

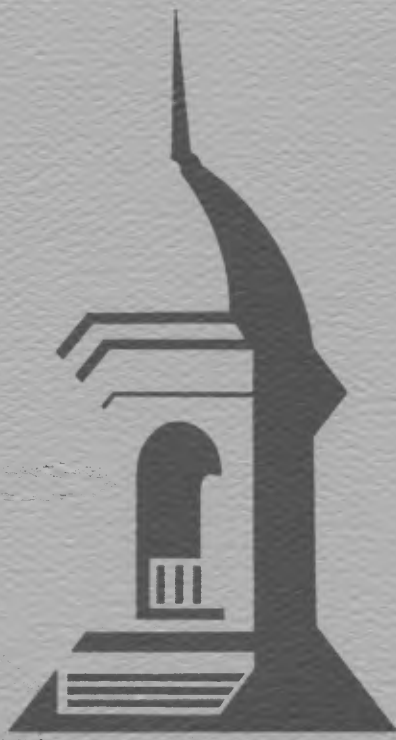

1989-90

Academic Structure: We have 14 Schools and Colleges with 46 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

Academic Fields: Undergraduates may major in 97 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 70 areas, and may choose from among 66 specialities for the Ph.D. degree.

Alumni: As of October 31, 1989, there are 83,296 alumni, with 64% of them living in Connecticut.

Admissions: As of October 1, 1989, 12,264 freshman applications for admission were received, 8,517 were admitted, and 3,111 were registered.

Residence Halls: We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residence halls which accommodate 8,866 undergraduate and 442 graduate students.

Enrollment: For Fall, 1989 there are 16,722 undergraduate, graduate and non-degree students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 3,548 who are non-residents.

Extended and Continuing Education: During 1988-89, 19,877 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Professional Development and Career Education enrolled 15,523 people in 472 programs, administered in 25 Connecticut communities & 24 foreign countries.

Fees: In 1989-90, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$2,631 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$3,660 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

Financial Aid: In 1988-89, awards totaling \$38,708,356 were made through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$10,444,754 in educational loans, \$5,099,755 in various forms of student employment, and \$23,163,847 in grants and scholarships.

Library: As of 6/30/89, the University Library in Storrs has 1.7 million volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2.3 million volumes.

Facilities: As of Fall, 1989 we have 373 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 3,976,329 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads: it has 92 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 50 acres of parking lots to serve approximately 12,000 registered cars.

