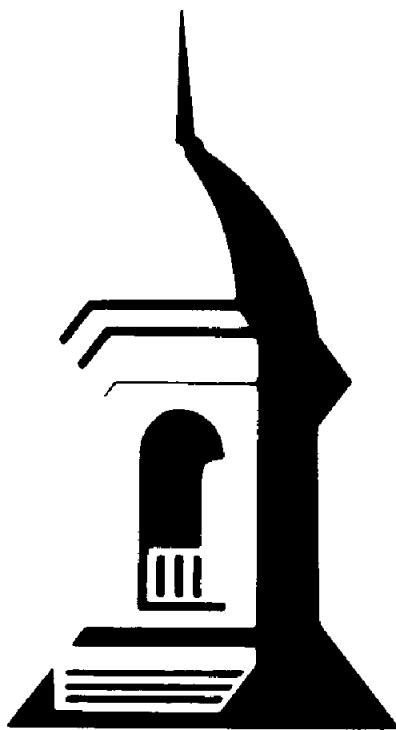
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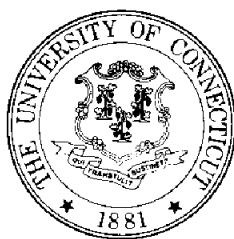

Academic Structure: We have 15 Schools and Colleges with 46 Academic Departments offering 17 different kinds of degrees.

Academic Fields: Undergraduates may major in 105 different fields. At the graduate level, students may earn Master's Degrees in 70 areas, and may choose from among 65 specialities for the Ph.D. degree.

Alumni: As of October 23, 1991, there are 92,815 alumni, with 65% of them living in Connecticut.

Admissions: As of October 1, 1991, 12,742 freshman applications for admission were received, 9,092 were admitted, and 2,879 were registered.

Residence Halls: We have 88 undergraduate residence halls with a design capacity of 8,633, and 3 graduate residence halls which accommodate 442 students.

Enrollment: For Fall, 1991 there are 16,447 undergraduate, graduate and non-degree students enrolled on the Storrs Campus who are Connecticut residents, and 3,456 who are non-residents.

Extended and Continuing Education: During 1990-91, 62,165 people were served by Extended and Continuing Education: 23,276 enrolled in statewide credit courses, 21,177 in programs offered through Continuing Professional Education, and 17,712 in programs through the Centers and Institutes which make up the Office of Public Service and Applied Research. Programs were offered in 91 Connecticut communities.

Fees: In 1991-92, it cost an average undergraduate Connecticut student \$3,946 in tuition and fees, and an average of \$4,522 for room and board to attend the University for one year.

Financial Aid: In 1990-91, awards totaling \$51,213,558 were made through various programs of financial assistance.

This total amount was composed of \$15,614,467 in educational loans, \$5,922,984 in various forms of student employment, and \$29,676,107 in grants and scholarships.

Library: As of 6/30/91, the University Library in Storrs has 1.8 million volumes, 294,540 assignable square feet, and tables and chairs to accommodate 3,000 students. At all campus locations, University Libraries have a total of 2.4 million volumes.

Facilities: As of Fall, 1991 we have 383 usable structures on the Storrs campus, with a total of 4,142,896 assignable square feet of floor space.

The Storrs campus has 23 miles of roads; it has 118 miles of sidewalk to sand, 400 acres of lawn to mow, and over 60 acres of parking lots to serve approximately 12,500 registered cars.

