PREFACE

Since its establishment in 1887, the Storrs Agricultural Experiment Station has continued to make valuable contributions in the major areas of agricultural economics, rural sociology, animal breeding, and animal nutrition.

The dairy, poultry and tobacco industries are of special concern in Connecticut, and they have been the subject of numerous research studies at the station. In addition, demographic analyses of the State of Connecticut based on the U.S. decennial censuses have satisfied the need of market researchers, educators, and others for whom population trends, growth, and migration patterns are significant. Members of the research staff at the station have included prominent scientists. Their research findings have been published in the important bulletin series.

Though station publications include more than one series, this index is specifically intended to provide better access to the 444 bulletins issued between 1888 and 1976. As an addenda I have added a chronological list of the bulletins published since number 444. These are not included in the subject matter section.