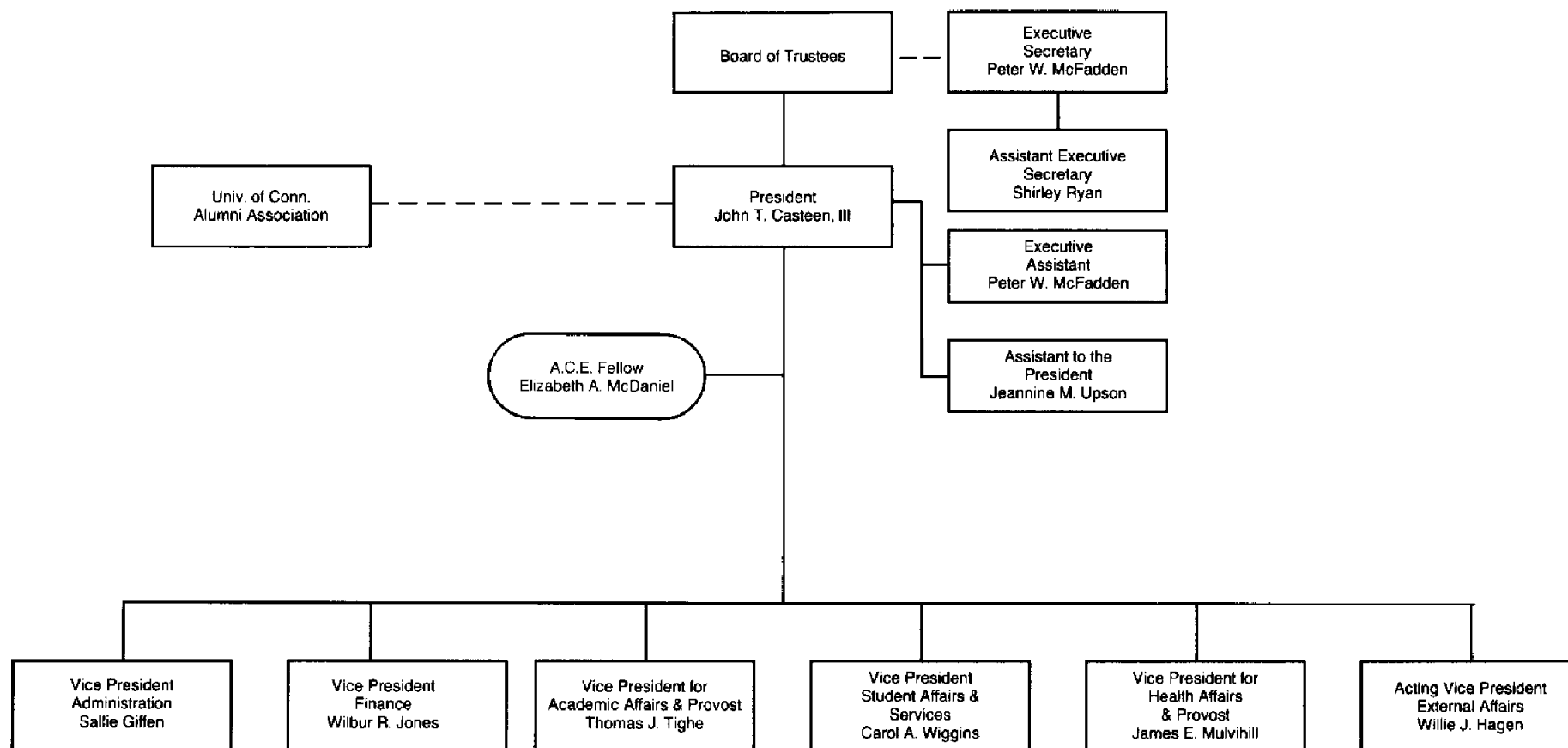

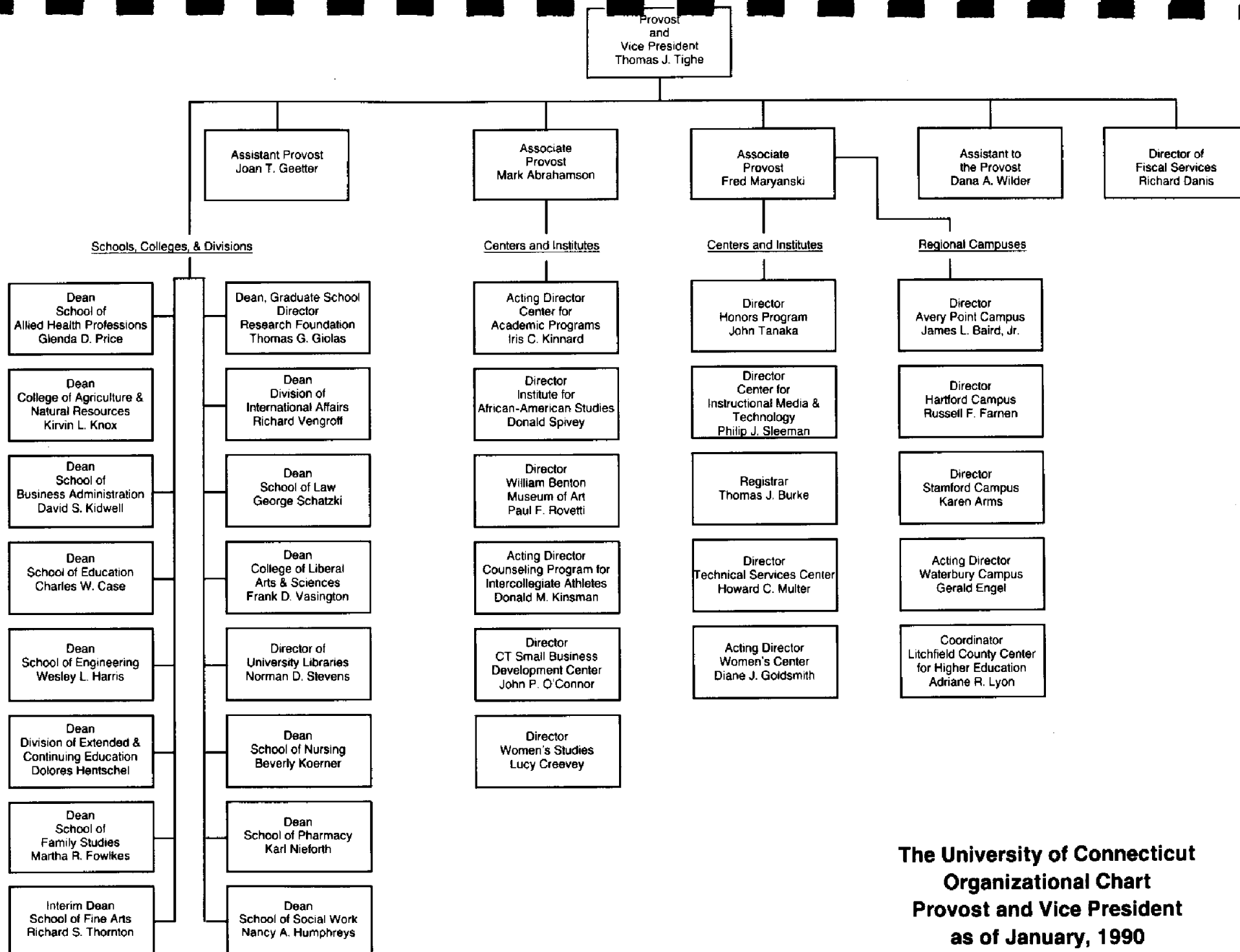