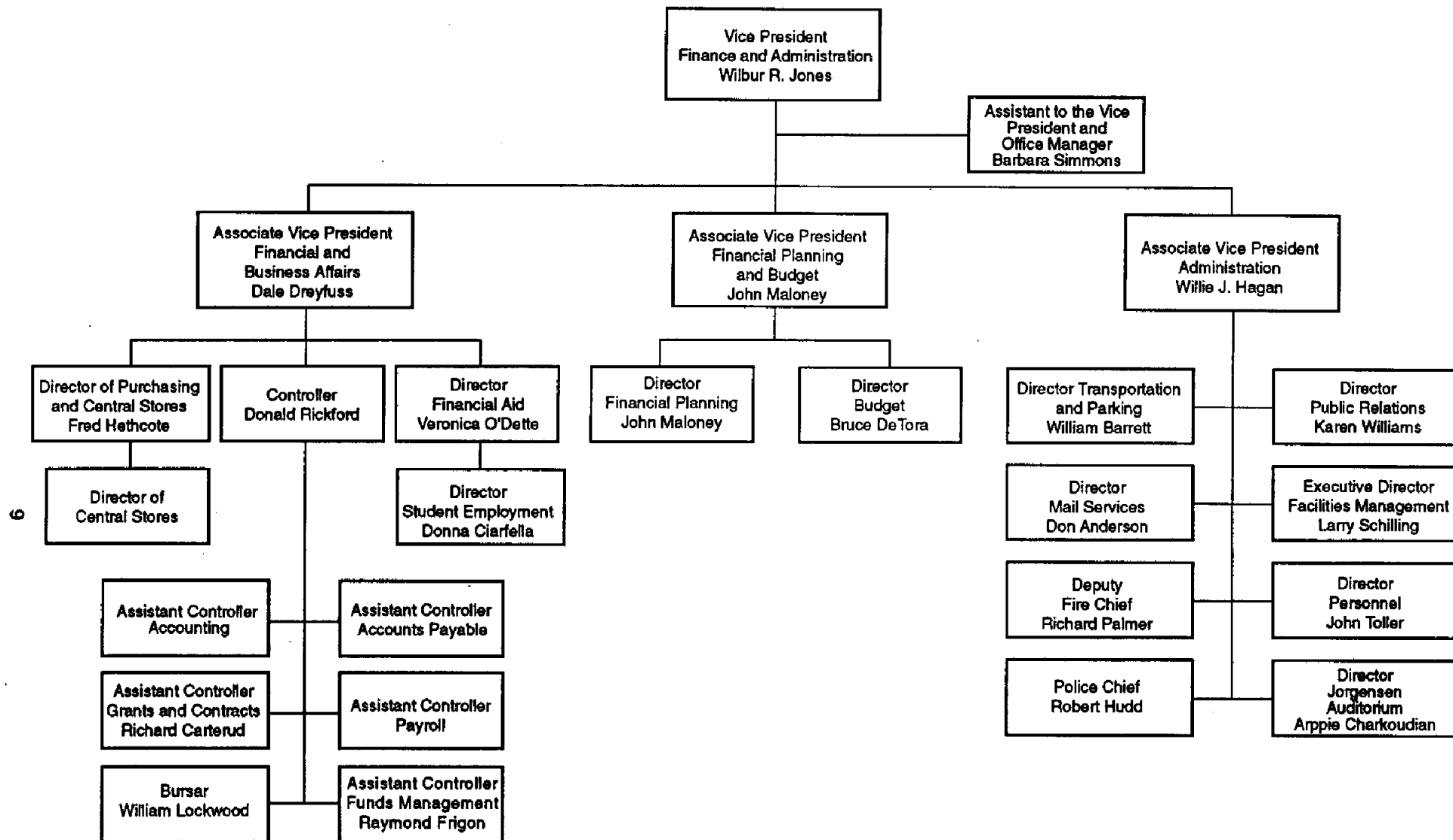

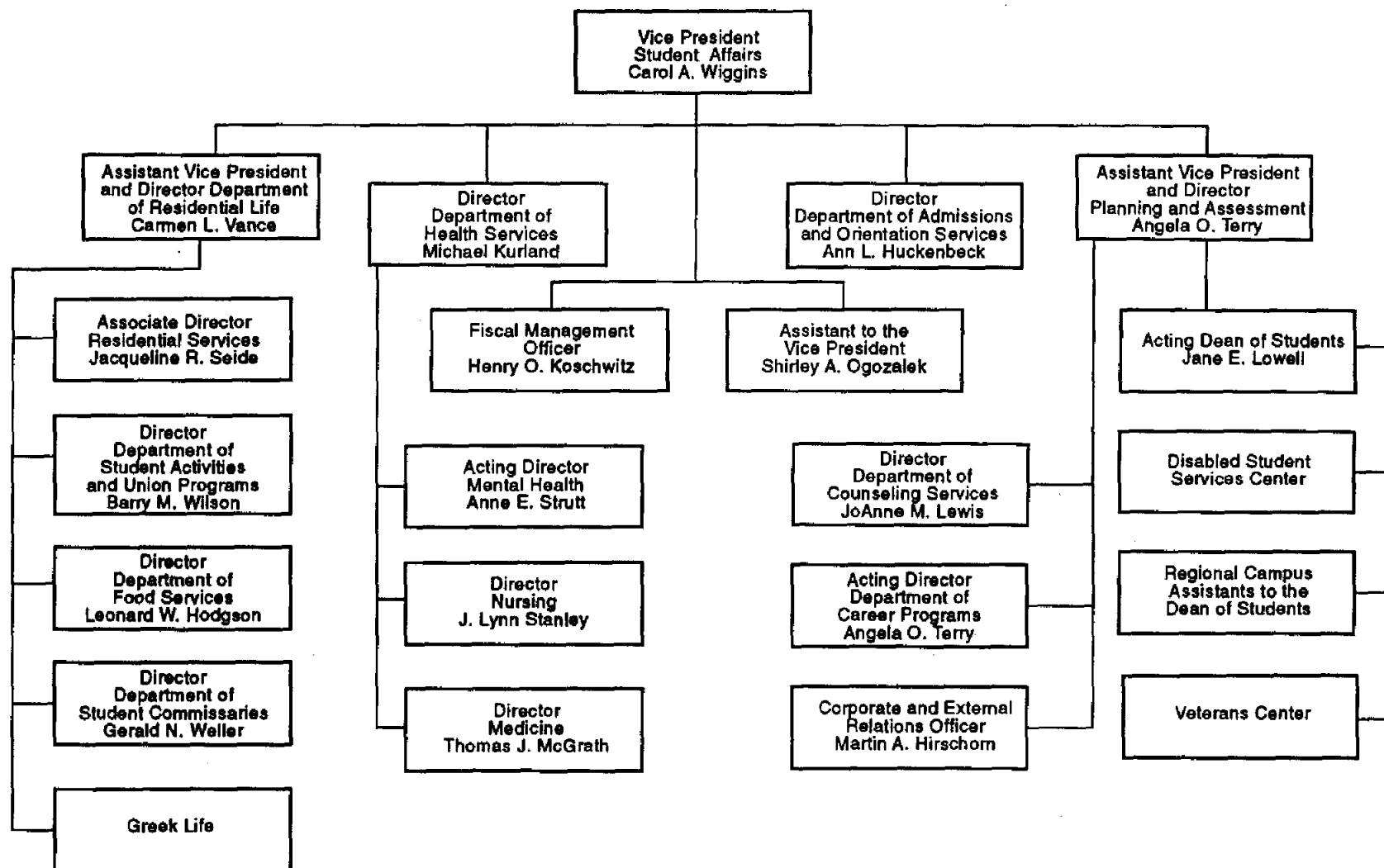




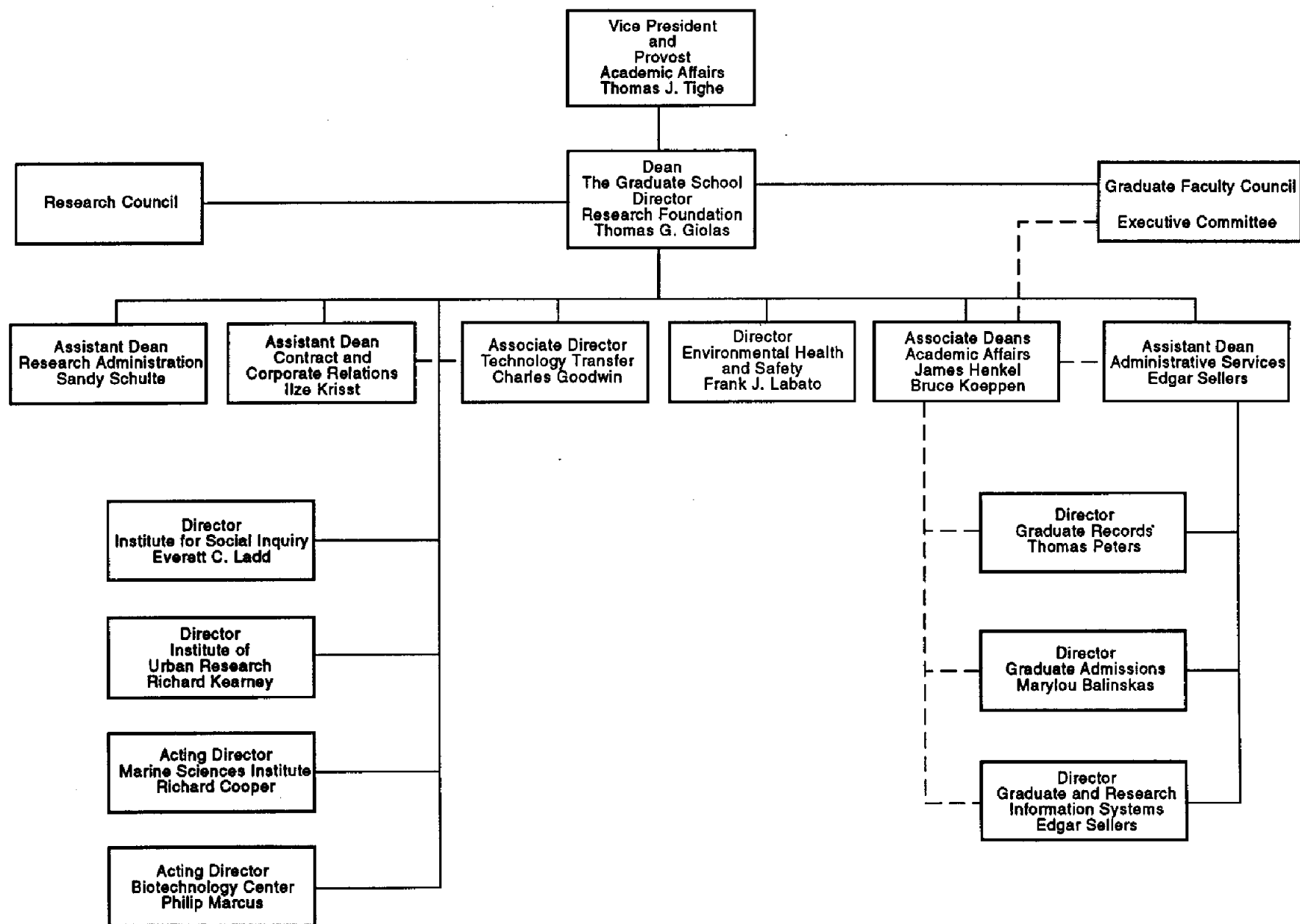
