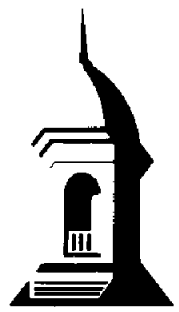

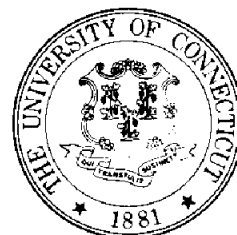

**Academic Structure:** We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 50 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

**Academic Fields:** Undergraduates may major in 97 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 69 areas, and may choose from among 67 specialities for the Ph.D degree.

**Alumni:** As of October 31, 1987, there are 81,882 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut.

**Admissions:** As of October 1, 1987, 13,174 undergraduate applications for admission were received, 11,169 persons were admitted, and there were 4,365 paid deposits.

**Residence Halls:** We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residences which accommodate 9,222 undergraduate and 440 graduate students.

**Enrollment:** For Fall, 1987 there are 16,356 undergraduate, graduate and non-degree students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 2,696 who are non-residents.

**Extended and Continuing Education:** During 1986-87, 18,369 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Non-credit programs enrolled 28,945 people in 502 programs, administered in 22 Connecticut communities.

**Fees:** In 1987-88, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$2,133 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$2,610 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

**Financial Aid:** In 1986-87, awards totaling \$33,186,926 were made through various programs of financial assistance.  
  
This total amount was composed of \$14,560,687 in educational loans, \$2,894,840 in various forms of student employment, and \$15,731,399 in grants and scholarships.

**Library:** As of 6/30/87, the University Library in Storrs has 1,624,690 volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2,207,389 volumes.

**Facilities:** As of Fall, 1987 we have 372 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 3,943,298 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve approximately 10,600 registered cars.