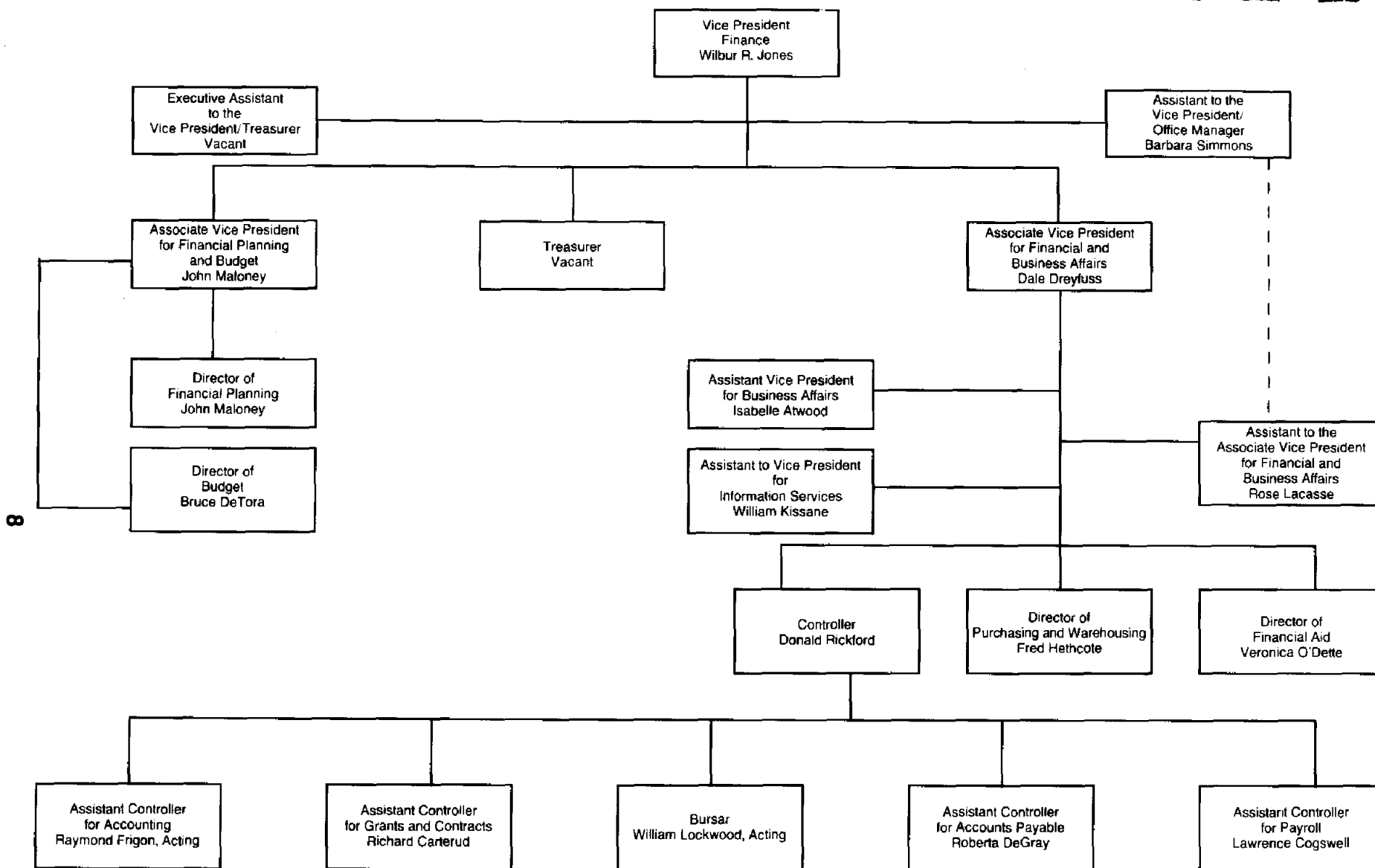
**The University of Connecticut

as of January, 1990**