**The University of Connecticut

as of March, 1992**



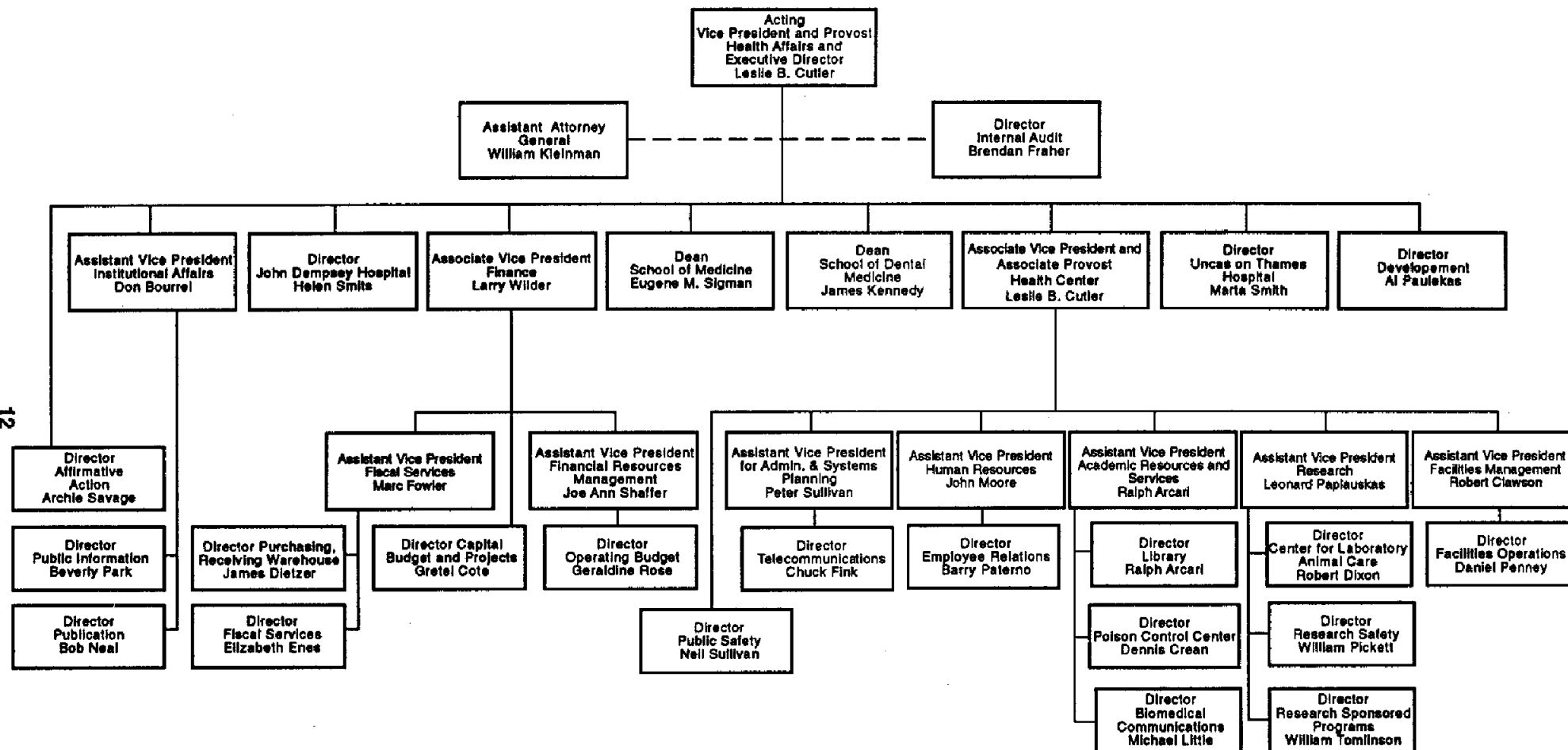
The University of Connecticut

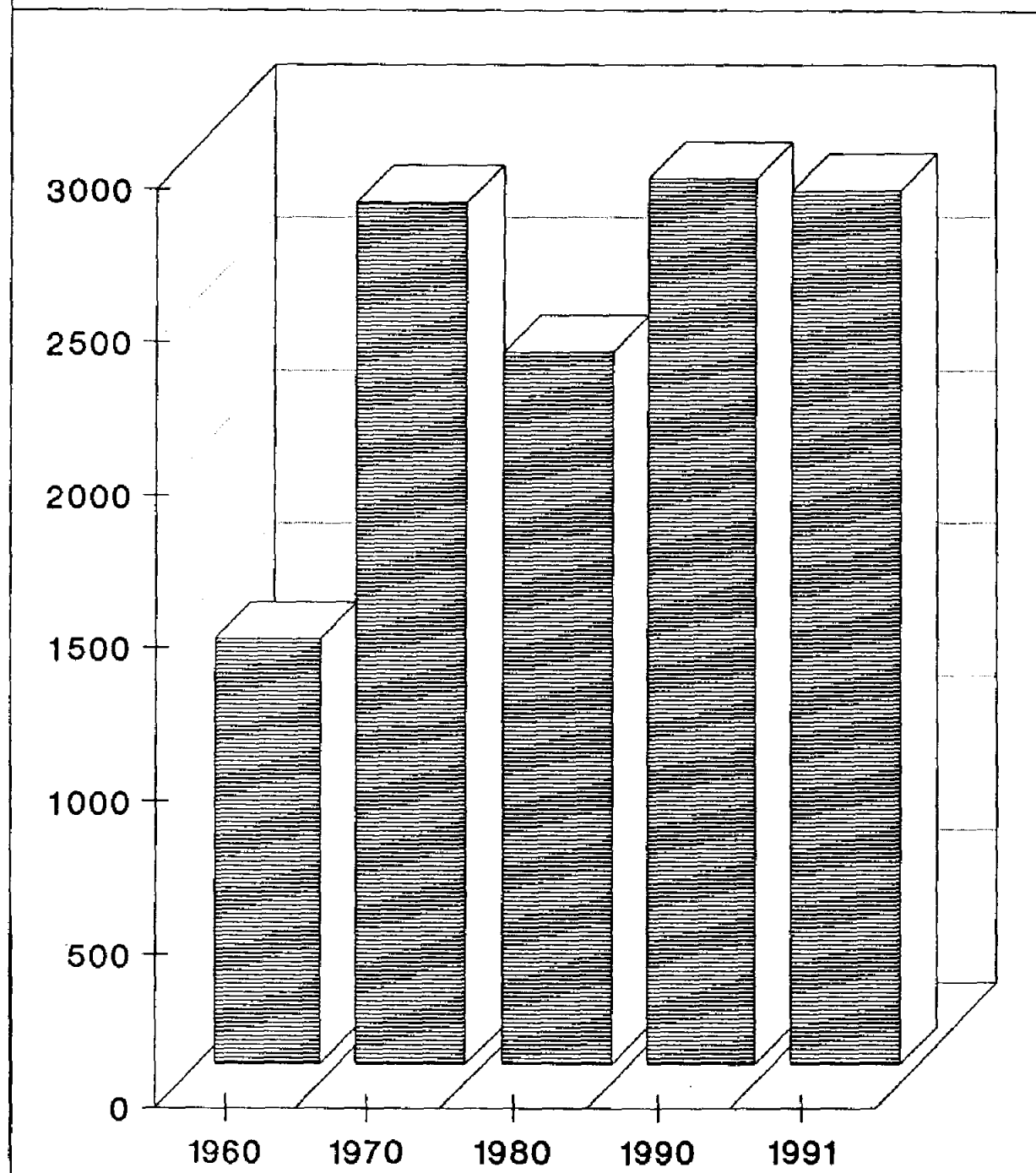

