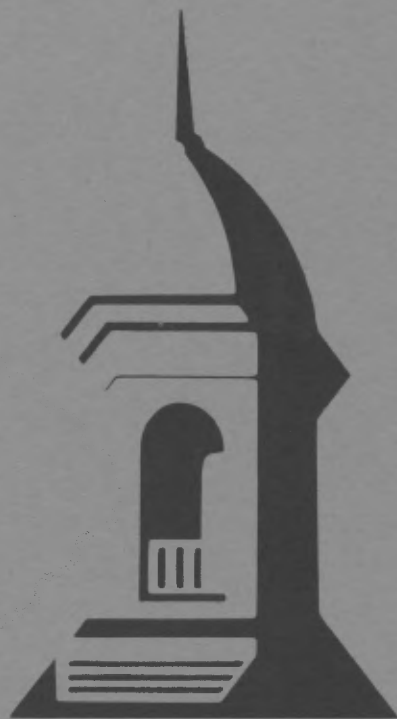
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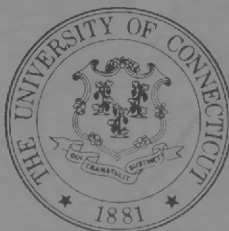

**Academic Structure:** We have 15 Schools and Colleges with 46 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

**Academic Fields:** Undergraduates may major in 99 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 72 areas, and may choose from among 64 specialities for the Ph.D. degree.

**Alumni:** As of September 6, 1990, there are 88,334 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut.

**Admissions:** As of September 1, 1990, 11,282 freshman applications for admission were received, 8,775 were admitted, and 3,032 were registered.

**Residence Halls:** We have 88 undergraduate and 3 graduate residence halls which accommodate 8,903 undergraduate and 442 graduate students.

**Enrollment:** For Fall, 1990 there are 13,617 undergraduate, graduate and non-degree students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 6,592 who are non-residents.

**Extended and Continuing Education:** During 1989-90, 21,769 people enrolled in statewide credit courses. Professional Development and Career Education enrolled 14,563 people in 305 programs, administered in 22 Connecticut communities & 24 foreign countries.

**Fees:** In 1990-91, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$2,975 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$4,258 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

**Financial Aid:** In 1989-90, awards totaling \$32,059,308 were made through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$11,382,170 in educational loans, \$4,419,303 in various forms of student employment, and \$16,257,835 in grants and scholarships.

**Library:** As of 6/30/90, the University Library in Storrs has 1.77 million volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2.4 million volumes.

**Facilities:** As of Fall, 1990 we have 375 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,094,360 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 118 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 60 acres of parking lots to serve approximately 12,500 registered cars.

