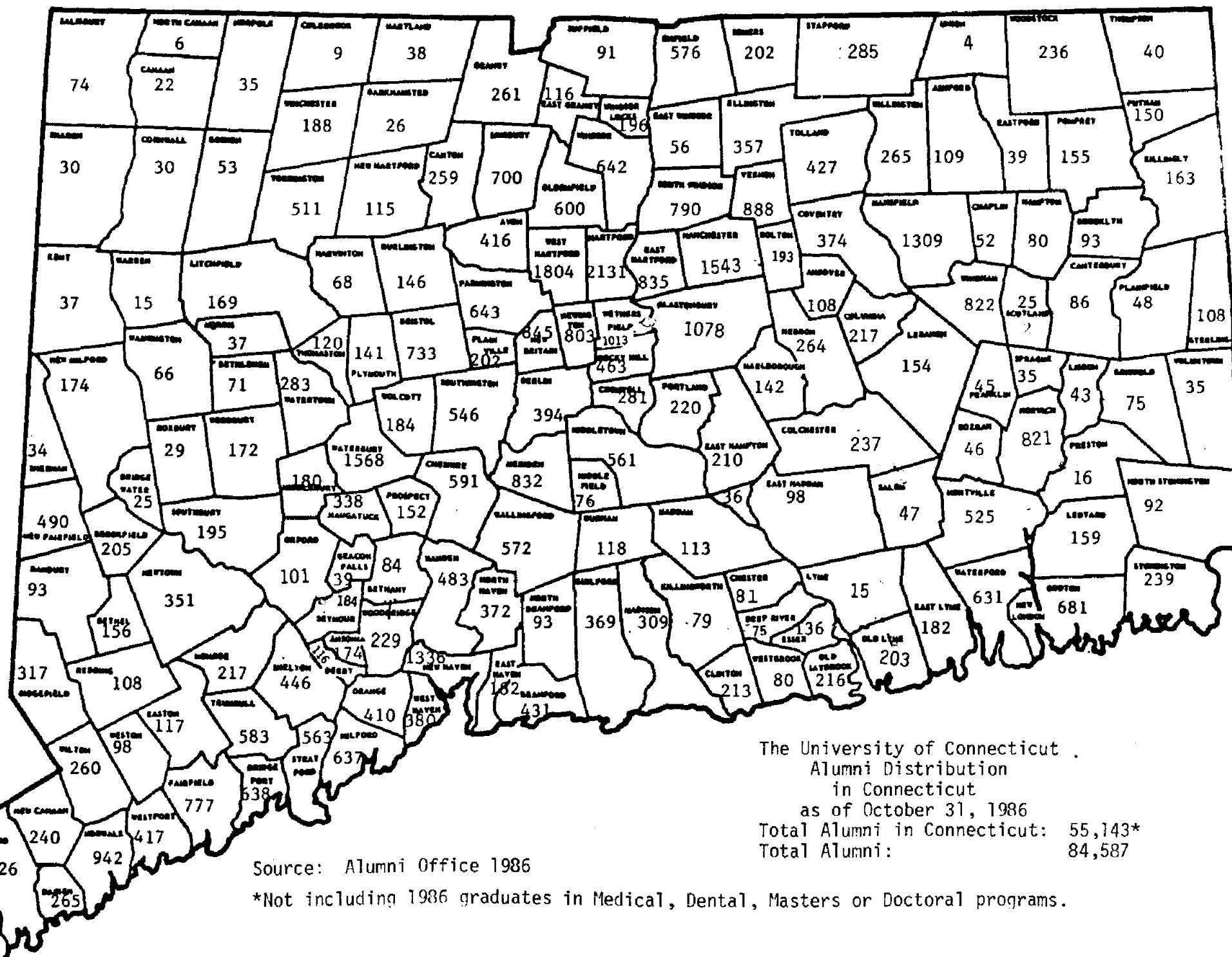