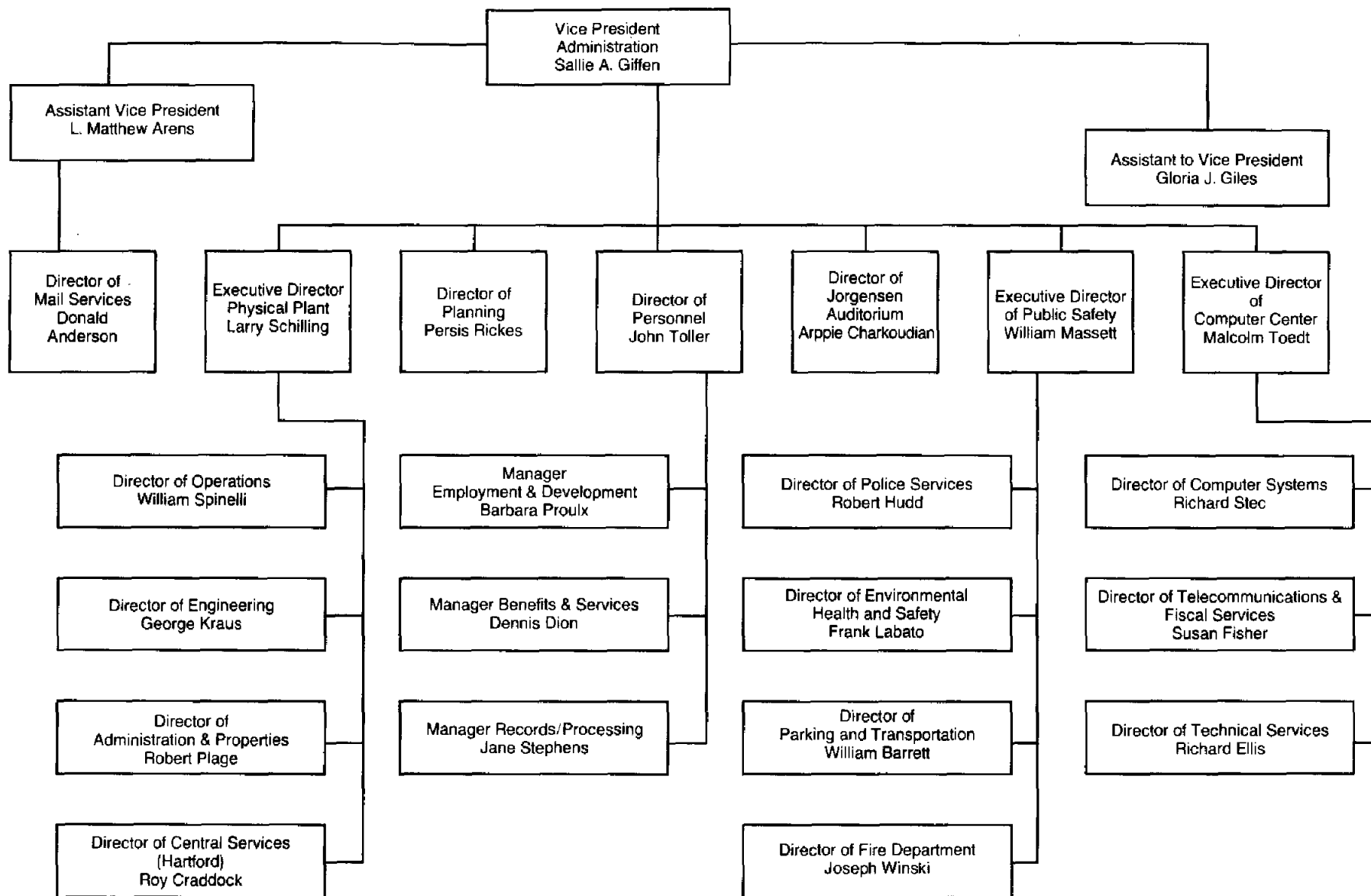
**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1989**