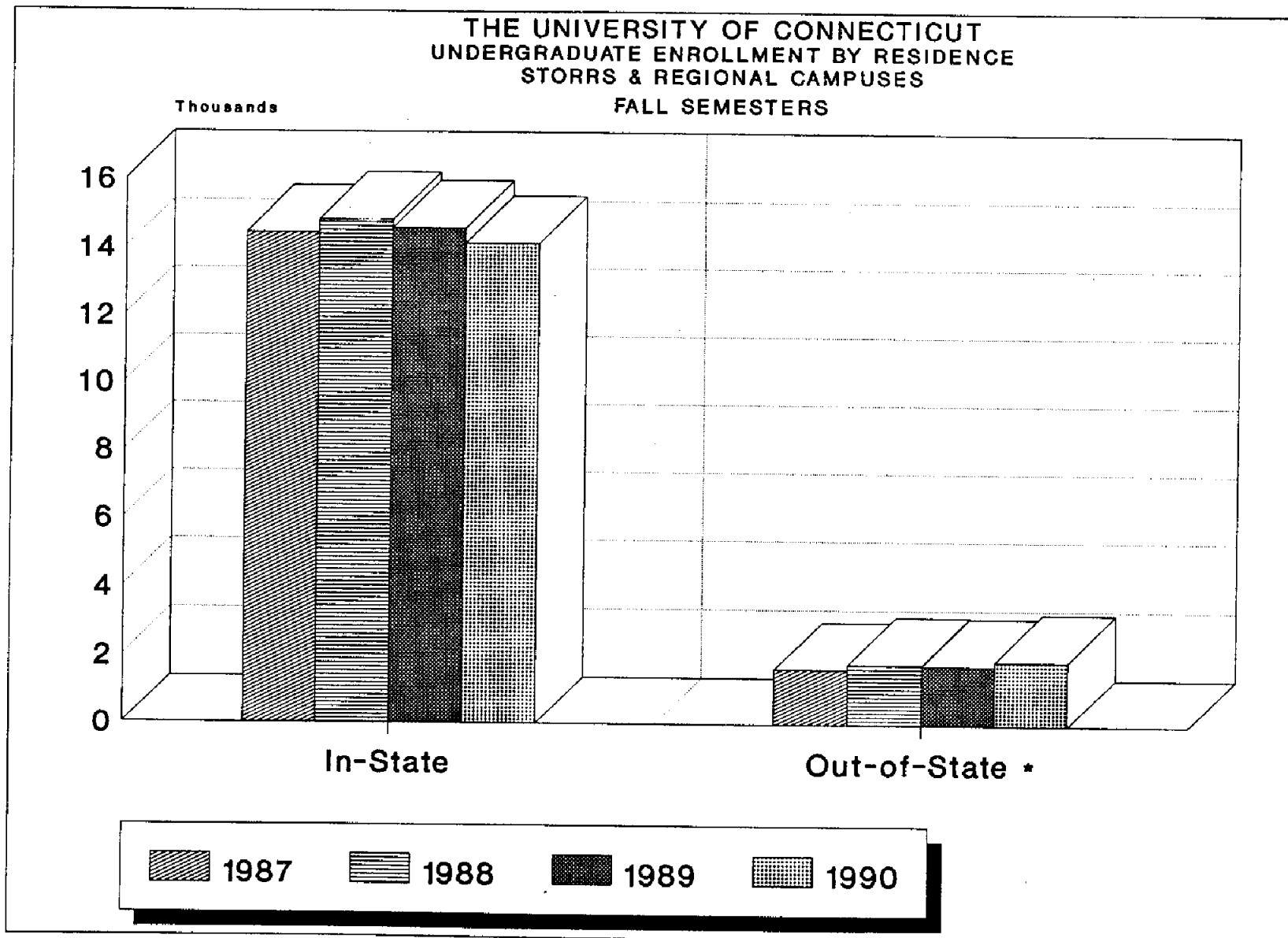

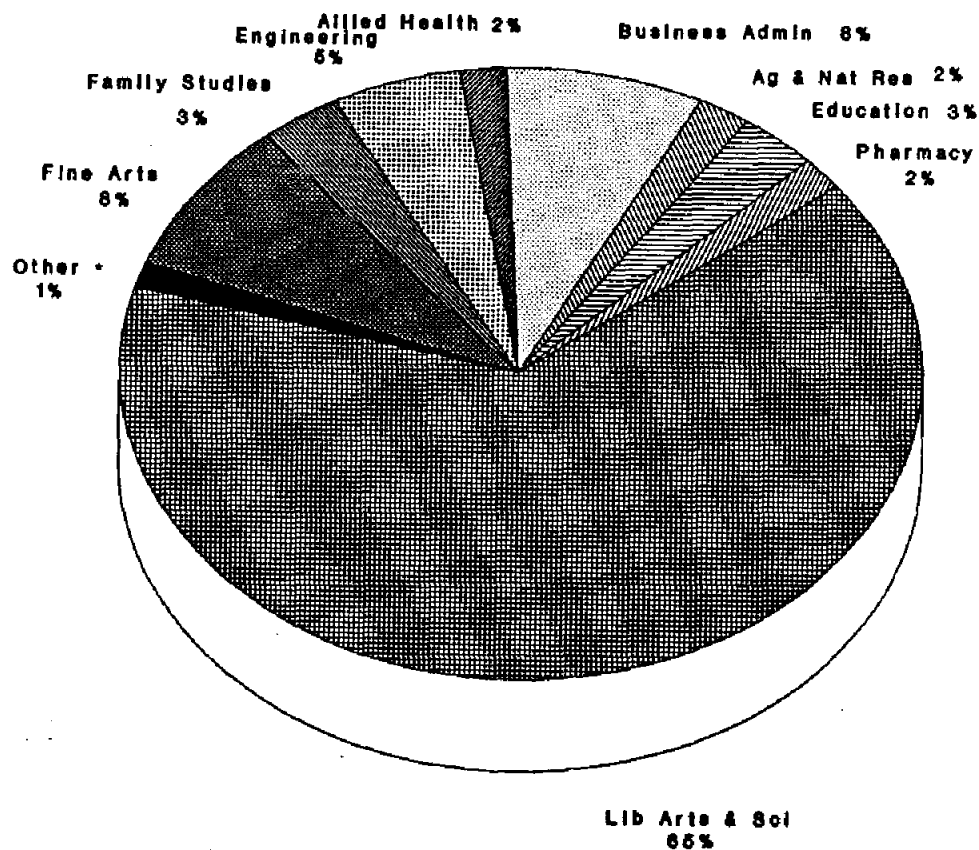