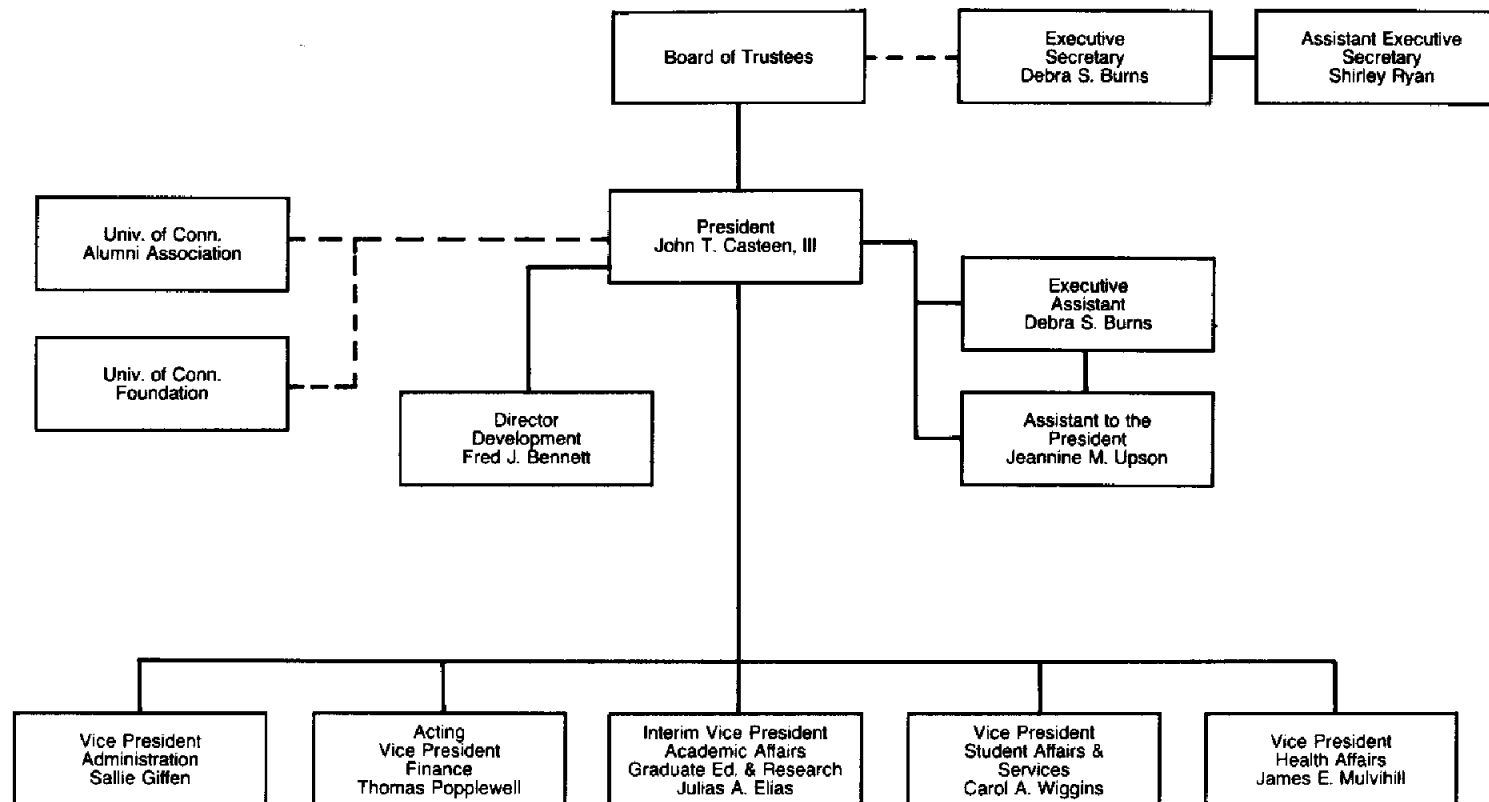

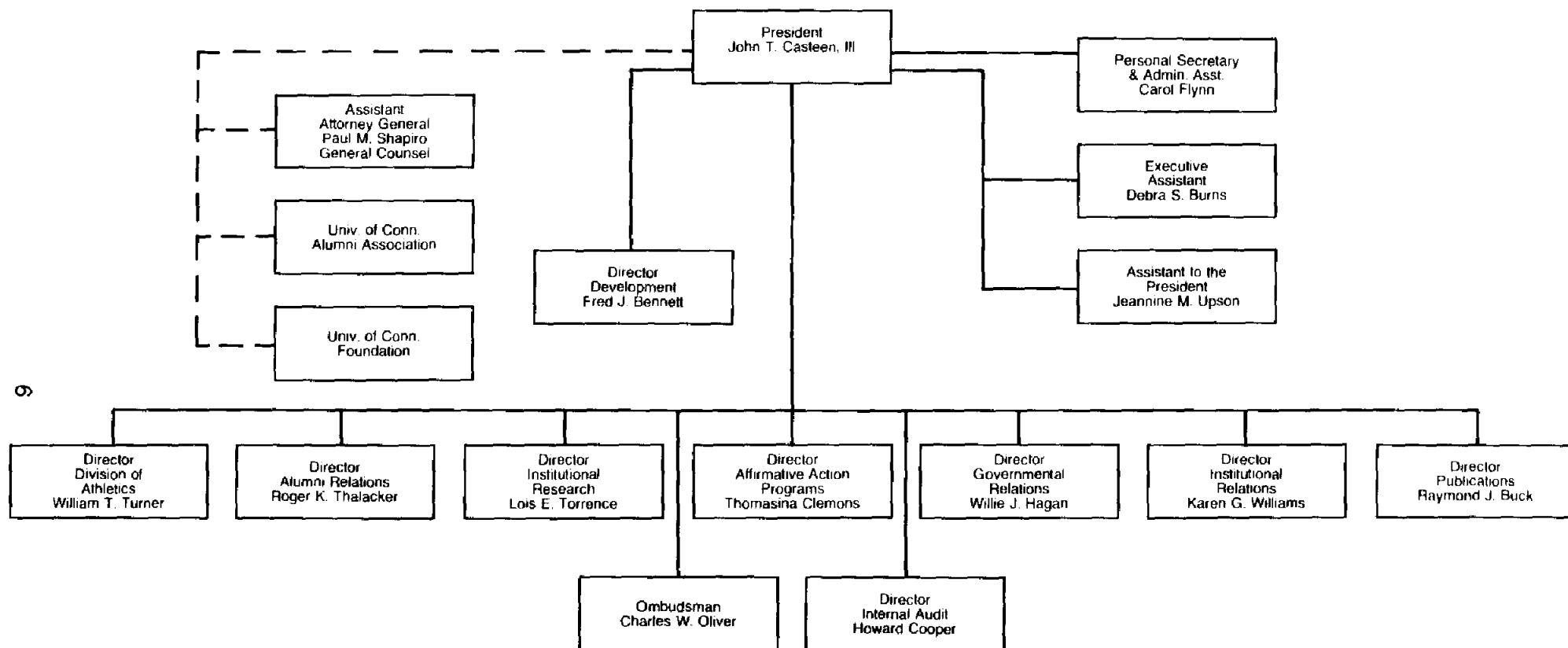

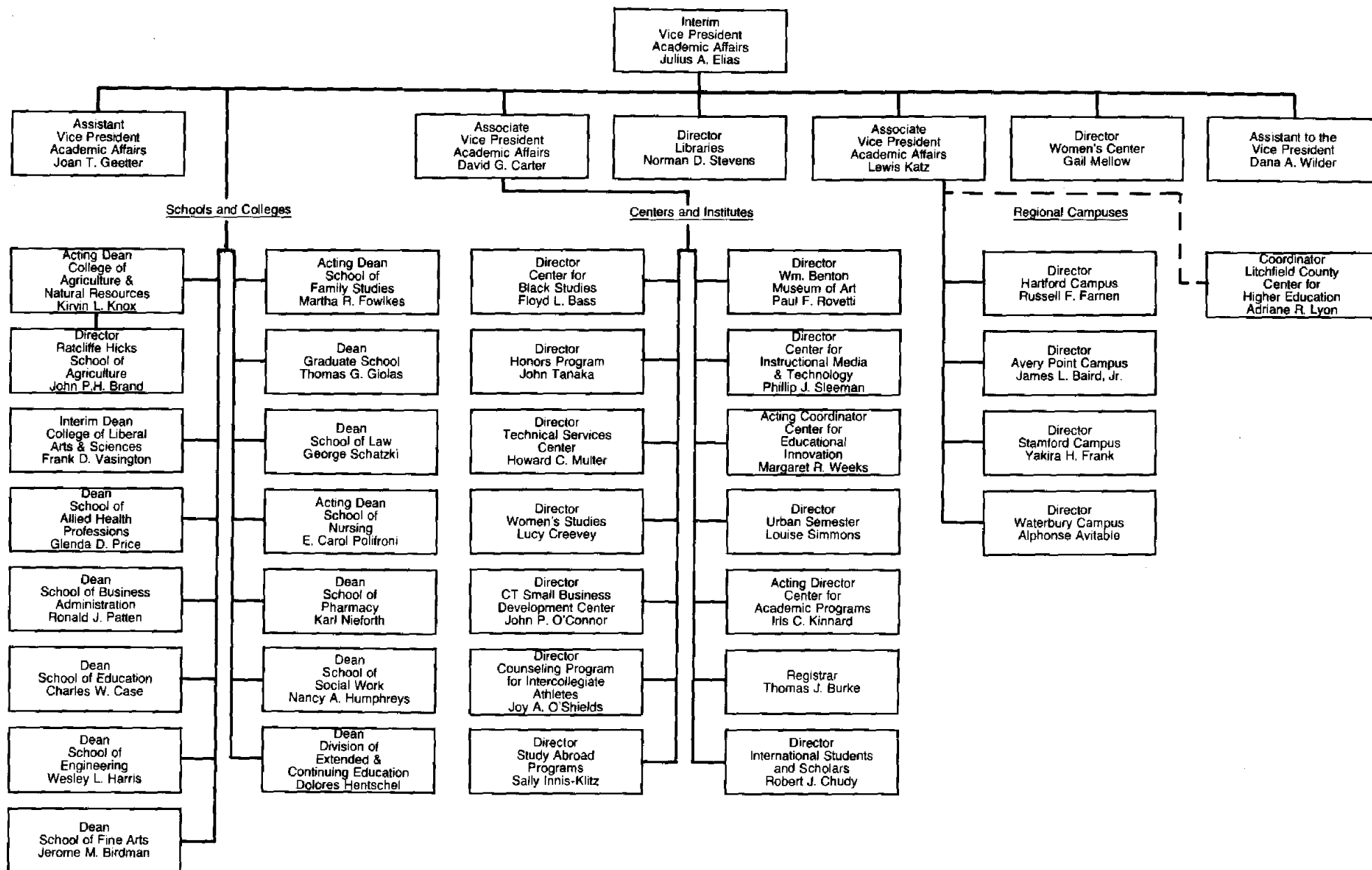