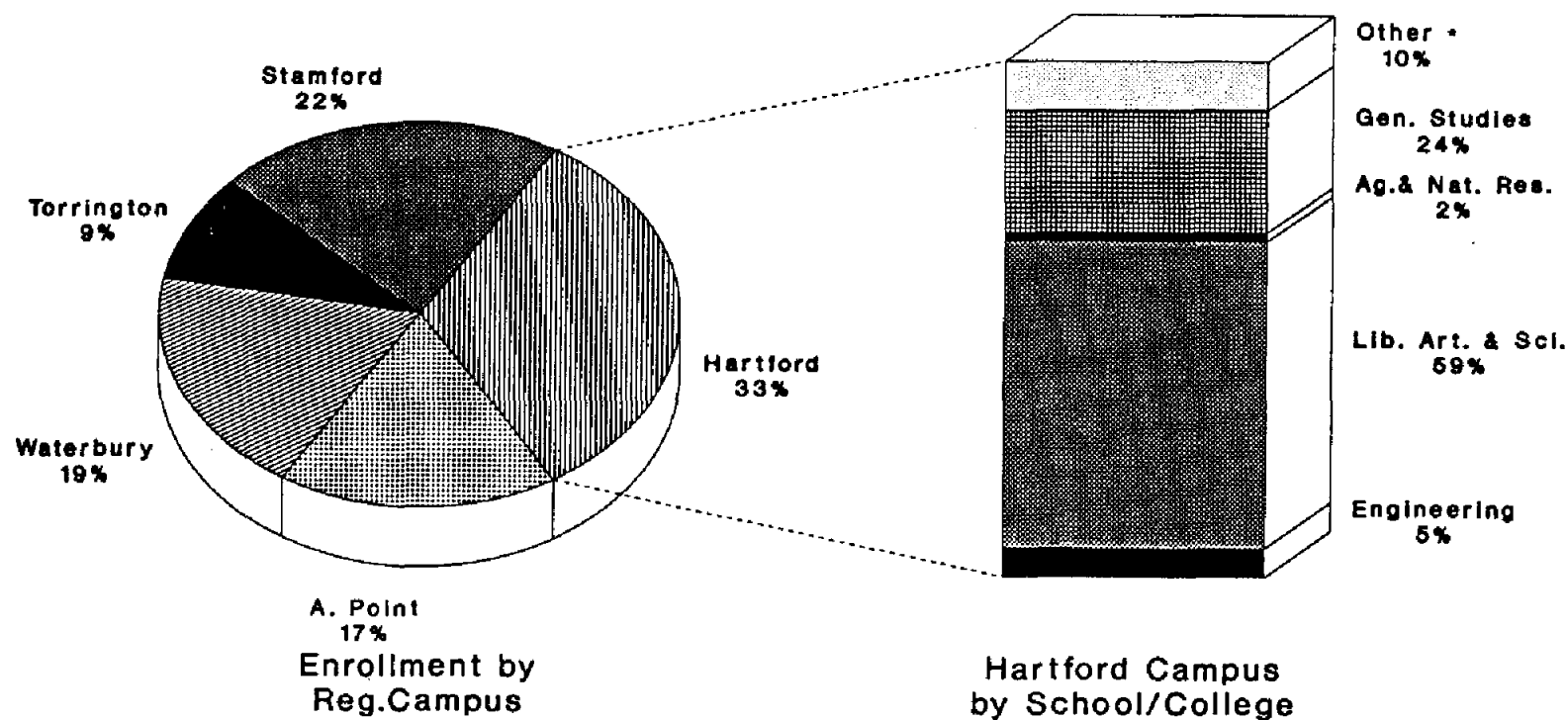

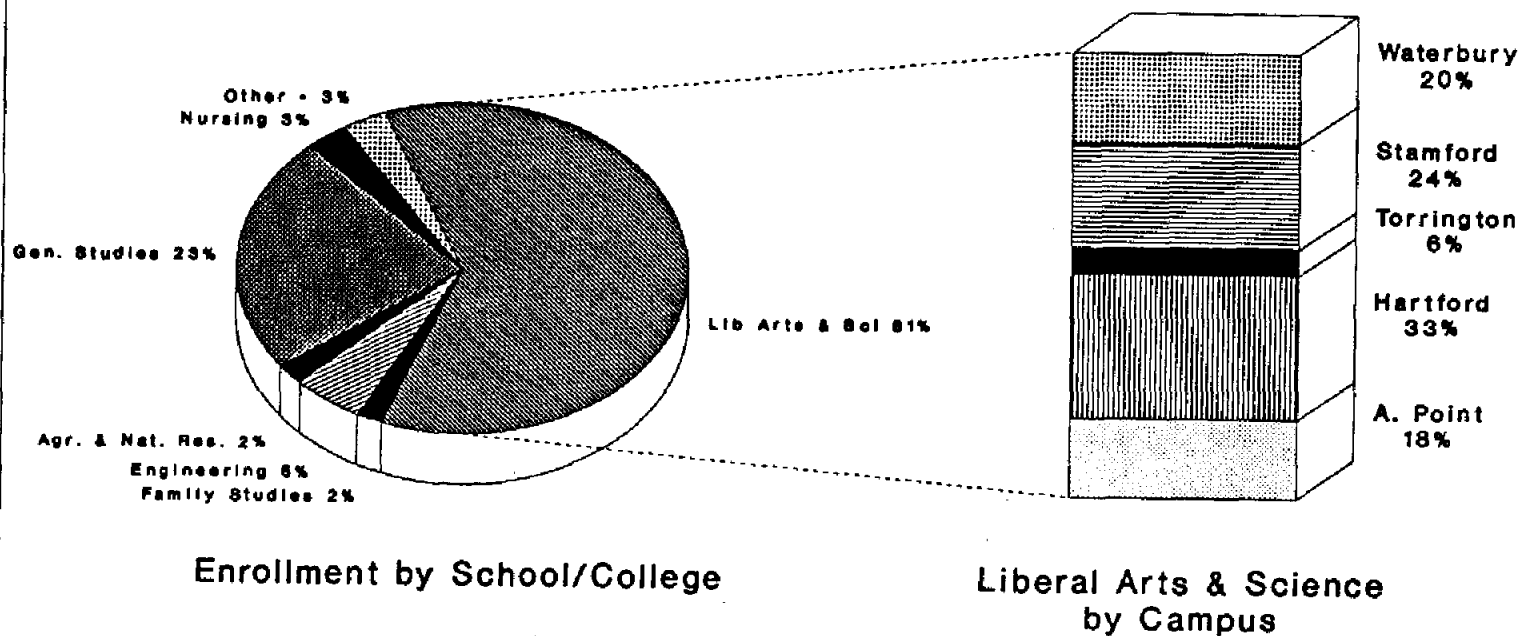

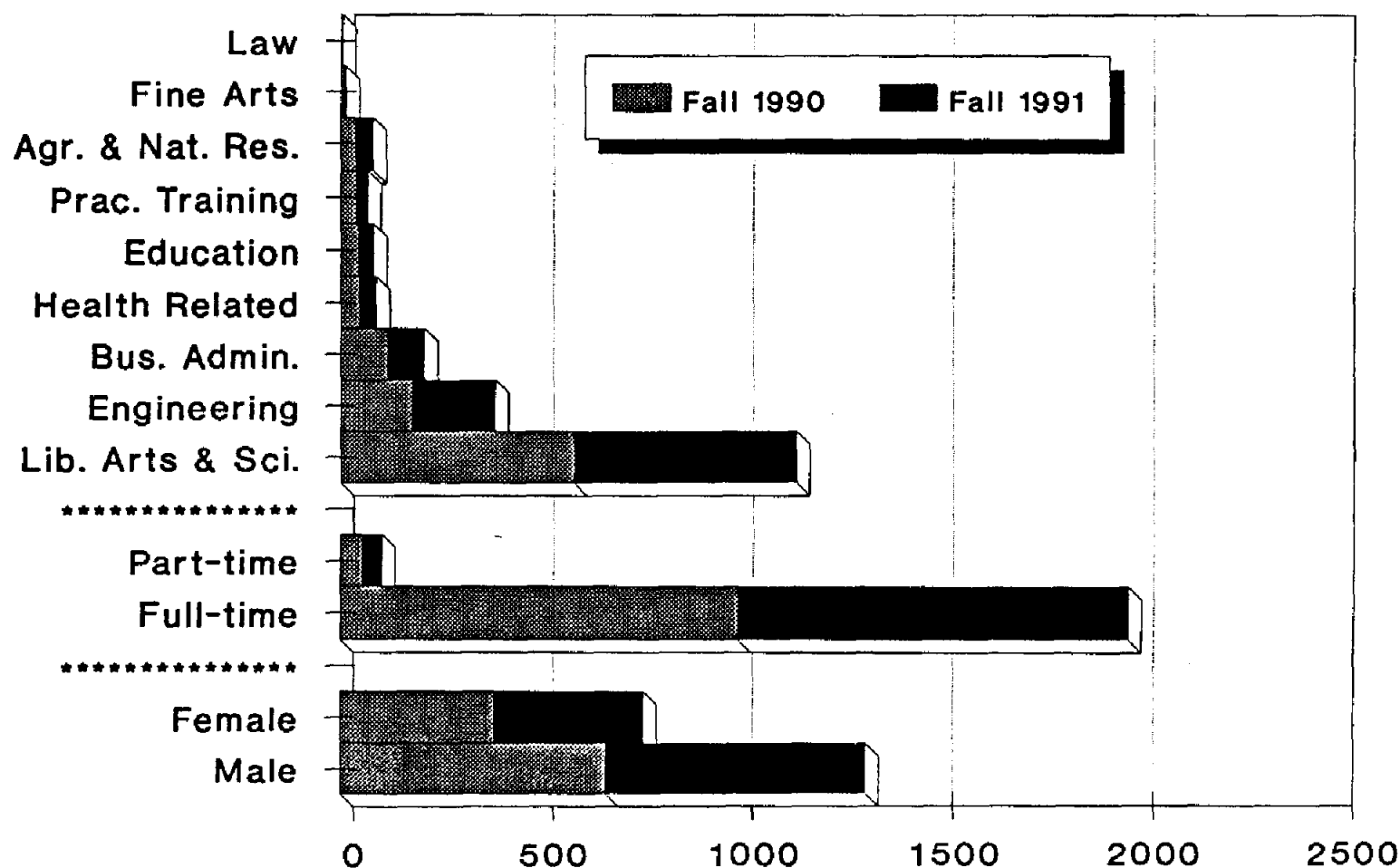

