



In Ohio she studied with Charles Reber and Kim McCann. She currently studies with Bob Hoyle. Emma is a Brother of Kappa Kappa Psi, National Honorary Fraternity for College Bandmembers.

JILL SENCZIKOWSKA, *flute*, is currently a sixth semester music education major at the University of Connecticut. She currently studies under Dr. Barbara Hopkins of the Hartford Symphony and previously studied with Kellyann Chester-Ouellette and Linda Alexander. She is a member of the Wind Ensemble, Symphony Orchestra, and is a section leader in the UConn Marching Band. In high school, she participated in the All State Orchestra for two years and Eastern Regional's for four years in either band or orchestra. She was a member of the Greater Hartford Youth Wind Ensemble through The Hartt School and traveled to Austria summer 2008 where they performed in venues such as the Musikverein with the Summa Cum Laude Music Festival. Jill is a Brother of Kappa Kappa Psi.