**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1987**

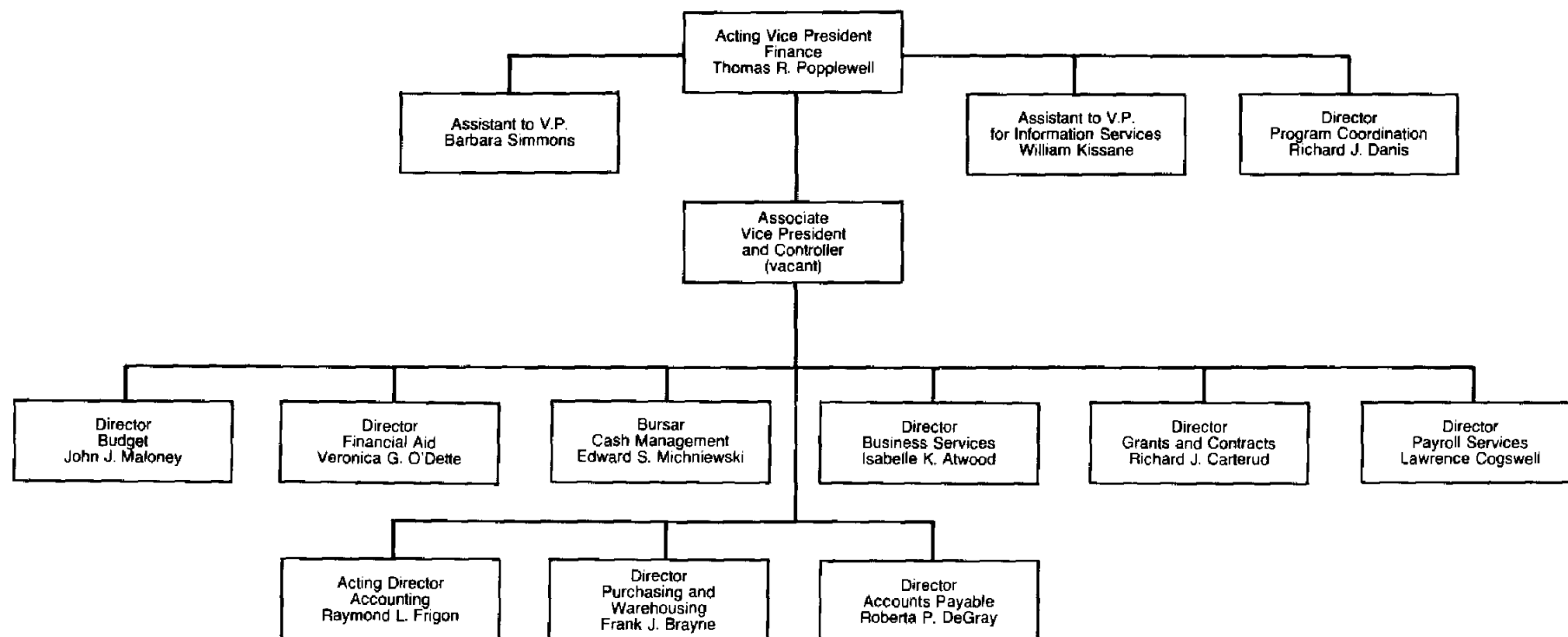




