1. The minutes of the meeting of January 16, 1952, having been mailed out, were approved without being read.
2. THE BOARD VOTED to accept the following resignations:
 - (1) Ann F. Clark, Library Assistant, effective February 9, 1952.
 - (2) George W. Crowther, Assistant Professor of Agricultural Engineering, effective April 16, 1952.

4. THE BOARD VOTED to accept and place on file the following requests for leave of absence:

 - (5) W. Howard Martin, Associate Professor of Agricultural Education, sabbatic leave 1952-53. Study for doctorate.

5. THE BOARD VOTED to accept the following scholarships and gifts and instructed the President to write appropriate letters of appreciation:
 - (1) \$39.89, Income from Ratcliffe Hicks Trust "A" Fund to be awarded to student enrolled in Ratcliffe Hicks School of Agriculture.
 - (2) \$1500 from The Borden Company Foundation for five additional annual scholarships designated the Borden Agricultural Scholarship Awards.
 - (3) \$125 Scholarship to School of Social Work from the Connecticut Public Welfare Association.

- (8) \$1000 from Clarence A. Wimpfheimer, Stonington, to Labor-Management Institute to further achievements of the Institute.
6. THE BOARD VOTED to approve the following research projects to be carried on by the University staff and financed by the several agencies indicated:
- (1) \$350 from MTM Association to be used in connection with research in area of methods and motion and time analysis of small human motions such as those required in the operation of typewriters and office equipment, under direction of Messrs. Smalley and Emerzian.
- (2) \$1875 from Research Corporation in support of continued project under the direction of Dr. Paul Zilsel entitled "Theoretical Investigations into the Nature of Superconductivity and Superfluidity."
- (3) \$4500 from American Cancer Society, Inc. in support of research program under the direction of Dr. W. Landauer entitled "The Development Physiology of Phenocopies in Fowl." July 1, 1952 to June 30, 1953.
- (4) \$3500 from American Cancer Society, Inc. in support of research program under the direction of Dr. S. Friedland entitled "To study the use of the Mass Spectrometer for Identification and Determination of the Structure of Low Vapor Pressure Molecules such as the Steroids." July 1, 1952 to June 30, 1953.
- (5) \$1740 from Chas. Pfizer & Co., Inc., in support of research program under the direction of Dr. W. Kulp. February 1, 1952 to January 31, 1953.

6. (6) \$10,000 from Chas. H. Hood Dairy Foundation for three year research program in the effects of milking techniques on udder infection under supervision of Drs. Plastridge and Eaton.
7. The proposed change in the By-Laws regarding the election of faculty senators which was presented and read at the meeting of the Board on January 16, 1952 was again read and THE BOARD VOTED to amend the last two sentences of paragraph 1 of Section K2(e) on Page 30 to the following:

Each year at the first meeting of the Senate after a new group of senators has been elected in accordance with Section F1 of these regulations, the Provost shall provide ballots containing lists of all senators who have just been elected to three-year terms and the Senate shall thereupon proceed to elect by secret ballot one of such newly-elected senators as a member of the committee of three to serve until the end of his then current term in the Senate. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the membership of the committee of three, the Senate shall elect in the same manner from the group in which the vacancy exists. These elections shall, in the absence of other provision by the Senate, be the first order of business at the meeting at which they take place.

8. At the January 16, 1952 meeting of the Board of Trustees, a report prepared by a special committee of the local chapter of AAUP entitled "A study of college teaching" was presented and tabled. The report was taken from the table and discussed. THE BOARD VOTED to accept the report with appreciation and advised the President to so notify the local chapter of the AAUP and to further advise that the report was being forwarded to a University committee appointed from the Faculty Senate, the official faculty representative body, to study the question of "teaching loads."
9. THE BOARD VOTED to authorize the President to sign a deed transferring a portion of land containing 0.25 acre located on the northerly side of the North Eagleville Road in the town of Mansfield, from the University of Connecticut to the State Highway Department. This parcel of land is required by the State Highway Department in connection with the construction of the North Eagleville Road, in the town of Mansfield.
10. The President reported to the Board on the recent evaluation of the programs of the College of Pharmacy and of the School of Social Work and reported that full accreditation has been continued for these two schools.
11. Mr. Lester E. Shippee reported to the Board of Trustees for the special Trustees' Committee on Finance, composed of Messrs. Shippee, Brock and Watson, on three matters which had been referred to the committee by the University Comptroller and his Assistant on Thursday, February 21, 1952.