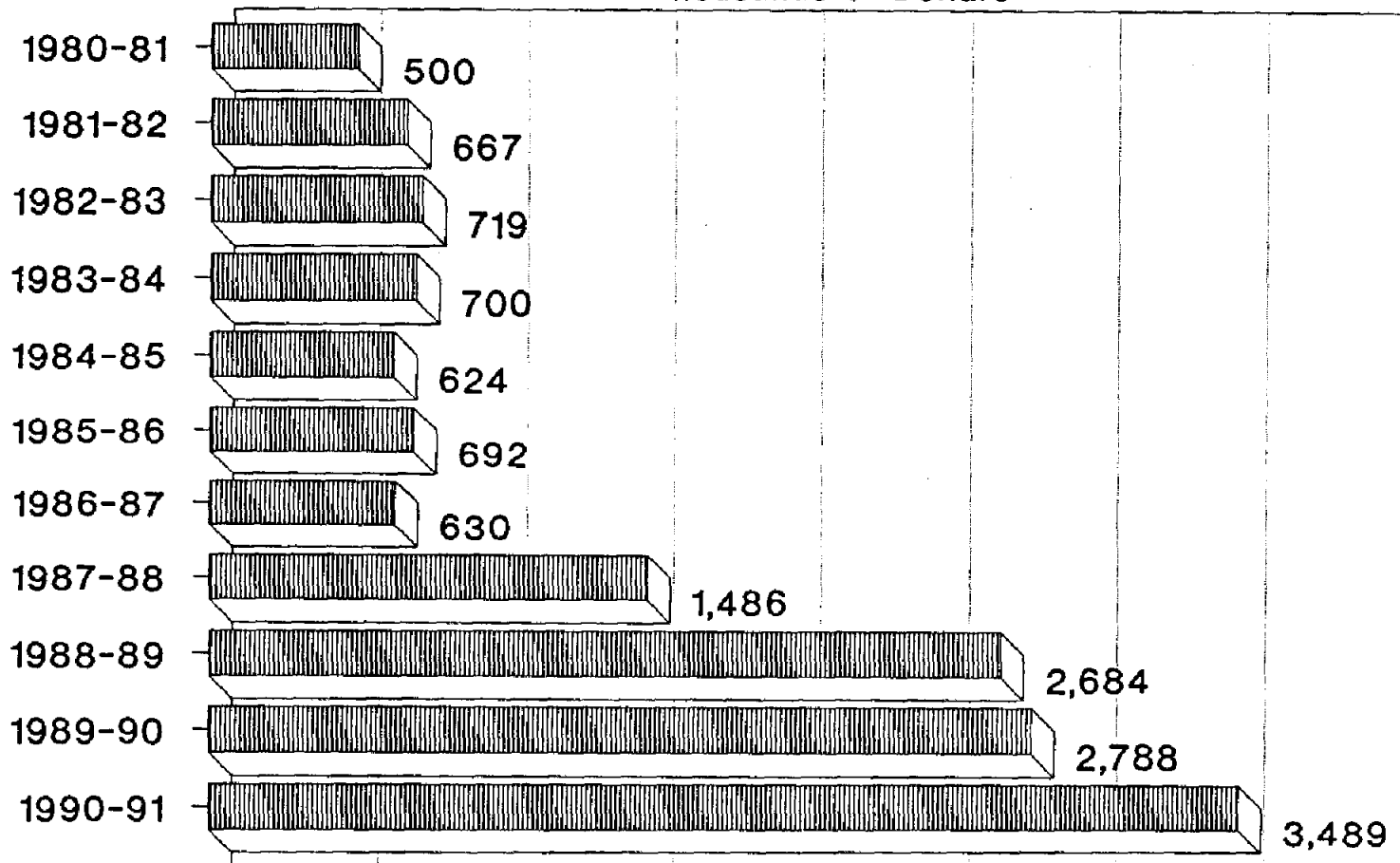

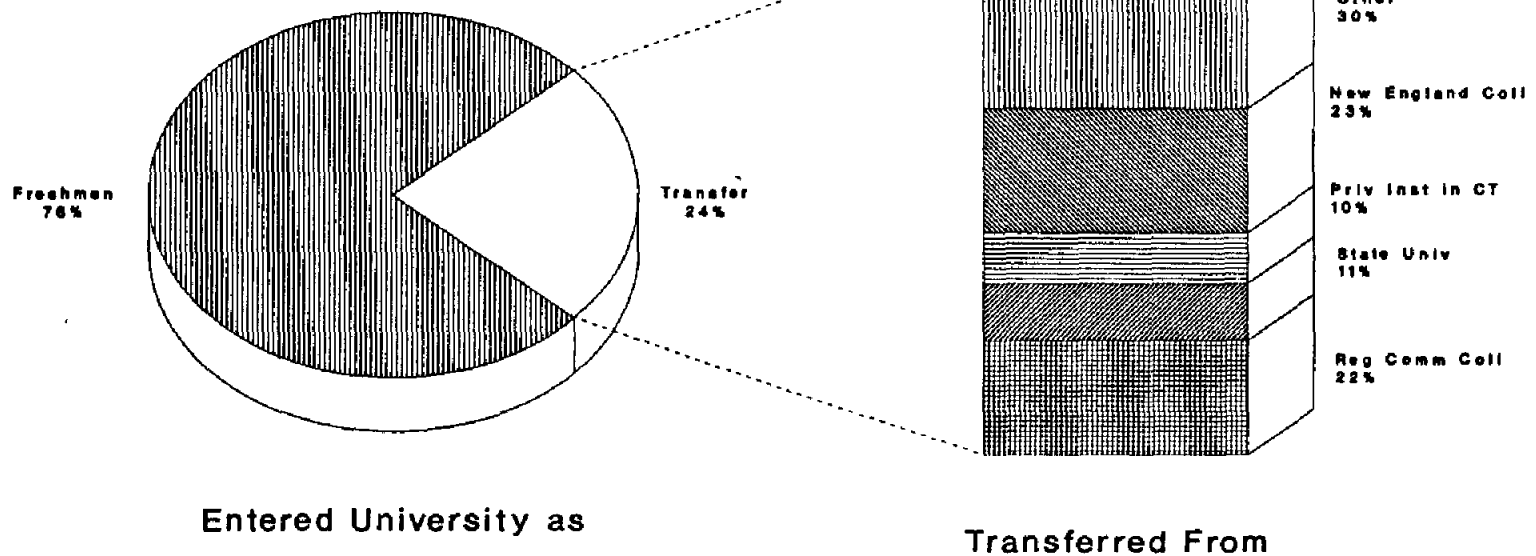

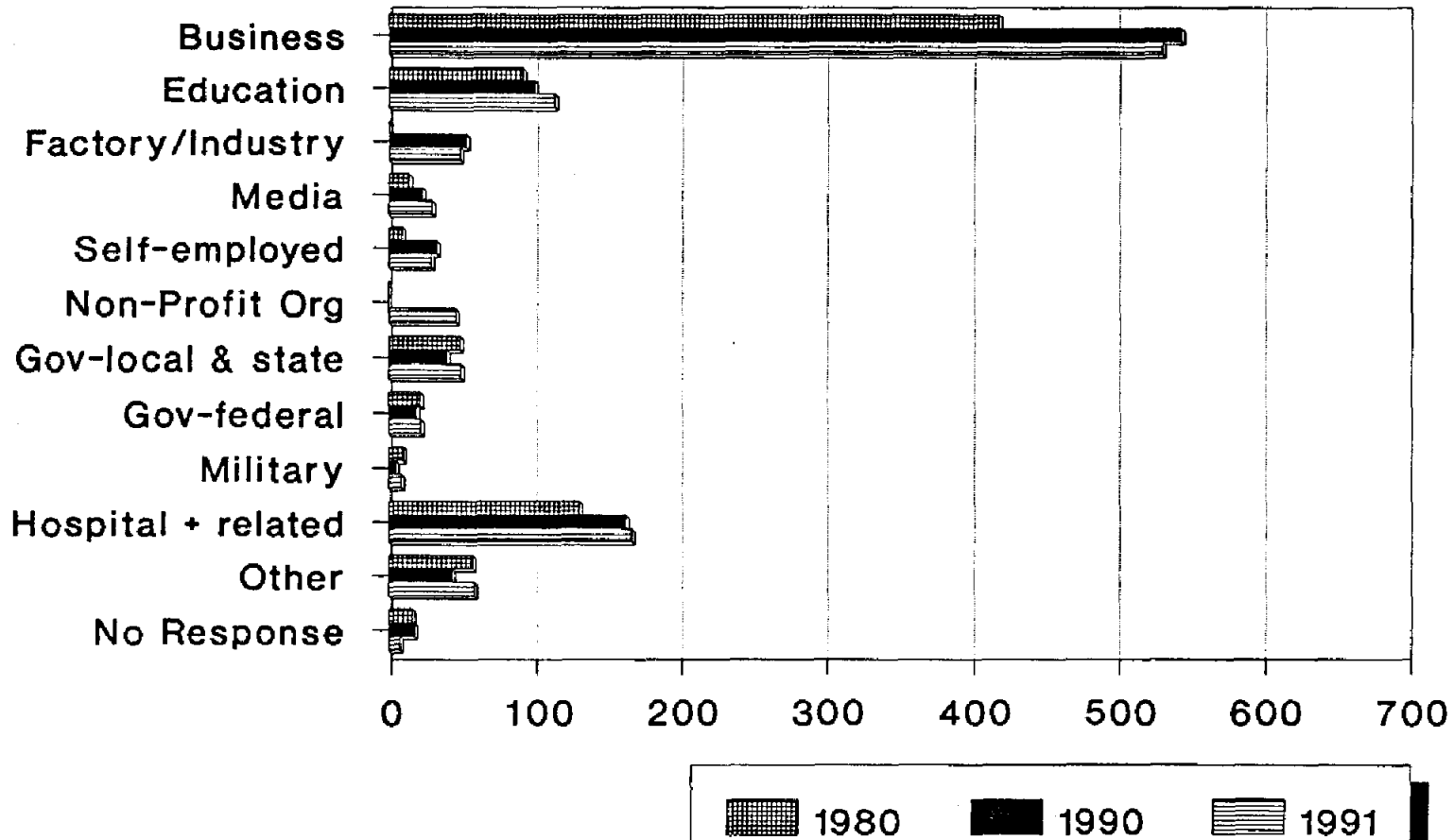

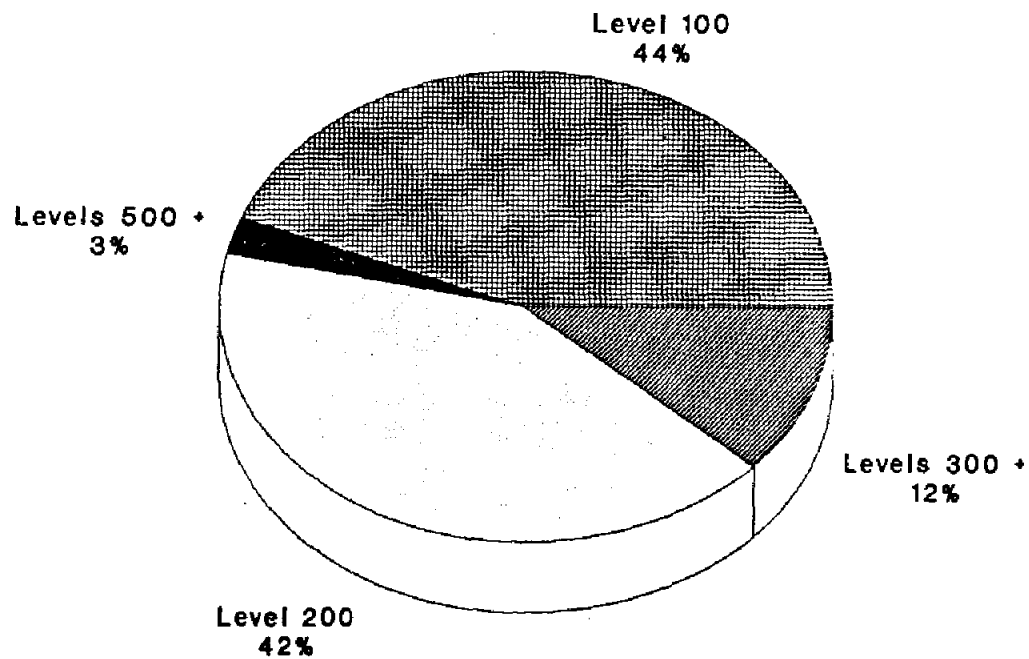