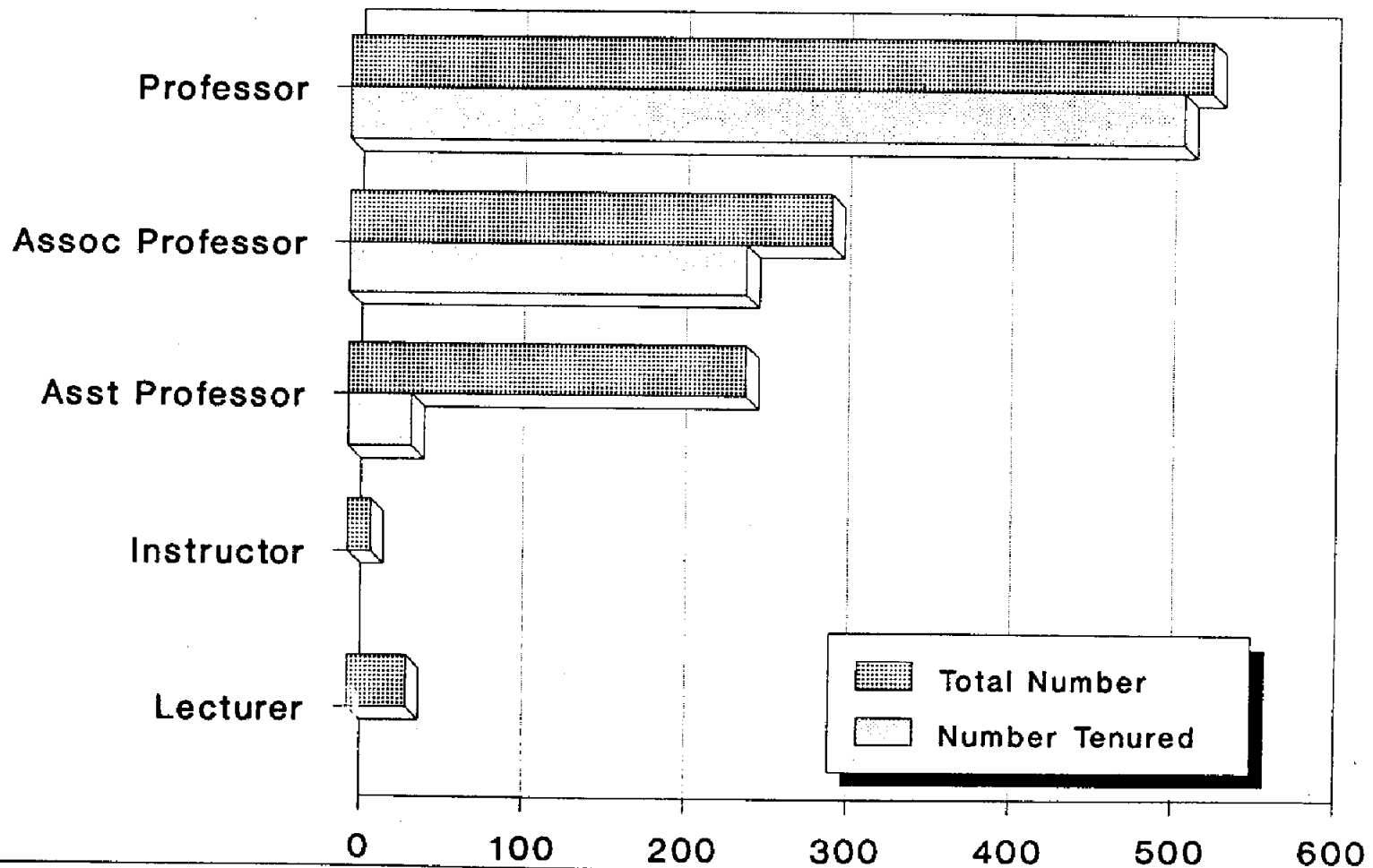