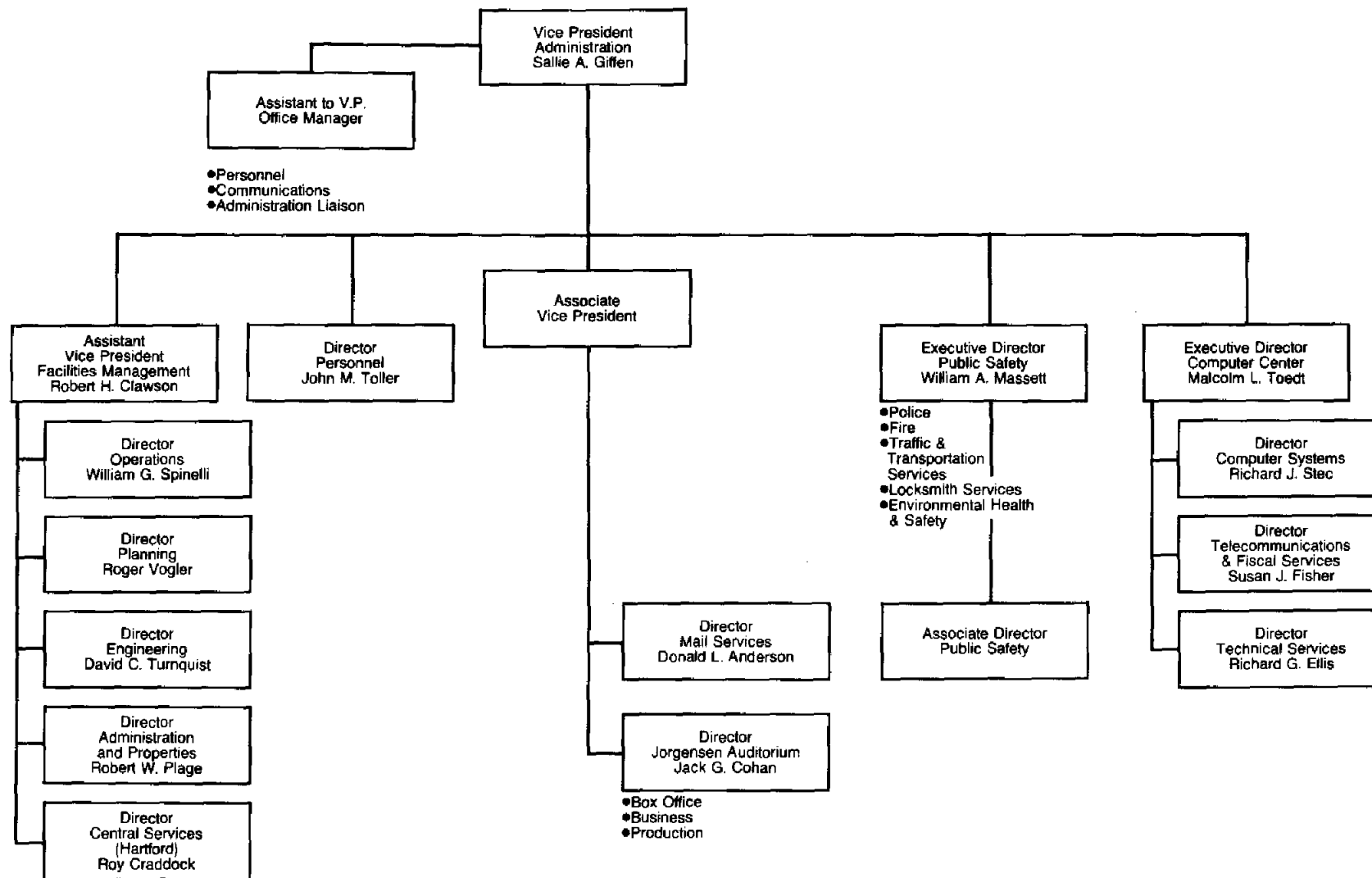
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1987**



