



1988-89

Academic Structure: We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 50 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

Academic Fields: Undergraduates may major in 99 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 69 areas, and may choose from among 67 specialities for the Ph.D. degree.

Alumni: As of October 31, 1988, there are 81,458 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut

Admissions: As of October 1, 1988, 13,460 undergraduate applications for admission were received, 9,557 persons were admitted, and there were 3,849 registered.

Residence Halls: We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residence halls which accommodate 9,209 undergraduate and 440 graduate students.

Enrollment: For Fall, 1988 there are 17,287 undergraduate, graduate and non-degree students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 3,616 who are non-residents.

Extended and Continuing Education: During 1987-88, 2,585 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Professional Development and Career Education enrolled 29,268 people in 472 programs, administered in 25 Connecticut communities.

Fees: In 1988-89, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$2,293 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$2,790 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

Financial Aid: In 1987-88, awards totaling \$34,893,729 were made through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$9,091,611 in educational loans, \$4,435,920 in various forms of student employment, and \$21,366,198 in grants and scholarships.

Library: As of 6/30/88, the University Library in Storrs has 1.6 million volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2.2 million volumes.

Facilities: As of Fall, 1988 we have 372 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 3,976,414 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve approximately 11,150 registered cars.

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


**The University of Connecticut

as of February, 1989**




**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1988**




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

as of October, 1988**





as of October, 1988**





as of October, 1988**




**The University of Connecticut