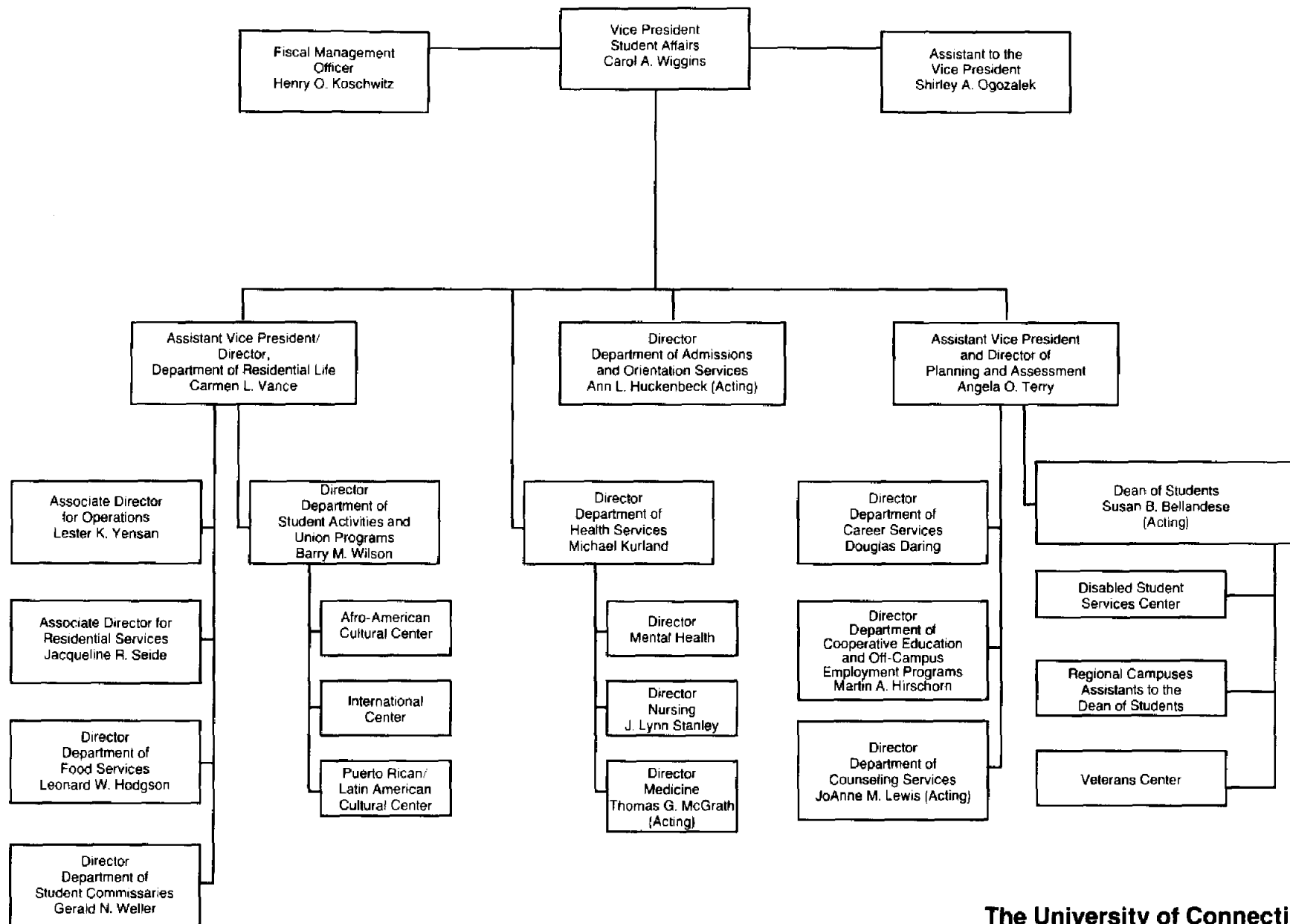


**The University of Connecticut

as of January, 1990**