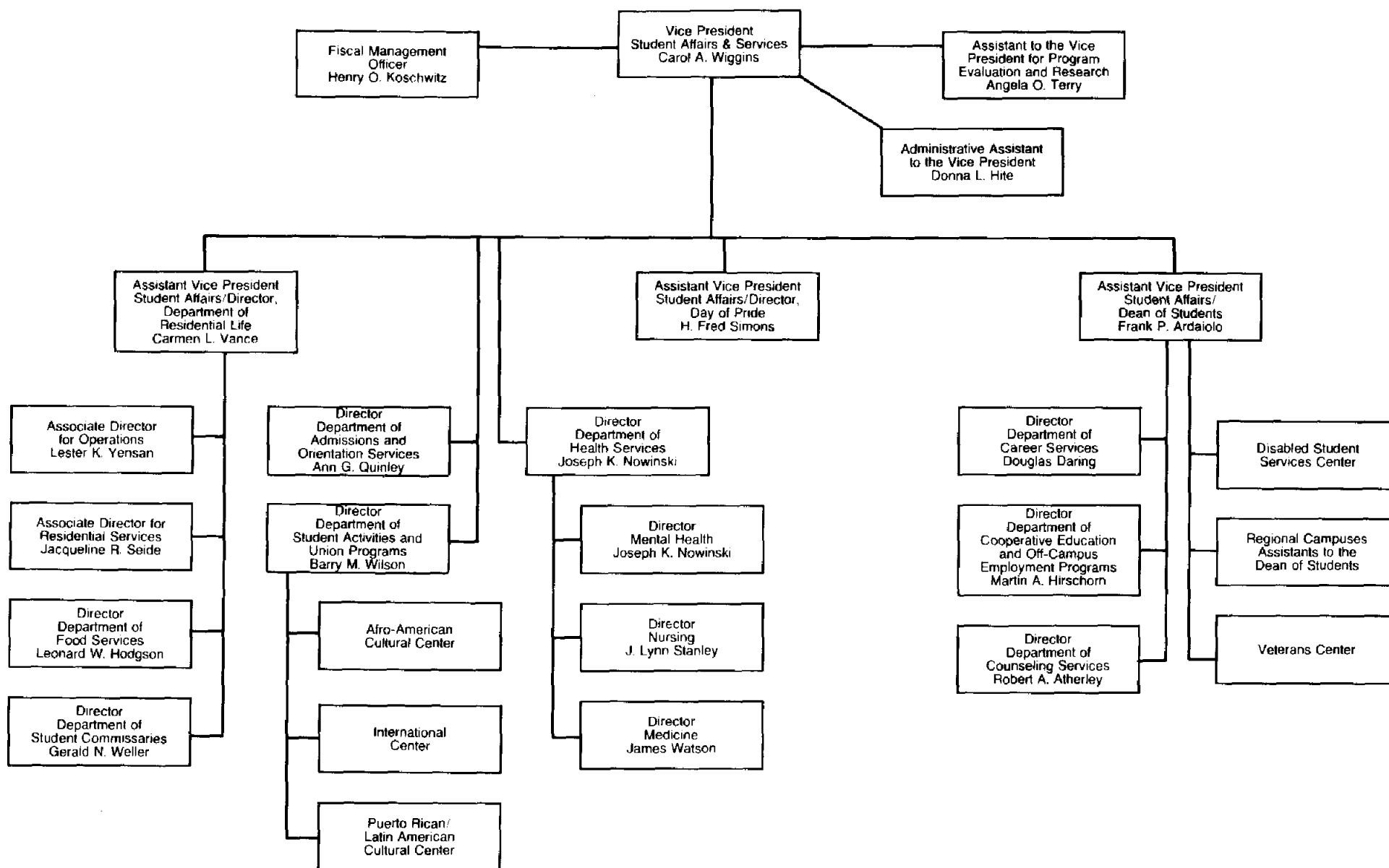
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1987**



