

THE POPULATION OF CONNECTICUT: TOWN AND COUNTY FACT BOOK 1970

This report is intended as a partial response to the growing demand for basic demographic data on Connecticut's population. Administrators in local and state governments, businessmen throughout the private sector of our economy, and the scientific-academic community have developed an increased appreciation for the utility of basic social, economic, and demographic characteristics of the State's population. Many of these persons, however, have experienced difficulty in locating the appropriate data sources and in retrieving, manipulating, or interpreting the resulting figures. It is hoped that this report, containing twenty-four tables of selected demographic characteristics, will serve as a quick reference volume for those without immediate access to the complete 1970 census publications.

All of the tables presented herein were derived from data produced in the 1970 census of population and, in the case of tables containing historical data, from relevant previous census publications. Most of these data may be found in various places in the following printed reports:

- U.S. Bureau of the Census, U.S. Census of Population: 1970, Number of Inhabitants, Final Report PC(1)-A8, Connecticut.
- U.S. Bureau of the Census, U.S. Census of Population: 1970, General Population Characteristics, PC(1)-B8, Connecticut.
- U.S. Bureau of the Census, U.S. Census of Population: 1970, General Social and Economic Characteristics, PC(1)-C8, Connecticut.
- U.S. Bureau of the Census, U.S. Census of Population: 1970, Detailed Characteristics, PC(1)-D8, Connecticut.

In addition to bringing selected facts together in a single, convenient volume, this report also contains detailed 1970 data for towns of less than 2,500 population, information not published by the Bureau of Census in the printed reports. Such data were only available on computer tape. Special thanks is due The Graduate School, University of Connecticut Research Foundation, for providing the funds for the purchase of the Fourth Count Summary Tapes for the State of Connecticut. These data were the basis for most of the tables shown here but several of the tables also utilized the First Count and Second Count Summary Tapes for Connecticut. The Social Science Data Center, University of Connecticut, kindly made available its copies of these computer tapes for our research purposes.

Every effort was made to maintain comparability with the previous report, The Population of Connecticut: Town and County Fact Book, 1960, The University of Connecticut, Storrs Agricultural Experiment Station Bulletin 380 (January 1964), prepared

under the direction of Dr. Edward G. Stockwell. However, the 1970 report contains one new table (Table 24) and omits one table that appeared in the 1960 volume (Table 9 on Population and Households). In a few cases new methods of data reporting by the Bureau of Census prohibited calculation of exactly equivalent tables. For example, the 1960 volume contained information on the labor force and employment status of the population 14 years old and over while the 1970 data were reported for persons 16 years old and over.

The official 1970 population for Connecticut is 3,032,217 which differs from the figure of 3,031,709 which would be obtained if data in certain tables of this report were summed. The difference is due to errors by the Bureau of Census that were detected only after both their printed reports and summary tapes had been prepared. This report utilizes the corrected population figures in Table 1 and other tables that require a total population count in the calculations. The towns and counties that were in error were:

However, on other tables it was not possible to use the corrected population counts for these four towns and two counties because the corrected counts were given for total population only. For example, in Table 11 on Mobility Status of the Population 5 Years Old and Over, the base for the percentages was the original count of persons by age since no corrected count of persons by age has been published by the Bureau of Census. The effects of these data problems are not too significant because of the small number of towns involved and the relatively minor differences between the original and corrected population counts.

Special thanks are due Mrs. Wendy Fall and Doris Lund for careful typing of table titles, table headings, and other material needed for final preparation. This report has also benefited from the helpful suggestions of Dr. William Groff and Dr. Kenneth Hadden, Department of Rural Sociology, University of Connecticut. Any errors that may have passed undetected remain, of course, the responsibility of the authors.

1. The towns indicated by Footnote No. 1 contain fairly large resident institutions. Prior to 1950, the U.S. Bureau of the Census enumerated the inmates of institutions (mental hospitals, jails, reformatories, military installations, and boarding schools and colleges), as living in their town of origin. Beginning in 1950, however, inmates were enumerated as living in the town containing the institution in which they resided. In these towns, a substantial part of the population increase between 1940 and 1950 may be explained by the change in the definition of usual place of residence.
2. For 1920, 1930 and 1940, the data are for the town of Saybrook. The name of the town of Saybrook was changed to "Deep River" on July 1, 1947.
3. Data not available for 1920. The town of Orange was split into the two towns of "Orange" and "West Haven" in 1921.
4. The Norwich State Hospital is located in the two towns of Preston and Norwich. In 1950, the U.S. Bureau of the Census included the entire patient population of the hospital in the figures for Norwich; in 1960 and 1970 the Bureau enumerated the patients in the town in which they were actually housed. The Department of Rural Sociology has made estimates of the 1950 population of these two towns with the hospital residents allocated to place of residence. These 1950 estimates are: Norwich, 35,601; and Preston, 3,807. See: Robert G. Burnight and Dorothy G.