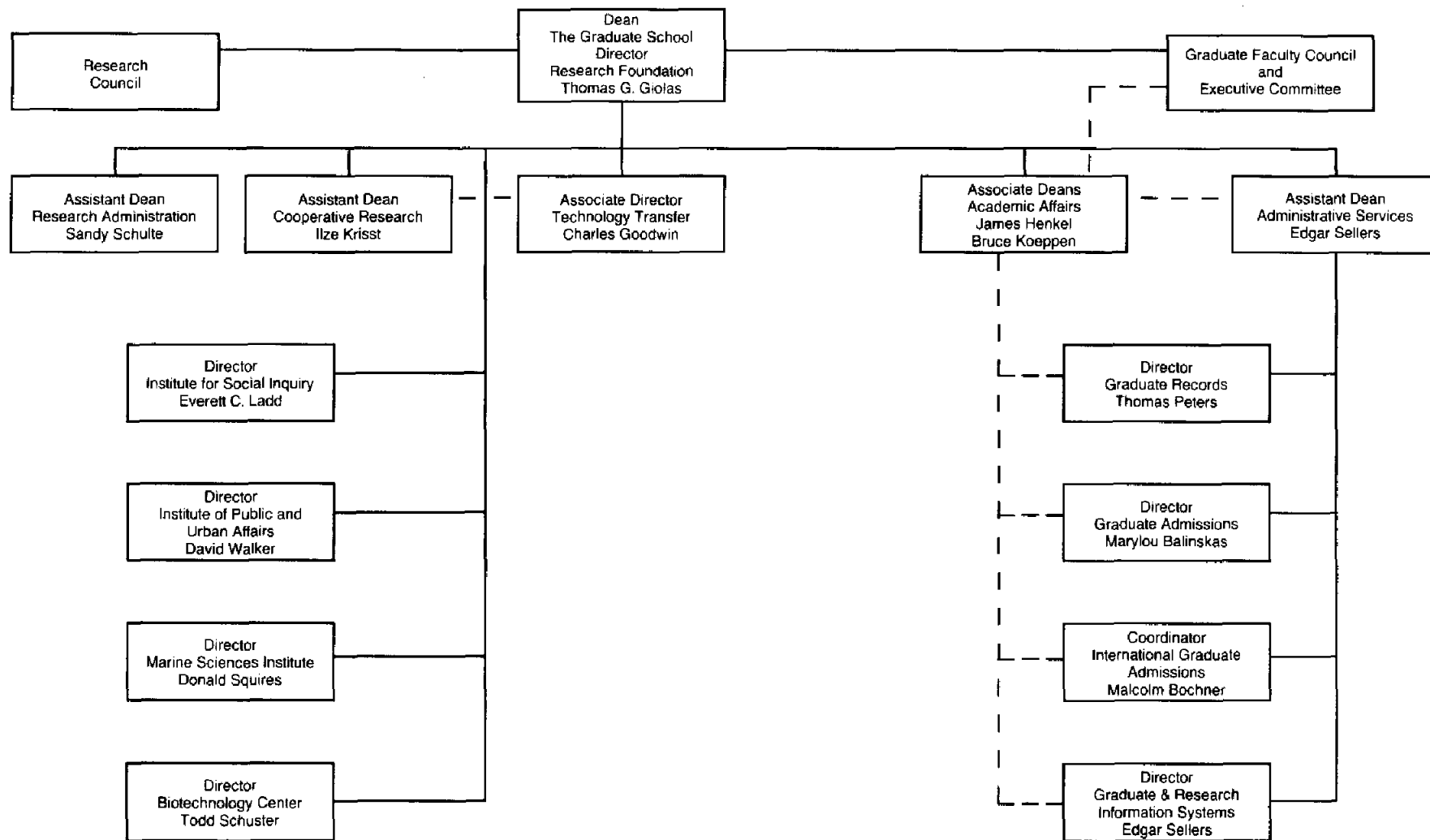


**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1989**

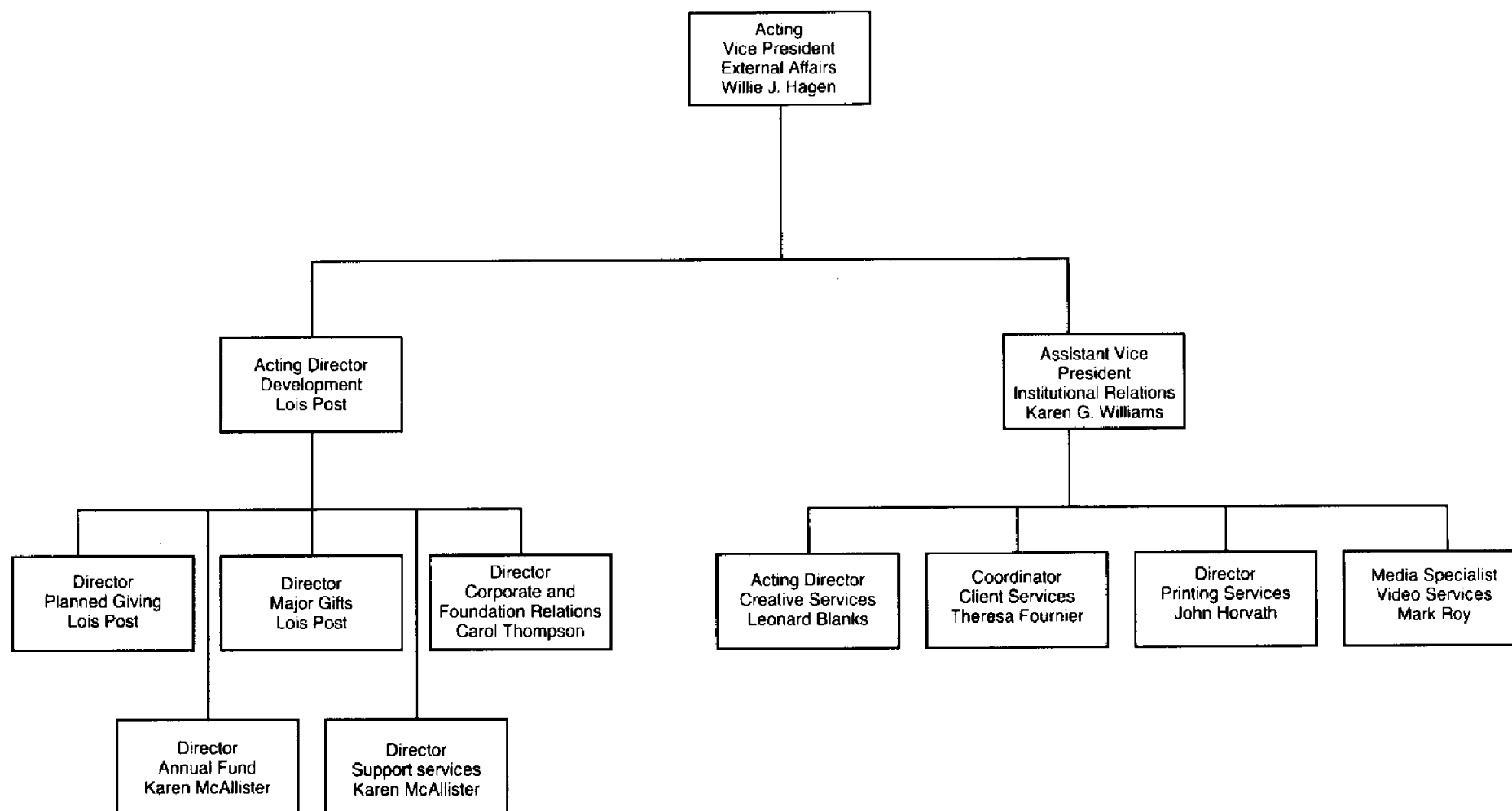