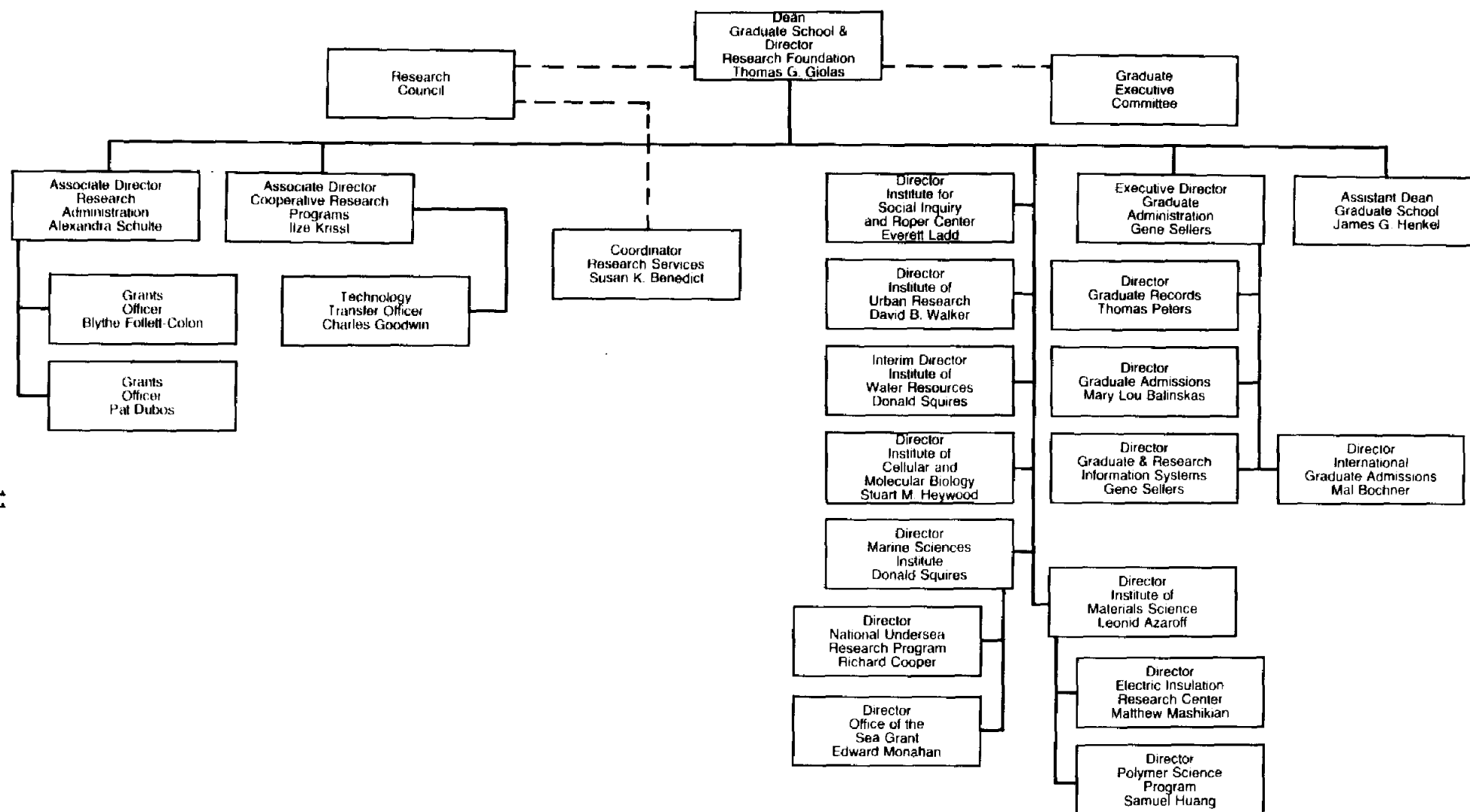

as of October, 1987**



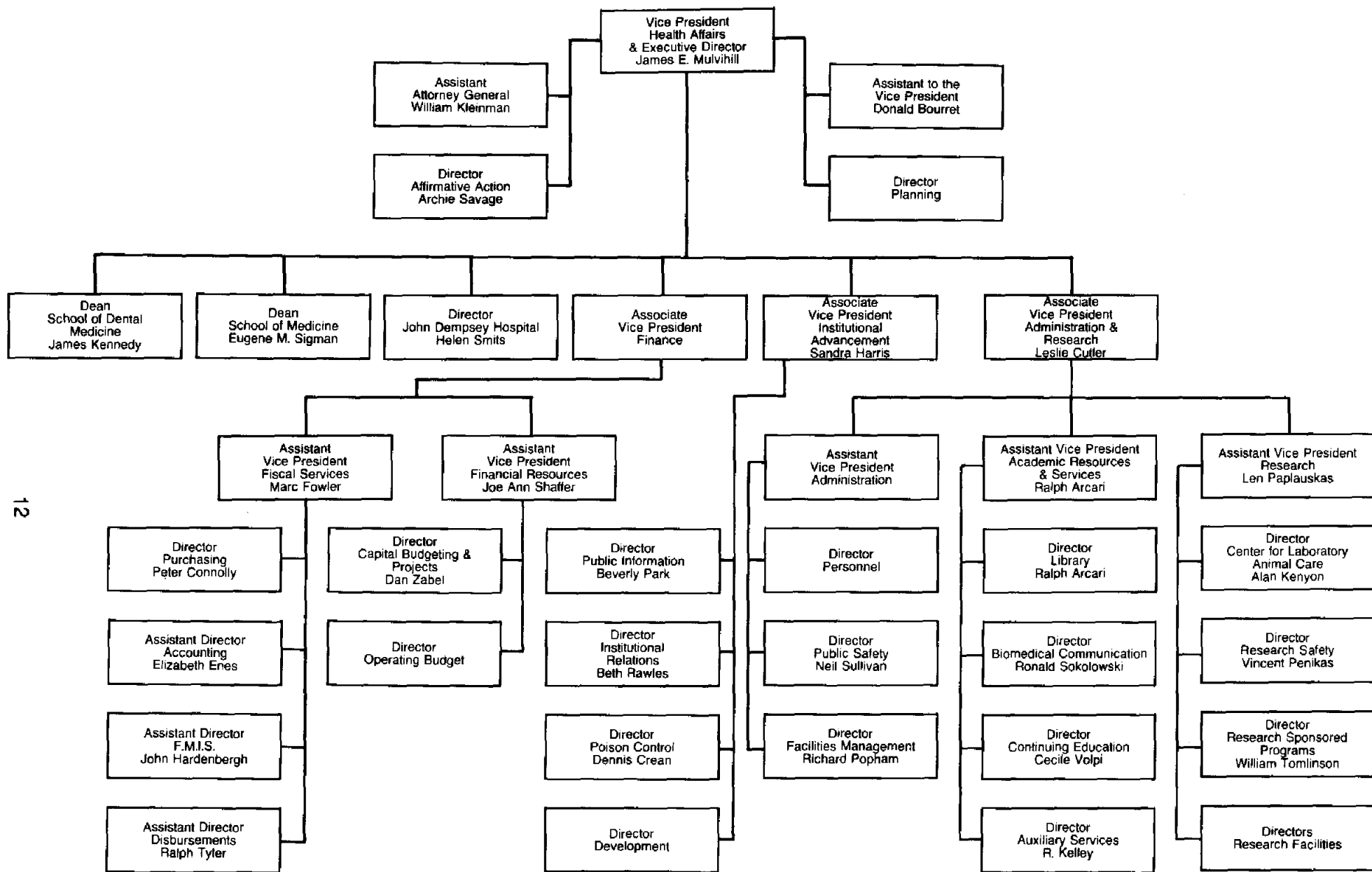
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1987**