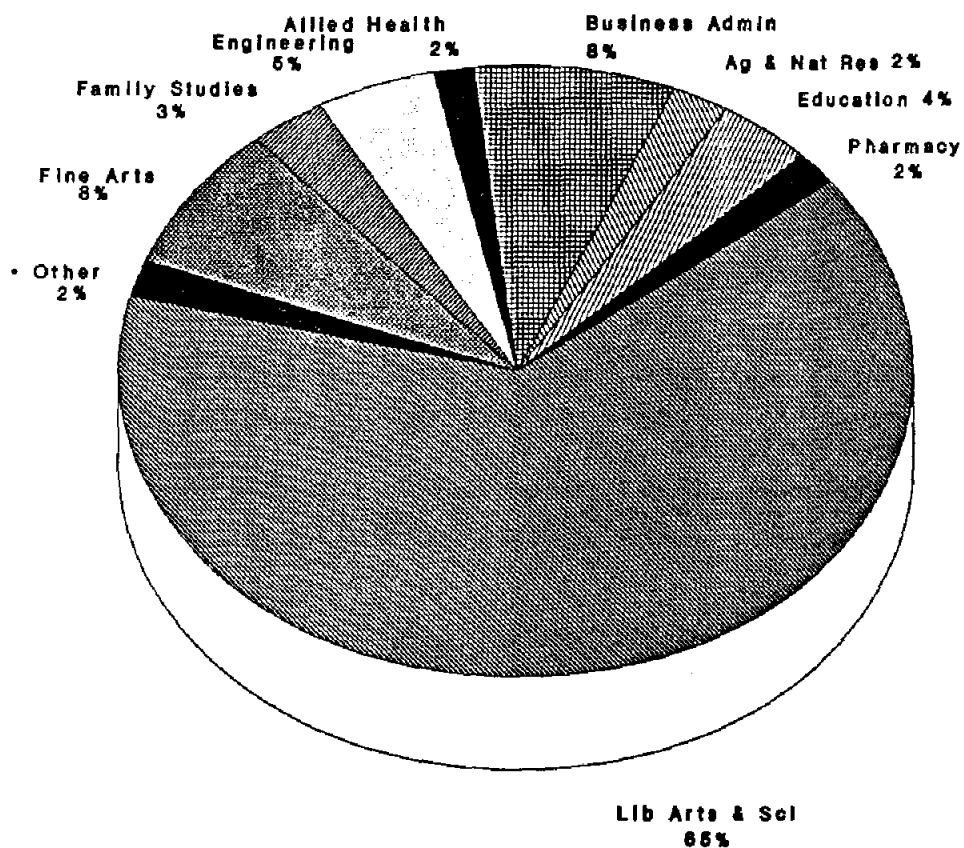

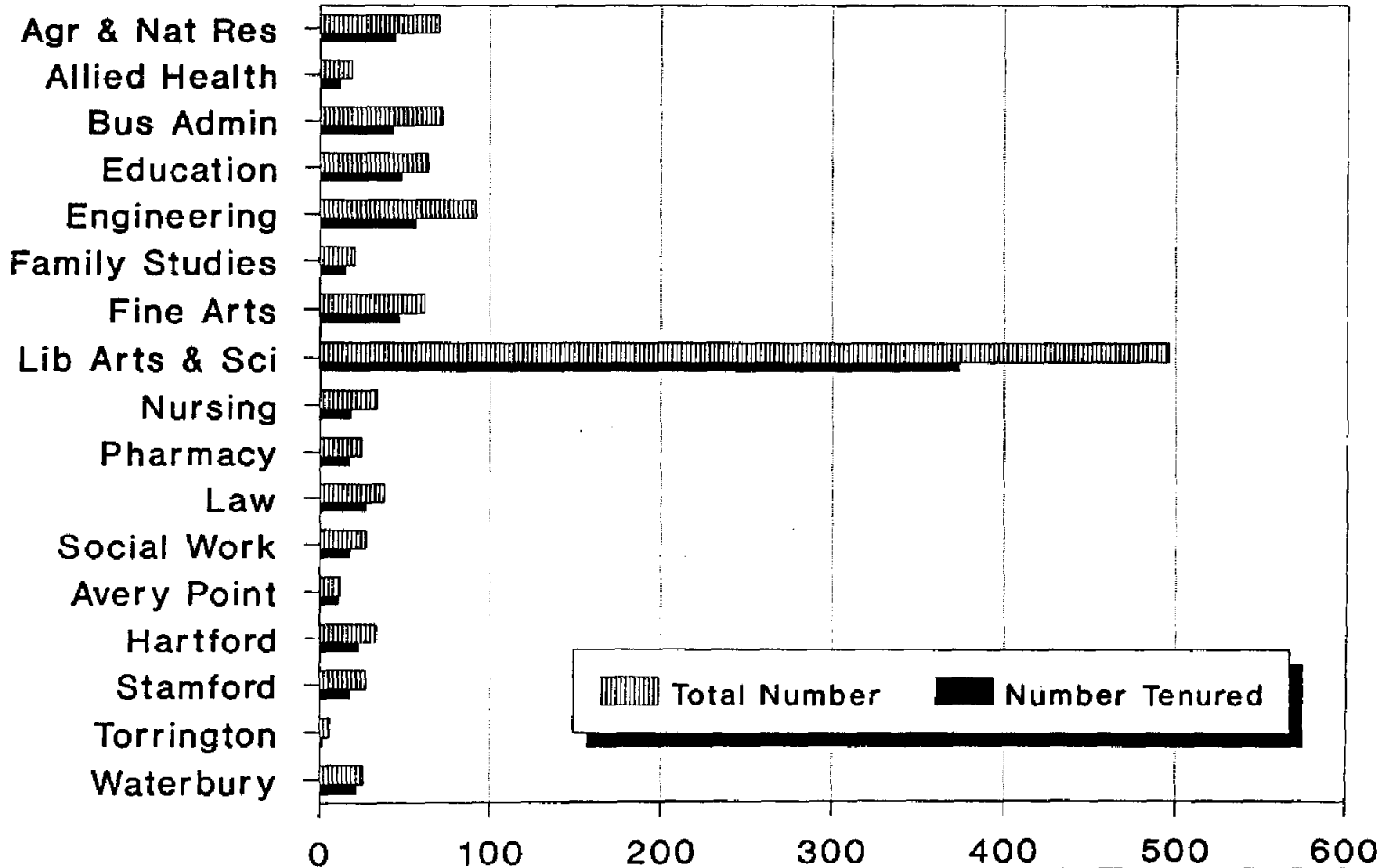

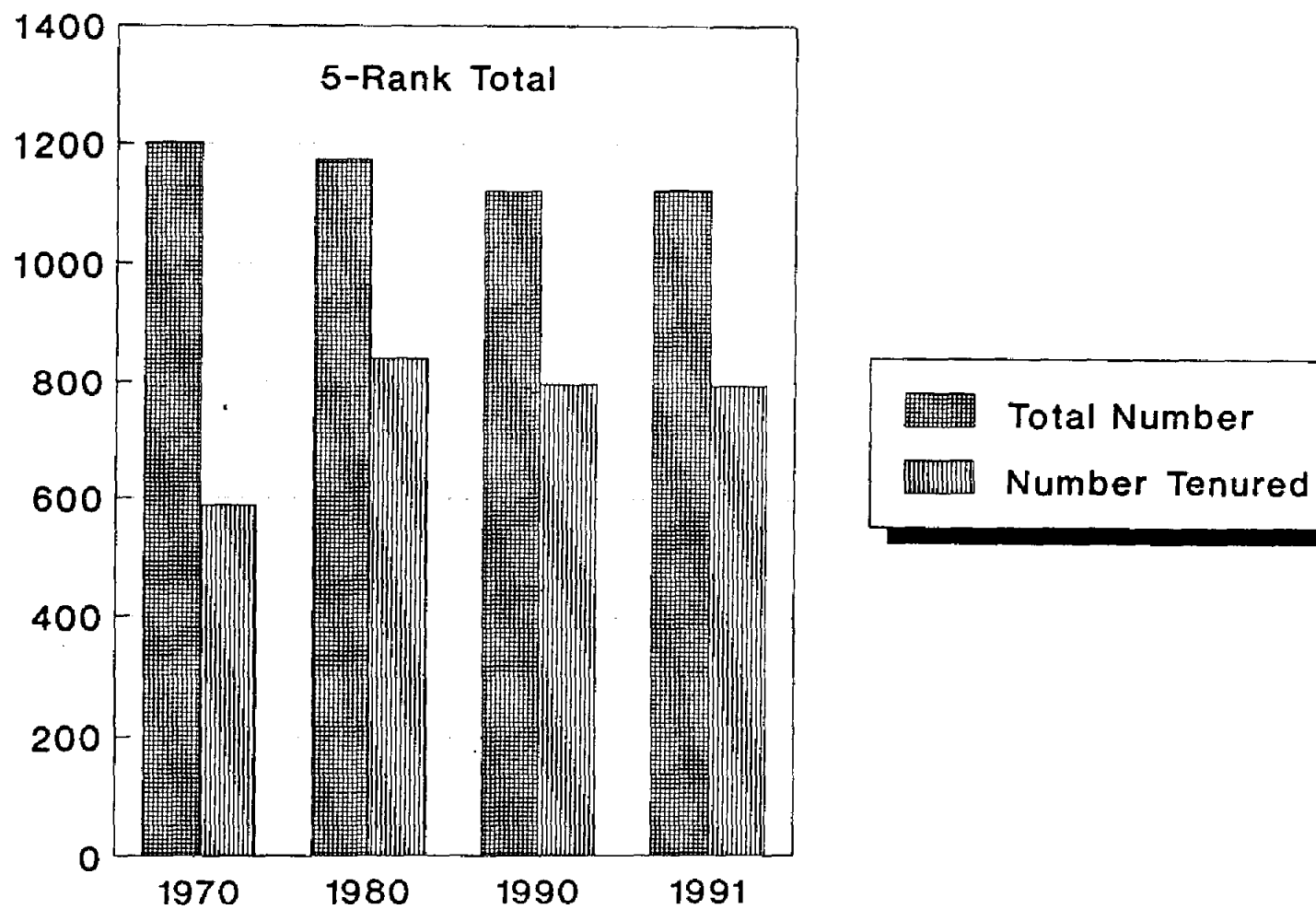