**The University of Connecticut

as of October, 1989**

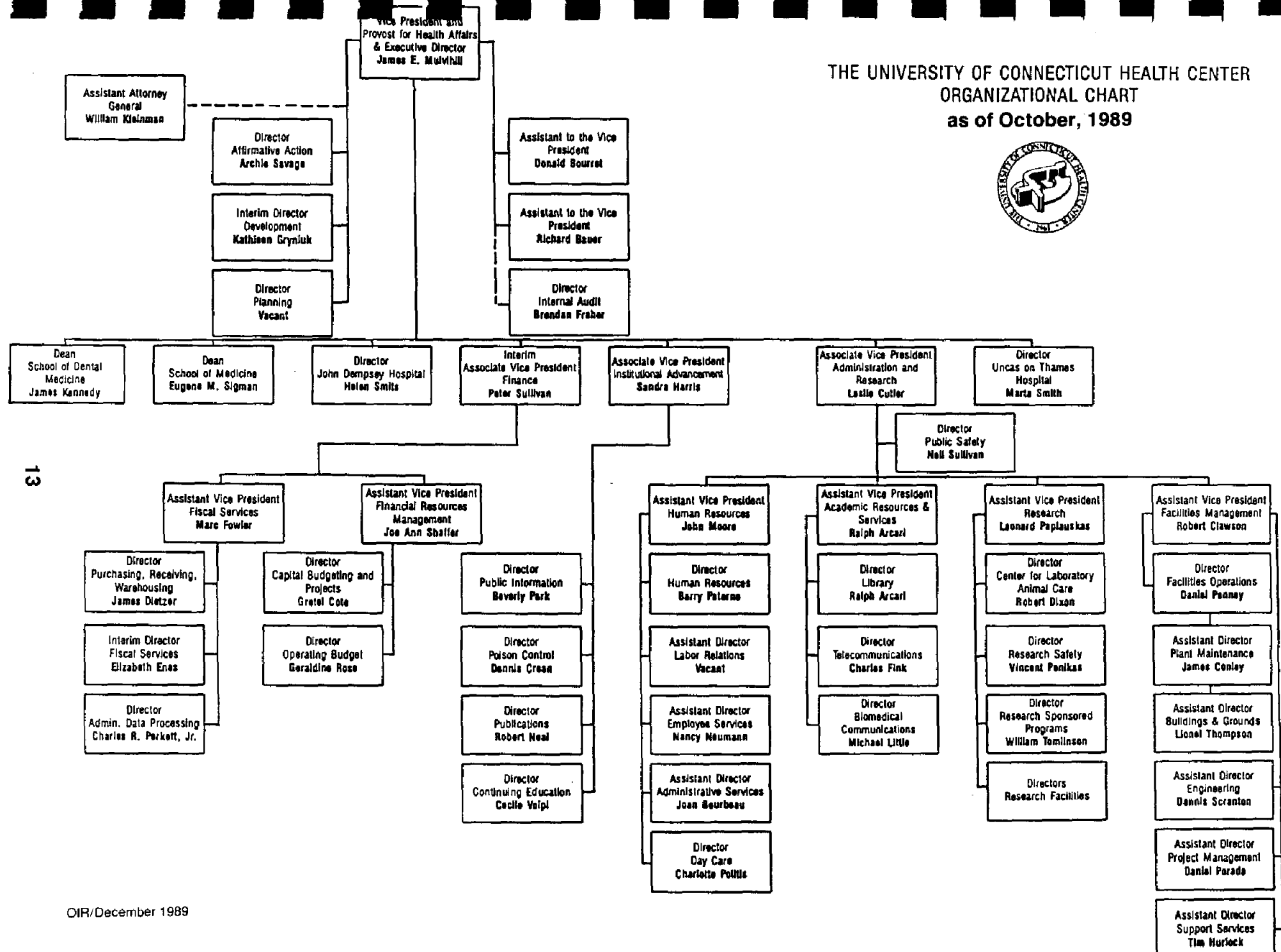