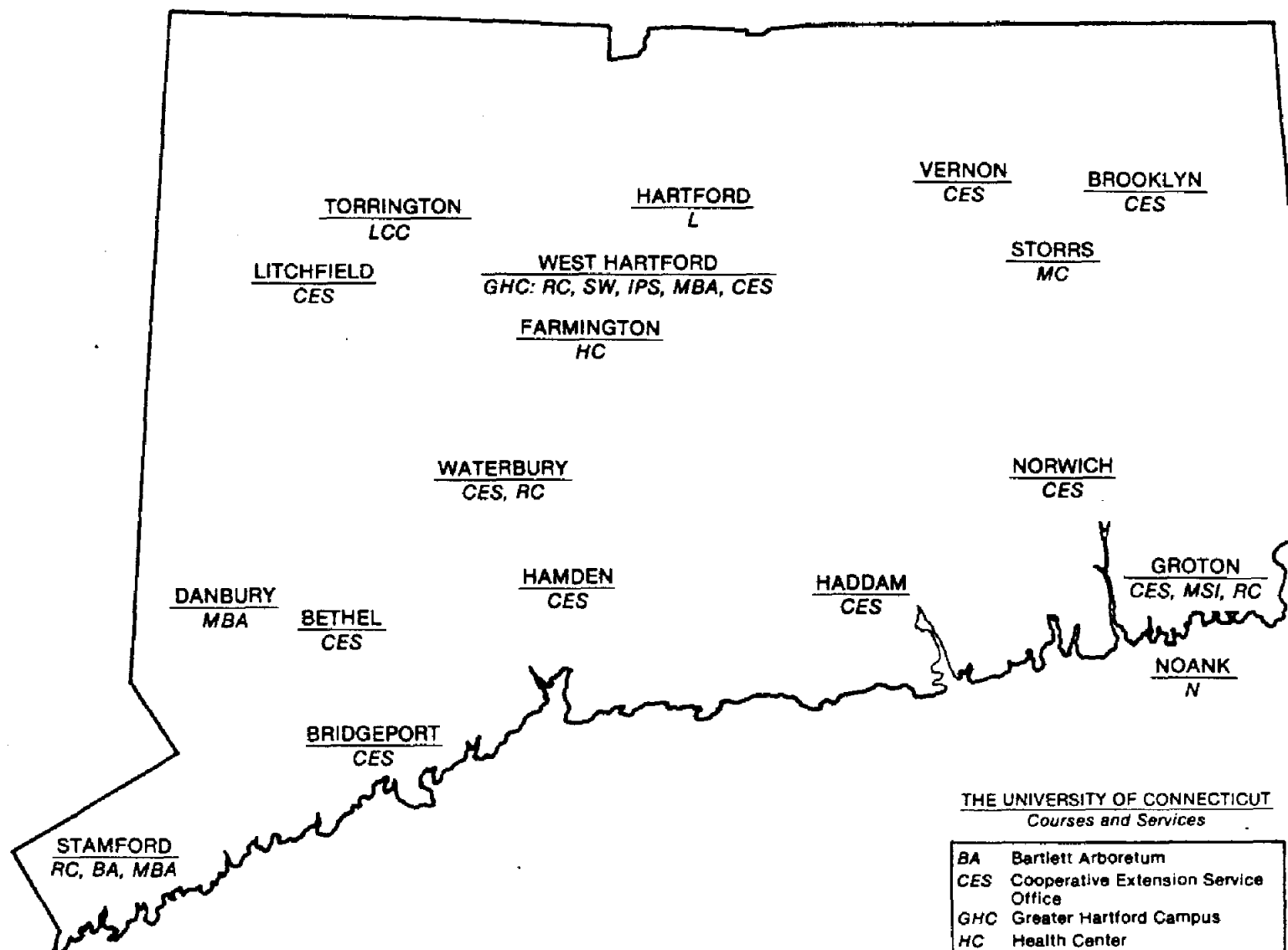