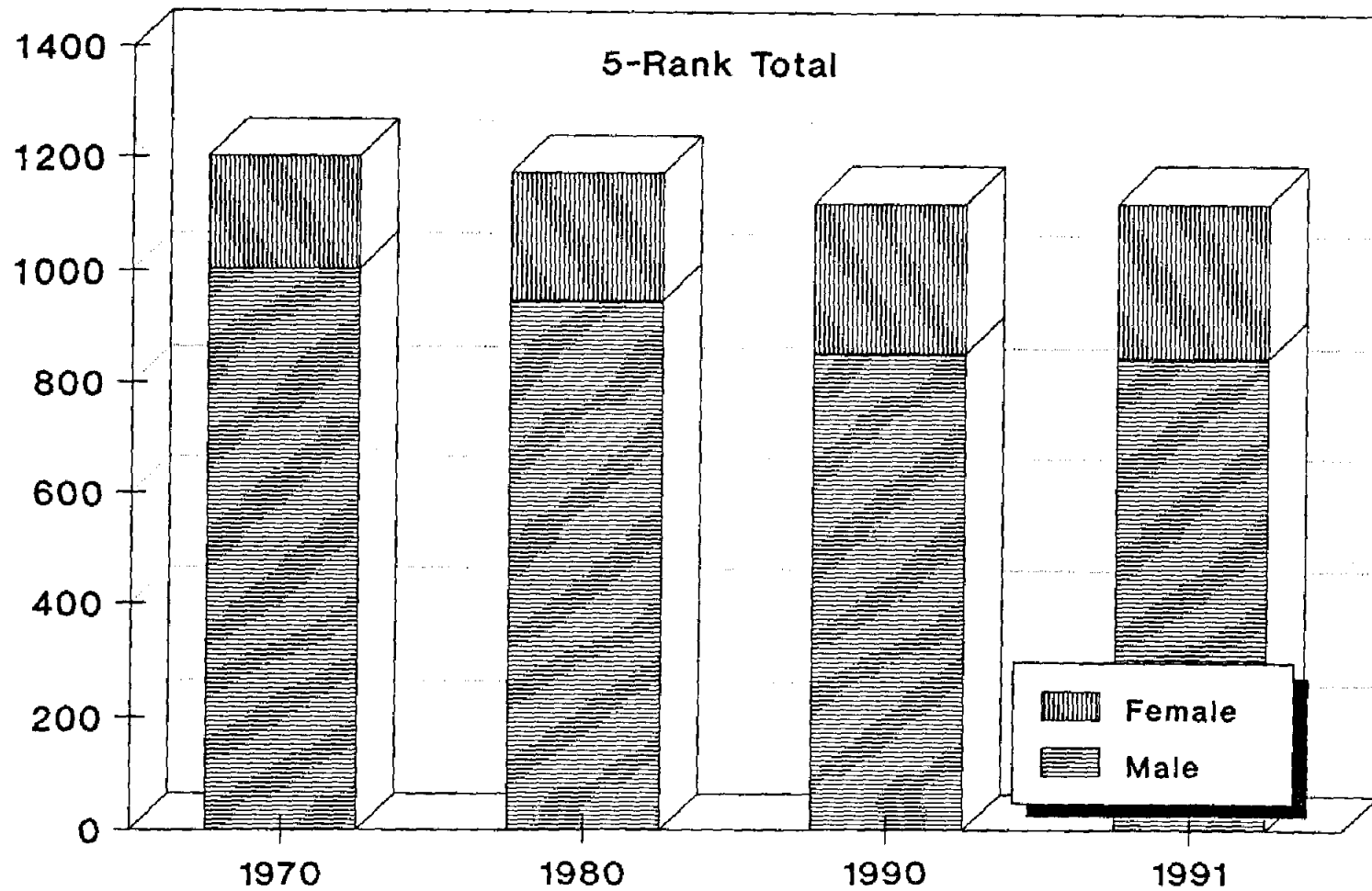

THE UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT Space Distribution by Functional Use Health Center