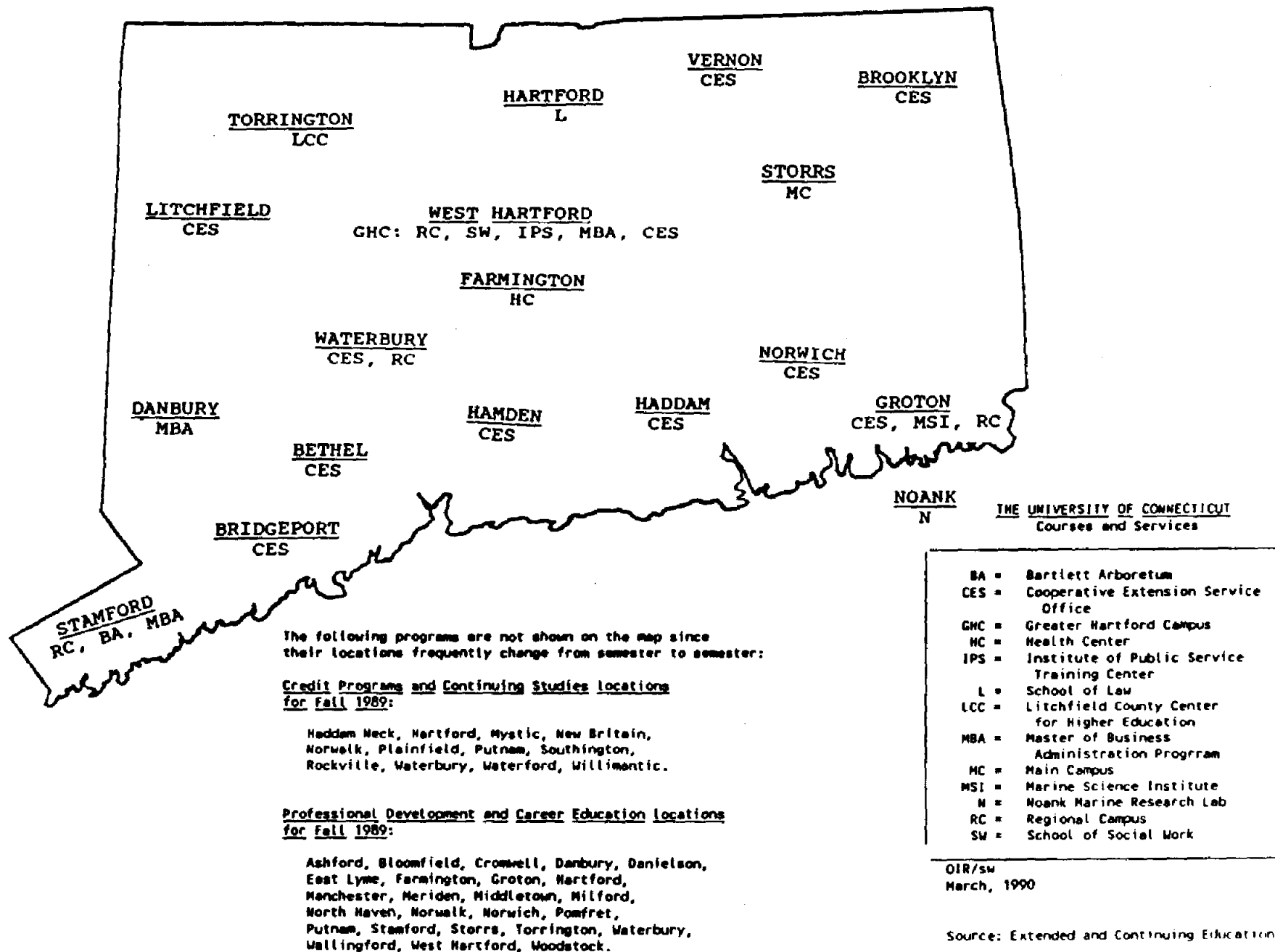
**The University of Connecticut

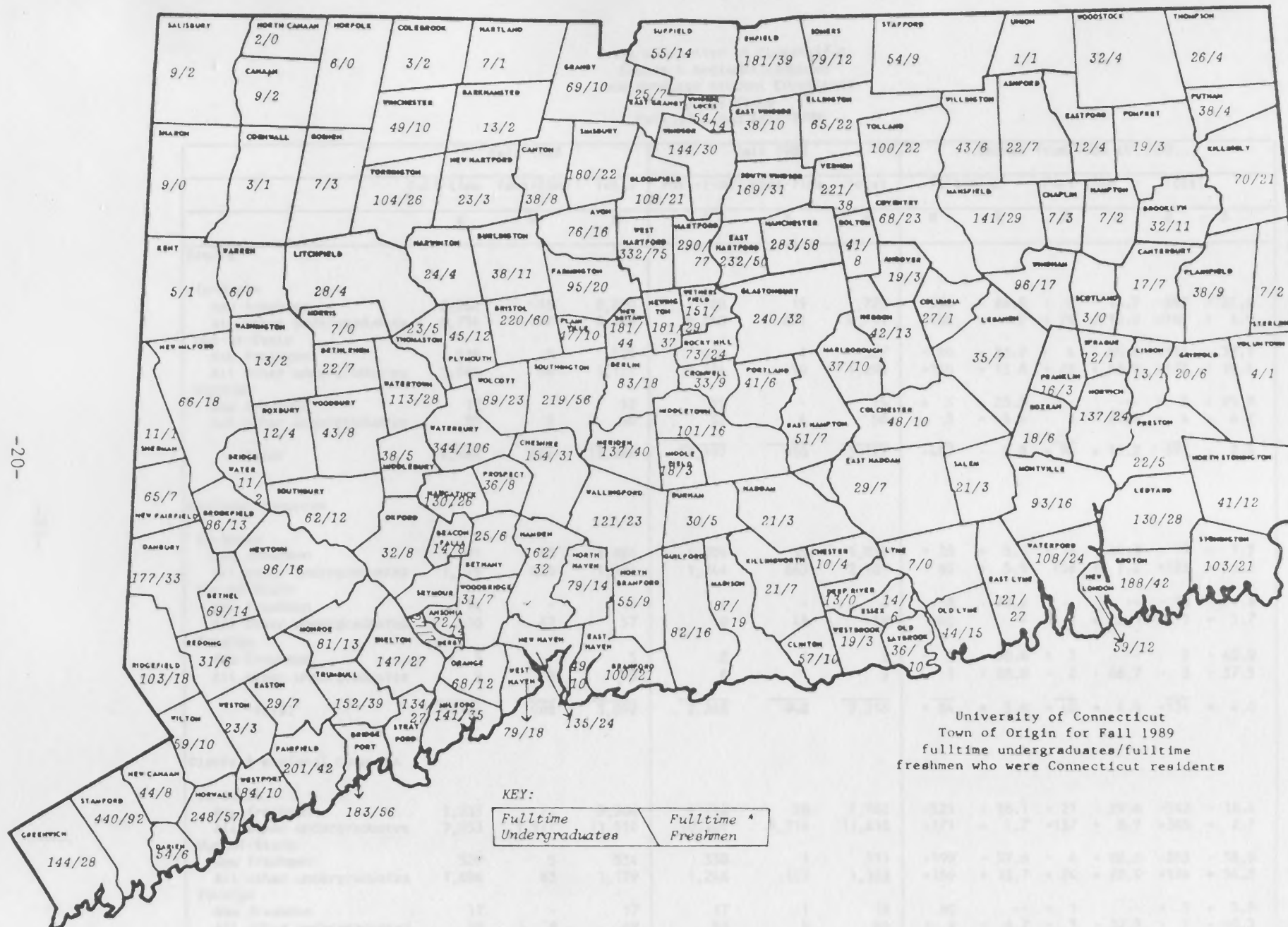