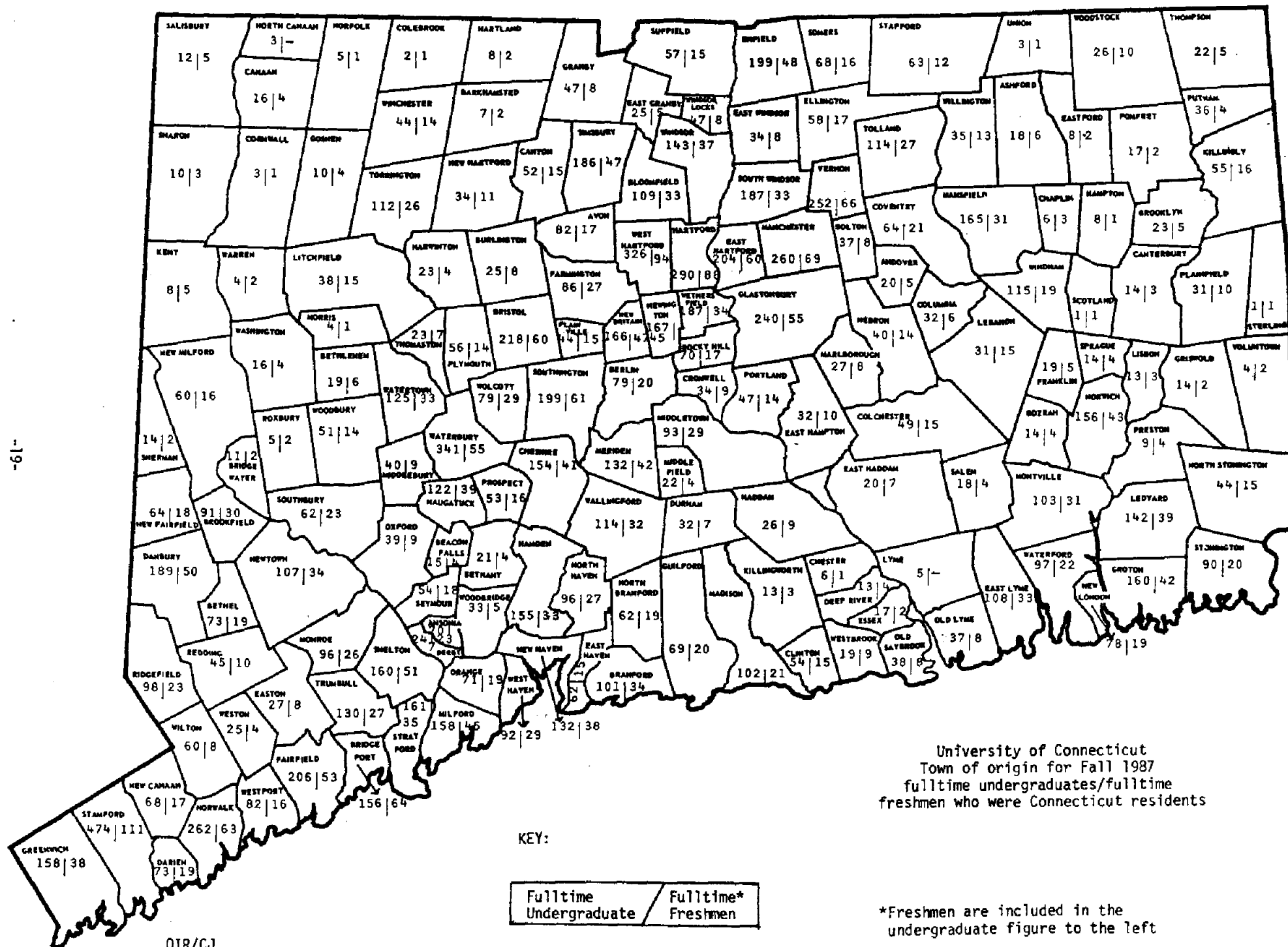

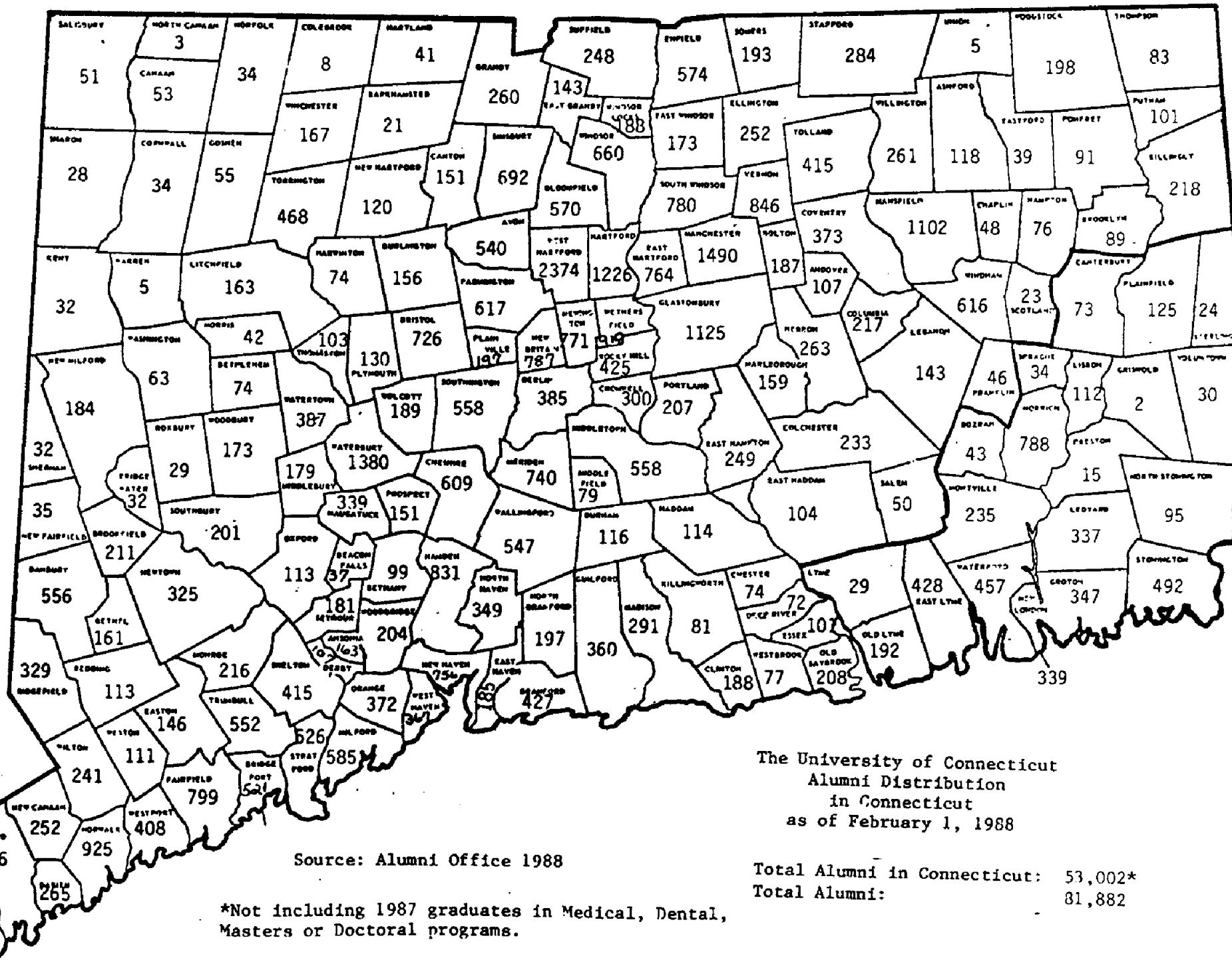