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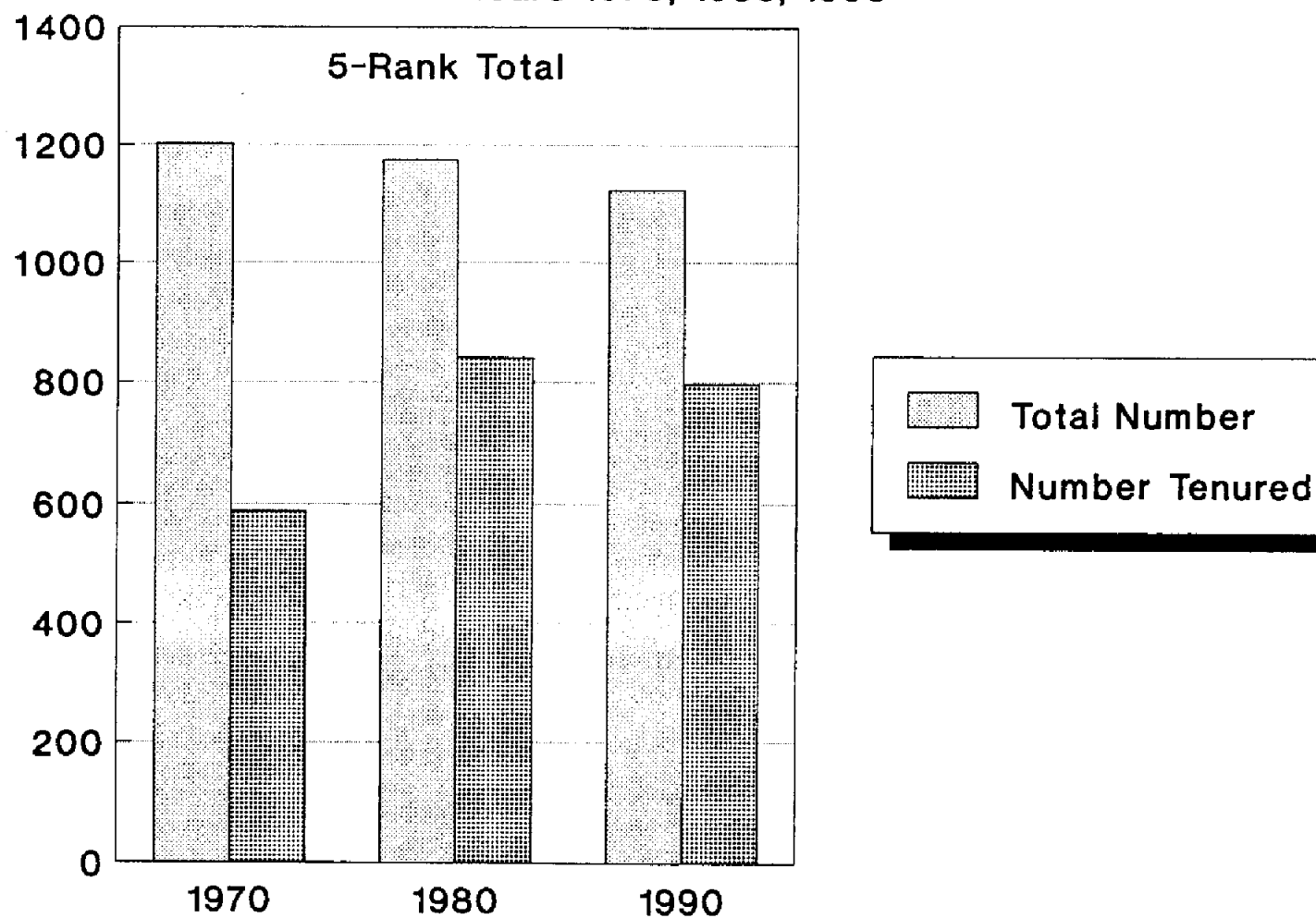