The report of Mr. Shippee is as follows:

11. (1) Invoice in amount of \$410.27 due Frederic C. Teich, architect, for revision of stadium plans. This bill was for services contracted for by the Public Works Commissioner after the contract had been let and without prior approval of the University. These services were not necessary nor productive and were unauthorized, but we feel that Mr. Teich should be paid and a letter sent to the Commissioner indicating that such payment does not establish a precedent nor indicate the Board's approval of his actions in this situation.

(2) Estimated additional costs of \$6000 for fill and rough grading around the new Agricultural Industries building. This anticipated additional cost is caused by a discrepancy between the specifications for the construction and the blueprints of the job regarding the building limits. There should be no discrepancies between the two, but if there are, these should be called to the attention of the contractor by the Public Works Department when the contract is signed. This was not done; however, the Public Works Commissioner has ruled that the contractor must complete the work without additional compensation. This ruling has been appealed by the contractor, and the State Comptroller has indicated that he has constitutional authority to settle this claim by paying same and charging the appropriate University account. It is recommended that, under these circumstances, the State Comptroller be advised that if he has the constitutional authority to settle claims of this kind, he should exercise this authority but he must assume responsibility for such charges as are made against University accounts for payment of the claims. ✓

(3) State Auditors' recommendation to the State Comptroller that the University pay out of income the costs of fire insurance on all University revenue producing buildings. (Insurance value approximately \$14,000,000). The dining halls, gymnasium, swimming pool, student union building, auditorium and stadium are not revenue producing, for purposes of maintenance and operation, and are not included in this figure. The State Comptroller originally interpreted this recommendation to apply to all buildings constructed from self-liquidating bonds. After a great deal of discussion, during which the attached copy of a letter from the President to the University Comptroller was read, it was felt that insurance charges should be approved and charged to the University Revolving Fund but only for those buildings that are designated as income producing buildings for purposes of bond amortization and interest charges and including income for operating and maintenance purposes. It is clearly recognized that all University buildings constructed at the University, regardless of source of capital funds, are State buildings. It is also recognized that the State authorities were of the same opinion in 1941 and transferred all insurances, carried prior to this date by the University, to the office of the State Comptroller, State Auditors and the State Comptroller now believe that these insurance charges should again be carried by the University, principally to eliminate any questions with respect to the University carrying all types of expenses for the operation and maintenance of self-liquidating and self-supporting buildings. 11. that the premiums for the self-supporting buildings under question would be about \$12,000 per annum.

(4) We also examined a statement listing endowment and loan funds in the custody of the University, particularly with respect to type of investment. This subject will be studied further before recommendations are made."

THE BOARD VOTED to approve the recommendations of the special committee and advised the President to instruct the University Comptroller to properly clear these matters.

12. The President discussed the question of "undergraduate residents and migration of students" as it affects higher education in Connecticut and with special reference to the University of Connecticut.

The following items of information were presented to the Trustees for consideration. No action was taken.

1. 41% of all Connecticut students attending college attend out-of-state institutions,
 - (a) Out-of-state students admitted to Connecticut publicly-supported institutions 2.7%
 - (b) Connecticut students attending out-of-state public institutions 16.4%
2. The national average of students attending out-of-state institutions 20%
3. The four states which retain the smallest proportion of their residents are located in the Northeast and in this order:

New Jersey
Connecticut
Delaware
New York