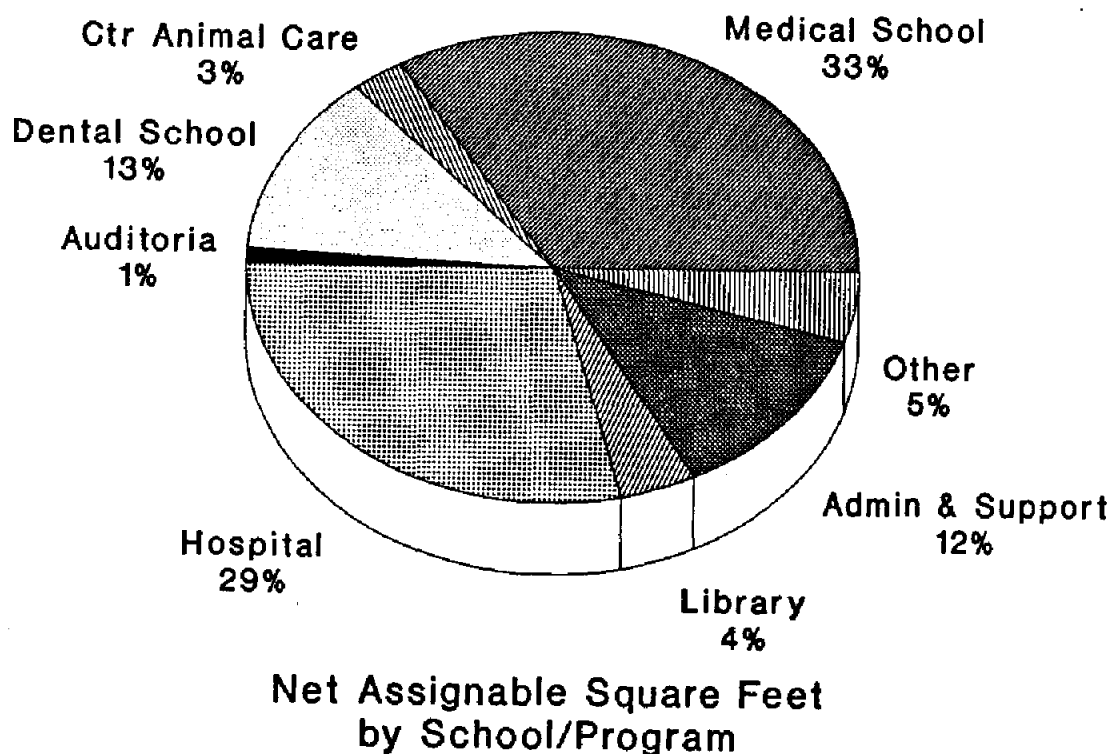

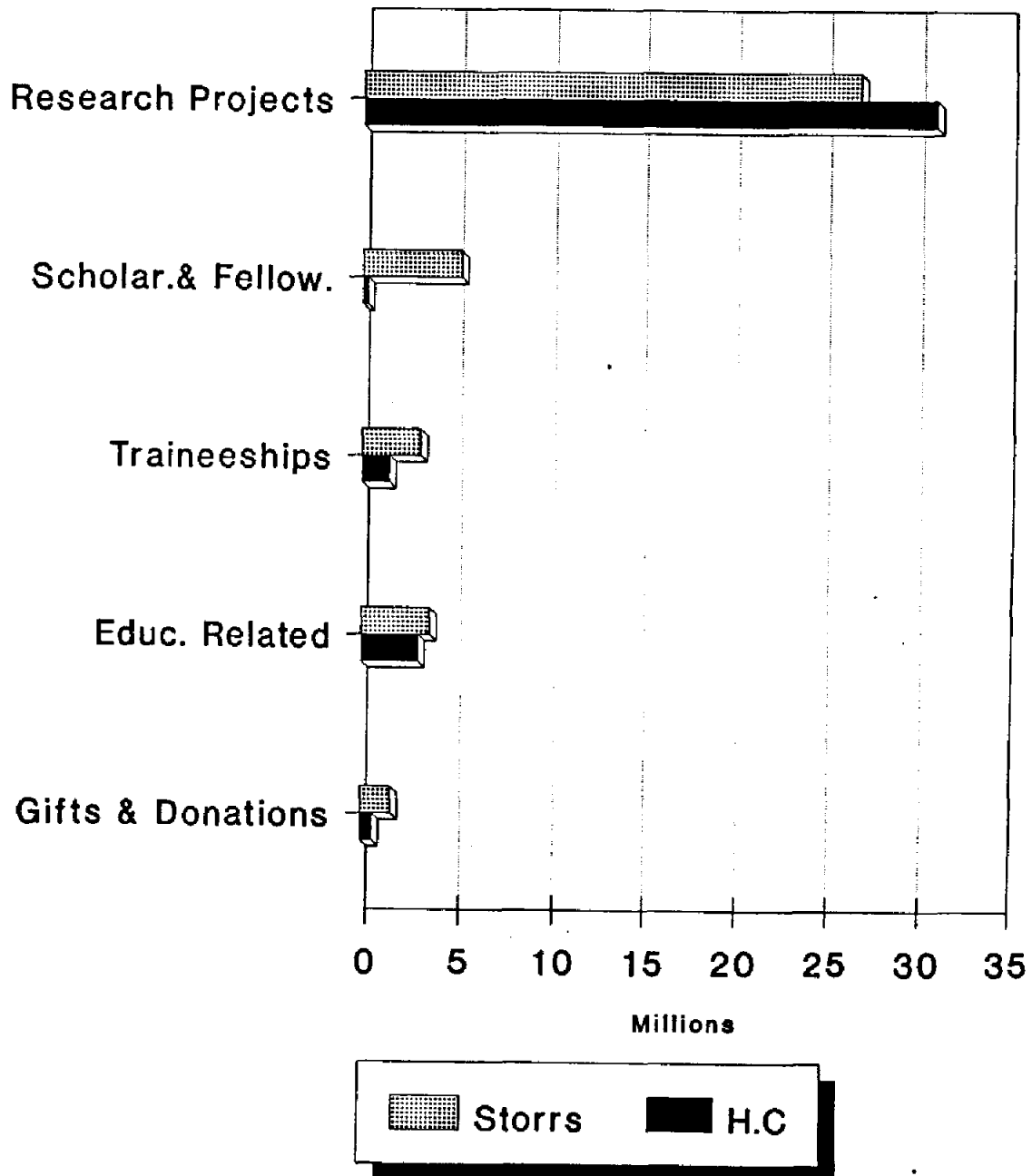

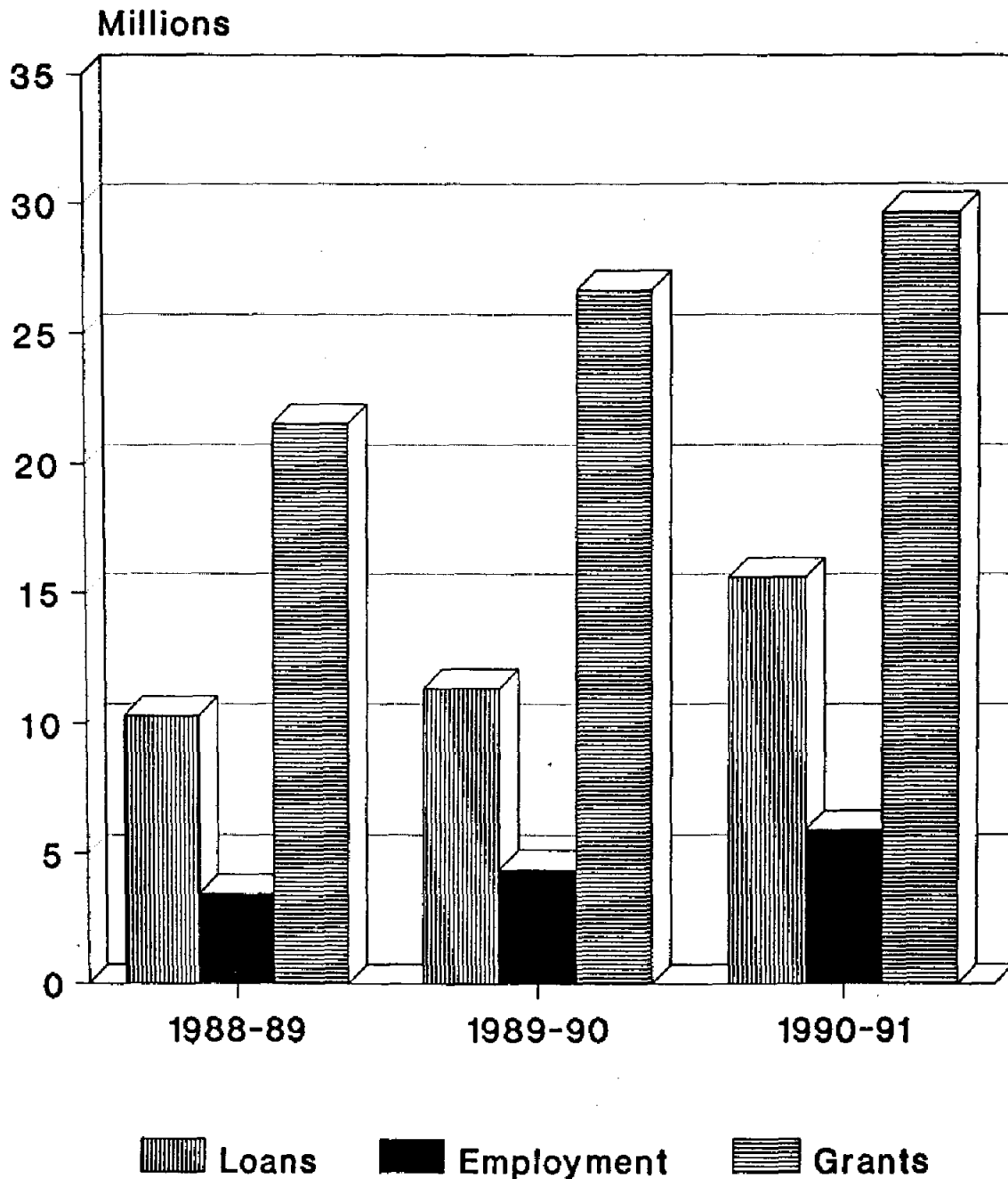