Years 1970, 1980, 1990

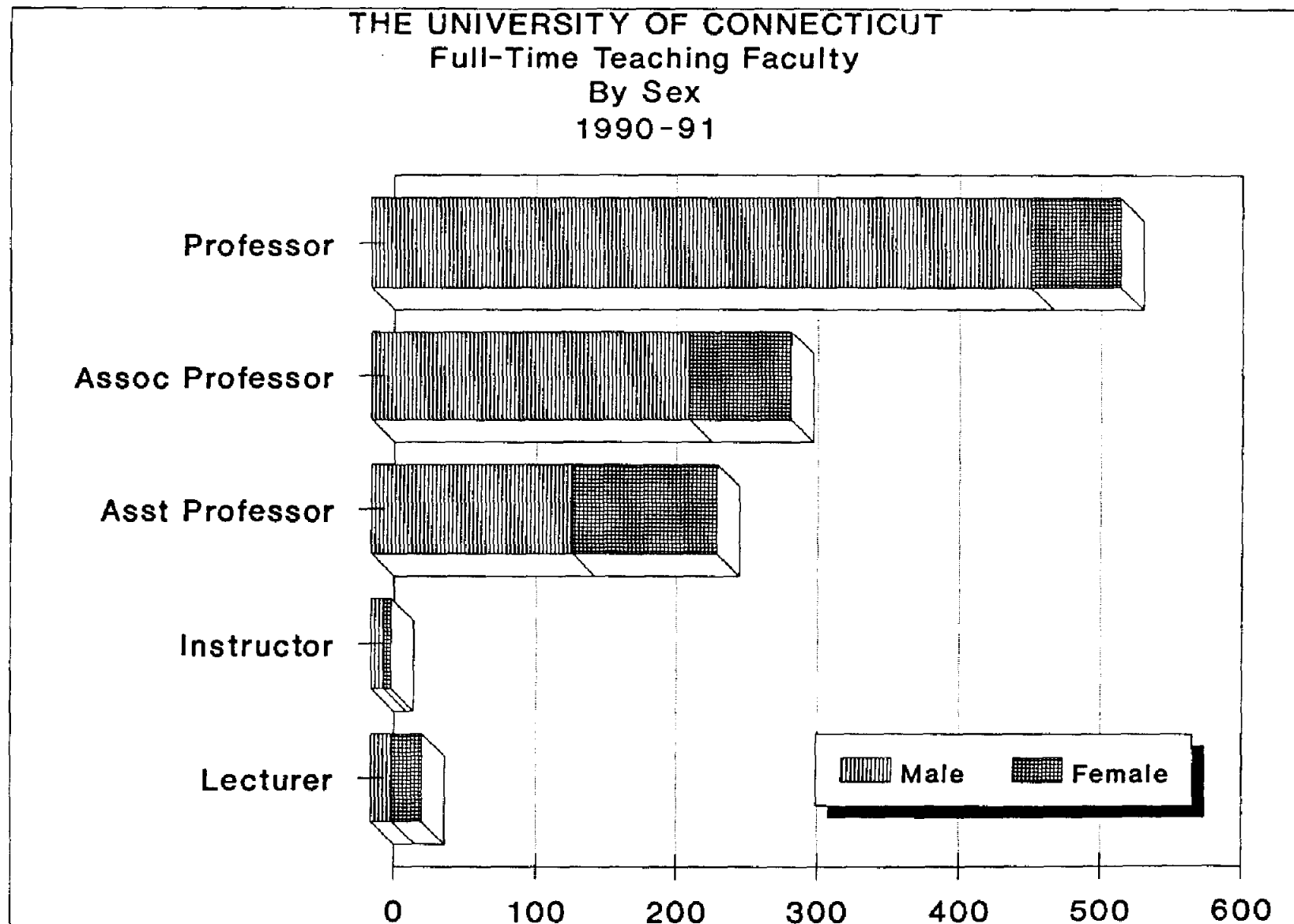

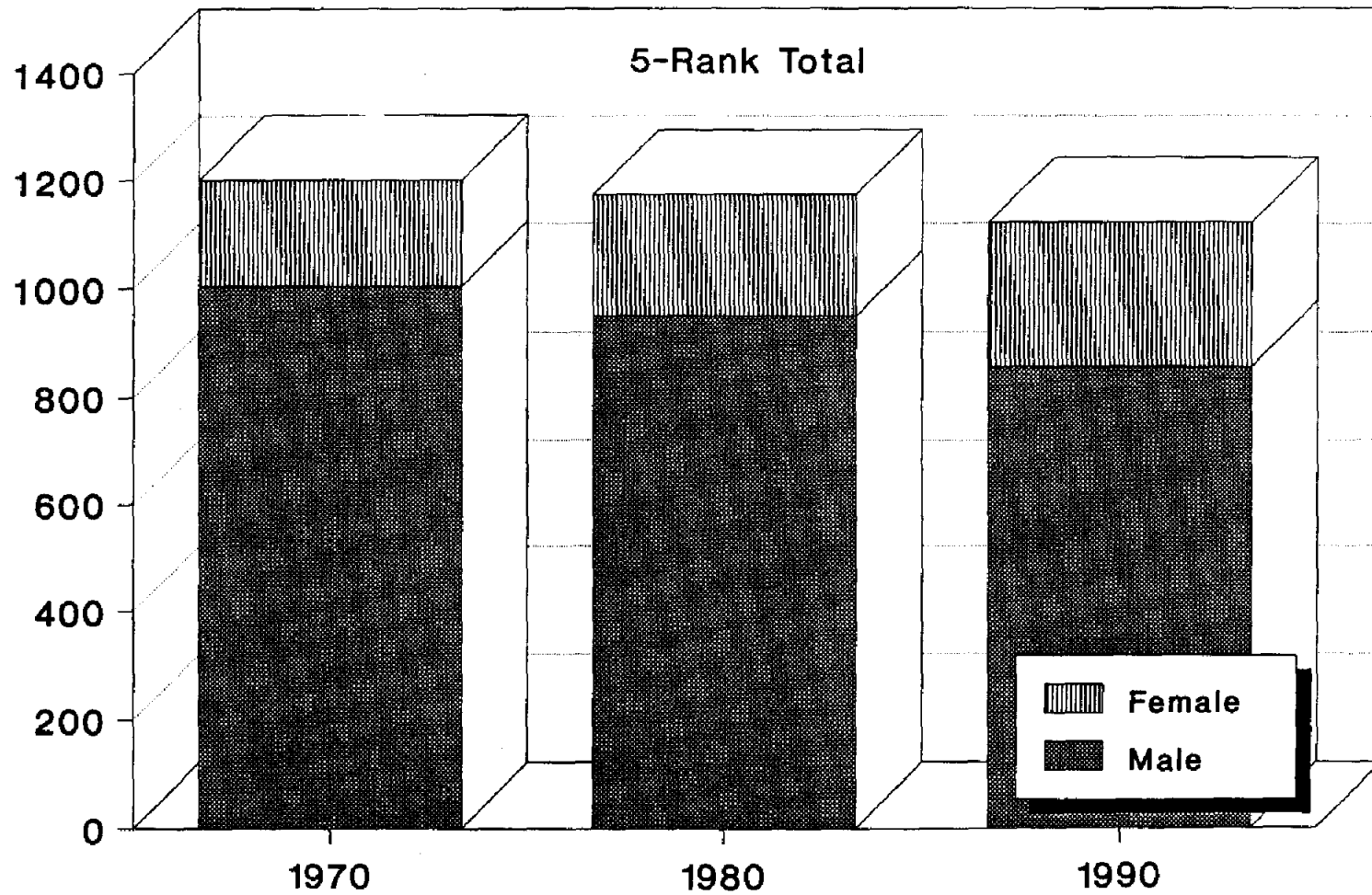

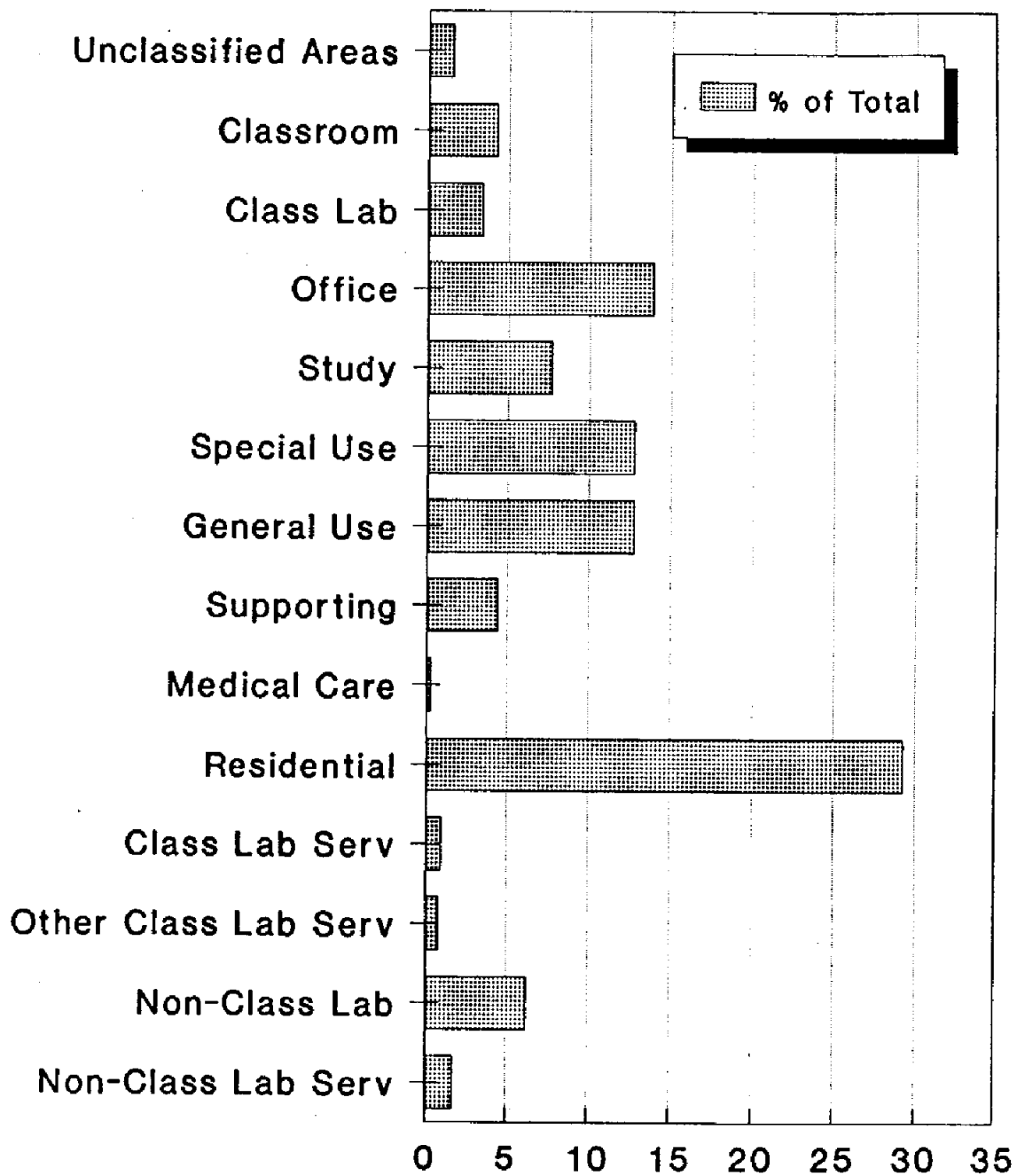
